



MINUTES

The fifty-first annual session of the French Broad Association of the Free Will Baptist Church, convened Thursday, August 22, 1929, at 10 o'clock a.m., with the Elkins Chapel Church, Jupiter, N. C. Committee reports called for and the following responded:

Temperance, Education, Obituary, Periodicals, Sunday School, Deeper Devotion, Home Missions, Foreign Missions, Marriage and Divorce, L. A. Work. The Temperance report was discussed by Rev. J. W. Alford; the Sunday School

report by D. L. Ballard; the report on Marriage and Divorce by Rev. C. Y. Elkins; and the report on L. A. Work by Mrs. Nancy Chunn. The other reports were adopted without discussion.

On motion of Rev. L. E. Ballard the Association recognized by a standing vote of respect Brother James Rice, the only charter member of the Association now with us, after which business was suspended until 2:00 p.m.

Reassembled at 2:00 p.m. Scripture lesson read by Rev. G. E. Quinton. Prayer by Rev. J. R. Owens, pastor Baptist Church.

On motion Rev. Owens and Clark were recognized as a fraternal delegation from the French Broad Baptist Association.

Offering taken for Elkins Chapel amounting to \$8.84.

Committees on Young Peoples' Work, Time and Place, and Ministerial Support received. The report on Young Peoples' Work was discussed by Chas. Chunn and J. S. Fortner.

On motion the word "baptism" was ordered struck from the report on Deeper Devotion and the word "filling" inserted. On motion of Rev. C. Y. Elkins the idea of building an orphans' home in this

Association was dismissed as impractical at this time, and support was pledged to the Middlesex home, after which Rev. J. W. Alford was given the floor and made an earnest appeal for better support for our orphanage work.

Adjourned until 9:30 Saturday morning.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 24TH

Opened at 9:30. Scripture lesson read by Rev. C. Y. Elkins. Remarks by Rev. B. E. Guthrie.

Rev. Mallie Rice, financial agent for the orphanage, reported collections amounting to \$178.82, all of which has been sent to the orphanage except \$68.31.

On motion L. E. Ballard, C. Y. Elkins, and A. P. Rich were appointed a special committee to reorganize the Asheville District Union Meeting and the Asheville District Sunday School Convention according to the plans originally adopted.

On motion the church and community of Jupiter were given a rising vote of thanks for the way in which the Association has been cared for.

Reports of the treasurer of the Old Ministers' Aid Board and the Historian received. Letter from Dry Branch Church read. Verbal reports made concerning the churches at Anderson Branch and Reynolds Hill. Financial report received.

On motion Letus A. Hyatt we elected as delegate to the State Convention. On motion all members of the Old Ministers' Aid Board retained for another year. On motion the Association thanks Rev. R. V. Self for his able services as Moderator. Collection amounting to \$7.14 taken for Elkins Chapel Church.

Minutes read and approved. On motion Association adjourned to meet again with Red Hill Church on Thursday before the 4th Sunday in August, 1930.

Ministerial Support-We recommend that the members of each church set aside and give one-tenth of their earnings for the support of the ministers and the work of the

Lord. We recommend that each church set aside a given amount for pastor's salary before calling pastor, and mention the amount of salary in letter calling pastor. This is the church telling the pastor how much they will pay him; not the pastor telling the church how much he will charge. Old Ministers' Aid—Received \$358.68. Paid out on note, \$100.00. Foreign Missions—We recommend that each church take up an offering twice each year for foreign missions, and forward to the treasurer, Mrs. Terrie Wilson, R. 3, West Asheville, N. C.

Periodicals—This committee respectfully calls attention to the report adopted last year, to-wit: We recommend first of all the Bible, and urge our people not only to read it, but to also live by the Bible. We also recommend that we read and support only first class and clean literature. We urge our people to use Free Will Baptist Sunday School literature, published at Ayden, N. C. We highly recommend our church paper to every home.

Ladies' Aid Work—We think the Ladies' Aid should be an organization of devoted Christians. That each member should sacrifice their work at home and attend the meetings. We believe that this is a great work in helping the cause of God, and that this work is really a help in bringing sinners to God.

Temperance—The Committee on Temperance recommends that this Association go on record as opposed to the traffic in and use of strong drink, and urges each church to rigidly enforce the discipline against offenders who will not heed proper admonition. We feel that the evil of intemperance in the many forms prevailing today has gone to such extremes that we are fully justified in taking the most positive stand possible against them.

Home Missions—We believe it the duty of every Christian to visit the sick, pray with the lost, and contribute to the poor, especially to those of the household of faith.

Marriage and Divorce—We protest against parents giving permits for marriage license being issued to children under lawful age. 2nd. We protest against marriages of persons who are mentally and physically unfit to care for a family. 3rd. There is only one Biblical cause for a divorce. We advise our ministers not to officiate at the marriage of any divorced persons, unless they are fully satisfied that the persons to be married were justified in their separation.

Sunday School—Realizing that youth is the time when the most lasting impressions are made on the mind, we would suggest that our ministers and Sabbath School workers urge parents to accompany their children to Sunday School when possible. We suggest to our Sabbath School Superintendents and teachers the need of being in their places at the appointed hour and the need of being filled with the Spirit, and recommend that each teacher call the roll each Sunday. We urge the need of good clean Sabbath School papers for every school. We also urge punctuality teachers and officers. Education—We recommend: (1) That our pastors keep before our people the ideal

Education—We recommend: (1) That our pastors keep before our people the ideal of Christian Education, urging upon all the importance of study of the Word of God, and upon parents the importance of sending their children to schools and colleges where truth is taught rather than error. (2) That we endorse the idea of a better educated ministry and urge churches having among their membership young men who are called to the ministry to aid such persons with means to go to school or taken correspondence courses in order to better equip themselves for service. (3) We urge upon all our people the duty of giving their loyal support to our own educational movements.

Young People's Work—We recommend: (1) That all the leagues in this Association meet at New Bridge Church on Sunday afternoon, September 8th, for the purpose of reorganizing the Young People's Convention. (2) That our leagues emphasize the spiritual purpose of the work above everything else, and especially that young converts be helped and encouraged. (3) That our leagues use the literature published by our own press and also that leaguers wear the F. W. B. L. pin.

Deeper Devotion—Spirituality is the life and power of the religion of Jesus Christ. The vocation of religion is devotion to God. Devotion means to adore, love and obey, yielding in humble submission to the will of God. It is explained as entire consecration. Regeneration comes as a result of repentance and faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. Sanctification or a filling of the Holy Ghost comes as a result of entire consecration. Bringing ourselves into active service, the altar sanctifies the gift.
