Tri-State Conference Clerk Rev. **Jeremy Luthy** will be bringing the Friday morning message from the theme <u>"A 2020 Vision"</u>. The Friday morning message is on the subject, "Watching Vigilantly".

Brother Luthy was ordained by the Tri-State Conference of Ohio in 2002. He graduated from Welch College in 2007 with a B.A. in Pastoral Training. He currently assists in the ministry at Ambassador Free Will Baptist Church in Cincinnati. He serves as the clerk of the Tri-State Conference, and serves on the Ohio State FWB General Board and Executive Committee.

He has been married to his wife Nicole for 14 years and has a daughter Josilyn (7), and son Findlay (2).



National Association Executive Secretary Dr. Eddie Moody is scheduled to preach on the subject, "Looking Anxiously".

Dr. Moody was selected as the National Association Executive Secretary at the 2019 National Association in Cincinnati. He was pastor of Tippett's Chapel FWB Church in Clayton, NC, 2000-2020. He was professor of counselor education and associate dean of the School of Education at North Carolina Central University, where he served since 1995. A licensed professional counselor supervisor and health services provider, the Licensed Professional Counselors Association of North Carolina named Moody Counselor of the Year in 2016. 



Item #4 Discussion was held concerning a change needed in the Bylaws due to a conflict in the description of a "quorum". <u>Page 7 Section D Meetings of the General Board</u> you will see that a quorum would be made up <u>from a majority of the number of the General Board Members</u>. Then on <u>Page 8 Section A 2. Meetings of the General Board c</u>, that a Quorum consists of those who attend the meeting.

Item #5 A request was received from the Liberty Association in Michigan to join the Ohio State Association. This matter was tabled pending further research and discussion.

The Committee then adjourned until next session.

Promotional Secretary's Report-2020

This will be my final report as Ohio Executive Secretary after serving 27+ years. The Lord has truly been faithful and He continued to bless in 2020.

Preaching

As you all know, 2020 was a challenging year because of the Covid-19. We were all hindered from doing what we normally have be able to do. Even with this, I am thankful to have preached in 28 church appointments, one conference, two church revivals and last year's State Meeting (General Board). I taught the lesson on the subject, "Why I Am a Free Will Baptist" in two churches. I attended a total of four conferences, the Ohio Executive Committee meeting (By Zoom), the International Mission WMO Dinner, the National Association (General Board) in Nashville, TN, the National Leadership Conference and two National Executive Committee Meetings in Nashville along with several Zoom Meetings. I would encourage you to use Brother Ben Crabtree, our new Ohio Executive Secretary in your conferences and churches.

Promotion

Our giving for 2020 for the State Office was mixed. The Ambassador Magazine had an income of \$10,301.00 which is down by \$1,820.75 under 2019, the State Office General Fund giving was \$13,931.33 which is down by \$114.67 under 2019 and Co-op giving was \$141,886.79 which up by \$472.56 over 2019. Total income for the Ohio Together Way Plan received in 2020 was \$478,154.61. This was less than 2019 receipts by \$12,313.36.

Our giving to the National Departments was *down* in 2020. This breakdown is as follows: Ohio gave \$138,481.25 to National Home Missions and \$146,921.57 to International Missions. Gifts to the Executive Office totaled \$20,421.21 and \$22,646.96 went to Welch College. Ohio churches gave a total of \$342,739.42 to National Ministries which is \$32,653.99 less than in 2019. In addition to this, Ohio gave to the \$71,208.23 to the FWB Family Ministries of Tennessee.

The approximate breakdown of percentages from all 2020 Ohio gifts income breakdown are as follows:

The Together Way Giving Plan allows our churches to funnel all their state and national outside giving through the State Office. 114 churches, conferences and ministries have given through the State Office in 2020.

We promoted the twenty-third annual State Ministries Offering. We received \$4,700.00 from at least 43 churches and conferences.



Our State Association did receive two commissions from Brotherhood Mutual from their Partnership Program. One commission totaled \$15,000.00. This commission is for advertising for them. We received an additional commission of \$15,000.00 based on a formula of A Preferred Insurance Provider premiums verses our churches losses.

