Wheelerburg Ohio Aug 7<sup>th</sup> 1868

Ohio River J. M. convened with Wheelerburg  
church. Opened with prayer by Rev. M. Seal  
Chose Rev I. Z. Haining Moderator. Letters from  
Meigs, Athens and Taylor I.Ms. were then read.  
Taylor I.M. West Va. requested admission into  
the J. M. Request granted and I.M. received.  
Letter from Little Sciota I.M. was then read.  
Visiting brethren were invited to take part in  
the discussions of conference. Minutes of last  
session read and approved. Voted that the dele-  
gates from the several I.Ms to fill any vacancy  
in their number from visiting brethren who  
are present. Appointed a committee consisting  
of T. H. Drake, Wm Hooper and R. J. Poston on  
the state of the J. M. and also to prepare an addres-  
s to the J. M. Appointed T. C. Peden, D. Powell and  
L. C. Chase a committee on Education. Appointed  
Rev. T. H. Drake, H. J. Wogan and B. B. Lewishay  
a committee on the state of the County. Appointed  
Rev. D. Powell, H. J. Carr and R. J. Poston  
a committee on the proposed change of name.

denominational name. Appointed Rev I. L  
Haining, T. E. Peden and H. F. Wogan committee  
on Periodicals. Appointed T. E. Peden, T. H. Drake  
and R. J. Poston committee on Sabbath schools.  
Appointed T. E. Peden, B. V. Newkirk and  
Wm Hooper to nominate delegates to General  
Conference. Appointed Rev. S. C. Chase, H. F.  
Wogan and D. Powell committee on Temperance.  
Appointed Rev. M. Sears, W. Titus and  
J. Littlejohn committee on Devotion. Elected  
M. Sears assistant Moderator. Appointed  
Rev A. Titus, Rev T. H. Drake and Wm Hooper  
committee on missions. Discussed a preamble  
and Resolutions in regard to Atwood Institute.  
Committee on Devotion made their report.  
Adjourned until tomorrow morning eight  
o'clock.

Aug 8<sup>th</sup> 1868

Morning session, Prayer by Rev D. Powell.  
Received Rev M. W. Spencer of Illinois & M as  
an advisory member of this body. Adopted  
after slight amendments the resolutions  
reported by committee on Education. Adopted  
the report of the Committee on Sabbath  
schools. Adopted the resolutions of the com-  
mittee on missions. Adjourned until 2 o'clock  
P.M.

Afternoon session

Prayer by Rev T. H. Drake. Amended and adopted  
the report of Committee on denominational name.  
Received Rev J. Seas of the M.E. Church as an ad-  
visory member of this conference. Bro Seas kindly  
offered the conference the use of the M.E. Church in  
Wheelersburg for the meetings on the sabbath, offer  
accepted and vote of thanks returned.

Adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on the State of the country. Adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on Temperance. Amended and adopted the resolutions reported by the committee on the State of the Y.M. Adopted a resolution in regard to the Sabbath. Adopted the resolutions proposed by committee on Periodicals. Adjourned until after evening service.

### Evening session.

Voted that the next session of the Y.M. be held in the bounds of Athens Y.M. Reconsidered the resolution on Periodicals struck out the fifth and readopted the other four resolutions. Passed resolutions in regard to Atwood Institute. Voted to give Rev D Powell a letter of commendation. On motion adjourned.

### Resolutions

#### Education.

Whereas education has much to do with the success of our general, religious and denominational interests and whereas there is an important and increasing demand for a first class P.H.B. Seminary in Northern Ohio and in consideration of the fact that here to we have not manifested the interest that we ought there will it Resolved that we repeat. Miss Athens and Little Sister Y.M. to raise twenty five dollars each by the first of November for the raising and general improvement of Atwood Institute and that the collection tomorrow morning be professed to the same, and that the collection in the afternoon be given to the interests of West Virginia College. Resolved that Cheshire Academy demands a liberal patronage. Resolved that we cheerfully welcome West Virginia College to the list of educational institutions and

our brethren give it a liberal portionage both in  
students and money. Resolved that this I. M.  
recognize in its total Institute no common interest  
that the Board receive our hearty cooperation in their  
attempt to raise an endowment fund of \$10,000.00  
and that we contribute liberally for the success of  
their noble cause. Resolved that we recommend  
that a course of study be introduced in said Institu-  
tute at the earliest possible convenience.

