

BROOKWOOD CHURCH - FAYETTEVILLE

December 29, 1962

Rev. C. H. Coates served as moderator-of-the-day. Devotions were given by J. V. Johnson and Alfred Cates. We withdrew the hand of fellowship from the First Free Will Baptist Church of Smithfield because of departure from Free Will Baptist customs, usages and practices.

The following churches were received into our conference: White Oak Hill - Oak Grove, Wilson County - Calvary, Enfield - Mount Olive, Plymouth under watchcare.

Alfred Cates was received as a licensed preacher. A. C. Morgan preached the sermon during the session.

GRIFTON CHURCH

March 30, 1963

Rev. Raymond Gaskins was elected moderator-of-the-day. Devotions were brought by Lonnie Cayton and J. A. Branch. Rev. L. R. Ennis presented special citations to our five oldest churches - namely, St. Delight, Prospect, Gum Swamp, Antioch, and Parker's Chapel. This recognition was authorized by the General Conference in its annual session at Garner because these churches were a part of the old General Conference before it disbanded in 1886. September 28, 1963

Rev. L. R. Ennis was elected moderator-of-the-day. Devotions were conducted by Bobby Carden. Evangelist Owen Ganey preached during the session. Al Davis, James Duke and James Gay were received as ordained preachers. Larry Wall, Larry Inscoe and H. C. Price were received as licensed preachers.

We adopted the following resolution:

RESOLUTION BY THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, this conference recognizes the independence of the local church, and

WHEREAS, the local church licenses, ordains, and disciplines preachers,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That we receive into our membership only those preachers who are members of churches in our conference.
- 2. That the local churches send written recommendations for these preachers.
- 3. That this resolution will not apply to present members of our conference.
- 4. That special and exceptional cases be dealt with on their merits at the option of the Conference.

By common consent the name of Gum Swamp Church was dropped from our list of churches. (NOTE: The Church has split. The minority, assisted and supported by the Connectional Central Conference, sued the majority group and threw them out of the church by court restraining order. The majority group was in sympathy with the world-wide ministry of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and was Congregational in government. Rather than spend thousands of dollars fighting a lawsuit, the majority group decided to build a new church. They did and its name is Belvoir Free Will Baptist Church. We were to have had our annual session of the General Conference at Gum Swamp Church).

I wish to report by letter for Rev. Russell W. Millard. He went into Watts Hospital Oct. 30, 1963, Durham, North Carolina for an operation. He will not be able to attend this session.

He sends his prayers and regrets.

The morning worship service began by singing "All Hail The Power." Prayer by Wayne Smith. Special music by ladies from the Host Church. They blessed our hearts as they sang with real spirit, "I Met the Master", "Blessed Be the Name of Jesus", and "Jesus Use Me". We sang "Heavenly Sunshine" and shook hands. After the offering, Jack Paramore led us in prayer.

Adam Scott introduced our speaker, Bro. Dennis W. Alexander, in the words of General Douglas MacArthur - "old soldiers never die." Scott further said that as it applies to Christian Soldiers - "old soldiers never die, they just change addresses."

Bro. Alexander began by saying that he was using the same text and outline he used 52 years ago when he began preaching. He said it was a good text to start with, live with, stop with and die with. He said it was good for young preachers. He read Psalms 46 and Hebrews 13:1-6 and used verse 6 as the text. He said he pastored the old Gum Swamp Church 49 years ago. He recognized Bro. L. R. Ennis and Bro. Marshall Joyner who have preached upwards of 40 years. His first church was at Bell Arthur, North Carolina and his first sermon was preached at Hickory Grove Church. His first salary was \$5.00 per month. In these 52 years Bro. Alexander has served 31 churches in 13 North Carolina counties, conducted over 1,300 funerals and married some 800 couples. He commended Edgemont Church for saving Free Will Baptists from tyranny. He said if the last trial had gone against us, there would now be 6 or 8 more lawsuits going.

He spoke on "THE LORD - MY HELPER," He said:

1. He has helped me in the past.

- 2. He helps me today.
- 3. He will help me in the future.

He used Scriptural illustrations of God's help to Noah, Abraham, children of Israel, Daniel, etc. He said his favorite Scripture portion was Psalms 23.

He commended Belvoir Church on taking his advice on not spending their money to fight a lawsuit to keep the Old Gum Swamp Church property but in building a new church instead. Bro. Alexander's sermon, observations, advice, etc., were challenging and uplifting to us all.

Prayer by Bro. Owen Ganey.

