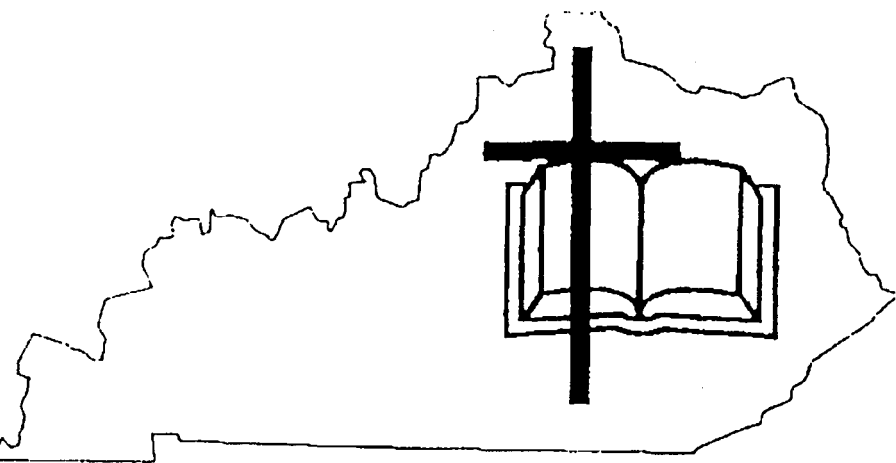

"Give Up and Let Jesus Take Over."

Rev. Paul Browning introduced the speaker, Rev. Clyde Waller who spoke from 2 Samuel 11:27 and Proverbs 22:1. His theme was on the dangers of displeasing the Lord.

During the invitation the congregation sang, "Just As I Am."

Rev. Trymon Messer gave the benediction.

There were 240 in attendance.

I. Morning Session began at 9:00 a.m. with 211 in attendance.

1. The congregation sang, "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder."

2. Rev. Dick VanHoose, previous Moderator, offered prayer.

3. Rev. Don Lee, Host Pastor, gave the welcome and introduced the Moderator, Rev. Tim Hall.

4. Rev. Hall delivered the Moderator's message from Ephesians 4:8-16.

His text was, "God's Given Gifts."

5. Rev. Lincoln Varney made a motion to seat the delegates. The motion was seconded by Rev. Sandy Adams and was passed.

6. Rev. Dick VanHoose made a motion to accept changes to the delegation as named by appropriate officials designated by local conferences. It was seconded by Rev. Kenneth Walker and passed.

7. Upon a motion by Rev. Tim York and seconded by Rev. Powell Collins the Association rescinded a 1994, business item, "Any ministry or organization that is not owned, operated and Board members elected by a Free Will Baptist Church, District Association, State Association or National Association, shall be required to submit in writing all minutes of Board meetings for the year and annual financial records to be sent to the Clerk of the Kentucky State Association, by June 1, before being placed on the program. If for some reason the Clerk questions the contents of the aforesaid information, it shall be referred to the Executive Board which meets prior to the Association.

The Free Will Baptist Church, District Association, and State Association must be a member in good standing with the National Association of Free Will Baptists."

8. Upon a motion by Rev. Joe Roysden which was seconded by Rev. Keith Crum the Association adopted the agenda as presented by the Executive Board.

9. Committee appointments made by the Moderator were:

Nominating —Rev. Bobby Spencer as Chairman, Rev. Joe Roysden and Rev. Willie G. Hayes.

Business —Rev. Keith Crum as Chairman, Rev. Bill Oakes and Rev. Sam Conley.

Resolution —Rev. James A. Hayes as Chairman, Rev. Gary Blackburn and Rev. Danny Smith.

Finance —Rev. Jim Patton as Chairman, Rev. Brent Patrick and Rev. Calvin Setser.

10. Rev. James Branham, Treasurer, gave the financial report as:

Balance \$ 7,478.20

Late dues & Off. 984.98 (All conferences submitted appropriate dues).

Ending Balance 8,463.18.

Received \$ 7.95 toward State Promotional Office through Telephone Project.

Rev. Keith Crum made a motion to approve the financial report. It was seconded by Rev. Bill Oakes and approved.