Men's Retreat

Because of the pandemic, we were forced to cancel our Ohio Men's Retreat for the first time in our history.

The Heartland Retreat Center was very gracious with us, allowing us to move our 2021 deposit of \$4,145.00 to our 2022 retreat. (According to our contract, they could have made us pay the whole amount for our 2021 contract.)

They did contact us and ask if we could help them with a project they were installing a filter system to clean the air that would help in stopping the transmission of virus and germs. The Board of Directors authorized a gift of \$500.00 to help in this project. Heartland was very appreciative of the gift.

The 2022 retreat is scheduled for January 20-22nd at the Heartland **Conference Center in** Marengo, Ohio.

This next year will be critical for this ministry. I think we would all agree that we personally and our association has benefited greatly from the retreat. I would encourage you to make sure to bring your men to the retreat in 2022. In addition, I would ask you to pray for this ministry and thank the Lord for what He has done for us over all these years!

Ambassador Magazine



In 2020 we completed our 60th year in publishing the Ambassador. The magazine had an income of \$10,301.00. Because of the pandemic and most of our churches not meeting, we only printed five issues in 2020. We delayed the May issue and did not print the July issue.

The magazine expense total of \$10,105.20 includes only the printing, clip art and shipping the magazine. It does not includes supplies (paper and shipping labels.) It also does not include any of the labor for (layout, proofreading and shipping and mailing of the magazine.)

We now have all available editions of the Ambassador on the Ohio website going back to 1959.

Pastor & Church Assistance

The State Office is there to assist churches in need of a pastor or pulpit supply. We are thankful that this ministry will continue to assist our pastors and churches when they are in need of counsel or advice.

Ohio Pastor's Retirement Plan

This voluntary plan allows the pastor of each church who gives to the Co-op Plan or directly to the Ohio State Association Office to have 5% of the gifts given to his retirement account at the National Board of Retirement in Nashville. If you would like to sign up, you can visit the registration desk and pick up an application.

We have 13 pastors signed up for the plan.

Two checks were sent to the pastor's accounts in 2020.

*In January we sent a check for \$1,623.40 for 13 pastors.

*In July we sent a check for \$1,617.95 for 14 pastors.



Web Page

We have redesigned our website. The website maintains our state ministry information, announcements, our history, beliefs, events calander, Executive Secretary's schedule, forms and links to our National, OYC, Ohio Missions and OWAC Pages. You can also find us on Facebook. We thank Brother Aaron Justice for assisting us in

the website redesign.

Ambassador Bookstore

The bookstore receipts were down compared to 2019. Our receipts for 2020 were \$4,130.21 and our product cost was \$2,235.33. Our actual sales for 2020 were \$3,972.35 compared with \$4,735.26 in 2019.





Randall House Commission

Our office represents Randall House Publications to our churches and conferences. We receive a quarterly commission based on Ohio FWB literature sales. In 2020 we received \$8,635.10 in commissions from Randall House based on our churches literature purchases for the year.

You support your own Ohio State Association when you use D6 material! You will also be presenting Free Will Baptist Doctrine to your students.

Building Repairs

We did run into some repairs that needed to be made to our building. First, our front door began to drag and we have to have it repaired at a cost of \$270.00. Then we had a leak in the walls and a plumber repaired it at a cost of \$240.00. Westerville Associate Pastor **Michael Sammons** fixed the drywall back and painted it. We thank him for taking care of that for us. We had to replace our refrigerator at a cost of \$159.00.

Ohio State Association Budget Notes

1. The Board of Directors requested and received authorization at 2013 State Meeting, "That if we incur a major expense such as the heating/cooling system, the copier, or computers, etc. that we would have permission to take care of these expenses with our savings or checking accounts." A Phone System, CC Terminal and Powerpoint Projector were added to this list in 2015.

"These additions would be contingent on a vote of the Board of Directors."

(The Board authorized the replacement of the copier at a cost of \$9,718.57 in 2021.)

(We did have two repairs that were paid for in 2021. The front door needed to be reinforced at a cost of \$270.00, and a water leak and wall repair that cost \$372.49. In addition, our refrigerator needed to be replaced at a cost of \$159.00.)