We enjoyed a wonderful lunch hour with good food and blessed fellowship.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Wingate Hansley opened the afternoon session with the singing of "Stepping in the Light". The ladies group from the Host Church sang again - this time "What a Day" and "I See Jesus." The devotions were led by Tom Johnson. He used Galatians 5:12-18, 22-26. His topic was "The Spirit as Against the Flesh." Prayer by Bro. Johnson.

Prayer before the business session by Bro. Underwood from Smithfield. Announcements were made that Bible College Records, Missionary Manuals, and "Who Are These Connectional Free Will Baptists", by Carey Watkins, were all on sale here today.

Bro. Waddell and Bro. Bobby Abrams reported on the WITNESS. They gave out this written message:

Dear Friends,

The WITNESS is now over one year old. Just as in most pastorates, we find that the honeymoon period is over. We have reason to rejoice in the fact that the magazine now has over 2,100 subscribers. But, the yearend bills are piled so high at this time it's hard to rejoice in this accomplishment.

The General Conference has given over 1,400.00 to the support of the Witness. Because of this faithful support, we hate to burden you with the matter of 800.00 in unpaid bills. However, as our dearest friend, we turn

once again to you in this time of desperate need. Attached to this report is a coin envelope. We are asking you to do one of three things: (1) Subscribe for yourself, only \$2.06 for a year. (2) Subscribe for someone else. (for either of the first two you can pay now or tell us to bill you later) (3) Make a generous offering. By responding to one of these propositions, you will help pay off the bills.

After one year of experience in this ministry, we have the following suggestions to make:

1. Send us all the news of your church or conference.

- 2. Every church should include the Witness in its budget. Only \$5.00 a month from every church in the General Conference would pay the printing bills. Only five churches in the state support us in this way.
- 3. Arrange to have a service in your church for a representative from the Witness. We would like to present the needs of the paper to your group of people. Services of this nature have averaged \$25.00 in subscription money alone.
- 4. Enlarge your scope in enlisting subscribers. The Witness should be in more doctor's offices, hospitals, rest homes, etc. You may want to subscribe for a friend or a love one. Several members of the state convention already take the paper; more of them should. A subscription would make a good Christmas gift.
- 5. Pray for Brother Waddell and Brother Abrams. Much wisdom is needed from the Lord in this type of work.

We hope each of you will take these suggestions to heart, and then do your part in removing the debt we find ourselves facing. May the Lord bless you in his service.

On motion of the clerk we voted to send a letter of appreciation to Immanuel Church for their generous gift to our Conference and express our hope and extend our invitation that they will come with us. We were dismissed with prayer by Bro. L. R. Ennis.

Tuesday Night

There was an excellent Youth Service Tuesday night planned by host pastor Al Davis, Mrs. Chester Phillips, State Auxiliary President; Mrs. Ed Hill, General Conference Youth Chairman and Mrs. Annas Spain, State Youth Chairman.

Wednesday Morning

Bill Robinson led us in singing "Standing on the Promises." Prayer by Don Pegram. Devotions were by Jack Paramore. He preached on II Cor. 5:9-17 -"Four Motives For Serving Christ."

- 1. To be accepted of Him. verse 9
- 2. Because of the terror of the Lord. verse 11
- 3. Because of the love of Christ. verse 14
- 4. Because we are new creatures. verse 17
 - a. New in appearance.
 - b. New in attitude.
 - c. New in appetite.

Prayer by Bro. Paramore.

The minutes of the previous day's session were read and approved. The State Home Missions Report was given by Chester Phillips.

A report on the work at Enfield was given by A. C. Morgan, pastor.

Since two members of the Organizational Structure Committee had moved, there was no report from the committee.

On motion of Nathan Eason the committee was reorganized and instructed to bring a report next session. The committee is:

The morning worship service got under way with singing "O, Think of the Home Over There" led by Billy Morris. The trio from the host church sang "It's Not An Easy Road" and the quartet sang "Dear Jesus, Abide With Me." Prayer by Bro. Morris. After the offering, Bro. Adam Scott presented the speaker, Bro. Wayne Smith. He read Psalms 96 and Matthew 24:4-8. Prayer by Bro. Smith. He pointed out the dangerous trends of today - politically, religiously, educationally, etc. He declared - "The greatest need among Free Will Baptists is to rediscover who God is." He listed these popular misconceptions:

- 1. To think God is complimented if a scientist says he believes in God.
- For a politician to think God is small enough for him to use to get votes.
 For an economist to say that God has no part in our system.
- 4. For a diplomat to think God is small enough to fit into chapels with other
 - gods. (Chapel at United Nations a good example)
- 5. For theologians to think God is small enough to dwell in temples made with hands.

