Willie Justice was received into fellowship of the First District Quarterly Meeting. 3. A motion was made and carried to draw up a petition concerning the textbook issue and ask all of our pastors and churches to sign this. This petition to be drawn up by the moderator and clerk in co-operation with Rev. Durham.

After the above mentioned business, a trio from Parker's Chapel sang "When Jesus Comes to Reign" and the Parker's Chapel Choir sang "Have You Knelt at the Cross?" Then Miss Molly Barker spoke to us on "Magnifying His Name Together" from Psalm 34:3. This was a challenging message to take a stand for God and to be real witnesses for Him. Miss Barker then shared with us slides showing some of our missionary work in South America, especially Urugary.

A motion was made and carried to give the offering received at this meeting plus the money sent in with the church letters to Molly Barker's account.
