#### MINUTES OF ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION

On Friday Night, March 9, 1956, delegates from six Free Will Baptist Churches---Prices Creek, Mine Fork, Terrys Fork, North Bend, Green Mountain and Bowditch; with the following Free Will Baptist Ministers: Rev. T. E. Woody, Rev. E. P. Blevins, Rev. E. L. Beachboard, Rev. James Peterson, Rev. Hayden Honeycutt, Rev. Alvin Mc-Peters, Rev. Josephine Bryant Blevins and Rev. Frances Radford convened in business session with the North Bend Church for the purpose of organizing a new Free Will Baptist Association.

The service was opened with congregational and quartet singing, after which we were led in prayer by Brother Blevins. As directed by the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists, we had requested an advisory council from another Free Will Baptist Association. This council consisted of Brother E. O. Connelly, Moderator; Brother John Cansler, Assistant Moderator; and Brother R. C. Mumpower, member; all ordained ministers of the Blue Ridge Free Will Baptist Association. The message of the evening was brought by Brother Cansler, who read from St. Luke 11, and spoke on the subject, "Praying For Something."

Following the worship service, in business conference Brother T. E. Woody, our oldest minister, was elected Moderator; Sister Frances Radford, Clerk; and Brother Mosco Towe, Reading Clerk. Letters of authorization from each of the six organizing churches were read, and the following delegates seated:

Prices Creek Church--Brothers Mosco Towe, James Burleson, Joe Blankenship, Roy Austin, Berle Ledford, Charles Penland, and Robert Arrowood.

Green Mountain Church--Brothers Erskine Miller, Earl Fox, Joe Woody, and Fred Blankenship. Mine Fork Church--Brothers Frank Laws, Uranus Deyton, Sid Laws and Hubert Freeman, and Sisters Mary Laws and Essie Laws.

Bowditch Church--Brothers Cassie Thomas, Roscoe Briggs, Clarence Byrd, Alec Hensley, James Ray, and Sisters Julia Boone, Elsie Thomas and Pearl Briggs.

Terrys Fork Church--Brothers W. Dell Woody, T.A. Watts, and Sisters Vivian Gardner and Essie Hicks.

North Bend Church––Brothers Noah Hughes, Bert Renfro, Nate Renfro, Landon Briggs, and John Renfro and Sister Lydia Duncan.

The name, Mt. Mitchell Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina was presented and unanimously adopted by the body.

A Constitution was presented and adopted by unanimous vote.

An offering to pay the expenses of the brethren who came to serve as our advisory council was received in the amount of \$25.00. The council then asked permission to accept only \$10.00, and to donate the remainder to the treasury of the new Association. The donation was accepted with thanksgiving. We were then led in a prayer of consecration by Brother Connelly. Several brethren then spoke briefly concerning the purpose of the new organization, and our special need of the leadership and power of the Holy Spirit; among them, Brother Blevins and Brother Beachboard. Another business session was appointed for tomorrow night at 7 o'clock by the Moderator, after which we adjourned, with Brother Mumpower leading the closing prayer.

#### SATURDAY NIGHT SESSION

Service opened with congregational singing of "Glad Reunion Day" and "Oh, What A Saviour". Prayer led by Sister Radford, followed by another song, "Blessed Jesus Loves You Too." Preaching by Brother Beachboard from St. John 13:34, 35. Subject: "A New Commandment".

The business session following preaching was opened by some pertinent remarks by Brother Woody, our Moderator. The minute of Friday evening's session was then read and adopted. Election of other officers provided for by the Constitution were elected following adoption of the minute. Brother E. P. Blevins was chosen Assistant Moderator, Brother Joe Woody, Treasurer; Sister Frances Radford, Historian; and Brothers Mosco Towe, Noah Hughes and Eckerd Hunter to constitute the Executive Board. By-laws to the Constitution adopted Friday evening were submitted at the request of the Moderator and unanimously adopted by the body.

It was moved by the clerk and voted by the body to send to the Jacks Creek Association a letter of explanation concerning our new organization. Moved and voted to adjourn to convene with Green Mountain Church, Thursday, September 6, 1956 at 10:30 a.m. in our first annual session.

