EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(make mention of conference in Fairborn - when the executive committee was charged to bring recommendations - goals - etc. our work last year. Program - Credentials)

Work during last year. The executive committee met 3 times during the year and today at 9:00 A.M. to act on Credentials.

On October 17th we met at Williams Road Church in Columbus - 4 members present- Livingston absent. In this meeting we made out the directives of the New Mission Committeed as the association authorized us to do last year.

We made out the directives' for the borad, also the church extension program, and sent them to all members of the Mission Committee.

On October 31st, with 4 members of Executive Committee present (Frisbee absent) with 5 members of the Mission Board we went over the board's duties - church Extension, and Mission program. All members of the board present agreed to what our committee had drawn up.

All this was explained in Decembers issue of the Ambassador.

While on this item of business the Executive Committee recommends to the State Association, that the Mission board function for 1 year and the their terms of office will be as follows starting at this association:

Term start 1965 Rev. Eddie Dollar and Rev. Ernest Percell - 4 years Rev. Thomas Moore and Rev. Clarence Newman - 3 years Rev. Andrew Parsons and Rev. Jerry Griffith - 2 years Rev. Fred Taylor - 1 year. These directives were printed in the Ambassador and I can read them if necessary.

On Saturday May 1st we met again at the same church. (Centrally located for all members) to make up the program, and make some recommendations to our association.

Rec. No. 1 The Association last year voted to adopt the co-operative program of the

Executive Committee con't National Association in principle, lay it on the table for 1 year and then vote on it at this session. It was also noted that Rev. Billy Melvin our National Association Executive Secretary was to make an itinerary, but could not accompany him due to ill health. He can tell you the evaluation of these meetings. We agreed to allow Bro. Melvin 15 or 20 minutes on the program.

We make no recommendation, and the association proper can act on this, but we agreed if it was passed, it will be up to our lower bodtes to adopt or reject, and then the local church will have the final say as to whether they want it or not.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

ITEM # L.

Whereas, there is a present effort to unite all religious bodies into an organic super world church under the guise of Christian unity known as the ecumenical movement and whereas, this attempt to unite all religions farther into an organic entity ignores the N.T. teaching to the church as the mystical body of Christ and the spiritual bond of Christ Kingdom, and whereas, the historic doctrines of Fundamental Christianity and mergers and scheme do bring all Christendom under the control of Rome, and Whereas, the Bible plainly forgids us to "Be unequally yoked together with unbelieveres", (II Cor. 6:14) and that we are to "come out from among them and be ye separated saith the Lord" (II Cor. 6:17) and that we are commanded plainly in II John 10-11 "If there come any unto you and bring not their doctrine, receive him not unto your house, neighber bid him God speed; For he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds and whereas, there plain Scriptural commands have been misinterpreted in evangelistic Christian under today in so-called "Co-operative evangelism" which allows any and all churches regardless of their doctrinel position or attitudes to Christ, and the Bible to take active parts in such evangelistic efforts and whereas, that tendency is contrary to the historic positions of F.W.B:

Therefore be it resolved , that we the State Association of Ohio, in their 27th session on the 26th day of June do call upon the churches and ggencies of our denomination to be en guard of any and all evidences of ecumenicalism in our ranks and do expose it in the light of the Word of God. That we encourage our pastors to inform their congregations as to the serious errors in the ecumenical movement through preaching and teaching of the Word of God.

That we respectfully urge our churches and pastors to refuse to sponsor cogoperate or promote any interchurch endeavor, such as evangelistic campaign, forums, etc. which are endorsed, sponsored or proted by those who are not Bible believing Fundamental Christian.

REPORT OF THE AMBASSADOR

We would like to report that this has been our best year in publishing the paper - (Said same thing last year) Last year 59 churches were supporting regularally with 2 conferences. We are happy now to report 85 churches are supporting and 6 conferences. We siad last year we felt when we hit between the 2200 and 2500 mark we will hit our peak, and as of now we are over 2000 and still increasing. At 2400 This has become our No. 1 project in the State, and we are happy to have a little part in getting out the printed page. (It cannot be evaluated.) This is basically a church and State news magazine and from reports of our readers we inted to keep it on this level. So far we are paying our way, and we thank God for that .- Explain about ot er State Papers on Subscription basis. (Subsidized) I spent 2 days in Nashville, to exchange ideas with other editors, and this was very enjoyable. I visit as many conferences as I pssible can in explaining about our work. We try to improve the paper each mont, and we trust to give you a better magazine in the future. Note June's adition cost over \$500.00 We have around 390, 40 coming in each month. We had to have a different addressing machine - Note the cost \$200.00 originally. We feel we can not longer give this magazine away we must have some money, it is too good a paper just to receive free; Costs around 22¢ per copy.

I want to make a proposal to this body, If I keep this job, (and the Executive Committee has give me the go ahead) I am going to have some help (paid help) to assist me.. This magazine is printed by and for this State Association, yet it does not contribute 1 cent for its support.

I am making the following recommendations after much thought and prayer that the Association pay \$50.00 per month on the paper \$25.00 for an assistant to the editor - \$25.00 for the expenses of the paper. We have equipment to keep up - typewritiers need cleaned and over hauled (could use one more) Addressing machine - etc.

This recommendation can be handled through the business committee or on the floor now.