11. The Moderator recognized and welcomed visitors:

Rev. Trymon Messer with Home Missions Department,

Rev. Fred Warner with Foreign Missions Department,

Rev. Chris Dotson, Martha Stone, Rich Stone and R.J. Rose with Harvest Free

Will Baptist Child Care Ministries,

Rev. Burt Tippet with Free Will Baptist Bible College.

Rev. Melvin Worthington with the Executive Office.

Rev. Jack Taylor with Free Will Baptist Family Ministries.

Bro. Billy Brown with Randall House Bookstore.

Rev. Lassiter with Southeastern Free Will Baptist Bible College and

Sounds of Praise Choral Group.

12. State Reports

Home Missions Committee—Rev. Bill Maynard, Chairman, requested that Rev. Sandy Adams, Pastor of the Louisville Mission Church give the report. He reported that the church is averaging 18 in attendance. Located on 2 acres, their building has 500 square feet. The church needs \$5,000 to initiate a Child Care Project.

A motion to receive the report made by Rev. Keith Crum was seconded by Rev. Gene Mullins and passed.

State Youth Committee—Bro. Brent Patrick, Chairman, reported that the youth had met for worship and competitive activities on May 19-20 at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington. Their goal is to involve more churches. They will sponsor a "Lock In" at the Lexington Ice Center on September 29th.

A motion to accept the report made by Rev. Lincoln Varney was seconded by Rev. James Branham and passed.

Woman's Auxiliary—Sis. Phyllis York, President, reported that the theme of their June 16th conference was, "Are You a Living Sacrifice?" They have 244 members including a new group from the Endicott Free Will Baptist Church. They reached \$22,772.12 of their 1995 goal of \$25,000 for auxiliary projects. They have set a goal of \$25,000 for 1996.

A motion to receive their report made by Rev. Sandy Adams was seconded by Rev. Tom Ratliff and passed.

Promotional Secretary, Rev. Tim York, reported that during the week of July 16th, the National Association will be held in Charlotte, North Carolina.

A motion to receive his report made by Rev. Keith Crum was seconded by Rev. Joe Roysden and passed.

Master's Miracle Bookstore—Rev. Harry Frisby reported that the bookstore was submitting a \$3,000 check to the Association. This represents a percentage of sales from participating Kentucky State Association churches who purchase through the bookstore.

A motion to receive his report made by Rev. Bill Maynard was seconded by Rev. John Newsome and passed.

13. Other Reports (Written reports were distributed).

National Home Missions—Rev. Trymon Messer stressed the importance of the Church Planting Program and encouraged participation in the Benjamin Randall fund raising program for Home Missions. Nine new missionaries have been installed and three new churches have been started.

National Foreign Missions—Rev. Fred Warner reported that Kentucky had exceeded its goal of support at 102%. 59 churches had contributed. The Second Free Will Baptist church of Ashland had given \$7,000. A special offering will be received in April for World Missions through the Laura Barnard Memorial Project.

Harvest Free Will Baptist Child Care Ministries—Rev. Chris Dotson reported that although this ministry in Virginia was but a brief two years in existence, 72 children were being served. Of these 30 had made profession of faith.

A motion to receive these three reports made by Rev. Delmas Martin was seconded by Rev. Keith Crum and passed.

14. Business was adjourned for Morning Worship which was led by Rev. Tim York.

The congregation sang, "Showers of Blessings."

Rev. Melvin Worthington led prayer and blessed the morning offering.

An offering of \$456.11 was received.

Sounds of Praise Choral Group uplifted the congregation with five presentations:

"Working on a Building,"

"There Was a Lamb,"

Medley of old favorite songs,

"The Cross Has Won Again,"

"When the Name of Jesus Is Spoken."

Rev. Jack Lassiter delivered an inspirational sermon from John 20:7. His text was, "The Napkin Is Still Folded." His main points were: 1) The Lord is not finished saving sinners, 2) The Lord is not finished perfecting the saints and 3) The Lord is not finished preparing a city. Upon invitation many came forward to renew dedication to Christian service.

Rev. Don Lee gave directions for lunch and blessed the food.

