

PROCEEDINGS

The French Broad Association of the F. W. B. C. convened in regular annual session August 25, 1927, with the Mountain View Church, and was called to order by B. E. Guthery, the former moderator, and after singing "Sweet Bye and Bye", prayer was offered by Rev. F. C. West. The organization was gone into. A secret ballot resulted in the election of C. E. Guthery as moderator. Brother C. S. Long suggested that the names of Brothers Mallie Rice and F. C. West be run for clerk. A ballot being taken resulted in the election of F. C. West. On motion of Brother R. V. Self, a committee was appointed to consider all resolutions to come before the association. Committee consisted of Bros. Fleet Williams, John Ramsey and R. V. Self. On motion of Bro. C. S. Long all visiting bretheren were seated in this association. On motion of Brother R. V. Self all satudnig committees were retained. Then the moderator proceeded to appoint the following committees: Arrangements, B. E. Guthery, F. C. West, Rome Woodson, 'l'emperance, J. C. Wallace, A. P. Rich, C. Y. Elkin. Educa-tion, Thomas E. Beaman, Mattie Rice, C. S. Long. Finance, John Ramsey, I. M. Reace, J. C. Wallace. Obituaries, Mrs. John Ramsey, Mrs. Frank Ramsey, Mrs. Lon Sluder, Mrs. A. P. Rich. S. S., Thomas Beaman, J. H. Casa Log Banks, Pariodicals, Rome Woodson, Low Mondow, F. C. West Gase, Joe Banks. Periodicals, Rome Woodson, Lou Monday, F. C. West, Pulpit, Pastor and delegates of Mountani View Church with the moderator and Clerk. Home missions, Mrs. Joe Randall, Mrs. Henry Vaughn. Foreign Missions, same as last year. Marriage and Divorce, I. M. Reese, L. E. Ballard. Ladies Aid, Mrs. E. W. Reece, Mrs. A. P. Rich, Mrs. C. L. Sharp. Resolution Committee, J. G. Ramsey, J. A. Martin, B. E. Guthery. On motion of Brother C. S. Long, house adjourned till 2 o'clock P. M.

Association called to order by the moderator at 2 p. m. and after song and prayer, Bro. John Ramsey and C. S. Long were appointed reading clerks, and the churches presented their letters by the delegates, and same were duly enrolled. Brother C. Y. Elkin at this time asked for information on a point of doctrine. Does our church teach a second definite saving work of grace, and after some discussion by Brothers Elkin, Selfe, Long, White, West, and others, the moderator asked Bro. R. V. Self to explain, and after reading resolution by Brother Ballard on deeper devotion and rehearsing the history of our church, gave his answer that we do not believe or teach a second definite saving work of grace. Motion was then made by C. S. Long and seconded by C. Y. Elkin that this subject should not come before this association again. On motion of R. V. Self, association adjourned till Friday morning at 9 o'clock. —F. C. West, Clerk.

The association was called to order by the moderator at 9 o'clock and after devotoinal services conducted by Brother Mallie Rice the minutes of the first day session were read, corrected and approved. Moderator called for committee reports on marriage and divorce. This was read and same adopted. Committee on Temperance read their report and it was adopted. Brother C. S. Long read report on Foreign Missions and it was discussed by Brother L. E. Ballard, with regard to the eight year program. Brother R. V. Self and Thomas Beaman also spoke on the subject. Then the report was adopted. Brother Beaman then submitted the report on S. S. and it was adopted. The report on Young Peoples League was read and approved. Ladies Aid report was read and adopted. Committee was called to investigate the condition of the Marshall church. All committees not reported were asked to hand in their reports at the evening session. The house then took 10 minutes recess.

At eleven o'clock, reassembled and after singing some old time Gospel Songs and Prayer, Brother Hurt, one of our honored veterans for the cross, took the stand, gave his experience, read John 17, and a wonderful outpouring of the Holy Spirit was witnessed by all present. Meeting then adjourned for dinner.

