Motion made and passed to write letter to Free Will Baptist Press that the French Broad Association will not use their literature as long as they advertise any Bible other than the King James Version, Committee of Rev. Raymond Shell, Rev. R. C. Stockton, and Arnold Bullman.

Rev. G. Y. Burgin resigned from investigating committee. Rev. R. C. Stockton was named to take his place.

A motion was made and passed to change the articles in the Minutes back to the original ones.

The date of the Association was changed to Thursday before the third Sunday in August.

Motion was made and passed for all churches in the Association to have the same discipline as the 1812 edition.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

ARRANGEMENTS: A standing committee, Pastor and delegates.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK: We, your committee of the Young People's work, suggest that our young people "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth . . ." (Ecclesiastes 12:1). May our young people of today strive more than ever to be a Christian example to their friends and classmates. We urge them to read their Bibles daily and to say a word for Christ whenever they might cause some lost soul to be saved. We also urge you to prayerfully read the third chapter of Colossians. Miss Louise Hensley, Mrs. Howard Payne.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS: We urge that more emphasis be placed on Sunday School attendance that we as Christian leaders gather them up and bring them in, visit the absentees, encourage and nourish them, cooperate with them in clean entertainment and the things they are interested in, and pray without ceasing, trusting the Lord for guidance. Paul Ballard, Rev. Alford Taylor.

HOME AND FOREIGN MISSIONS: We, the committee on the Home and Foreign Missions, recommend that the preachers, Sunday School teachers, and workers study Matthew 28:19-20 and teach as Jesus commanded: "Go preach and teach." We further recommend that sacrificial offerings be taken regularly for Foreign and Home Missions and for the aid of young people whom God calls for the mission fields and who are laboring for the necessary education. We also recommend that each church organize a group to visit each home in the vicinity and report back to the church their findings, and work for the fulfillment. Bert Roberts, Paul Ballard.

PASTOR'S SUPPORT: We, the committee on Pastor's Support, wish to urge our churches to support their pastors, financially and in every way they can. Jesus compared the ones he ordained and sent to preach His Gospel as workers or laborers. He said the laborer is worthy of his hire. The apostle Paul said they that preach the gospel shall live of the gospel. Also know them that labor among you and esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. Also Paul told the Corinthian church that he had robbed other churches, taking wages of them, to preach the gospel free to the Corinthians. Our Pastors are working for the church to its pastor. Let us not keep back the wages of God's ministers, his workers. May we help them as God has prospered us. God loves a cheerful giver. Mr. J. A. Crow and Lyda Brown.

EDUCATION: We, the committee on Education, present these facts: Ephesians 4:12:15, "For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:—That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind and doctrine by the sleigh of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive. But speaking the truth, in love, may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ." II Tim. 2:15. Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." We want to encourage everyone to do his best for this needful part in every individual. We recommend that we support the enterprises of our denomination and prepare our young people to be a useful people to God. We encourage every church to teach the doctrine of our discipline in order that every officer would know how to carry out his duties. Further, let every minister be acquainted with the parliamentary law which is in our discipline.

We furthermore recommend that our preachers study and preach the word. A church is no more advanced than their pastor. We recommend our pastors to advance Christian education in their churches, such as Bible Schools, Young People's league, and Woman's Auxiliary. Rev. Roy Waldrop, Ed Davis.

LORD'S DAY OBSERVANCE: We, your committee on Lord's Day Observance, agree: First, that we go on record as being opposed to all kinds of public sports and worldly amusements such as baseball, golf, dancing and anything of the world. Second, that we urge all our people to strictly abstain from taking part in them. We are opposed to operating such as parks, theaters, and other on the Sabbath. Third, we believe the Lord's Day to be a day of rest and for spiritual worship "And have no fellowship with unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them." Ephesians 5:11. Rev. Walter Wilson, Rev. George Plemmons.

MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE: We protest against parents giving permits for children under lawful age. We also protest against marriages of persons who are unfit to care for a family. There is only one Biblical cause for divorce. We will not allow our ministers to officiate at the marriage of any divorced person unless they are satisfied that the ones to be married are justified in their separation. We will not ordain or license ministers who have two living wives. A standing committee, written by Rev. Henry Ballard, deceased.

Amendment: We, your committee, recommend that the old Ministers' Board of the French Broad Free Will Baptist Association, be governed by the following:

1. That at the age of sixty-five (65) our ministers, if unable to support our insurance, at their own request, be relieved of this obligation.

