This committee was retained and asked to investigate further, and were authorized to approach the four Conferences for the necessary financial help that will be needed. Bro. C. A. Nevman replaced Homer Joseph on the Committee.

The Home Mission Committee reported that in their judgement the Yearly Meeting was not ready for an evangelist. Accepted

Bro. Newman and Alicie reported on the State Home Mission Board plans and thoughts. They reported a depleted treasurery and asked that the pastors and people present support the work actively.

The Executive Board report was accepted and the rules governing their conduct was approved. Rev. Arnold Moore was elected to the vacancy created by the expiration of the term of Rev. Eld. Mingus.

The letter from the Central Ohio Conference was read as a matter of information. It was accepted.

The Ministerial Cards were given out. A motion to grant cards unless there

was an objection passed.

A motion, which came as a result of a recommendation of the Ministerial Association, that we ask the State Association to consider the possibility of purchasing a seal to be applied to all official Ministerial Cards, passed.

Rev. Fred Evans was chosen as Moderator for the ensuing year:
