

CONSTITUTION. MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

1. This body shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the French Broad Free Will Baptist Association.

2. This Conference is formed under and by the authority of the French Broad Association and shall be composed of licensed and ordained ministers.

3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said Association, issuing license, prescribing qualifications for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, working for the most harmonious and eff ct ve ministry.

4. The officers of this Conference shall be a Moderator and Socretary-Treasurer, who shall be elected annually and perform the duties usually performed by such officers.

5. This Conference shall have power to make such By-laws and other

regulations as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.

6. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by a vote of two-thirds.

BY-LAWS MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

1. The regular meeting of this Conference shall be held annually in conncc ion with the meeting of the Association.

2. Each member shall report regular meeting either in person or by

letter.

- 5. At each regular meeting there shall be elected an Ordaining Council, -hose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant licenses, conduct ordinations, etc., and report at each regular meeting.

7. Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contributions or by assessment of its members.

tation for usefulness, but watch over each other and thus promote harmony and love among the membership.

- 10. Each member, not excused from age or infirmities, is expected to do something to advance the cause of Christ and make a full report at each regular meeting.
 - 11. Membership in the body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry.
- 12. These By-Laws may be amended by a vote of two thirds at any regular meet ng.

- 7. The Association may appoint such committees as may be necessary for the expediting of business and every committee appointed to attend to any particular business shall report their proceedings in writing to the Association while in session and all reports made by the committees may be

adopted by the body.

8. Any church can become a member of the Association by making application by letter or by delegates and adopting our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.

9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes dis-

orderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegate.

10. The Association assumes no higher authority than council.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

- 2. There shall be no conversation by the members, one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
 - 3. Every member speaking shall first rise and address the moderator.

4. No m mber shall interrupt a member while speaking.

- 5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of 'Brother'.
- 6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under considera-

7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.

8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the

moderator.

10. On all motions made where the vote of the body is taken a majority shall prevail.

11. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other

member, provided the chair is filled.

- 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the moderator.
 - 13. Not less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. GOD:—We believe that there is only one true and I ving God who is personally the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, equal and harmonious in every div.ne perfection. There is one God and one mediator between God and man, the man Christ Jesus who gave himself a ransom for all to be testified in due time.-1st Tim. 2:5.

2. THE HOLY SCRIPTURE: -- We believe that God is the author of the Holy Bible, and its teachings constitute the only infalliable doctrine for the government of His church. All scripture is given by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and instruction in

righteousnass.

3. ORIGINAL APOSTACY:—We believe that Adam was created holy but by voluntary transgression fell into depravity and consequently involved his rosterity in sin. "And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food and that it was pleasant to the eyes and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took the fruit thereof and did eat and gave to her husband with her and he didreat."-Gen. 3:6.

4. FREE GRACE:--We believe the grace of God comprehends all spiritual blessings, that the gospel is the power of God unto salvation, that the Hely Spirit not only reproves the world of sin but is the means whereby sinners are converted and made wise unto salvation. "For there is no differ-

ence between Jews and Greeks for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him."—Rom. 10:12.

5. CHRISTIAN FAITH:—We believe that Christian faith is the bel'ef in the I ord Jesus Christ as the Son of God and redeemer of the world and in the d'vinity of the Holv Scripture, that faith comes by hearing and hearing by the world of God. "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life and he that believeth not on the Son shall not see life but the wrath of

God abideth on him."-John 3:36.

6. KEPENTANCE:—We believe that repentance is sorrow for sin and the kind of sorrow which produces Godly repentance must be preceded by effectual conviction of sin: "Now I rejo.ce, not that ye were made scriy, but that ye sorrowed to repentance; for ye were made sorry after a gody manner that ye might receive damage by us in nothing, for Godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation, not to be repented or but the sorrow of the world worketh d ath."—2nd Cor. 7:9-10.

7. FREE AGENCY:—We believe that the human will is free and that men have ability to accept or reject the conditions of salvation as they are revealed in the Holy Scriptures. "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy,

and to walk humbly with thy God?"—Micah 6:8.

8. PERSEVERANCE:—We do not believe, under Gospel d'spensation, any soul is elect d to eternal life unconditionally but that those who by faith persevore to the end w! be saved, that it is rossible for men who have been converted to make shipwreck of their faith and turn again to sin and finally be lost. "And Jesus said unto him: "No man having put his hand to the plow and locking back is fit for the Kingdom of God."—Luke 9:62.

9. GOOD WCRKS:—We believe that good works are the results of faith and not necessity, that those who have faith will do works of righteourness while those who have not faith cannot do anything pleasing or acceptable to God. "Every tree that bringeth not forth fruit is hewn down and cast into the fire, wherefore by their fruit ye shall know them."—Matt.

7:19-20.

10. CHRISTIAN BAPTICM:—We believe that Christian bartism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son and Hoty Ghost; that baptism cannot be scripturally administered without faith in the subject who receives it. "Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death that like Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father even so we should walk in the newness of life."—Rom. 6:4.

11. THE LORD'S SUPPER:—We believe the supper was instituted by our tay or as a commonative ordinance, that it was instituted for Christians and that all Christians should unite in sacred serv ces regardless of name or denomination. "But let a man examine hims If and so let h m eat of that bread and drink of that cup for he that eateth and drinketh unworthily catch and drinketh damnation unto himself not discerning the

Lcrd's body."—1 Cor. 11:28-29.

12. FFET WASHING:—We believe that washing the saint's feet was a command of our Savior and that H's followers ought to practice the sam. We urge the pastors of all our churches to encourage the practical obedince of this command, especially among the members of our churches. "If I then your I ord and Master have washed your feet ye also ought to wash one another's fe t."—St. John 13:14.

13. THE GOSPEL:—We believe it to be the du'y of all churches to support the gospel. "Even so hath the Lord ordained that they which preach is

Gospel should live by the Gospel."—1 Cor. 9:14.