Following adjournment of Associational business, Ministers' Conference was organized, with the reading and adoption of a Constitution and By-laws and the election of officers as follows: Brother E. L. Beachboard, Moderator, Brother C. H. Honeycutt, Assistant Moderator; and Sister Josephine Bryant Blevins, Clerk. An Ordaining Council was chosen, consisting of Brothers E. P. Blevins, T. E. Woody, and Alvin McPeters. An offering was received for the use of the clerk and historian in purchasing record books and license and ordination blanks. Adjourned to convene with Prices Creek Church on Friday before the 5th Sunday in July, 1956.

#### MINUTES OF FIRST ANNUAL SESSION

The first annual meeting of the Mt. Mitchell Free Will Baptist Association convened with the Green Mountain Free Will Baptist Church, Burnsville, N. C., Route 1, Thursday morning, September 6, 1956 at 10:30 a.m. Service was opened with congregational singing of "Holy Light, Keep Shining Upon Me", "The Light On The River" and "Climbing Up The Highway", after which we were led in prayer by Brother Ebb Wheeler. The introductory message, one singularly appropriate, was delivered by the Moderator, Brother T. E. Woody, from 1 Corinthians 12 and 13, his subject being, "Charity Never Faileth." Prayers during the service led by Brother Blevins and Sister Radford. Service closed with Christian handshake and rejoicing.

Following worship, the roll of churches was called and delegates assigned for lunch. Remarks by Brother Blevins and Brother Wheeler preceded benediction by Brother Woody and adjournment for lunch.

Assembled for afternoon session with congregation singing of "Amazing Grace". Devotional reading from one of the Psalms by Brother Hayden Honeycutt. Prayer led by Brother Alvin McPeters. Moderator prepared for business by appointing Brother Mosco Towe and Joe Woody as reading clerks. Brother Levi Deyton was appointed to receive Disabled Ministers' Funds as churches were enrolled. Church letters were then called for and delegates enrolled as follows:

An offering in the amount of \$14.45 was received to supplement the minute fund submitted by the churches to the reading clerks, who also constituted a finance committee.

After seating of delegates, the following officers were elected: Sister Frances Radford, Clerk; Brother T. E. Woody, Moderator, and Brother Mosco Towe, Treasurer. Committees were then appointed as follows:

Committee on Temperance: Brothers E. P. Blevins and Ebb Wheeler.

Committee on Obituaries: Sister Maude Ray and Sister Josephine Blevins.

Committee on Resolutions: Brothers Clyde Duncan, Alec Hensley, and Hubert Freeman. Committee on Deeper Devotion: Brothers Ebb Wheeler, Joe Blankenship, and Roy Austin.

Committee on Sessions: Brothers Luther Renfro, James Burleson, Joe Woody, W. D. Woody, Roscoe Briggs and Carmon Laws.

Committee on Orphanage: Brothers Ralph Cook and Mosco Towe, and first named delegate on each church letter.

Committee on Disabled Ministers' Fund: Brothers Joe Woody, Alvin McPeters, and Fred Blankenship.

Committee on Churches and Pastors: Brothers C. H. Honeycutt, Frank Laws and Robert Arrowood.

Committee on Spiritual Promotion: Sister Frances Radford, Sister Faye McPeters, and Sister Bertie Hensley.

Committee on Lord's Acre Work: Brothers Levi Deyton, James Burleson, Alec Hensley, W. D. Woody, Hubert Freeman and Earl Fox.

Following completion of committee appointments, Brother Ebb Wheeler, visiting minister from the Toe River Free Will Baptist Association, was welcomed to a seat in our body.

Ministers present were then enrolled as follows:

Honeycutt--(Note: Clerk failed to get Brother Honeycutt's address, but thinks that Marion, North Carolina, c/o Post Master, will locate him.)

Rev. Frances Radford, Mars Hill, North Carolina, Rt. 2

Rev. T. A. Watts, Weaverville, North Carolina, Rt. 1, and Rev. E. L. Beachboard, Nebo, North Carolina, Rt. 1, were not present.

