

### PROCEEDINGS.

Prayer and reading by Eld. W. B. Everett. Song No. 142. The introductory sermon was preached by Eld. R. F. Pittman. 1ext—Gal. 5:7. "Ye did run well; who did hinder you that ye should not obey the truth." "After the introductory, the Convention adjourned till 2 o'clock p. m.

# RESOLUTION IN REGARD TO GROUPING CHURCHES (Adopted)

And be it further Resolved:—That the grouping be done by one man appointed by each conference to act as chairman, assisted by delegates appointed by each church in his respective confrence, and thateach group shall call its pastor.

# RESOLUTION IN REGARD TO REPRESENTATION.

(Adopted)

Resolution by J. F. Casey.

Seeing the deficiency in our representation and the absurdity of one delegate filling so many places in our convention.

Be it Resolved:—That no minister either licensed or ordained shall be allowed to represent either! church, union or Conference: and further, Be it resolved, That no one delegate shall represent more than one body in this convention.

# ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

The following officers were elected for the ensuing year: S. H. Styron, President; J. F. Casey, Vice-President; C. K. Dunn, Treasurer; E. T. Phillips, Recording Secretary; M. C. Prescott, Field Secretary.

By a legal vote, the last clause of Article III, Section IV of the Constitution was dropped. The part left off reads as follows: "The Field Secretary shall also be chaiman of the Board of Home Missions."

Addresses were made on the importance of an Orphanage by W. R. Coats, M. C. Prescott, A. T. Dawson, W. J. Braxton, W. B. Everett, A. B. Utley, and others. The following were appointed to draw up some resolutions concerning the Orphanage and submit the same to this body now in session. A. T. Dawon, R. F. Pittman and W. J. Braxton.

### RESOLUTIONS

Be it Resolved:—That the State Convention ought to be the chief Executive Body of the Free Will Baptist denomination in North Carolina; And that we ask the conferences and churches to make it such.

The following resolutions on the Orphanage work were adopted:

Resolved: I. That this Convention appoint an Orphanage committee of five, whose duty it shall be to handle all Money raised for said work, locate a site for same. Also to report what is being done through the paper.

II. That we appoint a man in each conference to visit the churches and canvass among our members for the purpose of raising funds for the building of said orphanage.

III. That said men be paid for the time that they are actively engaged in the work.

The following Orphanage Committee was appointed:

J. F. Casey, Chairman, Goldsboro, N. C., J. E. Davis, Pikeville, N. C.; W. R. Coats, Four Oaks, N. C.; W. J. Braxton, Winterville, N. C.; M. C. Prescott, Ayden, N. C.

The following were appointed to canvass for the Orphanage: Eld. W. R. Coats the Cape Fear Conference; Eld. J. E. Davis the Western; Eld. D. W. Alexander the Central; Eld. Luke Wetherington the Eastern.

On motion, the canvassing agents be allowed 10 per cent of what they actually collect to defray expenses while in their various fields collecting.

The bonding of the treasurer of the Orphanage committee was left with said committee.

A number of the present and former students of the Seminary at Ayden met and organized under the following resolutions:

# RESOLUTIONS OF THE ALUMNI ASSOCIATION OF THE SEMINARY.

Be it Resolved: I. That this convention broadcast throughout the state that the students of the Seminary are organized into an organization known as the Alumi Association of the Seminary.

II. That each member urge every student of the Seminary to

donate a fund to be used in the building up of the Seminary, and that said funds be sent to the treasurer of the Association, Prof. B., F. Taylor, Ayden, N. C.

III. That each member do all in his power to aid the students in every way to build up the Seminary.

The following are the officers of the Association:

On motion, we advise the Sunday School Board to make any arrangements they may see proper to advance the Sunday School interests in the state for the denomination.

# EDUCATIONAL ADDRESS

The eleven o'clock service at the stand was dispensed with and the hour given to Prof. J. E. Sawyer, Principal of the Seminary, to make an educational address in the house. The Proffessor made an address full of sound logic showing the great

importance of education in North Carolina. He told of the great strides the state had made since the people had been arounsed to the great impoprtance of culture. That while some had argued that we were not able to educate our people, the great truth stared us in the face that we were too poor not to educate. That money put in brains was a fine investment, infact, the best that could be made from a material stand point. What should claim our attention more than the children of our homes upon which the future weal or woe of our state and nation depends? The address was well received and we feel that seed were sown that will produce much good in the community of the church and among our people in other sections.

# REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

Be it Resolved: I. That our Churches Union Meetings and Conferences send all money intended for these funds direct to the Convention Treasurer subject to the order of the Educational and Mission Boards, and to be spent by them in whatever way that will best advance our Educational and Missionary interests in the State.

II. That we urge our Mission Board to meet juarterly as set forth in Art. 4. Sec. 1, of the Convention Constitution; and their meetings work our for us the best ways and means for us to advance our Mission work. Also give us reports through the Baptist of what is being accomplished.

III. That the treasurer give through the Baptist juarterly reports of money received for Missions and Education, giving proper credits to those sending the same, also showing disposition of moneys used in order that our people may know what is or is not being done.

# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

—of the—

NORTH CAROLINA STATE CONVENTION

\_of the\_

ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH

OF JESUS CHRIST.

We, the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, assembled, in order to advance, promote and increase the cause of Jesus Christ and to increase, unify and develop the work, do establish and ordain this Constitution for the North Carolina State Convention.

# CONSTITUTION

# Article I.

This assembly shall be known as the North Carolina State Convention of the Original Free Will Baptist Church of Jesus Christ.