- 2. Since we are in transition of our staff in 2021 there is some overlap in salary as a new Executive Secretary and staff are brought on and trained. Also, the Board of Directors encountered additional expenses in the hiring of a new Executive Secretary. These costs were not reflected in the budget.
- 3. Any shortfall between income and expenditures will be covered by using a portion of the current State Office accounts.
- 4. In order to balance the 2022 budget, we had to add \$3,000.00 from the Brotherhood Commission.

Our Staff

We thank our staff, Ambassador Bookstore Manager Paul Keener, Bookkeeper Ruth Ann Castle (Who retired in 2020.) Ambassador Magazine Proofreader and Bookkeeper Linda Hayes and Ambassador Magazine Distribution Sue Keener. They all have done a wonderful job for our association and have been a joy to work with.

As most of you know Brother Paul came to help us in a very difficult time for our association and bookstore. He took hold of the bookstore ministry and helped get us through troubling circumstances and helped put us on solid ground. Ruth Ann also came on to help us at that same time. Sue came on later to help Paul with the bookstore and to help us ship and mail the *Ambassador Magazine*. Linda had proofread the *Ambassador* for many years and when Ruth Ann retired as our bookkeeper, she came in and filled that position. As all of you know, you cannot fulfill these ministries alone. I am truly grateful for all the staff who has helped me.

As, I close out this time of ministry, I do want to take the time to thank others who supported my efforts.

BYLAWS

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I. Name

This Association shall be called the Ohio State Association of Free Will Baptists and shall be composed of all regularly organized and disciplined Free Will Baptist local Associations as may embody themselves under these bylaws.

ARTICLE II. Purpose

The purposes of this State Association of churches are to assist in the establishment and maintenance of voluntary Associations of autonomous Free Will Baptist churches in fulfilling their ecclesiastical mission; to foster and promote involvement in the state and The National Association of Free Will Baptist churches; and to encourage cooperative support, conduct meetings, and create fellowship among regional associations of Free Will Baptist churches to further the cause of Christ. This organization operates as an association of churches exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes according to the Bible as interpreted by Free Will Baptist doctrine.

ARTICLE III. Statement of Faith

<u>Section A. Incorporation by Reference.</u> This State Association's statement of faith incorporates by reference parts II and III of A Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

<u>Section B. Additional Faith Provisions.</u> In addition to the beliefs incorporated by reference in Article III Section A of these bylaws, this State Association also adopts, as part of its statement of faith, the following positions:

1. Marriage and Human Sexuality

- a. We believe that the term "marriage" has only one legitimate meaning, and that is marriage sanctioned by God, which joins one man and one woman in a single covenantal union as delineated by Scripture. Marriage ceremonies performed in any facility owned, leased, or rented by this Association will be only those ceremonies sanctioned by God, joining one man with one woman as their genders were determined at birth. Whenever there is a conflict between the Association's position and any new legal standard for marriage, the Association's statement of faith, doctrines, and biblical positions will govern. (Gen. 2:24; Eph. 5:22-23; Mark 10:6-9; I Cor. 7:1-9)
- b. We believe that God has commanded that no intimate sexual activity be engaged in outside of marriage as defined in (a) above. We believe that any other type of sexual activity, identity, or expression that lies outside of this definition of marriage, including those that are becoming more accepted in the culture and the courts, are contradictory to God's natural design and purpose for sexual activity. (Gen. 2:24; Gen. 19:5; Lev. 18:1-30; Rom. 1: 26-29; 1 Cor. 5:1; 6:9-10; 1 Thess.