Rev. James Peterson, Travellers Rest, South Carolina, Rt. 2, was also absent, due to sickness.

#### Deacons present enrolled as follows:

Moved, seconded and voted to designate the fund heretofore known as Disabled Ministers' Fund as the Aged and Disabled Ministers' Fund. Business session adjourned for preaching following intermission by Sister Edith Pauley of South Side Free Will Baptist Church, Erwin, Tennessee.

Reconvened following short intermission for worship. Service opened with singing by the choir of the local church, "Voices Calling Me." Congregation called around altar for prayer led by Brother Roscoe Briggs. Sister Pauley read for her text Isaiah 54:2. We were blessed with a wonderful service, which closed with a mighty outpouring of the Spirit of rejoicing and several testimonies.

### THURSDAY NIGHT SERVICE

The congregation reassembled at 7:30 p.m. for preaching by Brother C. H. Honeycutt. The choir opened the service by singing, "Lord, Lead Me On," "Heaven's Jubilee", and "That Glad Reunion Day". Mrs. Howard Whitson then sang two solos, accompanying herself at the piano. Her songs were "Chilly Jordan" and "The Lord Will Make A Way Somehow". She was followed by the Big Creek Church choir singing, "Surely I Will, Lord", "In God's Garden", "When The Sun Goes Down", and "We Should Walk Together". Then Brother James Burleson gave his testimony and sang, "Just A Closer Walk With Thee", after which we were led in prayer by Sister Opal Blankenship. Brother Honeycutt read for his text 1 John 4:1, from which he brought an inspiring message. The message was followed by more singing, Christian handshake and much rejoicing in the Spirit. Dismissed to meet at 9 a.m. Friday morning.

## FRIDAY SESSIONS AND SERVICES

The Associational body reconvened Friday morning at 9 o'clock. Singing of "Mansion Over The Hilltop" and "I've Been A Waitin'" by the congregation opened the service. Moderator then called body to order and asked Brother Alvin McPeters to lead the opening prayer. Sister Josephine Blevins as appointed temporary clerk in Sister Radford's absence, due to illness. Rules of decorum were read by Moderator, preceding calling for committee reports.

The report of the Committee on Missions was called for and discussed by Brother James Burleson, Brother Woody, Sister Blevins, Brother Frank Laws, Brother McPeters, and Brother Howard Whitson. Report adopted.

(Clerk's Note: All committee reports will be found grouped together in the minute for the convenience of the reader.)

Report of Committee on Education submitted and discussed by Sister Vinita Miller, Brother Joe Woody, and Brother Blevins. Adopted by body as read and discussed.

Report of Committee on Sunday Schools received and discussed by Brothers C. H. Honeycutt, Erskine Miller and Roscoe Briggs. Adopted.

The Committee on Temperance submitted its report and was discussed by Brother E. P. Blevins. Further discussion tabled until afternoon to make time for worship. Adjourned until 2:0'clock p.m. -8Assembled at 11 a.m. for preaching by Brother Ebb Wheeler. Songs by the Patterson Branch Singers, "It's Worth It All To Be His Chile", "When The Sun Of Life Goes Down", and "I'll Wear A White Robe" opened the service. Brother Wheeler's text was Daniel 4:3, from which he delivered a splendid message. Service closed with much rejoicing and fellowship.

Afternoon session convened at 2 o'clock with singing of "Amazing Grace" and "City On The Hill". The Superintendent of the Free Will Baptist Orphanage, Brother Jackson and his daughter were present to represent the children of the Home, and Miss Jackson sang a solo, "Constantly Abiding", after which her father gave an interesting discussion of the home and children. An offering amounting to \$40.25 was received by Brother Jackson for the Orphanage, which was supplemented by \$30.67 from the churches, making a total of \$70.92. Adjourned for preaching at 3 p.m.

The afternoon worship hour was opened with singing by the Jackson sisters. Then Sister Josephine Blevins read for her text Exodus 3: 1–9 and Hebrews 2: 1–5. Her subject: "This is the beginning of days and of months." Good service closed with much rejoicing in the Lord. Recessed until 7:30 p.m.