II. Afternoon Business Session began at 1:15 p.m. with 153 in attendance.

1. The congregation sang "Amazing Grace."

2. Rev. Lincoln Varney, Assistant Moderator, read Ephesians 2:1-5 for devotional thoughts and led prayer.

3. While ushers distributed written informational items, reports from other ministries were given:

Randall House Bookstore—Bro. Billy Brown emphasized the significance of the National publishing work and requested that all churches use its ministries. He gave free copies of *Depth*, a daily devotional, and *Tomorrow's Trends in Sunday School*.

Free Will Baptist Bible College—Rev. Burt Triplett reported that of the 377 school enrollment 16 were from Kentucky. He reminded that December is Free Will Baptist Bible College Month and that churches should do something special during the Paul Ketterman Memorial Christmas Drive.

National Executive Office—Rev. Melvin Worthington reported that copies of the "Denominational Digest" were given to Conference clerks. He quoted some interesting

statistics: Free Will Baptists in 1994 had given \$8.7 million to denominational work. Kentucky had given \$107,300. Of the denominational dollar \$0.51 went to Foreign Missions, \$0.31 went to Home Missions, \$0.11 went to the Bible College and \$0.07 went to the remaining ministries.

WNAC—Sister Phyllis York reporting on the WNAC repeated some statistics

earlier cited..

A motion to receive the four reports made by Rev. Bobby Baldrige was seconded by Rev. Keith Crum and passed.

4. Other Ministry Reports

Camp Caleb—Rev. Jason Hurt, Director, stressed that the camp exists to provide Christian recreation and spiritual guidance to children and opportunities for fellowship and counseling to married couples. Through the years many children have been led to Christ and to Christian service.

Tennessee Free Will Baptist Children's Home—Rev. Jack Taylor thanked churches who had been assisting the Home and reported on expanding services to the children served.

A motion to receive the two reports made by Rev. Lincoln Varney was seconded by Rev. Bobby Spencer and passed.

5. Old Business

Rev. James A. Hayes called for the question on two amendments to the Constitution and By Laws as tabled in the last Association. Rev. Kenneth Walker made a motion to move the amendments for floor consideration which was seconded by Rev. Joe Roysden and passed. Both items were read.

"Section III. Article XXIII. Master's Men Board - The State Association shall establish a ten (10) person State Master's Men Board (consisting of one (1) representative from each quarterly conference), nominated by the quarterly conference and elected by the State Association for a term of two (2) years; with rights of succession. The purpose of the Board is to plan, promote, and implement plans relative to the State Master's Men work. Initially, five (5) members will be elected for one (1) year and five (5) for two (2) years. After that, five (5) will be elected each year. The alphabetical listing of the conference will determine those elected to one (1) or two (2) years. The Board shall elect its own: chairman, vice chairman, secretary, and treasurer who in turn will constitute its Executive Committee.

Section XXIV. Senior's Board - The State Association shall establish a ten (10) person State Senior's Board (consisting of one (1) representative from each quarterly conference), nominated by the quarterly conference and elected by the State Association for a term of two (2) years, with rights of succession. The purpose of the Board is to plan, promote, and implement plans relative to the State Senior's work. Initially, five (5) members will be elected for one (1) year and five (5) for two (2) years. After that, five (5) will be elected each year. The alphabetical listing of the conference will determine those elected to one (1) or two (2) years. The Board shall elect its own: chairman, vice chairman, secretary and treasurer who in turn will constitute its Executive Committee."

Rev. James A. Hayes made a motion to adopt the amendments which was seconded by Rev. Keith Crum and passed.

6. New Business

The Clerk reported that the Executive Board was presenting three items for consideration: Constitution and By Laws amendments, one resolution and one recommendation. Each item was read. Constitution and By Law amendments:

- 1) Change the Ministers Meeting to a Ministers and Workers Conference.

Section II. Article I. "Ministers and Workers Conference - There shall be a Ministers and Workers Conference, planned by the Executive Board, for fellowship and edification. All Christian workers shall be called together once each year prior to the Kentucky State Association."

2) Additional provision in Section III. Article IX. Executive Board - "The Executive Board is authorized to decide on the amount of honorarium and expense allowance for visiting ministers during the State Ministers and Workers Conference."

3) Additional provision in Section III. Article XX. "The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, State Missions Board Chairman, State Youth Board Chairman shall receive reimbursement of their expenses of motel and meals."