- 4:1-8; Heb. 13:4)
- c. We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as male or female. These two distinct, complementary genders together reflect the image and nature of God, and the rejection of one's biological gender is a rejection of the image of God within that person. (Genesis 1:26-27)
- 2. Family Roles. We believe that men and women are spiritually equal in position before God but that God has ordained distinct and separate spiritual functions for men and women in the home and the church. The husband is to be the leader of the home and men are to be the leaders (all ministers and deacons) of the church. (Galatians 3:28; Colossians 3:18; 1 Timothy 2:8¬15; 3:4, 5, 12). This Association will only accept for membership those entities (churches, local associations) where all ministers affiliated with the entities are males, and no church may become a member of this Association if it has any ministers who have two living wives or whose wife has two living husbands.
- 3. Abortion. We believe that human life begins at conception and that the unborn child is a living human being. Abortion is murder and constitutes the unjustified, unexcused taking of unborn human life. (Job 3:16; Ps. 51:5; 139:13-16; Isa. 44:24; 49:1, 5; Jer. 1:5; 20:15-18; Luke 1:36, 44)
- 4. Euthanasia. We believe that an act or omission that, of itself or by intention, facilitates premature death is assuming a decision that is to be reserved for God. We do not believe that discontinuing medical procedures that are extraordinary or disproportionate to the expected outcome is euthanasia. (Ex. 20:13; 23:7; Matt. 5:21; Acts 17:28)
- 5. Love. We believe that we should demonstrate love for others, not only toward fellow believers but also toward those who are not believers, those who oppose us, and those who engage in sinful actions. We are to deal graciously, gently, patiently, and humbly with those who oppose us. God forbids the stirring up of strife, the taking of revenge, or the threat or use of violence as a means of resolving personal conflict or obtaining personal justice. Although God commands us to abhor sinful actions, we are to love and pray for any person who engages in such actions. (Lev. 19:18; Matt. 5:44-48; Luke 6:31; John 13:34-35; Rom. 12:9-10; 17-21; 13:8-10; Phil. 2:2-4; 2 Tim. 2:24-26; Titus 3:2; I Peter 3:8-9; 1 John 3:17-18)
- 6. Lawsuits within the Church. We believe that Christians are prohibited from bringing civil lawsuits within the Church. We do believe, however, that a Christian may seek compensation for injuries from another Christian's insurance company as long as the claim is pursued without malice or slander. (1 Cor. 6:1-8; Eph. 4:31-32)
- 7. Protection of Children. We believe that children are a heritage from the Lord and must be absolutely protected within the body of Christ from any form of abuse or molestation. This Association has zero tolerance for any person, whether paid staff, volunteer, member of an affiliated church, or visitor, who abuses or molests a child. (Ps. 127:3-5; Matt. 18:6; Matt. 19:14; Mark 10:14)

<u>Section C.</u> Authority of the Statement of Faith. The statement of faith of Article III, including those provisions incorporated by reference, does not exhaust the extent of our

faith. The Bible itself is the sole and final source of all that we believe. We do believe, however, that the foregoing statement of faith and this document accurately represents the teaching of the Bible and, therefore, is binding upon all board and committee members, officers, local Associations, member churches, delegates, staff, and volunteers. All literature, whether print or electronic, used in the State Association shall be in complete agreement with the statement of faith. All activities permitted or performed in any facilities owned, rented, or leased by this state Association or engaged in by any staff member of the state Association (volunteer or paid) and all decisions of the administration of the state Association shall not conflict with the statement of faith.

ARTICLE IV. Membership

<u>Section A.</u> Composition. This Association shall be comprised as follows: Local Associations shall send the number of delegates equal to the number of member churches within their Association; along with one delegate from each Local Church within the state, together with all ordained authority and the Officers of this Association.

Section B. Requirements for Membership

- 1. A properly organized local association may request membership in the State Association by submitting to the Clerk or Moderator of the State Association a formal letter requesting membership three months prior to the annual meeting of the State Association. The letter must include the following information and be accompanied by the annual reporting form and annual dues:
 - a. a purpose statement of the local association;
 - b. a statement that the local association has adopted the Bible and the document, A Treatise of the Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., as its guide for faith and practice—a local association is not permitted to join this State Association that has not adopted the Treatise;
 - c. a statement that the local association is in agreement with the State Association's evangelistic enterprise; and
 - d. a signature of the Moderator or other officers representing the local Association.
- 2. The Executive Committee of the State Association should meet with an official delegation of the local association requesting membership prior to the annual meeting of the State Association.
- 3. The Executive Committee of the State Association will examine the reporting form and the dues submitted and make a recommendation to receive the local association into full membership of the State Association.
- 4. The Moderator shall, at the annual State Association meeting, welcome the local association moderator as a new member.

