REV. CADMUS HUNTER COATES

April 16, 1899 - August 13, 1968

The nineteen-sixty-eight session of our General Conference authorized the placing of an historical sketch of Rev. C. H. Coates in our printed minutes. His daughter, Mrs. Celia Snipes and her husband Mr. Charles Snipes of Buies Creek, N. C. have contributed the information and material for this tribute to Rev. Coates.

Rev. Coates, who was a faithful soldier of the cross was born April 16, 1899 in Johnston, County, N. C. His father was Rufus A. Coates and his mother was Florence (Barboür) Coates.

He was ordained to preach the gospel at Four Oaks, N. C. on October 6, 1929 with Rev. D. R. Ennis, W. Ruffin Coates, and L. R. Ennis serving on the Ordaining Council.

Brother Coates gave some 34 years of his life as a pastor of a number of our Free Will Baptist Churches in Harnett, Johnston, Durham, Sampson, Wayne and Wake Counties before retiring from the ministry in 1963 at the age of 64.

He pastored St. Mary's Grove Church, Corinth, Lees Chapel, Stancils Chapel, Prospect, Pleasant Plains, Tippets Chapel, Shady Grove and organized and pastored Community Chapel of Buies Creek where he continued to minister until his retirement.

Rev. Coates was dearly loved and highly regarded among our Free Will Baptist people as a minister of the Gospel of Christ.

He went to be with the Lord on August 13, 1968 after being ill for several months. He was survived by one daughter, Mrs. Celia (Coates) Snipes of Buies Creek, with whom he lived after retirement. His ministry is remembered by many.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Rev. Ronnie Peele, Pastor of the host church, welcomed the ministers and delegates. This was followed by the Moderator's message brought by Rev. Billy Walker.

A motion was adopted to omit the reading of the minutes of last years session.

The roll of ministers and churches was called.

The Moderator appointed the following Committees:

Resolutions: Rev. Joe Ange, Chairman, Rev. Broncho West, Rev. L. D. Creech.

Digest: Mr. Fred Parker, Rev. Glenn Hill, Rev. Wayne Phillips.

Finance: Rev. Robert Durham, Rev. Lonnie West, Rev. Fred Hall.

Rev. Roger Russell, visitor from the Coastal Association, was recognized.

The Membership Committee gave a partial report.*

A motion was adopted that the report be accepted, receiving the churches pastors and approving the action of the clerk in granting letters.*

A report was given on the Investment Retirement Plan of our State Superannuation Board.

The State Mission Board gave a report.

We heard from the following pastors of mission points or new churches: Broncho West, in Winston Salem, Andy Edwards, in Cary, and Glenn Hill, in Rocky Mount.

After a short recess, Mr. Ron Christ led the song service, Rev. Fred Hall sang a solo and Rev. David Paramore brought the morning message from John 4. We were dismissed for lunch by Rev. Bobby Jackson.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session began with singing led by Rev. Eddie Dollar and devotional thoughts by Rev. Grant Saverance.

A report of the Special Study Committee for the betterment of the General Conference was given by the chairman of the committee, Rev. Joe Ange. A motion was adopted that the report be received and recommendations be voted on, one at a time.*

A motion was adopted that recommendation 1 become a part of our Constitution through amending by substitution articles 4 and 5 of our present Constitution.

Motions were made that recommendations 2 and 3 be adopted.

A motion was adopted that recommendation 4 become a part of our Constitution through amending by substitution article 1 of our present Constitution.

A motion was adopted that recommendation 5 be substituted by the following: That we retain our present guidelines as set forth in a resolution from the session held at Peace Church, September 28, 1963.

Recommendation 6 was tabled. Recommendations 7 and 8 were adopted. Recommendation 9 was tabled until the 1969 session.

A motion was adopted that a committee of five men be elected to revise our Constitution. The following were elected: Rev. Frank Davenport, Rev. L. R. Ennis, Rev. Joe Ange, Rev. Ronald Creech, and Rev. Herman Hershey.

A motion was adopted that the Moderator appoint a nominating committee. He appointed Rev. Eddie Dollar, Rev. A. C. Morgan and Rev. Chester Phillips.

The reports of the Resolutions Committee, Digest Committee, Finance Committee, Membership Committee, and Nominating Committee were adopted.*

A motion was adopted that the general officers approve the minutes for printing.

It was adopted that the 1969 session be held in Roxboro, N. C.

Rev. Ronald Creech gave the report of the Historian. He was elected Historian of the General Conference.

A motion was made to adjourn. Rev. A. C. Morgan dismissed in prayer.

REPORT OF THE SPECIAL STUDY COMMITTEE

The Special Study Committee for the Betterment of the General Conference makes the following recommendations to the General Conference:

1. That the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer be elected annually and serve no more than two years successively in any one office or combination of these offices.
2. That a Youth Committee of three men be elected annually consisting of one man from each district comprising the General Conference. We further recommend that the Conference elect the chairman of the committee.
3. That the General Conference sponsor an annual Youth Conference during the month prior to the State Association and that the Youth Committee designate the date and arrange the program.
4. That the Annual General Conference meet on Friday following the first Sunday of November, beginning at 9 a.m. and concluding Friday evening with an evening service, provided this one day conference proves to be effective.
5. That a committee be elected to study and propose guidelines for receiving ministers into membership of the General Conference.
6. That the ministers of the General Conference be required, as a basis of fellowship with the conference, to make an annual report either by letter or by being present at the annual conference. Those failing to do so for two years in succession will be considered out of fellowship with the conference.
7. That we have an annual Ministers' Conference and that this session of the General Conference elect a committee to plan and promote the first conference, working out all details.
8. That the Program Committee be composed of the Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer and host pastor.
9. That a committee be elected by the conference to investigate the possibility of dividing the General Conference and that this committee make a report at our next annual meeting.
