Albany (Sec. Pt.) Ohio, Aug. 1st, 1891.

The Ohio River Yearly Meeting held its fifty-
eighth annual session with the Albany Church,
Aug. 7th & 8th, 1891. Rev. D. Powell was chosen Moderator
Rev. W. J. Fulton Assistant Moderator and Rev. S. J.
Weed Assistant Clerk. Six of the Quarterly Meetings
were represented by delegates. The reports indicated
a fair degree of prosperity the past year. The Coal-
ton church, in the Jackson T. M. has erected a much
needed house of worship, and Rev. Isaac Hoover
organised a church at Fair Farm that united
with the T. M. The Knox church, in Athens T. M.
erected a house of worship, but there is a debt a-
gainst it that has prevented its dedication.
The brethren expect to liquidate soon and
have a place of their own in which to worship
God. The Burlington church in the same T. M.
is building a union house of worship. Nearly all
the churches have been blessed with some revival
work the past year, and with a very few exceptions
have pastors. They commence the new church year
with good reason for expecting a large ingath-
ering of souls before the next annual meeting. Rev.
D. Powell was appointed corresponding messenger
to the W. A. S. M. Resolutions were passed on
Education, commending H. T. and K. C. and
Colleges, asking the churches to give Rev. W. J. Ful-
ton, financial agent of the latter institution a
cordial reception. Ord. Temperance demand-
ing the Prohibition of the Liquor traffic. On

Publications, urging the patronage of the Morning Star, Church Watchman, and our own Sabbath School literature. On Ministry, requesting that all ministers be ordained at the sessions of the Yearly Meeting, assisted by a council appointed by it. On Missions, urging more activity in raising the salary of Sister Nellie Phillips, and more zeal in every department of the cause. Requested the Athens M. to raise \$15. Gallia \$15. Meigs \$16., Shiloh \$5. Jackson \$6. Johnson \$5. and WVA \$5. and forward as soon as possible to Bro. S. B. Blake, treasurer, Sec, Athens Co, Ohio, to pay the assessment of General Conference. Appointed Rev. D. Powell a committee to call a convention of churches willing to be grouped into pastorate to make arrangements for such cooperation. Preaching Friday night by Thos. E. Peden. Sat. morning, James Chailton. Sat. Morn. Fulton, Sabbath morning W. J. Fulton, Sabbath afternoon A. W. Bingham, Sabbath night. R. J. Poston, in the Freewill Baptist Church. Sabbath morning, H. B. Bolton preached in the M. E. Church. Rev. W. G. Archer of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. Rev. F. J. Clark of the M. E. Church, and Rev. Lewis Simmons of the Christian Connection, brought the greetings of their respective denominations. Next session in the bounds of Meigs M. The people of Albany entertained the delegates and visitors with their usual hospitality and the vote of thanks passed by conference was unmeaning form but expressed the real feeling of everyone in attendance. It is hoped that every minister and member will at once engage in the work of the Master with such zeal and wisdom that success will crown their efforts and

make the next anniversary the most glorious
in our history up to that time. Our territory is
vast and the opportunities for effective work
are many. It is not time for apathy, but an excellent
time to enter the vineyard with strong faith in
the promises of the Savior.