2. That we continue to work with the state board regarding our eligible ministers who are in need of a state pension.

3. That our local ministers co-operate with our local board in every way possible. Rev. Warren Reece, Rev. W. O. Adcock, Rev. G. Y. Burgin, Committee.

DEEPER DEVOTIONS: Spirituality is the life and power of the religion of Jesus Christ. The vocation of religion is devoted to God. Devotion is shown by consecration to God. Therefore we urge our preachers to deeper spirituality. The Holy Spirit, in His office work, does a complete work. If we are submissive, we must be annointed by the Holy One. So to undertake to preach without this power is to be disobedient and our preaching will prove fatal and disastrous (Luke 24:49). We believe it would be better to remain silent, although the congregation should be disappointed, than to undertake to preach when the Holy Spirit does not speak in us. We know that this Holy Spirit teaches a full gospel, holy life and salvation from sin. He testifies of Christ and brings his teachings to our remembrance, and guides us into all truth. A standing committee, written by W. W. Ballard, deceased.

OBITUARIES: We, your committee, recommend that we continue to put in our minutes the obituaries of our members who pass away keeping in mind I Thes. 4:13. "But I would not have you ignorant, brethren, concerning these which are asleep that we sorrow not, even as others which have no hope." We would like to suggest that we write one Obituary for all, then list individual names from every church (these to be handed to the clerk with the church letters—Under the heading "In Memory of Our Beloved Dead.") Cora Ramsey, Blanch Framer.

RESOLUTIONS: Be it resolved, that we study additional ways and means by which the rank and file of our churches may be aroused to action in increasing their support to all phases of the work, and particularly home and foreign missions. If we had worked as hard as the communists to carry out our mission of sharing Christ as they have carried out their mission, so many doors would not be closed to missionaries today. A standing committee, Rev. Charlie Hollifield, Rev. Lonnie Crawford.

TEMPERANCE: We, your committee on temperance, believe it to be unchristian to be intemperate in any form. We believe it sinful to use intoxicating beverages. Proverbs 20:1, "Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging, and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise." We believe as Paul taught in 1 Corinthians 6:12, "All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient; all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." II Peter 5:6. "And besides this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, and to virtue knowledge, and to knowledge temperance, and to temperance patient godliness." Rev. Charlie Hollifield, Andrew Chandler.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME: We, your committee on Children's Home Support, urge each church to set aside one Sunday each month for an offering for the support of our Children's Home; and that all funds for the regular support of the home to be sent monthly to the superintendent, Rev. G. W. Everton, Middlesex, N. C. The special drives during May and November should be given special prayerful attention by all pastors and churches. We strongly recommend that all churches resume the canning program and the giving of any other produce and commodities that can be used by the home. A committee should be appointed in the different localities to encourage the people to give and to gather it together for easy pick up. We further recommend that all churches set a definite goal and work toward raising the necessary funds for the office building known as the French Broad Building. All money for this fund to be sent to Rev. W. L. Moretz, treasurer, Box 548, Swannanoa, N. C. Rev. Alford Taylor, Dock Lunsford.

PERIODICALS: We, your committee, realize that parents can't take too much care on the literature our youth read, because literature contributes greatly to the

shaping of character. First and foremost we should recommend daily Bible reading of the King James Version. Be careful that our youth don't get hold of literature of false doctrines as some literature has enough of the scripture to cause us to take it for the real Bible. The Bible tells us, "To study to shew thyself approved unto God a workman that needed not to be ashamed rightly dividing the word of truth." II Timothy 2:15. No better book can be found than the Bible that will teach us the way to live and the way to teach our youth to live. If we live by the word we will be ready to die by the word. Rev. WOMAN'S AUXILIARY: We, your committee believe each church should or-ganize and uphold the Woman's Auxiliary, keeping in mind I Corinthians 3:9, "For we are laborers together with God" to encourage Mission work at home and abroad. Mrs. Wayne Rayburn, Mrs. Zennie Parris.

#### RESOLUTIONS

Be it resolved that this association be empowered to have jurisdiction over all churches in this body, and shall have the power to settle disputes that may come before it. Any church that may have a dispute that cannot be settled peaceably in said church, the dissatisfied party shall have a right to appeal to the association, and abide by the decision of the same.

#### Constitution, Ministers' Conference

1. This body shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the French Broad Free Will Baptist Association.

2. This conference is formed under and by the authority of the French Broad Association and shall be composed of licensed and ordained ministers.