Section C. Duties of Members

- 1. It shall be the duty of each local association belonging to this Association to send the required annual fees along with a report of statistics and benevolent work to the annual State Association meeting on a form provided annually by the State Association.
- 2. Any local association that does not send in the proper form and the appropriate fees shall not be seated with its delegates until the matter has been resolved to the satisfaction of the Executive Committee. Failure to complete and return this form

for two successive annual meetings of the State Association may be the basis for dismissal from the State Association.

ARTICLE V. Officers

<u>Section A.</u> Composition. The officers of this Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk.

<u>Section B. Election and Terms of Office.</u> The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk shall be elected annually at the close of each session and may succeed themselves as often as the body of delegates shall decide.

Section C. Duties of Officers

- 1. Generally. The officers of this body shall submit, at every session, a report of the work done for this Association.
- 2. The Moderator shall:
 - a. be the principle executive officer of the Association;
 - b. sign, with the Clerk or any other people, officers, or agents of the Association as authorized by the General Board, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the General Board has authorized except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall otherwise be expressly delegated by the General Board or by this Association, or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed;
 - c. preside at the meetings of the State Association, the General Board, and the Executive Committee;
 - d. call special meetings of the General Board and Executive Committee with the consent of three other members;
 - e. receive an honorarium in an amount agreed upon by the body; and
 - f. fulfill whatever responsibilities may be commensurate with his office or delegated to him by the body or General Board.
- 3. The Assistant Moderator shall:
 - a. perform the duties of the Moderator in the absence of the Moderator or in the event of his death or inability or refusal to act;
 - b. when acting as Moderator, have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Moderator; and
 - c. perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board.

4. The Clerk shall:

- a. keep an accurate record of all business transactions by keeping the minutes of the Association and the General Board meetings in one or more books provided for this purpose;
- b. superintend the printing of the minutes;
- c. see that all notices are given in accordance with the provisions of these bylaws or as required by law;
- d. be custodian of the Association records and of the seal of the Association and see that the seal is affixed to all documents, the execution of which on behalf of the Association under its seal is duly authorized;
- e. perform all duties incident to the office of Clerk and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Moderator or by the General Board; and

- f. receive an honorarium of an amount agreed upon by this body.
- 5. The Assistant Clerk shall:
 - a. perform the duties of the Clerk in the absence of the Clerk, or in the event of his death or inability or refusal to act;
 - b. when acting as Clerk, have all the power and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Clerk; and
 - c. perform such duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the Clerk or by the General Board.

ARTICLE VI. Boards and Committees

<u>Section A.</u> Standing Boards. All standing boards shall be composed of seven members, and shall be elected for seven-year terms (with the exception of the General Board, see Article VII). Standing boards include the Home Mission Board, Board of Directors, CTS Board, and the General Board. Standing Board members shall be elected for 7-year terms.

The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the General Board, shall be elected as follows: The first named for a term of one year, the second for a term of two years and a third for a term of three years, the fourth for a term of four years, and the fifth for a term of five years, sixth for a term of six years and seventh for a term of seven years and thereafter each shall be elected for a term of seven years.

No person shall fill more than one office at the same time, except as he may become a member of the General Board by virtue of being a chairman of the board of which he is an elected member.

No person who is an employee of the State Association may be elected to any standing board of this body.

<u>Section B. Duties of Standing Boards.</u> The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields and to receive, hold, manage, use, or convey any funds and property entrusted to said boards. Each board or agency shall be required to present a projected budget to the State Association when in session. All budgets must be presented to the General Board for recommendation to the Association delegates for approval.

<u>Section C. Nominating Committee.</u> The Nominating Committee (comprised of three [3] persons) will be appointed by the State Moderator during the Saturday morning Business Session at each year's Association meeting to serve the following year. The duty of said committee is to recommend one nomination for each standing board, Executive Committee, and General Officers open for election for consideration to the Association.

<u>Section D. Executive Committee.</u> An Executive Committee, consisting of eight members of the General Board (described in Article VII), shall be composed of the officers of this Association (Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk of the State Association, and Assistant Clerk), and four other members to be elected annually by the delegates to the State Association, whose duty it shall be to act on all matters coming within the scope of the work of the General Board when said Board is not in session. It shall also plan and execute the program for the annual sessions of the Ohio State Association.

