

MINUTES

of the

FIRST DISTRICT QUARTERLY MEETING OF THE GENERAL CONVERENCE of
THE N. C. ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

The First District Quarterly Meeting of the General Conference of the N. C. Association of Original Free Will Baptists met at the Joy Free Will Baptist Church, Tarboro, N. C., on October 20, 1967.

The meeting was opened by the Rev. Eddie Dollar leading the congregation in a song after which we were led in prayer by the Rev. Glenn Hill.

Special music was rendered by the choir and a duet from the host church. The Rev. Charles Brown, Pastor of the Collingswood Free Will Baptist Church, Portsmouth, Virginia, delivered a challenging message, entitled "The Marks of a Christian." He used the Scripture in Gal. 6:12-18 for his text.

An offering of \$13.65 was received during the meeting for Foreign Missions, to be applied to Estenio Garcia's account.

Following the message, we entered into a brief business session, with the Moderator, Rev. Henry Hughes, presiding. The following items of business were brought before the body:

1. Motion was made and carried to receive Rev. Joe Hailey, Jr., Pastor of the Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Enfield, N. C., into our fellowship. The Moderator extended the right hand of fellowship on behalf of the Quarterly Meeting to Brother Hailey.
2. Motion was made and carried to have four (4) meetings a year, to be held the last Friday night in January, April, July, and October.
3. Motion was made and carried to add \$20.00 to the Foreign Missions offering which was received at the meeting, making it a total of \$33.65.
4. Motion was made and carried to accept the invitation of the White Oak Hill Free Will Baptist Church to have the next meeting there, January 26, 1967.

The minutes of the last meeting and the treasurer's report were approved as printed.

There were 7 Pastors present and 8 churches represented, with 8 delegates registered.

Motion was made and carried to adjourn. Rev. J. W. Long, Jr. dismissed the meeting in prayer.
