Ind Rutland Co Aug 13th 1858

The Ohio River Y.M. met with the Ind Rutland Church. The I.M. all reported by letter and delegates. The meeting was interesting and a general union seemed to prevail throughout. The next session of this Y.M. will be held with the Little Scioto I.M. The following resolutions were adopted by the Conference.

1. Resolved that we as a Y.M. believe that Slavery is a sin against God and a crime against man, that we as a body will use our influence for its speedy extinction from the world.
2. Resolved that we repudiate the doctrine held by the present administration that Slavery exists in the Territories by virtue of the Constitution and that we will support no man for office unless we believe him to be opposed to the doctrine both by word and deed.
3. Resolved that we will vote for no man, he will not oppose the admission of any more slave states into the Union and will use his influence for the extension of Slavery in the Territory, the District of Columbia, and the interstate slave trade.
4. Resolved that it is the duty of every Christian to use its power in combination with England for the total extinction of the African Slave Trade.