<u>Section E. Authority of Committees.</u> Committees, whether standing or special, have no authority to act on behalf of the Association. Their primary function is to research and recommend. Committees shall make available upon request all records and materials to the

Moderator and the General Board, who shall have the right to overrule any plans or decisions made by the committee. Each committee shall have a secretary that keeps minutes of each meeting and shall timely submit the minutes to the Clerk of the Association to be filed with Association records.

ARTICLE VII. The General Board

<u>Section A. Composition.</u> The General Board shall be composed of the officers of the State Association (Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Assistant Clerk); the chairman of all standing boards; the chairman of the Nominating Committee; and one member from each local association to be elected by the state body.

<u>Section B.</u> Terms of Office. Each Local Association General Board member's term of office shall be two years and so constituted that the expiration date of the term of office of half of these shall expire one year and the other half the following year. This shall be determined by alphabetical order of the name of the affiliated Association.

<u>Section C. Powers and Duties of the General Board.</u> The General Board shall have power to:

- 1. act in behalf of and for the State Association from one regular session to another;
- 2. call special meetings of the General Board when necessary by the Moderator, with the written consent of three other members of the Executive Committee, also call special meetings of the General Board upon the written request of a majority of its members;
- 3. elect such officers as may be necessary to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association; and
- 4. make written reports of all its work to each annual session.

<u>Section D. Meetings of the General Board.</u> A majority of the number of the General Board members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the General Board.

<u>Section E. Expense Reimbursements.</u> By resolution of the General Board, the Board members shall be reimbursed their reasonable and necessary expenses, including travel expenses reimbursed at the standard IRS mileage rate, for attendance of special meetings of the General Board and regular meetings of Executive Committee.

Section F. Elections

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in these bylaws, The General Board shall fill any regular vacancies that may occur in its own body as well as any irregular vacancies that may occur in any department of work between sessions of the State Association.
- 2. Any vacancy occurring in the General Board may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Board members though less than a quorum of the General Board.
- 3. All Board members elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his predecessor in office.
- 4. Any member of the General Board of the State Association who does not put forth any interest in or function on said board for the period of one year, shall have his

office declared vacant and a new member be elected by the General Board to fill his unexpired term of office.

ARTICLE VIII. Meetings of the General Board and the State Association

Section A. Meeting Requirements

- 1. State Association Meetings
 - a. Time/Date/Location
 - i. The session of this Association shall be held on Friday before the fourth Saturday in June, at 9:30 a.m., at a location to be determined by the Executive Committee.
 - ii. In the event the necessity arises from war or pestilence, or any cause which prevents a regular meeting of the State Association, whether such a condition is of a local or general condition, the General Board shall call and act with full authority in all matters pertaining to the general welfare of the State Association, provide whatever transaction passed shall be by two-thirds vote of the members present, and provided that such transactions shall not conflict with the purpose and edicts by the bylaws of the State Association.
 - b. Notice. The State Association Moderator/Clerk shall mail each individual church a notice of all meetings of the State Association meetings, including annual and any special meetings, at least one month in advance of the meeting, or in the event of a special meeting, as soon as is practically possible.
 - c. Quorum. A quorum consists of those who attend the meeting, provided it is either a stated meeting or one that has been properly called.
- 2. Meetings of the General Board
 - a. Time/Date/Location
 - i. Regular meetings.
 - ii. Special Meetings.
 - b. Notice.
 - i. Regular meetings.
 - ii. Special Meetings. Notice of any special meeting shall be given at least fifteen days previously thereto by written notice delivered personally or by mail to each board member at his business address.
 - c. Quorum. A quorum consists of a majority of the General Board members provided it is either a stated meeting or one that has been properly called.

Section B. Procedures of the Annual State Association Meeting

- 1. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to seat the delegates in a convenient place.
- 2. All business meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion from God's Word, and prayer.
- 3. The Clerk shall call the Association to order.
- 4. The Moderator shall not allow any conversation except it be in a Christian spirit; the Moderator has discretion to end conversations that he thinks will cause discord.
- 5. Anyone desiring to speak must rise to his feet and address the Moderator.

