





 REPORT ON EDUCATION: We, your committee on education, feel
 deeply the need of a real Christian influence in our schools. If we, as a
 people, embrace all that is to be found in our present educational system,

we must embrace much that is contrary to the word of God. For in our schools, as in our churches, many deccivers have crept in, who have no love for the truth. It is our indispensable christian duty to observe closely the effect that education has upon our youth, and when we find it a good in-fluence, strengthen it with every available means; when the effect is evil, flight it with every available means. We recommend that every christian parent visit the schools as often

as possible to observe how we may improve our influence upon the schools. If our young people grow up with no knowledge of the reality of God, and if they accept the fashion of scepticism toward all that is spiritual and really good, we shall be largely to blame because we have failed in our duty to instruct them in the ways of truth.

We recommend also that the ministers consider themselves a special committe to investigate our educational system; that each minister visit often those schools closest to him that we may gain a greater influence over the students and that we may know better how to support the truth when it is taught and to combat the evil that may be found.

We further recommend that parents instruct their children prayer-fully at home, and that we all, as instruments of God, "study to show ourselves approved unto Him, rightly dividing the word of truth."

B. E. GUTHRIE CONSTITUTION. MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

1. This body shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the French

Broad Free Will Baptist Association. 2. This Conference is formed under and by the authority of the French Broad As ociation and shall be composed of licensed and ordained ministers.

3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said Association, issuing license, prescribing qualifications for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, working for the most harmonious and effective ministry.

4. The officers of this Conference shall be a Moderator and Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be elected annually and perform the duties usually performed by such officers.

5. This Conference shall have power to make such By-laws and other regulations as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.

6. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by a vote of two-thirds.

BY-LAWS MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

1. The regular meeting of this Conference shall be held ; annually in connection with the meeting of the Association.

2. Each member shall report regular meeting either in person or by letter

3. Five members shall constitute a quorum at all regular or legal meetings. 4. The Moderator may call a special session at any time on request of three members.

5. At each regular meeting there shall be elected an Ordaining Council, whose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant licenses, conduct ordinations, etc., and report at each regular meeting.

6. Licentiates shall pursue a definite course of study under the direc-tion of the Ordaining Council. 7. Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contributions or by assessment of its members.

8. No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for their pastor and contribute to other benevolent enterprises, according to their ability.

9. No member shall meddle with the work of another or injure his reputation for usefulness, but watch over each other and thus promote harmony

and love among the membership. 10. Each member, not excused from age or infirmities, is expected to do something to advance the cause of Christ and make a full report at each regular meeting.

11. Membership in the body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry. 12. These By-Laws may be amended by a vote of two thirds at any regular meeting.

CHURCH COVENANT

1. Having given ourselves to the Lord, through Jesus Christ, we agree to accept the Free Will Baptist articles of faith, we give ourselves to each other by the help of God. 2. Also we agree to be liberal with those who are afflicted and needy, and especially those of the house-hold of faith. 5. We also agree to attend the monthly meetings regularly, if not Providentially hindered, and to submit to all ordinances implied in a profession of faith. 6. We also agree to abstain from all sinful and va'n amusements. 7. We also agree to abstain from all intoxicating liquors, nct to use it as a keverage, nor aid or assist in the manufacture of such, nor furn sh it to others. 8. Any church can become a member of the Association by making application by letter or by delegates and adopting our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.

9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by 1 tter or delegate. 10. The Association arsumes no higher authority than an advisory

council.

RULES OF DECORUM

1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. There shall be no conversation by the members, one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.

3. Every member speaking shall first rise and address the moderator.

4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.

•

5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of 'Brother'.

6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.

8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the moderator.

10. On all motions made where the vote of the body is) taken a majority shall prevail.

11. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the moderator.

13. Not less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.
