

Green, August 12, 1848.

The Ohio River Annual Conference met in Green, Scioto Co. Ohio, Aug. 12, 1848.

1. Proceeded to business by appointing Elder J. Fullerton, moderator, and Elder J. Rice, clerk pro tem.

2. Voted, That Elders Topping have a seat in conference.

3. After calling for the letters from the Quarterly Meetings, the following resolutions were adopted.

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Conference, that it is the duty of the Churches, composing this U. M. to establish Sabbath school and Bible associations, and instruct the minds of the youth the importance of the Christian religion.

Resolved, That we believe it is the duty of the members of this U. M. to oppose both morally and politically the annexation of any more Slave Territory to the United States.

Resolved, That in the opinion of this Conference, ~~that~~ there is a great lack of Christian piety in our Churches and that the cause is far the ~~less~~ want of a better system of supporting the ministry.

Resolved, That it is high time for us to awake out of sleep,

and engage in the moral enterprise
which has indicated to us the
condition of man kind.

Philadelphia, that we request the
different Society Meetings of
this City, to extend their aid in a
Committee, to be held in December, on
the first Saturday in October, for the
purpose of adopting some rule or mat-
ter, whereby we may be better able to
attend the preaching of the Gospel
of Christ, and promote the interest
of the Kingdoms and souls among us.

We trust, that the Spirit of
the Lord, is pouring the anointing
upon the Church, in the Morning

Star for publication, that the next
will be held with Misses J. M.
Philadelphia, that this Congress
be dissolved.