4) Dues increase for each member church in Section V. Article II. "Dues - Each quarterly meeting shall report of its work before the regular session of the State Association with delegates and a contribution of \$30.00 per church in the quarterly meeting."

Resolution: "May it be resolved that the Kentucky State Association of Free Will Baptist set a goal to further develop the State Office for a full/part-time Promotional Secretary, to be determined by the State Association or the Executive Board acting on its behalf, as soon as such venture is financially feasible. Designations will be deemed unbinding, that in the event such office is not so developed, the State Association may use the funds for other worthy projects. In the meantime, expenses incurred by Association personnel in promotion of this office shall be reimbursed by the Kentucky State Association."

Recommendation: Because the National Association has increased the annual dues assessed for each participating church from \$10.00 to \$25.00, it is recommended that each quarterly conference contribute \$30.00 per member church to the Kentucky State Association next year.

A motion to receive the report made by Rev. Morgan Chapman was seconded by Rev. Tommy DeHart and passed.

A motion to table the recommended Constitution and By Laws amendments for one year as required by such made by Rev. James A. Hayes was seconded by Rev. Gene Blackburn and passed.

A motion to adopt the recommended resolution made by Rev. James Branham was seconded and discussed. The Moderator clarified the intent of the resolution as to eventually lead to a full-time Promotional Secretary. This person would actively promote the State work and assist churches with development and growth. Expenses in developing this resolution would be minimal and associated with meetings of the Executive Board. The motion was passed.

A motion to adopt and notify quarterly conference clerks of the need to increase church dues made by Rev. Clifford H. Austin was seconded by Rev. Joe Roysden and passed.

The Credential Committee had no business for consideration.

Rev. Keith Crum, Business Committee Chairman, reported that the next Kentucky State Association would be hosted by the Faith Free Will Baptist Church located at Rush, Kentucky on June 14 and 15, 1996. Tri-State is the host Conference.

A motion to receive the report made by Rev. Bobby Spencer was seconded by

Rev. Bobby Baldridge and passed.

Rev. Jim Patton, Finance Committee Chairman, reported that the Finance Committee recommended giving Conference speakers an honorarium of \$50.00 each, that the Free Will Baptist Bible College and Southeastern Free Baptist Bible College be given \$125.00 each and that \$106.11 be given the Louisville Mission Church. The morning offering was \$456.11.

Rev. Joe Roysden made a motion to receive the report which was seconded and passed. A motion to adopt all recommendations of the Finance Committee made by Rev. Morgan Chapman was seconded by Rev. Tommy DeHart and passed.

Rev. James A. Hayes, Resolutions Committee Chairman, reported one resolution for adoption: "We the Resolution Committee resolve to give a heartfelt thanks to the Pikeville Free Will Baptist Church for hosting the Kentucky Association."

A motion to receive the report and adopt the resolution was made by Rev. Bobby Baldridge, seconded by Rev. Keith Crum and passed.

The Moderator explained that an item on the agenda, Steering Committee report, had been inadvertently picked up from a previous agenda but was no longer functional and had no report.

Rev. Joe Roysden, Nominating Committee Chairman, submitted the names of individuals nominated for the following offices and terms of office:

A motion to receive the report and to elect all officers by acclamation made by Rev. Delmas Martin was seconded by Rev. Kenneth Walker and passed.

Bro. Brent Patrick, Youth Board Chairman, reported that Tri-State and Northern Ohio Conferences had not designated persons to serve on the Youth Board. Rev. Keith Crum made a motion to receive the report and advised that conferences may send representatives to the Youth Board meeting. The Youth Board may then seat those representatives a per Constitution and By Laws Section III, Article IX. Item 7. The motion was seconded by Rev. Bobby Spencer and passed.

State Executive Board. The Clerk read the names of local conference nominees to the Executive Board: Rev. Kenneth Walker for Bluegrass, Rev. Bobby Baldridge for Floyd County, Rev. Morgan Chapman for Sandy Valley and Rev. Bill Maynard as his alternate. A question was raised concerning the admissibility of alternates. The Moderator explained that according to the Constitution and By Laws Section III, Article IX, Item 7, the Executive Board could seat representatives sent by local conferences to make-up a quorum of the Executive Board. Rev. Joe Roysden made a motion to receive the report and seat the nominees. It was seconded by Rev.

