

DEEPER DEVOTIONS: Spirituality is the life and power of the religion of Jesus Christ. The vocation of religion is devoted to God. Devotion is shown by the consecretion to God. 






On October 17, 1975, Rev. Vernon E. Ratcliff quietl finished the course set before him in this life and moved to his Heavenly home. An ordained minister since August 11, 1956, he had pastored at Marshall Free Will Baptist Church and was pastor at Mountain View Free Will Baptist Church at the time of his death.

Throughout his ministry, Vernon Ratcliff stood firm on the foundations of God's word, proclaiming the saving power of God to the world. To those who came in contact with him, his spirit was an everpresent witness of his strong love and faith in the Lord. This was especially true during his long and painful illness, from which his Lord finally called him to eternal rest. FRENCH BROAD F.W.B. ASSOCIATION

CONSTITUTION.

- 1. The association shall be composed of delegates chosen and sent from each church.
- 2. The delegates chosen and sent shall be recommended by letter from the church to which they belong and shall include the minister and some of the most able members belonging to the church.
- 3. The association when met and formed shall elect a moderators, assistant moderator and clerk.
 - 4. The rules of decorum shall be read immediately after the association is formed.
- 5. This association will encourage a sound ministry, such as present Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the tearms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.
- 6. Any minister in good standing, whether a delegate or not, may be invited to a seat and take part in the delibartions and his name be enrolled in our minutes.
- 7. The association may appoint such commmittees as may be necessary for the expediting or business and every commmittee appointed to attend to any particular business shall report their proceedings in writing to the association while in session and all reports made by the committee may be adopted by the body.
- 8. Any church can become a member of the association by making application by letter or by delegates and adopting our Articles of Faith and Church Convenant
- 9. The association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegates.

The association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

10; The Association may withdraw from any church having a pastor either elected or acting of a different denomination.

Ministers of the Free-Will Baptist denomination; but of another association may pasto our churches

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe that there is but one living, true and eternal God, the Father of whom are all things from everlasting to everlasting, glorious and immutable in all His attributes. 1 Cor. 8:6; Isa. 40:28.
- 2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, the only begotten Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, whome God freely sent into this world, because of the great love wherewith He loved the world; and Christ as freely gave himself a ransom for all, tasting death for every man; who was buried and rose igain the third day, and ascended into heaven, from whence we look for Him the second time in the clouds of heaven at the last day to judge both the quick and the dead. I Tim. 2:5-6: Jhn 2:2; Neb. 2:9; St. John 3:16; Rev. 1:7; Acts 24:15.
- 3. We believe that there is one Holy Ghost, the precious gift of the Father through His dear Son, unto the wor'd, who quickeneth and draweth sinners home to God. St. John 16:7, 8; Acts 2:4; Eph. 2:1; Eph. 4:4, 6.
- 4. We believe that in the beginning God made man upright, and placed him ina State of glory without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntarily, by transgression, fell, and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. Gen. 2:17; 3:19.

FRENCH BROAD F.W.B. ASSOCIATION

- 5. We believe that God is not willing that any should perish; but that all should come to repentance and the knowledge of the truth, that they might be saved; for which end Christ hath commanded the Gospel to be preached among all nations and to every creature. Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; John 3:15-17; I Tim. 2:4.
- 6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of a Christ who died for him, but as the Scripture has said, for denying the Lord that bought them; because they believe not in the name of the only begotten Son of God. Unbelief, therefore, being the cause why the just and righteous God of heaven will condemn the children of men; it follows against all contradiction that all men, at one time or other, are found in such a capacity as that through the grace of God they may be eternally saved. Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Heb. 3:10; I John 5:10.
- 7. We believe the whole Scriptures are infallibly true, and that they are the only rules of faith and practice. II Tim. 3:16-17.
- 8. We believe in the doctrine of General Provision made to God in Christ for the benefit of all mankind, who repent and believe the Gospel. Luke 14:16-20; Matt. 28:19-29; Luke 13:3-5; Luke 24:47; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:15.
- 9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ His Son, and that the Holy Ghost offers his divien aid to all the human family, so as they all might be happy, would they give place to His divine teachings; whereas, such who do not receive the divine impressions of His Holy Spirit, shall at a further day, own their condemnation just, and charge themselves with their own damnation, for willfully rejecting the offers of sovereign grace. Matt. 11:27; St. John 6:44; Ps. 1:1; Tit. 2:11-12; Jer. 22:29.
- 10. We believe that men, not considered simply as men, but ungodly men, were of old ordained to condemnation; considered such who turn the grace of God into lasciviousness, denying the only Lord God, and cur Lord Jesus Christ who brought them, and therefore, shall bring upon themselves swift destruction; but we observe that they, and such the Apostle saith because they receive not the love of the truth that they might be saved; therefore the indignation and wrath of God is upon every soul of man that does evil, living and dying therein; for there is no respect of persons with God. Jude 1:4; II Peter 2:1; II Thes. 2:11-12; Rom. 2:9-11.
- 11. We believe that all children dying in infancy, having not actually transgressed against the law of God, in their own persons are only subject to the first death, which was brought on them by the fall of the first Adman, and not that any one of them dying in that state, shall suffer punishment in hell by the guilt of Adam's sin, for such is the kingdom of God. 1 Cor. 15:22; Matt. 18:2-5; Mark 9:36-37; Matt. 19:14.
- 12. We believe that good works are the fruits of a saving faith, and that in the use of the means of grace, and not out of the use of those means, eternal life is promised to men. Rev. 22:14-15; Isa. 1:19-20; Matt 7:8; Jer. 6-16; Luke 13:34-35.
- 13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the Holy Scriptures for justification before God through his own works, power of ability which he has in and of himself, only as he by grace is made able to come to God, through Jesus Christ believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God. Rom. 4:24; Acts 8:20, 21.

- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God, so that God knoweth whatever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions; yet not as having decreed any persons to everlasting death or everlasting life, out of respect or mere choice, farther than He hath appointed the godly unto life and the ungodly, who die in sin, unto death. Heb. 4:13; Prov. 8:22-31; Matt. 25:31-46.
- 15. We believe, as touching Gospel ordinances, in believers' baptism, laying on of the hands, receiving of the sacrament in bread and wine, washing the saint's feet, anointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, praying, singing praise to God and the public ministry of the Word, with every institution of the Lord we shall find in the New Testament. Mark 16:15-16; Acts 8:17; Acts 19:6; Luke 22:19; John 13:5-17; Jas. 5:14.
- 16. We believe the Gospel mode of baptism is by immersion, and that believers are the only susbject for baptism. Matt. 3-16; Mark 1:9; Acts 2:28, 39: Rom. 6:4; Col 2:12.
- 17. We believe in a general resurrection of the dead and a final judgment at the last day. John 5:28, 29; II Cor. 5:10.
- 18. We believe the happiness of the righteous as evernal and the torments of the wicked are endless. Matt. 25:46.

CHURCH COVENANT

1. Having given ourselves to the Lord, through Jesus Christ, we agree to accept the Free Will Baptist articles of faith; we give ourselves to each other by the help of God. 2. We solemnly covenant before God that we will carefully observe, rebuke and admonish those having gone astray and watch over each other's reputatioin, use our influence to the upbuilding of the church, commands implied in a profession of faith, and in the spirit of kindness and for the advancement of the cause of Christ, endeavoring to seek the unity of the Spirit in the bonds of peeace, and to confess our faults to one another, and to strengthen those who are weak. 3. We promise by the help of God, that we will faithfully practice family and secret prayer and strive to cultivate the doctrine of God's revealed Word in the minds of those under our care. 4. We also agree to use our influence for the support of the gospel and contribute liberally to aid the ministry according to our several abilities. Also we agree to be liberal with those who are afflicted and needy, and especially to those of the household 5. We also agree to attend the monthly meetings regularly if not of faith. providentially hindered, and to submit to all ordinances applied in a profession of faith. 6. We also agree to abstain from all sinful and vain amusements. 7. We also agree to abstain from all intoxicating liquors, not to use it as a beverage, nor aid or assist in the manufacturing of such, nor to furnish it to others. We also agree to encourage home and foreign missions, educations, Sabbath school, good morals and everything that is for the glory of God, and to the welfare of men, and may the God. of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ, that we may be happily admitted into the Kingdom of God, where we can ascribe honor unto the Lamb forever. --Amen

RESOLUTIONS

We believed in Congregational Government, the Church being the highest tribunal power ruled only by the vote of the majority of the active church members of the church that is involved.

CONSTITUTION, MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

- 1. This body shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the French Broad Free Will Baptist Association.
- 2. This conference is formed under and by the authority of the French Broad Association and shall be composed of licensed and ordained ministers.
- 3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said association, issuing licenses, prescribing qualificatons for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, working for the most harmonious and effective ministry. Any persons having the call of God to preach His Word, shall be liberated by his church for one year before presenting himself to the ordaining council to be licensed. Each licensed minister shall be elected as pastor of a duly organized church of the regular Free Will Baptists, in this or some other association or conference, he may apply for ordination after having been licened for one year.
- 4. The officers of this conference shall be a moderator and secretary-treasurer, wno shall be elected annually and perform the duties usually performed by such officers.
- 5. This conference shall have the power to make such by-laws and other regulations as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.
- 6. This constitution may be amended by any annual meeting by a vote of four-fifths.

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2 There shall be no conversation by the members, one with another so as to interrupt business, while in session.
 - 3 Every member speaking shall first rise and address the moderator.
 - 4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
 - 5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of "Brother"
 - 6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
 - 7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- 8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- 9. No members shall absent himself from the body without leave of the moderator.
- 10. On all motions made where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.
- 11. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other members, provided the chair is filled.
- 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the moderator.
 - 13. Not less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.

BY-LAWS, MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

- 1. The regular meeting of this conference shall be held annually the day after the meeting of the association.
- 2. Each member shall report at the annual meeting, either in person or by written report. \$1.00 shall accompany each minister's report to merit necessary expenses of this organization.
 - 3. Five member shall constitute a quorum at all regular or legal meetings.
- 4. The moderator may call a special session at any time on request of three members.
- 5. At each annual meeting there shall be elected an ordaining council whose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant licenses, conduct ordinations, etc., and report at each regular meeting.
- 6. No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for their pastor and contribute to other benevolent enterprises according to their ability.
- 7. No member shall meddle with the work of another or injure the reputation for usefulness, but watch over each other and hose promote harmony and love among the membership.
- 8. Each member, not excused from age or infirmities, is expected to do something to advance the cause of Christ and make a full report at each regular meeting.
 - 9. Membership in this body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry.
- 10. These by-laws may be amended by a vote of four-fifths majority at any annual meeting.
- 11. A minister will not be licensed or ordained in onis conference if he owns a television.
- 12. If a minister misses three quarterly conferences in succession, he will be silenced until he makes restitution.
- 13. If a man has been liberated by his church to preach his church must write a letter of recommendation to present to the conference at the end of the year.
 - 14. A minister must abide by the laws that are now in force if he remains in the conference.
 - 15. A minister must come in person to ask for letter to go to another conference.
