The Ohio River I. M. assembled by delegates with
the Cheshire church. Prayer by Rev. B. V. Lewkobury.
Elected Rev. J. S. Haining Moderator, and Rev. B. V.
Lewkobury Assistant moderator. Minutes of last
session read and approved. Meigs and Athens I. M.s.
reported by letter and delegates. No letter or delegate
from Little Scioto I. M. Received Rev. S. D. Bates of
Marion I. M. as an advisor member of this Confer-
ence. also Rev. D. Powell a C. Baptist Minister of W. Va
Rev. G. Evans of Ohio Northern I. M. Appointed
J. E. Peden, A. D. Williams and W. C. Humphrey a
committee to present resolutions on Temperance. Voted
that Bro. J. A. Mank, L. Curtis and J. Lash be a
committee to select ministers to preach during
the meeting. Voted that Rev. S. H. Barrett, J. D.
Bates and J. E. Peden be a committee on Education,
Voted that Rev. A. D. Williams, Z. W. Hoskinson and
J. W. Martin be a committee on Freed men's mission
Voted that Rev. J. S. Haining R. J. Poston and Z. W.
Hoskinson be a committee on the State of the coun-
try. Appointed J. Sherritt, B. V. Lewkobury and
J. Powell Committee on Sabbath Schools. Added
L. C. Chase to the committee on the State of the County.
Voted that the next I. M. be held in the bounds
of the Little Scioto I. M. Appointed Rev. A. D.
Williams, H. F. Wogan and Jacob Mank a committee
on Periodicals. Added Bro. G. W. Miles and J. Lash
to the committee on Education. Adjourned to meet
at six o'clock this evening.

Evening session

Prayer by Rev. R. J. Poston, Adopted the resolu-
tions reported by the committee on Temperance

Adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on Periodicals. Adjourned. Adjourned until tomorrow morning eight o'clock.

Aug 10th 1867.

Morning session.

Prayer by Rev. D. Powell. Adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on Sabbath Schools. Report of committee on Freedmen's Mission discussed and laid over until some other time. Invited Rev A. H. Chase Agent of Freedmen's Mission to take part with us as an advisory member of Conference. Adopted the resolutions on the Theological School presented by the committee on Education. Adjourned until 2 o'clock P.M.

Afternoon session

Prayer by Rev. H. F. Wogan. Referred the resolutions on Freedmen's Mission back to the committee and added Rev. A. H. Chase to the committee. Adopted a resolution against dancing and kindred amusements. Adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on Education. Adopted a resolution recommending Rev. S. H. Barrett as a suitable person for a local Book agent. Passed the resolutions reported by the committee on the State of the County. Voted to request Rev. A. H. Chase to take a collection tomorrow morning for Western Freedmen's Mission. Passed resolutions on Freedmen's Mission in lieu of those reported by the committee.

Resolutions

Theological School.

Whereas the funds of the Theological school are the property of the whole denomination and whereas in each of its two previous removals to

of the General Conference was first obtained, Therefore Resolved that we respectfully but most earnestly urge that the Theological School be not moved without the consent and direction of the General Conference.

Periodicals

Resolved that we love the dear old Star and rejoice in its Day-light.

Resolved that we give a hearty greeting to the Freeman, as worthily meeting a manifest western want.

Resolved that having the Freeman, we do not desire the removal of the removal of the Star from New England.

Resolved that the Quarterly is so eminently worthy that the minister who does not take it wrongs both himself and his hearers, and our intelligent laymen will be much profited by it. Resolved that the good little Myrtle ought to be taken in all our Sabbath Schools.

Freedmens Mission

Resolved that as ever the Freedmen have our prayers and sympathy.

Resolved that we heartily approve the course taken by the Western Committee in planting churches and schools at the same place and time and will give the proposed Normal School at Cairo all the support in our power.

Resolved that the proposed Institution at Harpers Ferry has our best wishes and approval.

Temperance.

Whereas indulgence in the use of intoxicating drink is increasing in many communities and no adequate efforts are being made to stop its ravages. Therefore resolved that it is duty of our churches to put forth increased

efforts for the promotion of temperance.
 Resolved that those who sell intoxicating liquors
 to be used as a beverage whether under pretense
 of keeping a Drug-store or otherwise, should be
 ostracized from society and receive no patronage
 whatever until they abandon the nefarious business.
 Resolved that we should insist on total abstinence
 from all that intoxicates by all the members of
 our churches.

Education.

Resolved that in order to fully develop the whole
 man, education must be of a three fold nature—
 moral, physical and mental.

Resolved that the endowment of a Professorship
 in Atwood Institute, is essential to the permanent
 prosperity of that Institution, and we urge its
 immediate completion.

Resolved that Cheshire Academy, under its present
 able board of instruction, and with its improved
 facilities for teaching, merits a liberal share of
 patronage from the Yearly Meeting, and the suc-
 cess of the committee in raising funds for a complete
 apparatus gives further evidence of success.

Resolved that we sympathize with other prominent
 brethren engaged in the business of education within
 the limits of the Yearly Meeting.

Resolved that we approve of the establishment of
 a P. W. B. Book Depository in the city of Chicago
 by the P. W. B. printing establishment.

Sabbath Schools.

The true object of Sunday schools is the religious
 education of the young and neglected. Therefore
 Resolved that this work properly belongs to the
 church.

Resolved the churches be urged by their

Pastors to take special action in the organization and support of Sunday schools in their midst. Resolved that this body recommend the propriety of organizing a Sunday school convention to send delegates annually from the several L. Ms. to this body to take into consideration the best means of extending and supporting Sunday schools.

- State of the Country.

Whereas the public mind seems embarrassed and undecided as to what is the best policy to be pursued in the reconstruction of the rebel states, and whereas it is the duty of all loyal bodies whether political or ecclesiastical to define their position on all questions affecting the prosperity and moral interest of the state Therefore Resolved that it is the sense of this Conference that our government is secure only when controlled by loyal men.

Resolved that we most heartily endorse the reconstruction policy of the present Congress. Resolved that but for the treacherous course of the incumbent administration the work of reconstruction might have been nearly if not completely accomplished.

Resolved that it is the duty of every voting Free Will Baptist to cast his ballot for the proposed Suffrage Amendment at our approaching State election.

Resolved that that sympathy which would pass by the persecuted loyalists of the south, ignore the sacrifices and hardships of our soldiers, and even the graves of the patriotic dead, and fix itself upon unrepentant traitors, is a disgrace to the American name.