Sandy Adams and passed.

The Moderator directed that the letter with appropriate fees be sent to the National Association. Delegates appointed were: Phyllis York, Jane Branham, Eula Baldrige, Phyllis Adams and Dorcie Patton. Alternates appointed were: Thomas Stacy, Jr., Judy Mullins and Joe Mullins.

A motion that the letter be approved made by Rev. Keith Crum was seconded by Rev. Joe Roysden and passed.

A motion to adjourn made by Rev. Bill Maynard was seconded by Rev. Bobby Spencer and passed. The Moderator adjourned the meeting with prayer.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE ORIGINAL KENTUCKY STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Preamble

From experience we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us; to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us; to unify the work of the various bodies composing the original Kentucky State Association; and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in cooperation with the various bodies of the Association, or that may be hereafter represented therein, do there fore ordain the Constitution for our better denominational government.

SECTION I. THE ASSOCIATION

Article I

Design—The design of this Association is to comprise all the quarterly meetings belonging to the State Association of Kentucky who belong to the Free Will Baptist denomination and to unify more completely the church work.

Article II

Position—The Kentucky State Association sustains the same relations to the quarterly meetings as the quarterly meetings to the churches. The body was organized May 6, 1939, and adopted the following constitution and by-laws to govern its mission work. (First revision June 21, 1975, second revision June 17, 1978, third revision June 16, 1990, fourth revision June 15, 1991).

Article III

Object—The object of this organization shall be to unify that work of the various quarterly meetings in the aforesaid State Association, and to devise means for the extension of Christ's Kingdom in the State Association.

Article IV

Membership in the Kentucky State Association is based upon affiliation of the several Quarterly Associations with the Kentucky State Association. When a quarterly meeting is affiliated with the Kentucky State Association according to the process described in the by-laws, its various associations, local churches with their members and ministers are also members of the Kentucky State Association.

Article V

Representation—Each quarterly meeting composing this association shall be entitled to five delegates from the quarterly meeting and one additional delegate for each 300 members or major portion thereof, together with all ordained Ministers and Deacons in good standing.

The Kentucky State Woman's Auxiliary and the Kentucky State Youth Conference are to be represented by two delegates each to the Kentucky State Association.

Article VI

Placement—The Kentucky State Association shall be on a rotary basis, going to each quarterly meeting in alphabetical order. The Quarterly Meeting that will host the association must designate in the letter the name of the host church so honored. A church desiring to host the Kentucky State Association should have ample seating, plenty of parking space, facilities to feed, and in general be able to serve the association.

Article VII

Admission To—A Quarterly Meeting desiring membership in the Kentucky State Association of Free Will Baptists must file application and send it to the Kentucky State Association for approval of the Credential Committee. The report of the Credential Committee shall be voted on by the assembly, which may accept or reject the same.

Article VIII

Meeting Date—The Kentucky State Association shall meet the (3rd) third Saturday in June at 9:30 A.M., EDT, with an introductory message on Friday night at 7:30 P.M. before the (3rd) third Saturday. The Saturday night service shall be the prerogative of the host church pastor.

SECTION II. AUXILIARIES

Article I

Ministerial Meeting—There shall be an annual Ministerial meeting, planned by the Executive Board, for fellowship and edification. All ordained and licensed ministers shall be called together once each year prior to the Kentucky State Association. This meeting shall convene the (3rd) third Saturday in March at 10:00 A.M., at the same church hosting the State Meeting that year. At this meeting there may be preaching and/or seminars on doctrine, funerals, weddings, hospital visitation, discussing church disturbing problems and other items. The Clerk shall notify all Ministers of the program aforesaid.

Article II

Ladies Auxiliary—The Ladies Auxiliary shall meet on the Friday before the third Saturday of June, at 10:00 A.M. EDT.

Article III

Youth Conference—The Youth Conference shall convene on the (3rd) third Saturday in May, at 10:30 A.M. EDT.

Article IV

Placement—The Ladies Auxiliary will meet at the church hosting the Kentucky State Association, and the Youth Conference of the Kentucky State Association will meet at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Lexington, Kentucky. These organizations cannot move their meeting place or time without permission of the Kentucky State Association.