# Article II.

Section 1. The officers of the Convention shall be President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Field Secretary, Treasurer, Executive Committee, a State Board of Missions, a State Board of Education, and a State Board of Sunday Schools, elected annually by the Convention.

Section 2. The Convention shall be composed of all the ordained and licensed ministers in good standing and teaching no other doctrine than that taught by the Original Free Will Baptist, living in the State of North Carolina, one delegate from each church in good standing, one delegate from each Union Meeting, and one from each Conference or Association fr every 1000 members of fraction thereof.

#### Article III.

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside over each session, preserve order, govern the body according to established parliamentary usage and appoint all committees, unless otherwise provided for by the Convention.

Section 2. The duties of the Vice-President shall be the du-

ties of the President when that officer is not present.

Section 3. The duties of the Recording Secretary shall be to keep an accurate record of the transactions of the Convention and preserve the same, to keep all valuable documents of the Convention and surrender same to his successor in office when ordered to do so by the Convention.

Section 4. The duties of the Field Secretary shall be to correspond with those desirous of knowing anything pertaining to the work of the Convention. He shall also from year to yaer pre-

pare a statistical table showing the increase in membership, church property and other data pertaining to the work of the church. He shall read same at each session of the annual Convention, and shall refer the same to the Recording Secretary for record.

Section 5. The duties o the Treasurer shall be to keep all money belonging to the Convention and pay out the same only by order of the Convention when said order is signed by the President and Secretary, except money reaised for Home Missions, which shall be paid out by order of the Home Mission Board when said order is signed by the Chairman of the Board.

The Treasurer of the Convention shall also be Treasurer of all the the Boards and Committees of the Convention.

Section 6. The duties of the Executive Comlittee shall be the duties of the Convention when not in session; said committee shall have the power to call extra sessions when in its judgment such sessions become necessary; said committee shall have power to suspend any officer of the Convention when that body is not in session and said officer or officers prove a failure in his or their official duties or prove to be non-Christian in his work, or detrimental to the cause of Chrisit, and appoint others to fill said vacancies and any other vacancy which may occur from various causes and all officers thus appointed shall hold office until the next regular Convention. The Executive Committee shall be composed of the President of the Convention as Chairman, the chairman of the Home Mission Board, the Chairmanman of the Sunday School Board, the chairman of the Educational Board and one or more to be appointed by the Convention.

#### Article IV.

Section 1. The Home Mission Board shall be composed of one member from each conference or association belonging to the Convention. The Home Mission Board shall look after the home missions in the State. It shall have the power to appoint state and district Evangelists and Missionaries.

The Vice-President shall be chairman of the Home Mission Board. The Board shall elect three members to act as Executive Committee to meet juarterly and attend to home mission work, with what aid the other members can give. The Board may collect and use all money belonging to the Convention intended for home missions, using such money within the bounds of the Convention. The Treasurer of the Convention shall be a member of the Home Mission Board and shall pay all orders when signed by the Chairman and Secretary of the Board, when there is home mis-

sion money with which to pay.

The Convention may at all times devise ways and means to increase the support of home missions.

Section 2. The duties of the Board of Education shall be to look after the educational interests of the church and young ministers.

Section 3. The duties of the Sunday School Board shall be to look after the interests of the Sunday School work in the state, and they may put a field-worker in the efild to encourage and promote the Sunday School cause. They may devise ways and means for the support of said field worker. One duty of the field worker shall be to prepare a statistical table of the number of churches with and without Sunday Schools, with the number enrolled and any other data in the interest of Sunday Schools he may deem proper, and make an annual report of same to the Convention.

### Article V.

Section 1. The Convention shall have no power that is not granted by this Constitution, which shall not be changed or altered only by a two-thirds vote of all members present in a regular session.

Section 2. This Convention shall have a right to say who shall become members, and shall have a right to exclude any member, conference or association from its fellowship for false doctrine, departing from faith, or for non Christian conduct.

Section 3. The Convention shall not admit for membership, any minister, church, conference or association that does not teach and practice the doctrine and usage of the Original Fred Will Baptist Church.

The Convention shall provide itself with a seal, said seal to be placed on all official papers.

### Article VI.

Section 1. The duties of delegates shall be to attend each session of the Convention, answer to roll and serve on committees when appinted.

Section 2. Delegates shall have the right to speak on any subject before the Convention, by first addressing the President and obtaining the floor.

Section 3. Each delegate will be expected to bring a collection from the body he represents for Home Missions, Education and Convention purposes.

Delegates guilty of non-Christian conduct shall be expelled from the Convention and be reported to the body that sent them.

### Article VII.

Section 1. The following committees shall be appointed at each session of the Convention: Condition of Church in General, Temperance, Credentials, Ways and Means, and any other that from time to time may be needful.

Section 2. The order of business shall be:

- 1. Singing.
- 2. Prayer.
- 3. Introductory Sermon.
- 4. Recess.
- 5. Calling Convention to order by President, or in his absence, Vice-President, or Secretary.
- Calling for corresponding letters, reading same, enrolling delegates and calling the roll.
- 7. Report of Field Secretary.
- 8. Appointment of Committees.
- 9. Report of Executive Committee.
- 10. Election of New Executivie Committee.
- 11. Report of State Board of Missions.
- 12. Election of New Board of Missions.
- 13. Report of Board of Education.
- 14. Election of New Educational Board.
- 15. Report of Sunday School Board.
- 16. Election of New Sunday School Board.
- 17. Election of Officers.
- 18. Unfinished business.
- 19. New business.
- 20. Miscellaneous.
- 21. Report of Committees.
- 22. Treasurer's report.