Association was reassembled and called to order by moderator. Letters from Swannanoa, Hot Springs, Old Fort and Antioch, all new churches, were read and on motion of Brother S. C. Long were duly accepted and admittoed to fellowship in this association. Resolution on Orphanage read and approved. Then a resolution to empower a committee to act when necessary in settling disputes or other troubles that might arise was read and adopted. Bro. E. B. Guthery, C. S. Long, C. Y. Elkin, J. H. Martin and A. P. Rich were appointed on this committee. The committee on Memoirs reported. Committee on Ministerial Support was read and adopted. The work of the Marshall Church was adjudged illegal and said church was ordered to retain old membership roll until a pastor was elected. The report on Education was deferred until the next session. Then the association Evangelist read his report and it was adopted and he was elected to held same office for the coming year. Moved and seconded that we adjourn till 8:30 a. m. Saturday morning. Benediction by moderator.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Association convened at 8:30, with Brother E. B. Guthery, moderator, in the chair after devotional exercises, conducted by Rev. F. C. West. Business was called. Brother Ballard read 5 resolutions which were adopted on motion of J. G. Ramsey,—the association to pay historian \$4.00, and clerk \$7.00. Then Brother Ballard brought greetings from Cumber-land association. Rev. F. C. West was appointed as a fraternal delegate to attend the Cumberland association. Then Brother Beaman spoke in regard to sending delegates to State convention and Mrs. R. V. Self and Mrs. A. P. Rich were elected to attend. Then Brother Beaman asked us to elect delegates to the U. S. Conference. Rev. R. V. Self and Rev. C. S. Long were elected. Rev. C. S. Long was then re-elected as evangelist for this association. Brother J. G. Ramsey then read his report and it was adopted. Then the Finance Committee reported \$48.02. Brother Mallie Rice read report for orphanage. It was adopted at this time. Brothers Sprinkles, Pikes and Woody were seated in regular order. Then the preachers were asked to give their reports after which Brother R. V. Self took pledges for old ministers fund and raised \$164.00.

Then Brother C. S. Long read report on Education and after remarks

by Brother R. V. Self and others the report was tabled. The house then recessed until 11 o'clock. At that hour Rev. Thomas E. Beaman of the Eastern Conference was introduced by Rev. R. V. Self and delivered a very able and helpful message from II Corinthians 4:5, after which adjournment for dinner.

SATURDAY EVENING SESSION

Association was called to order by moderator at 2:30 p. m. and resumed business. Brother H. Grogan was appointed to preach intrductory sermon next year. Swannanoa church asked for the next association and it was granted. Brother R. V. Self offered resolution on Education and it was adopted. Resolution on ministerial support was adopted, then the other committees handed in their reports without reading. Brother C. S. Long made motion to thank moderator and clerk for faithful services rendered. Brother C. S. Long was appointed to thank the good people of Mountain View Church for their hospitality. Association then adjourned until Thursday before the fourth Sunday in August, 1928, at Swannanoa.

Brother Rome Woodson asked for a letter of recommendation to Jack's Creek association. It was granted. Brother G. W. Quinton was also granted a letter to the same association. The following preachers were elected as ordained council for the ensuing year. C. S. Long, ch., R. V. Self, B. E. Guthery, J. A. Martin and C. Y. Elkin. A committee was appointed and given power to act on any and all trouble arising in any of our churches, consisting of, Moderator, E. B. Guthrie, Clerk, F. C. West, J. A. Martin, R. V. Self, C. S. Long, A. P. Rich. The Ordaining Council then reported on the names of Brothers G. W. Briggs, and George Peaks, and they were ordained.

The conference then adjourned to meet one year hence with Swannanoa Church. Benediction by B. E. Guthrie, Moderator.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

1. This body shall be known as the Minister's Conference of the French Broad Association of the Free Will Baptists.

2. This conference is formed under and by the authority of the French Broad Association and shall be composed of licensed and ordained ministers.

3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said Association, issuing license, prescribing qualification for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, working for the most harmonous and effective ministry.

4. The officers of this conference shall be a chairman, secretary and treasurer, who shall be elected annually and perform the duties usually performed by such officers.

5. This conference shall have power to make such by-laws and other regulations as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.

 $\hat{\mathbf{6}}$. This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by vote of two-thirds.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

1. The regular meeting of this conference shall be held annually in connection with the meeting of the Association.

2. Each member shall report at each regular meeting either in person or by letter.

3. Five members shall constitute a quorum at all regular or legal meetings.

4. Chairman may call a special session at any time on request of three members.

5. At each regular meeting there shall be elected an ordaining council, whose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant license, conduct ordinations, etc., and report at the next regular meeting.

6. Licentiates shall pursue a definite course of study under the direction of the ordaining council.

7. Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contribution or by assessment of its members.

8. No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for their pastor and contribute to other benevolent enterprises, according to their ability.

9. No member shall meddle with the work of another or injure his reputation for usefulness. But watch over each other in love and thus promote harmony and love among the membership.

10. Each member not excused from age or infirmities is expected to do something to advance the cause of Christ and make a full report at each regular meeting.

11. Membership in this body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry.____

12. These by-laws may be amended by vote of two-thirds at any regular meeting.

CHURCH COVENANT

1. Having given ourselves to the Lord through Jesus Christ, we agree to adopt the Free Will Baptist Articles of Faith. We give ourselves to each other by the help of God.

2. We solemnly covenant before God that we wil carefully observe, rebuke and admonish those who have gone astray, and watch over each others reputation, and use our influence to the upbuilding of the church, commands implied in a profession of faith, and in the spirit of kindness and for the advancement of the cause of Christ, endeavoring to seek the unity of the spirit in the bonds of peace, and to confess our faults one to another and to strengthen those that are weak.

3. We promise by the help of God that we will faithfully practice family and secret prayer, and strive to cultivate the doctrine of $_0$ Gd's revealed word in the minds of those under our care.