- 5. Anyone desiring to speak must rise to his feet and address the Moderator.
- 6. The voting sign shall be at the discretion of the Moderator.
- 7. No member shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any subject and not more than five minutes at a time.
- 8. The Association shall sit with open doors except when it goes into a committee as a whole.
- 9. No person shall nominate more than one person if that person be elected.
- 10. The form of financing the State Association shall be \$225 from each local church in a conference and \$2 for each local church sending a local delegate. In addition, an offering received from each church in the state and an offering from each morning and evening service that shall be divided as follows: 50% to the State Mission Board, 40% to the State Office, and 10% to the State CTS Board.

ARTICLE IX. Designated Contributions

From time to time the Association, in the exercise of its religious, educational, and charitable purposes, may establish various funds to accomplish specific goals. If the Association receives a designated contribution for these funds or for any other designated purpose, the Association will attempt to honor the designation; however, all designated contributions shall be deemed advisory rather than legally mandatory in nature-and shall remain subject to the exclusive control and discretion of the General Board. No fiduciary obligation shall be created by any designated contribution made to the Association other than to use the contribution for the general furtherance of any of the purposes stated in Article II.

ARTICLE X. Tax Exempt Provisions

<u>Section A. Private Inurement.</u> No part of the net earnings of the Association shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, officers, board members, or other private persons except that the Association shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above in Article II.

<u>Section B. Political Involvement.</u> No substantial part of the activities of the Association shall be the carrying on of propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and to the extent prohibited by law, the Association shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

<u>Section C. Limitation of Activities.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Association shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or (b) by an organization contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

<u>Section D.</u> Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, no part of the corporation's earnings or assets shall inure to the benefit of any of its members and shall be distributed to the National Association of Free Will Baptists. In the event that the NAFWB ceases to exist, the corporation's earnings or assets shall go to another organization of like faith and

practice that is organized for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of IRC 501(c)(3) at the time of the distribution. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a court of competent jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, that are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

<u>Section E. Nondiscrimination Policy.</u> This Association shall not discriminate against member churches, regional associations or conferences, officers, delegates, board members, or others on the basis of race, color, or national and ethnic origin. As a religious institution, however, this organization reserves the right to deny membership or employment or to terminate the membership or employment of persons whose lifestyle, words, actions, or otherwise do not align with the Association's incorporated *Treatise of Faith and Practice*, additional articles of faith, code of conduct, or other policies of this organization.

Article XI. Limitation of Liability and Binding Arbitration

<u>Section A. Limitation of Liability.</u> This Association is not responsible for the actions of local member churches or regional associations or conferences that constitute the members of this Association nor for the actions of members or attendees of such local churches, regional associations, or conferences.

<u>Section B.</u> Submission to Arbitration. Delegates to this Association, officers, board members, and members of the local churches, regional associations, or conferences that constitute the membership of this Association agree to submit to binding arbitration any legal matters that arise between the member churches, regional associations, or conventions and this Association or between the individuals within the member churches, regional associations, or conventions and this Association that cannot otherwise be resolved, and they expressly waive any and all rights in law and equity to bring any civil disagreement before a court of law, except that judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof.

<u>Section C.</u> Notice of Arbitration. In the event of any dispute, claim, question, or disagreement arising out of or relating to these bylaws or any other Associational matter, the parties shall use their best efforts to settle such disputes, claims, questions, or disagreement as befits Christians. To this effect, they shall consult and negotiate with each other in good faith and, recognizing their mutual interests to not disgrace the name of Christ, seek to reach a just and equitable solution. If they do not reach such solution within a period of sixty (60) days, then upon notice by either party to the other, disputes, claims, questions, or differences shall be finally settled by arbitration as described in Section A, above, using such procedures for arbitration as are adopted pursuant to the following section.

<u>Section D.</u> Arbitration Procedures. The procedures for arbitration shall be as adopted by the General Board.

ARTICLE XII. Amendments

These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the member delegates present and voting at a state Association meeting provided the amendment(s) is/are presented, at a minimum, on the day prior to the vote.

ADOPTION

These bylaws were adopted by a majority vote of the member delegates present and voting
at a duly called meeting of the state Association in which a quorum was present.

These bylaws supersede any other bylaws of the state Association.