Article V

Rules—No by-laws shall be passed by the Ladies Auxiliary or Youth Conference repugnant to the Kentucky State Association. Each of these two auxiliaries will submit an annual report to the Kentucky State Association.

SECTION III. OFFICERS —THEIR DUTIES AND QUALIFICATIONS

Article I

Officers—The officers of the Association shall consist of the following who shall be elected at each regular session and serve until their successors are elected and qualified:

A Moderator and an assistant, a Clerk, and a Treasurer. It is recommended that the Clerk and the Treasurer have an assistant.

Article II

Qualifications—The moderator and his assistant shall bear the same qualifications. He must have been an ordained minister for not less than (5) five years, and has pastored churches for not less than (3) three years. He should possess a fair working knowledge of parliamentary procedure as set forth in Roberts Rules of Order. He should possess a good knowledge of the by-laws of this body. He should possess the ability to call order in a firm and humble manner when it becomes necessary while conducting meetings. He must be present to be elected.

Article III

Duties of the Moderator—He shall preside at all associational meetings and have general supervision of all church work, during his term. He is to appoint all non standing committees for the association, that the business be properly brought before the body. His assistant accepts his responsibilities in his absence.

Article IV

Qualifications of the Clerk—The clerk must have the ability to keep neat and accurate records. He should be an interested worker and try to expedite the minutes to each quarterly conference as quickly as possible. The clerk, treasurer and their assistants, and the promotional secretary, if through sickness or funerals, cannot be present, may be elected if they report by letter.

Article V

Duties of the Clerk—He will keep an accurate record of all meetings and read them for approval at the next session. He will keep a record of all finances coming to the treasurer, and settle with him at each session for comparison.

Article VI

Qualifications of the Treasurer—He should be a stable, dependable and honest man. He should be bondable and willing to be bonded by this body if and when it deems necessary. He should possess a fair knowledge of mathematics and bookkeeping.

Article VII

Duties of the Treasurer—He is to keep up to date records at all times. There will be no checks written, or money drawn from the Kentucky State Associations treasury, except it be authorized by the General Assembly when in session, or the executive board between sessions. He shall place all monies totaling over \$3,000.00 in a savings account within (30) thirty days after the associational meeting in June.

Article VIII

Purchasing—The clerk of the State Association is authorized to purchase any supplies that he may need to fulfill his duties.

Article IX

Executive Board - Composition and Duties —The personnel of the Executive Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association the chairman of all standing boards and one member nominated by each local Association and elected by the State

body whose term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.

DUTIES

1. The Executive Board shall have power to act in behalf of, and for the State Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The Board shall plan and execute the program for the annual Ministerial meeting and the annual sessions of the Kentucky State Association. The Board shall have power to collect money from its members as is needed for the work, and employ and superintend such workers for the Association as may be needed. The Board also may acquire the Kentucky State Bookstore (Master's Miracle Bookstore) and oversee its operation should such an endeavor become feasible and practical and available to the Organization.
2. In the event the necessity arise from war, or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, then the Executive Board shall be privileged to call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association; providing whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and providing that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts by the By-Laws of the State Association.
3. Special meetings of the Executive Board shall be called when necessary by the Moderator of the Association with the written consent of three other members of the Executive Board. Special meetings of the Board shall also be called upon written request of a majority of its members.
4. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or by mail to each Board member.
5. A majority of the number of the Executive Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Executive Board.
6. The Executive Board shall have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur as a result of death or extreme illness, in its own body and shall also have power to fill any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association. It shall be the duty of the Board to make written reports of all its work to each session of the State Association.
7. Any vacancy occurring in the Executive Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of the majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the Executive Board.

Article X

Credential Committee Qualifications—Members of this committee shall be ordained ministers for not less than (5) five years, and have pastored churches for not less than (3) three years. They should have a good knowledge of the by-laws of this body. They should be level-headed men and very stable in the doctrine. They shall be an elected committee and shall serve in a 3-2-1 order, one member to be elected each year.

Article XI

Duties of the Credential Committee—This committee may be activated upon any appeal confronting the Kentucky State Association and work in conjunction with the Executive Board. All appeals (grievances) shall be forwarded to the Credential Committee. This committee will be activated to go when invited by a church, minority group, majority group, or conference; to hear the evidence, and offer advice, and report back to the general assembly, or executive board, depending on the nearness of the State meeting.