He said Christ overcame:

a. Death with life.

b. Time with eternity.

c. Hell with heaven.

d. Sin with salvation.

After reading Daniel 4:35, he said that suffering brought out the best in us and cited his own experience at Smithfield as one proof.

His sermon was a moving one. Prayer at the close by Bro. Ennis with all preachers at the altar.

Wednesday Afternoon

We sang "At Calvary" led by Ronnie Peele. The devotions were conducted by Gene Waddell using Galatians 4:19. He said we were to give the Word true and straight but in love and we were to travail till Christ be formed in our flocks. Prayer by Conrad Williford.

No report from the committee on a permanent time. They are to report in December. Bro. Frank Davenport was asked by the moderator to serve as chairman of the committee.

The report of the Historian was given by Bro. Waddell. He asked for everyone to continue sending in things of historical value for our Conference collection. He then resigned and Carey Watkins was elected to succeed him.

Ronnie Peele reported on the work of the Bible College. He pointed out the some 90% of all workers in our National Home and Foreign Mission fields were trained at the college. The budget for the General Fund is \$85,000 and the budget for improvement is \$40,000.

The Membership Committee's report was given by Billy Walker.

On motion of Wayne Smith, Glenn Hill was enrolled as an ordained preacher pending a letter of recommendation from his church.

On motion of Carey Watkins the name of Broncho West was enrolled as an ordained preacher.

On motion of Don Pegram the name of Sigbee Dilda was enrolled as a licensed preacher.

On motion of Nathan Eason a letter of transfer was granted Johnny Eason to Ohio.

The Foreign Missions report was given by Milton Worthington. He brought a stirring challenge from Matthew 9:36-38.

On motion of Adam Scott a rising vote of thanks was extended the host church, host pastor Davis and the singers from the host church.

The following expressed confidence that they could get \$5.00 per month for the Witness: Al Davis, L. R. Ennis, Carey Watkins, Wayne Smith and Billy Walker.

On motion of Don Pegram a gist of the happenings at our Union Meetings is to be included in our printed minutes.

RESOLUTIONS BY CAREY WATKINS

1. That we commend the Edgemont Church at Durham in their faithfulness in standing for our historic Congregational church government, and that we earnestly beseech God through much prayer and supplication that the Supreme Court of North Carolina will deny the appeal of the Western Conference of Connectional Free Will Baptists and that the decision of the Superior Court Judge to throw this case out of court will stand.

2. That we encourage our churches to give systematically to the Leah Waddell Student Loan Fund for the benefit of worthy students and as a living memorial to her dedication to young people for Christ.

On motion of Carey Watkins the resolutions were adopted.

On motion of Carey Watkins we voted to send \$100.00 to the North Carolina Mission Board, \$100.00 to the Bible College and \$100.00 to the Witness.

On motion of the clerk we voted to print the 1845 minutes of the General Conference in our 1963 minutes.

On motion of Tom Johnson a rising vote of thanks was extended to the clerk and treasurer.

On motion of Adam Scott we adjourned.

Held at Grimsley's meeting house, Greene County, N. C.

On the 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th days of November, A. D. 1845.

Thursday, November 6th, 1845.

Agreeably to previous appointment, the Ministers, Messengers, and Delegates of the North Carolina Free Will Baptist Conference, met at Grimsley's meeting house, Greene County, North Carolina.

According to appointment, at 12 o'clock, Elder Thomas Moore introduced divine service, and preached from the 4th chapter and 14th verse of St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, viz. "That we hence forth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive."

Conference was then duly organized by choosing Elder Thomas Moore, Moderator; Elder Calvin Ruff, Clerk; and brother Willis Murphrey, Assistant Clerk.

On motion of Elder Thomas Moore, agreed that brethren James Garland, and Henry Suggs, be appointed a Committee of Finance, to receive contributions, settle with the Treasurer, and report to Conference.

On motion of Elder Jeremiah Heath, agreed that Elder Little J. Utley be invited to a seat with us in conference.

On motion of Elder John F. Jones agreed that Elder Jacob Utley, Elder John F. Jones and brother William Forice be a committee, to supply the congregation, and fill the stage with preachers during this Conference.

On motion of Elder Jesse Vause, agreed that Conference adjourn until Friday 10 o'clock, a.m. Prayer and praise by Elder Roderick Powel.

Friday, November 7th. Met agreeably to appointment. Prayer by Elder W. Witchard.

On motion of Elder Jesse Vause, agreed that the letters from the several churches be called for and read.