3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said association, issuing licenses, prescribing qualifications for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, working for the most harmonious and effective ministry. Any person having the call of God to preach His Word, shall be liberated by his church for one year before presenting himself to the ordaining council to be licensed. Each licensed minister shall be elected as pastor of a duly organized church of the regular Free Will Baptists, in this or some other association or conference, he may apply for ordination after having been licensed one year.

4. The officers of this conference shall be a moderator and secretary-treasurer, who shall be elected annually and perform the duties usually performed by such officers.

5. This conference shall have the power to make such by-laws and other regulations as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.

6. This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a vote of four-fifths.

#### **Rules of Decorum**

1. The association shall be opened and closed by prayer.

2. There shall be no conversation by the members, one with another so as to interrupt business, while in session.

3. Every member speaking shall first rise and address the moderator.

4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.

5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of "Brother."

6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.

7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.

8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the person who made it.

9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the moderator.

10. On all motions made where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.

11. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the moderator.

13. Not less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.

#### Constitution

1. The association shall be composed of delegates chosen and sent from each church.

2. The delegates chosen and sent shall be recommended by letter from the church to which they belong and shall include the minister and some of the most able members belonging to the church. 3. The association when met and formed shall elect a moderator, assistant moderator and clerk.

4. The rules of decorum shall be read immediately after the association is formed.

5. This association will encourage a sound ministry, such as present Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.

6. Any minister in good standing, whether a delegate or not, may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations and his name be enrolled in our minutes.

7. The association may appoint such committees as may be necessary for the expediting of business and every committee appointed to attend to any particular business shall report their proceedings in writing to the association while in session and all reports made by the committees may be adopted by the body.

8. Any church can become a member of the association by making application by letter or by delegates and adopting our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.

9. The association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

10. The association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

#### Articles of Faith

1. We believe that there is but one living, true and eternal God, the Father, of whom are all things from everlasting to everlasting, glorious and immutable in all His attributes. I Cor. 8:6; Isa. 40:28.

2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, the only begotten Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, whom God freely sent into this world, because of the great love wherewith he loved the world; and Christ as freely gave himself a ransom for all, tasting death for every man; who was buried and rose again the third day, and ascended into heaven, from whence we look for Him the second time in the clouds of heaven at the last day to judge both the quick and the dead. I Tim. 2:5-6; I John 2:2. Heb. 2:9, St. John 3:16; Rev. 1:7; Acts 24:15.

3. We believe that there is one Holy Ghost, the precious gift of the Father through His dear Son, unto the world, who quickeneth and draweth sinners home to God. St. John 16:7,8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 2:1, Eph. 4:4-6.

4. We believe that in the beginning God made man upright, and placed him in a State of glory without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntarily, by trangression, fell, and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

5. We believe that God is not willing that any should perish; but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of the truth, that they might be saved; for which end Christ hath commanded the Gospel to be preached among all nations and to every creature. Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; John 3:15-17; I Tim. 2:4.

6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of a Christ who died for him, but as the Scripture has said, for denying the Lord that bought them; because they believe not in the name of the only begotten Son of God. Unbelief, therefore, being the cause why the just and righteous God of heaven will condemn the children of men; it follows against all contradiction that all men, at one time or other, are found in such a capacity as that through the grace of God they may be eternally saved. Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Heb. 3:10; I John 5:10.

7. We believe the whole Scriptures are infallibly true, and that they are the only rules of faith and practice. II Tim. 3:16-17.

8. We believe in the doctrine of General Provision made of God in Christ, for the benefit of all mankind, who repent and believe the Gospel. Luke 14:16-20; Matt. 28:19-20; Luke 13:3-5; Luke 24:47; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:15.

9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ His Son, and that the Holy Ghost offers his divine aid to all the human family, so as they all might be happy, would they give place to His divine teaching; whereas, such who do not receive the divine impressions of His Holy Spirit, shall at a further day, own their condemnation just, and charge themselves with their own damnation, for wilfully rejecting the offers of sovereign grace. Matt. 11:27; St. John 6:44; Ps. 1:1, Tit. 2:11-12; Jer. 22:29.

10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation; considered such who turn the grace of God into lasciviousness denying the only Lord God, and our Lord Jesus Christ who brought them, and therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction; but we observe that they, and such the Apostle saith because they receive not the love of the truth, that they might be saved; therefore the indignation and wrath of God is upon every soul of man that doeth evil, living and dying therein; for there is no respect of persons with God. Jude 1:4; II Peter 2:1; II Thes. 2:11-12; Rom. 2:9-11.

1. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own persons are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam, and not that any one of them dying in that state, shall suffer punishment in hell by the guilt of Adam's sin, for of such is the kingdom of God. I Cor. 15:22; Matt. 18:2-5; Mark 9:36-37; Matt. 19:14.

12. We believe that good works are the fruits of a saving faith, and that in the use of the means of grace, and not out of the use of those means, eternal life is promised to men. Rev. 22:14, 15; Isa. 1:19, 20; Matt. 7:8, Jer. 6:16; Luke 13:34, 35.

13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the Holy Scriptures for justification before God through his own works, power or ability which he has in and of himself, only as he by grace is made able to come to God, through Jesus Christ believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God. Rom. 4:24; Acts 8:20, 21.

14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God, so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions; yet not as having decreed any person to everlasting death or everlasting life, out of respect or mere choice, farther than He Hath appointed the godly unto life and the ungodly, who die in sin unto death. Heb. 4:13; Prov. 8:22-31; Matt. 25:31-46.

15. We believe, as touching Gospel ordinances, in believers' baptism, laying on of the hands, receiving of the sacrament in bread and wine, washing the saint's feet, anointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, praying, singing praise to God and the public ministry of the Word, with every institution of the Lord we shall find in the New Testament. Mark 16:15-16; Acts 8:17; Acts 19:6; Luke 22:19-20; John 13:5-17; Jas. 5:14.

16. We believe the Gospel mode of baptism is by immersion, and that believers are the only subjects for baptism. Matt. 3:16; Mark 1:9, 10; Acts 2:28, 39; Rom. 6:4; Col. 2:12.

17. We believe in a general resurrection of the dead and a final judgment at the last day. John 5:28, 29; II Cor. 5:10.

18. We believe the happiness of the righteous is eternal and the torments of the wicked are endless. Matt. 25:46.

#### Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to the Lord, through Jesus Christ, we agree to accept the Free Will Baptist articles of faith; we give ourselves to each other by the help of God. 2. We solemnly covenant before God that we will carefully observe, rebuke and admonish those having gone astray and watch over each other's reputation, use our influence to the upbuilding of the church, commands implied in a profession of faith, and in the spirit of kindness and for the advancement of the cause of Christ, endeavoring to seek the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peace, and to confess our faults to one another, and to strengthen those who are weak. 3. We promise by the help of God, that we will faithfully practice family and secret prayer and strive to cultivate the doctrine of God's revealed Word in the minds of those under our care. 4. We also agree to use our influence for the support of the gospel and contribute liberally to aid the ministry according to our several abilities. Also we agree to be liberal with those who are afflicted and needy, and especially to those of the household 5. We also agree to attend the monthly meetings regularly if not providentof faith. ially hindered, and to submit to all ordinances applied in a profession of faith. 6. We also agree to abstain from all sinful and vain amusements. 7. We also agree to abstain from all intoxicating liquors, not to use it as a beverage, nor aid or assist in the manufacture of such, nor to furnish it to others. We also agree to encourage

home and foreign missions, education, Sabbath schools, good morals and everything that is for the glory of God, and to the welfare of men, and may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, that we may be happily admitted into the Kingdom of God, where we can ascribe honor unto the Lamb forever. Amen.

#### **By-Laws, Ministers' Conference**

1. The regular meeting of this conference shall be held annually the day after the meeting of the association.

2. Each member shall report at the annual meeting, either in person or by written report. \$1.00 shall accompany each minister's report to merit necessary expenses of this organization.

3. Five members shall constitute a quorum at all regular or legal meetings.

4. The moderator may call a special session at any time on request of three members.

5. At each meeting there shall be elected an ordaining council whose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant licenses, conduct ordinations, etc., and report at each regular meeting.

6. No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for their pastor and contribute to other benevolent enterprises according to their ability.

7. No member shall meddle with the work of another or injure his reputation for usefulness, but watch over each other and thus promote harmony and love among the membership.

8. Each member, not excused from age or infirmities, is expected to do something to advance the cause of Christ and make a full report at each regular meeting.

9. Membership in this body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry. 10. These by-laws may be amended by a vote of four-fifths majority at any an-

11. A minister will not be licensed or ordained in this conference if he owns a television.