Article XII

Appointed Committees—These committees of this body should be picked with great care. They should have the ability to perform well on the respective committee for which they are chosen. To be chosen for a committee, the one chosen must be present at the meeting.

Article XIII

Home Missions Board—The Kentucky Home Missions Board is to become a standing committee consisting of four members elected by the body on a 4-3-2-1 basis. The treasurer is to be chosen from among the four board members. The moderator of the State Association is to work with the Home Missions Board.

Article XIV

Nominating Committee—This committee is an appointed committee. The committee shall be composed of three, each from a different conference, who are appointed by the Moderator as follows: The first named for term of three years, the second for a term of two years, the third for a term of one year. Thereafter, each member shall be appointed for a term of three years. The duties of said committee is to recommend one nomination for each office open for election for consideration to the State Association.

Article XV

Business Committee—The Business Committee is an appointed committee. Any business coming from a quarterly meeting must be attached to the letter to the State Association and mailed or handed to the clerk at least (3) three weeks prior to the state association meeting. All business must come through the business committee of the Kentucky State Association.

Article XVI

Resolutions Committee—This is an appointed committee.

Article XVII

Finance Committee—This committee is an appointed committee.

Article XVIII

Obituary Committee—This committee is a standing committee of the clerks of the conference.

Article XIX

Promotional Secretary—A promotional secretary shall be elected every two years, to promote unity, missions, Bible College, and all phases of our work. It is recommended that the conference that he visits pay his expenses at the rate of 15¢ per mile. Promotional Secretary shall serve as the Kentucky State Association's representative to the General Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Article XX

Expenses—That an honorarium of \$50.00 be paid to the Moderator, plus 15¢ per mile, and the Clerk be given \$100.00 plus 15¢ per mile, and the Treasurer be given \$50.00 plus 15¢ per mile. When the Credential Committee, or Executive Board has been called to their duty as prescribed in foresaid By-Laws or Constitution the driver or drivers will be paid 15¢ per mile for expense of their car. Also, that the Finance Committee make provisions for the General Board member.

Article XXI

Number of offices to be held—No member shall hold more than (2) two offices in the Kentucky State Association at one time. Whenever necessary others may be authorized protem.

Article XXII

State Youth Board - The State Association shall establish a ten (10) person State Youth Board (consisting of one (1) representative from each Quarterly Conference). Nominated by the Quarterly Conferences and elected by the State Association; for a term of two (2) years with rights of succession. The purpose of the Board is to plan, promote and implement plans relative to the State Youth work.

Initially (5) members will be elected for one (1) year and five (5) for two (2) years. After that, five (5) will be elected each year.

The Alphabetical Listing of the Conference will determine those elected to one (1) or two (2) years.

The Board shall elect its own: chairman, vice chairman, secretary and treasurer; who in turn will constitute its Executive Committee>

SECTION IV. DOCTRINE

Article I

Baptism--We believe that after you have been saved and made a profession of faith you must be baptized by emersion. This must be done by an ordained minister of God, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, that is: providing you have the opportunity before death. This must be done to become a member of this body.

Article II

Footwashing and the Lord's Supper--Members of this body must observe the practice of footwashing and the Lord's Supper at least once yearly.

Article III

Tongues--The practice of speaking in tongues shall not be condoned by this body.

Article IV

Second and third works--The practice of sanctification and receiving of the Holy Ghost as a second and third work of grace shall not be permitted. We believe this takes the place at conversion and is one work of the Spirit without which we are not saved.

Article V

Women Preachers--This association will not permit a woman to preach or be ordained in any capacity. 1 Timothy 2:11, 12 & 15; Titus 2:3, 5 and 1 Corinthians 14:34,35.

Article VI

National Treatise--for further clarification of our doctrinal practices we refer you to the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article VII

HOMOSEXUALS--That no known practicing homosexual shall be admitted to this body. Any conference belonging to this body and allowing such practices shall be dealt with. Failure to comply with this by-law, after reasonable labor by the State Association, shall result in dismissal from this body.