Evening worship opened at 7:30 o'clock with singing by the choir, "Where No Stormy Winds Blow" followed with a special song, "Somebody Will Know Me In Heaven" by the Price and Freeman Quartet, and the Patterson Branch Singers rendering "The Father Turned His Back". Opening prayer led by Brother Charlie Miller, after which Sister Vinita Gail Miller read for her text 1 Corinthians 8:13 and 1 Peter 5:10, dwelling especially upon the words, "If meat make my brother to offend, 1 will eat no flesh while the world standeth...", from which she brought a profitable message. Dismissed in prayer by Brother Woody.

#### SATURDAY SESSIONS AND SERVICES

Association met Saturday morning at 9 o'clock for transaction of business. Service opened by choir singing "The Light On The River", after which Brother Roscoe Briggs led the opening prayer. Remarks by the Moderator urging that business be expedited as rapidly as possible.

Report of Committee on Sessions received and adopted with amendment that time of annual meeting be changed to Thursday before the 4th Sunday in August.

Report of Committee on Deeper Devotion called for. Part of committee absent, and Bro. Blevins appointed to work with Brother Austin on report.

Brother Elzie Robinson, visiting minister from Jacks Creek Conference welcomed to a seat in our body.

Report of Committee on Churches and Pastors received and adopted without discussion.

Report of Committee on Spiritual Promotion received, discussed by Sister McPeters, and adopted.

Report of Committee on Temperance, tabled earlier, adopted without further discussion.

Oral report of Committee on Lord's Acre Work received and adopted. Voted to authorize this Committee (which is composed of one member from each church) to select a committee from their respective churches to work with this central committee in furthering the work in each local church.

Clerk requested and was granted authority to revise church letter form. Treasurer's report on Aged and Disabled Ministers' Fund. Report of Committee on Aged and Disabled Ministers' Fund received, discussed by Brother Joe Woody, Sister Radford, Brothers C. H. Honeycutt, Robert Arrowood, and Roscoe Briggs; and adopted by vote of body.

Brother Zenus Allen, from Jacks Creek Conference, welcomed to a seat in the body and a voice in our deliberations.

Special prayer requested by Brother Roscoe Briggs for E. P. Blevins, Jr., Brother & Sister Blevins young son, to be healed. Altar prayer for this request.

Report of Committee on Deeper Devotion submitted, discussed by Brother Blevins, Brother Roy Austin, Sister Ruth Franklin, and adopted by vote.

Moved, seconded and voted to use same Investigating Committee in Association and Ministers' Conference.

Committees on Resolutions and Investigation had no report to offer, except verbal request by Brother Levi Deyton that Lord's Acre Committee work up plans and present them at next Conference for a meeting early in 1957 to be held with each local church in the interest of the Lord's Acre work.

Offering taken for Moderator and Clerk in amount of \$8.81.

Clerk instructed by body to insert in the minute an expression of the Association's gratitude to the Green Mountain Church and Community for their excellent care of the Association.

Business of Association adjourned to meet with North Bend Church in August, 1957.

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Reassembled for preaching at 11 a.m. by Brother Zenus Allen. Service opened with singing "Heaven's Jubilee" and "Just A Little Talk With Jesus". Prayer led by Brother Elzie Robinson. Opening remarks by Brother Alvin McPeters, pastor of the host church. Testimony and song, "I'm On The Firing Line For My Lord" by Brother Elzie Robinson. Scripture lesson read by Brother Allen from Romans 13. Subject of discourse, "The Higher Power of God". Brother Allen brought a good message, and the service closed with Christian fellowship and rejoicing, testimonies and prayer.

## PROCEEDINGS OF MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

The Mt. Mitchell Free Will Baptist Ministers' Conference convened on Saturday afternoon following the Association in its first quarterly meeting. Service opened with congregational singing, "The Light On The River" and prayer led by Brother Honeycutt. Clerk then read minute of last session, and officers for the ensuing year were elected as follows: Brother T. E. Woody, re-elected Moderator; Brother Hayden Honeycutt, Assistant Moderator, and Sister Josephine Blevins, re-elected clerk.

Brother Elzie Robinson and Sister Ruth Franklin welcomed to a seat in the body.