4. We also agree to use our influence for the support of the Gospel and to contribute liberally to aid the ministry according to our several abilities. Also, we agree to be liberal with those that are afflicted and needy, and especially those of "The Household of Faith."

5. We also agree to attend the monthly meetings regularly, if not providentially hindered, and to submit to all ordinances implied in a profession of faith.

6. We also agree to abstain from sinful and vain amusements.

7. We also agree to abstain from all intoxicating liquors, not to use it as a beverage, nor to aid or assist in the manufacture of such, nor to furnish it to others.

8. We also agree to encourage home and foreign missions, education, Sabbath Schools, good morals, and everything that is for the glory of God and to the welfare of men, and may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ that we may be happily admitted into the Kingdom of God, where we can ascribe honor unto the Lamb forever. Amen.

CONSTITUTION

Article 1. That Association shall be composed of delegates chosen and sent from each individual church.

2. The delegates chosen and sent shall be recommended by letter from the church to which they belong and shall include the minister and some of the most able members belonging to the church.

3. The Association, when met and formed, shall elect a chairman and secretary.

4. The rules of decorum shall be read immediately after the Association is formed.

5. That Association will encourage a sound ministry, such as present Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel, which is freely offered to all.

6. Any minister in good standing, whether a delegate or not, may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberation, and his name enrolled in our minutes.

7. The Association may appoint such committees as may be necessary for the expediting of business, and every committee appointed to attend to any particular business shall report their proceedings in writing to the Association while in session, and all reports made by committee may be adopted by the body. 8. All queries regularly presented to the Association by any church shall be attended to.

9. Any church may become a member of this Association by making application by letter or by delegates and adopting our articles of faith and church covenant.

10. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegate.

11. The Association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

RULES OF DECORUM

Article 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.

2. There shall be no conversation by the members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.

3. Every member wishing to speak shall first arise and address the Moderator.

4. No member shall interrupt another while speaking.

5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother.

6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

7. No member shall speak more than twice on any subject.

8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.

10. On all motions made where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.

11. The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair be filled.

12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.

13. No less than nine members constitute a quorum.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. GOD—We believe that there is only one, true and living God, who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every divine perfection. There is one God and one Mediator between God and man, the Man Christ Jesus, who gave Himself as ransom for all to be testified in due time.—I Tim. 2:5.

2. THE HOLY SCRIPTURE—We believe that God is author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infallible doctrine for the government of His church. All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, instruction in righteousness.

3. THE ORIGINAL APOSTACY—We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into the depravity and consequently involved his posterity in sin. And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof and did eat, and gave unto her husband with her he did eat.—Gen. 3.6.

4. FREE GRACE—We believe the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings, that the Gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Holy Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. For there is no difference between the Jews and the Greeks, for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon Him.-Rom. 10:12.

5. CHRISTIAN FAITH—We believe that Christian faith is the belief in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and Redeemer of the world and in the divinity of the Holy Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing the Word of God. He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.—John 3:36.

6. REPENTANCE—We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin, and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin. Now I rejoice, not that ye were made sorry, but that ye sorrowed to repentance, that ye might receive damage by us in nothing. For Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of but the sorrow of the world worketh death.—II Cor. 7:9-10.

7. FREE AGENCY—We believe that the human will is free, and that men have the ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scripture. He hath showed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee but to do justly and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God.—Mich. 6:8.

8. PRESEVERENCE—We do not believe under Gospel dispensation any soul is elected to eternal life unconditionally, but that those who by faith persevere to the end will be saved; that it is possible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of their faith, turn again to sin and be finally lost. And Jesus said unto him, "No man having put his hand to the plow and looketh back is fit for the Kingdom of God."—Luke 9-62.


9. GOOD WORKS—We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity; that those who have faith will do works of righteousness, while those who have not faith, cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable unto God. Every tree that bringeth not forth fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them!— Matt. 7:19-20.

10. CHRISTIAN BAPTISM—We believe that Christian Baptism is the immersion of a believer in water, in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, that Baptism cannot be scriptually administered without faith in the subject who receives it. Therefore we are buried with Him by Baptism into death; that like Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we should also walk in newness of life. —Rom. 6:4.

11. THE LORD'S SUPPER—We believe that Supper was instituted by our Saviour as a commemorate ordinance, that it was instituted for Christians, and that all Christians should unite in sacred services regardless of name or denomination. But let a man examine himself and so let him eat of that bread and drink of that cup, "For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation unto himself. not discerning the Lord's body."—I Cor. 1:28-29.

12. FEET WASHING—We believe that washing the saints' feet a command of our Saviour, and that his followers ought to practice the same. We urge the pastors of all our churches to encourage the practical obedience of this command especially among the members of their churches. "If I then your Lord and Master have washed your feet, ye also ought to wash one another's feet."—St. John 13:14.

13. THE GOSPEL—We believe it to be the duty of all churches to support the Gospel. Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel.—I Cor. 9:14.