### Sabbath Schools.

Resolved that the increased interest taken in  
Sabbath Schools throughout our state calls for  
a general Thanksgiving and praise to the Lord  
of all mercies for the glad already accomplished  
and the prospect of greater usefulness in the  
future. Resolved that every just even \$1,  
under the control of our brethren in the I. M., be  
taken a penny for Missions at least once per month.  
Resolved that we enclose the State S. S. Union  
and advise our schools to cooperate with the aux-  
iliaries of the State-Society. Resolved that  
there should be organized in each I. M. or I. M. S. S.  
a society and that such a society should  
organize a I. M. S. S. Association.

### Missions.

"Woe to the world if to be saved only by the preaching of  
the Cross to every creature and leaving the ob-  
ligations of our Master still in force, to that intent  
Therefore Resolved that we commend the Home, Foreign  
and Freedmen's Missions to each member of this I. M.  
as it only <sup>worth</sup> his treasures and self-sacrifice but  
also his means. That the present want of one or more  
missionaries in this I. M. is one of the most distressing  
character, and that we urge the several I. M.s to take  
steps to fill up this void and secure such laborers

as will at least satisfy all their members with  
sufficing.

### I. State of the Country.

Notwithstanding the trouble and difficulties of our  
nation in these days that by man's soul, Our faith  
and hope are unshaking that solid and permanent  
peace will be our future inheritance if we are true  
to our duties as Christian men.

That despite the unworthiness of many politicians  
and of ten of parties, we feel that as citizens  
and especially as Free Will Baptists, we can not do  
less than support the nominees of the Republican  
party in the coming national election without in-  
fringing our record of the party.

That when politicians seek simple selfish ends  
and have had the control of public offices so long  
we deem it wrong for Christians to keep a sufficient  
portion of white and interest nationally or vitally  
impeded, pray, etc., trust in God. — here is  
our deliverance.

### Denominational Name.

Whereas some have thought it best to change our  
denominational name from Free Will Baptist to  
something more expressive or less offensively  
and where a name is only a distinctive title.  
Therefore Resolved that we agree with them to give  
up that name which will give them most good  
for their portion. It is not the name that gives reproach  
or fame. Beloville and the name distinguishes  
such an cause to be officious. But our indi-  
vidual references are for Free Will.  
Resolved that this 1st M. in the General Con-  
ference to retain the name Free Will.

### Sin and Sinners.

### Christian Freeman.

Resolved that we regard the Christian Freeman as essential to the progress of our denomination in the West. That published at Chicago the commercial metropolis of the West it is not only the most available paper for F.M.B. but wield a more potent influence over us than mind than any paper published in a less central locality. That having become so intimately connected with our denominational life it must not be weakened or impaired by the want of a hearty and general support. Resolved, that we earnestly request the ministers and brethren of the F.M. to make a vigorous exertion within the coming month to introduce the Christian Freeman into all our churches.

### State of F.M.

Resolved that as a F.M. we are profoundly grateful to Almighty God for the degree of prosperity which he has vouchsafed to us the last year. That we should labor with increased zeal to maintain a healthy tone of religion in our stronger churches and to build up the weaker, and strengthen those that are ready to perish. That we believe it to be the duty of our ministers to visit all professed labor upon feeble churches. That it is especially the duty of licentiates and prominent laymen to labor with such churches in the absence of the minister. Resolved that the quarterly meetings are authorized to print Sagments & short and held meetings in

distinct places.

report as follows. Delegates Rev I. L. Manning Al-

member to defray the expenses of delegates to  
General Conference. Resolved that we in  
struct our delegates to oppose dropping the word  
"will" in our denominational name.