Moved and seconded to authorize clerk to write Brother E. L. Beachboard for written statement regarding his intent to remain in our Conference.

Sister Vinita Gail Miller submitted to Ordaining Council for examination for license.

Ordaining council elected for ensuing year, Brother E. P. Blevins, chairman, Brother Alvin McPeters and Brother C. H. Honeycutt. Voted to hold next session of Conference with the Bowditch Church; Brother Blevins to preach the introductory message; Brother Woody to be his alternate.

Sister Miller examined publicly by Ordaining Council and granted license to preach the Gospel for one year by unanimous vote of the body.

Offering for Aged and Disabled Ministers' Fund received in amount of \$7.00. Dismissed in prayer, to reconvene at 7:30 p.m. in communion and feet washing service.

## SATURDAY NIGHT SERVICE

After opening song service, we were led in prayer by Brother Charlie Miller. Then Brother Alvin McPeters preached, reading from John 13, after which Brother T. E. Woody conducted communion and feet washing services. A wonderful service, with a large part of the congregation taking part was closed with great rejoicing and prayer. And so ended the first annual meeting of the Mt. Mitchell Association, a gathering so blessed with the manifestation of God's Presence that it will not be soon forgotten by those attending. May God grant it will be but the beginning of a work that will glorify His Name in the salvation and blessing of many souls!

CONSTITUTION FOR PRESENTATION TO DELEGATES OF FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCHES CONVENED IN BUSINESS SESSION WITH THE NORTH BEND CHURCH.

\* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \* \*

# ARTICLE 1

This Association shall be known as the Mount Mitchell Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

## ARTICLE 2

The objects of this Association shall be: to proclaim a full salvation and lift up a standard of holy living in accordance with the teaching of the Bible; to promote unity, fraternity, fellowship, and cooperation within the bounds of our own churches, and Christian charity toward all Christians; to encourage and engage in larger Christian enterprises than can be carried on by one church; to combine and direct the energies of the Free Will Baptists within its bounds in one sacred effort to encourage and promote the general spread of the Gospel, and all of its benevolent enterprises.

Tennessee: recognizing however, the truth stated therein,

 This Association shall be composed of all licensed and ordained ministers, and of delegates chosen and sent by each church within its bounds, said delegates being duly recommended by letter from the church to which they belong.
 Each church, irrespective of size, shall be entitled to five (5) delegates, with an additional delegate for every ten (10) members or fraction thereof above fifty (50). Each church is expected to send with its delegation a contribution to help defray the expenses of the Association and the causes which it fosters.

3. The Association disclaims the right to exercise lordship over the churches, or to have any power which entitles it to infringe upon the internal affairs or rights of any of the churches composing it. Each church shall consider its internal affairs to be its own business, but it shall not disrespect the Association and those placed in authority by the proper processes.

## ARTICLE 4 of the effect of the

The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to be represented by letter or delegation, providing however, that any church accused of disorderly walk or unscriptural doctrine shall have the same right as an individual in the church to have specific charges presented in writing, together with convincing evidence; a fair opportunity for defense, and to be considered innocent until proved guilty.

This Association shall make use of the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptists adopted by the National Association November 7, 1935, at Nashville, Tennessee; recognizing however, the truth stated therein, that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our only infallible rule of faith and practice.

### ARTICLE 6

Churches coming from another denomination will be carefully examined and approved as to doctrine and practice before being received as members.

#### ARTICLE 7

1. The officers of this Association shall be Moderator and Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and Historian, all of whom shall be elected for a term of two years, except the Moderator and Assistant Moderator, who shall be elected annually. They shall enter upon the duties of their offices at the close of the current session.

2. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over all the meetings of the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to preside in the absence of the Moderator.

4. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a faithful record of the proceedings of the Association in a business-like manner, to superintend printing and distribution of the minutes, and to give over all properties belonging to his or her office to his or her duly elected successor.

5. The clerk shall be paid a fee to be determined by the Association. Minutes of the Association shall be sent to all visiting Free Will Baptist Ministers.

6. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive all funds belonging to the Association, and to disburse same as directed by the Association. The treasurer shall be bonded for an amount sufficient to cover all the funds for which he is responsible. 7. It shall be the duty of the Historian to keep a record of such items of interest as may be useful in the future, especially a file of all the minutes, and to preserve the same in a book. He or she shall also be required to give over all properties of the office to the successor to the office.

## Hee, and willingness 8 ARTICLE 8 Constitution and 8y

The Association shall appoint annually such committees as it shall deem necessary to expedite its business. These committees may be called upon to serve in either a temporary or standing capacity. Temporary committees complete their work and make a report of it during the same session in which they are appointed. Standing committees are appointed to assist in such matters as may require service both during and between sessions. The Moderator is empowered to choose the Chairman of each Committee, and the delegates may assist in choosing other members of said committees from among their own ranks.

## ARTICLE 9

The Executive Board of this Association shall consist of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Historian, and three (3) members elected from the floor. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to have the supervision of the work of the Association between sessions. The Moderator and Clerk, by virtue of their respective offices, shall be Chairman and Secretary, repsectively, of the Executive Board.

## ARTICLE 10

It shall be the duty of this Association to encourage a sound ministry, such as present Christ as an all-sufficient Saviour, having made salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel, which is freely offered to all.

A church may become a member of this Association by making request by delegation, which delegation shall present a letter showing vital statistics of said church, provided however, that such church shall be examined as to doctrine, practice, and willingness to abide by the Constitution and Bylaws of this Association.

# ARTICLE 12

The by-laws of this Constitution shall be read annually immediately after the body is organized.

# ARTICLE 13

This Association advises all its church to commemorate the death and sufferings of our Lord at least twice a year, with the service of feet-washing to follow the communion.

## ARTICLE 14

This Association shall meet annually on Thursday before the second Sunday in September for the purpose of worship and the transaction of business. There shall be no less than two (2) worship services daily while the Association is in session.

## ARTICLE 15

This Association's printed Minutes shall consist of a record of all business transacted and all worship services during the annual meeting, the proceedings of the quarterly sessions of Conference, the Constitution and By-laws of the Association and the Constitution and By-laws of the Ministers' Conference, the Church Covenant, and such tables of statistics and blank forms as may be necessary.

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote at any annual meeting of the Association.

## BY-LAWS OF THE MOUNT MITCHELL ASSOCIATION OF THE ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF NORTH CAROLINA.

#### ARTICLE 1

A session of this Association shall meet annually.

## ARTICLE 2

This Association shall be opened with Bible reading and prayer.

## ARTICLE 3

There shall be no conversation with members, one with another, so as to interrupt business, while in session.

#### **ARTICLE 4**

Every person wishing to speak shall first arise to his feet, address the moderator and receive recognition.

## **ARTICLE 5**

No member shall interrupt another who is speaking.

#### ARTICLE 6

Every member shall attend to the subject under consideration.

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No member shall speak more than three (3) times on any one subject.

## ARTICLE 8

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Every motion made and seconded shall be acted upon after suitable discussion unless withdrawn by those who made it.

#### ARTICLE 9

A motion before the house must be acted upon before another motion can be made.

#### ARTICLE 10

On all motions, when a vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.

### ARTICLE 11

The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.

## ARTICLE 12

We will admit of no other title but that of Brother or Sister while in session.

#### **ARTICLE 13**

No member shall absent himself from the body while in session without permission of the Moderator.

#### ARTICLE 14 address the second second

Any person transgressing these by-laws shall be admonished by the Moderator.

No less than seven (7) members shall constitute a quorum.

## ARTICLE 16

These by-laws may be amended at any regular annual meeting by two-thirds vote.

CONSTITUTION FOR PRESENTATION TO MINISTERS" CON-FERENCE OF THE NEWLY FORMED MOUNT MITCHELL ASSOCIATION OF THE ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF NORTH CAROLINA.

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## ARTICLE 1

This body shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the Mount Mitchell Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

## ARTICLE 2

This body is formed under and by the authority of the Mount Mitchell Association, and shall be composed of its licensed and ordained ministers, with such delegates as provided by Article 8.

