## Committee of Investigation.

To the Ohio River Yearly Meeting  
of Free Will Baptists, assembled in annual  
Session Aug. 9-11, 1895. The Committee  
appointed at your annual session in Aug.  
1894, to investigate the proceedings and  
action of West Virginia Quarterly Meeting  
against Rev. David Powell and Flemington  
Church, and the accusations made by  
Rev. David Powell against Rev. Thomas C.  
Peden, and the accusations made by Rev.  
Thomas C. Peden against Rev. David Powell, beg  
leave to submit the following report:

Agreeably to appointment, we visited the  
field of the West Virginia Q.M. and spent all  
of Sept. 12 & 13, 1894, in discharge of our  
duties to the best of our knowledge.

We had previously notified Revs. Peden  
and Powell, and also the Clerk of W. Va. Q.M.  
of the time of our visit, and asked for all  
information each could give to aid us in  
our work. Revs. Peden and Powell each  
gave us a statement of grievances against  
the other, and gave names to whom we  
might refer for evidence; also, the Q.M.  
Clerk arranged for a meeting at Laurel  
Run Church, Sept. 13, to which meeting we  
presume the greater part of the members of  
the Q.M. who had been active in the proceed-  
ings of the Q.M. referred to, were present; and  
kindly aided us, by answering questions,  
making explanations, &c.; at which time and  
place we had access to the records of the Q.M.  
We made our business as clearly understood

as we were able. Besides the public meeting, we visited the parties referred to, and made careful investigation. After all was done we unanimously agreed,

I. That the action of West Virginia D. M. against Rev. David Powell, and against Huntington church, during the preceding year, was all irregular, consequently illegal.

(a) Charges preferred against Rev. David Powell, as given to the clerk, even without specifications

(b) A council was named by the plaintiff, - accepted and elected by the D. M., the members of conference not knowing the members of said council, and supposing they were ordained ministers and members of the Ohio River yearly Meeting, - though they were connected with another G. M. and we are informed that one of them, Bro. Sifford, is not an ordained minister - voted for them in all good faith, because they were recommended by one in whom they had confidence; - and accepted them without considering whether the defendant - who was absent, - and did not know any action was to be taken against him - might have good and lawful reasons for objecting to the council in part or in whole.

(c) Without the defendant having opportunity for defence, - and while he was not informed that any action was expected to be taken against him without specifications to the charges, - and without investigation, the D. M. proceeded - and suspended the defendant from the ministry until such time as the council should take action in case

against him.

(d) Said council was objected to by defendant for reasons which commended themselves to your committee, as good and lawful; nevertheless, said Council proceeded and notified the defendant to appear at Sciotoville, Ohio, a place more than two hundred miles from his home, and where the charges were made, to answer to ten charges, named without specifications, the time of notice being about two weeks before the time specified for the meeting.

The defendant refused to appear, for reasons approved by your committee; so no defense was presented to the council, and they voted that the defendant should be deposed from the gospel ministry, which vote was subsequently approved by said D. M. in session April 28, 1894.

2. In the action against Flemington church, charges were preferred against said church, and without labor to investigate the charges, or to effect any improvement in the condition of said church, the D. M. voted to exclude Flemington church from the D. M., and from the Freewill Baptist denomination.

3. In case of the accusations made by Rev. Thomas C. Peden - against Rev. David Powell, and vice versa, or record many things said and reported as having been said, such as do not become Christian charity, and from which all brethren should abstain unless in case of positive assurance with

full proof; but we failed to find ~~so~~ proof of any action on the part of either of the brethren in matters submitted to us, which we consider justifies disciplinary action: although their uncharitable talk should be disapproved, and if there are just grievances, regular action should be taken and evidence produced.

We notified West Virginia D. M. of our decision concerning their action and requested them to rescind what they had previously done in said case. We hold in possession a copy of the proceedings of said D. M. in the case mentioned, and of statements received by us in the whole matter.