SECTION V. BY-LAWS

Article I

Alteration--The constitution and by-laws may be altered or amended at a regular session of the association by a two-third vote of those present, provided that notice shall have been filed with the clerk at the preceding session, showing that it is desired. Copies of amendments shall be made available by the clerk upon request by association members for study.

Article II

Dues--Each quarterly meeting shall make a report of its work before the regular session of the state association with delegates and a contribution of \$25.00 plus \$6.00 for each church in the quarterly meeting. We recommend an increase of \$1.00 per year for each church until it has reached \$10.00 per year for each church. In 1979 this

would be \$7.00 per church, in 1980 \$8.00 per church, in 1981 \$9.00 and in 1982 \$10.00 per church.

Article III

Rights—This association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or government usage coming before it properly from any of the bodies composing this organization, or act upon any appeal that may be made from any body belonging to the association.

Article IV

Government—The Kentucky State Association shall be governed by this compact of Constitution and By-laws, and by parliamentary procedure.

Article V

Rules of Decorum —Any minister or delegate not abiding by this decorum shall be dealt with immediately by said association.

1. This association shall be opened with singing and prayer and closed with prayer.
 2. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise to his feet and address the moderator.
 3. Each person thus speaking shall not be interrupted in speech, except by moderator, nor shall the moderator interrupt unless he breaks order.
 4. The person speaking shall adhere to the question and in no wise cast reflection on the person who may have spoken before him.
 5. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission of the association.
 6. Members shall address one another as Brother, Brethren, or Sister.
 7. No member of this association shall absent himself when the association is sitting in conference without leave of the moderator.
 8. The names of the members of the association shall be enrolled and called over as often as the association thinks necessary.
 9. No person shall speak longer than 5 minutes at one time without permission of the moderator.
 10. The rights of the minority shall be respected.
- The above Rules of Decorum are to be read at each state association.

Article VI

This compact (Constitution and by-laws) may be used as a guideline by quarterly meetings in bringing forth a Constitution and By-laws to govern their own association.

Article VII

Repugnant—No quarterly meeting shall be repugnant to this Kentucky State Association By-laws. Neither are these by-laws intended to be repugnant to the treatise of the National Association. We recommend that the Kentucky State Association accept the National Association Treatise.

Article VIII

Transfer—No church may transfer to another quarterly meeting except it have a letter of recommendation from the quarterly meeting it is leaving. The church must be in fellowship with its quarterly meeting and the Kentucky State Association.

Article IX

Article of Faith—The Original Articles of Faith of Free Will Baptists in the United States is referred to in part two of the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article X

Attendance—It is recommended that all ordained ministers attend the Kentucky State Association for Christ sake and His Kingdom.

Article XI

Dress—It is recommended that all the brethren of the Kentucky State Association of Free Will Baptists shall appear clean shaven and with hair of a modest length at all worship services. That all sisters observe modesty in their dress and general appearance. No pants suits nor shorts are to be worn. It is further recommended that the quarterly meetings use this as a guideline.

Article XII

Church Covenant—It is recommended that the Church Covenant be read by the pastor of each church at least once a month.

Article XIII

Business Withheld—No business having come before the business committee shall be withheld from the floor of the assembly to be acted upon without permission from the moderator. Otherwise parliamentary procedure shall be applied at once.

SECTION VI. MIINISTERS

Article I

Disqualifications—The Kentucky State Association will grant no minister a recommendation card who has been married to two different women and both are alive at the present. No minister will be granted a recommendation card who has a wife that has been married to two different husbands and both are alive at the present time.

Article II

Parliamentary Law—It is recommended that all ministers study the principles of Parliamentary Law.

Article III

Pastor Membership—It is recommended that a minister become a member of the quarterly meeting in which he pastors a church.

Article IV

Excluded Ministers—Any quarterly meeting belonging to the Kentucky State Association of Free Will Baptists permitting a minister who has been excluded to preach in one of its churches shall be dealt with by the Kentucky State Association.

Article V

Letter of Recommendation—No minister shall carry a card or letter of recommendation more than (6) six months in his possession and will have voting rights, he must put his letter in some Free Will Baptist Conference. It is recommended that if he wants to change conference that he apply for membership in the other conference, and let the conference send for the letter.