## ARTICLE 3

This body shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said Association, issuing license, prescribing qualifications for the ministry, conducting examinations and ordaining ministers, and at all times working for the most harmonious and effective ministry. Each licensed minister shall work under a license for a period of not less than one year; then being eligible for ordination, providing he can meet all other requirements set forth by the Ordaining Council.

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We deem it necessary for the protection of the Gospel not to receive anyone as a minister who has two living wives.

## ARTICLE 5

Suitable women may be ordained to the Christian ministry, provided there are no objections to such indorsement other than the matter of sex. (NOTE: This is a word for word copy of a ruling passed in the General Conference of the Free Will Baptist Church in 1886.)

## ARTICLE 6

We believe the Bible teaches that Christian women should wear modest apparel, have long hair, and avoid addorning their persons with useless jewelry. This body shall require its female members to be guided by these principles.

## ARTICLE 7 A Hertoti M touch ent to

The officers of this Conference shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be elected annually, and shall perform the duties usually performed by such officers.

## ARTICLE 8 And ARTICLE 8

Each church shall be advised by its pastor to send two delegates to each session of this Conference, with a letter of authorization from the church, which delegation shall enjoy equal privileges with the ministry, both in deliverations and in voting.

# ARTICLE 9

Each year, upon being organized, this body shall elect an Ordaining Council. This Council shall consist of three (3) ordained ministers. One member of this Council shall be

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retained from the preceding year's Council, the other two (2) to be elected at the discretion of the Conference.

#### ARTICLE 10

The Ordaining Council, when properly organized, shall have charge of all examinations and ordinations of candidates for the ministry, who have been ordered before it by the Conference. It shall also conduct due investigation into the social life of any candidate for ordination.

#### ARTICLE 11

This Conference may receive any Christian minister as a visiting member, and when thus received he may enjoy all rights and privileges of regular members except voting privileges.

### ARTICLE 12

This Conference shall meet on Friday before each fifth Sunday, with some church in the Association previously agreed upon, or at the call of the Moderator, provided that more than one session may not be held with any church during the same Conference year; and providing also that there be no session held at the fifth Sunday in April immediately following the adoption of this Constitution.

## ARTICLE 13

The Moderator is empowered, and it is his duty, to call an extra session of the Conference, upon receiving a properly signed petition from five (5) members, at least (3) three of whom shall be ordained ministers.

## ARTICLE 14

Each applicant for either license or ordination shall present a letter of recommendation from his church, properly signed by both pastor and clerk. He must of necessity be a member of a church within the bounds of this Conference. Any minister coming from another denomination shall first unite with one of our churches, then present a letter of recommendation from the church, just as any applicant for license or ordination.

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Any minister who does not represent either in person or by letter for two (2) successive sessions of Conference shall be charged with delinquency and shall be deprived of his vote on any question until his disability is removed by vote of the Conference. However, if the delinquent brother offer a satisfactory reason for his absence, a majority vote of the Conference may remove his disability.

## ARTICLE 16

The Conference may withdraw fellowship from any member who becomes disorderly, provided however, all Scriptural and Christian means have first been used to help him.

## ARTICLE 17 relates and don't a tom

#### **ARTICLE 18**

Any article of this Constitution or its By-laws may be suspended or amended by a two-thirds vote of the Conference.

## BY-LAWS OF THE MOUNT MITCHELL FREE WILL BAPTIST MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

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No licentiate shall succeed to ordination unless he can furnish sufficient evidence that he has obeyed the Scriptural admonition to<sup>,</sup>"Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of Truth." The Ordaining Council must be satisfied that he or she is divinely called, and the fruit of life and work during the period served under license must be satisfactory to the Ordaining Council. If it deems such a course advisable, the Ordaining Council may require a licentiate to renew his license, for as often as may be necessary, before ordination.

#### ARTICLE 2

Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contribution or by assessment of its members.

## ARTICLE 3

No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, care for its pastor according to its ability, and strive to go forward in spiritual progress and the advancement of the cause of Christ.

Any member who meddles with the work of another, or injures another's reputation for usefulness shall be subject to a charge of disorderly conduct, and shall be dealt with according to Article 16 of the Constitution.

### CHURCH COVENANT
