# Carpenter Church, Meigs Co., Ohio

The Ohio River Yearly Meeting of Free  
Will Baptists in its annual ses-  
sion with the Carpenter church,  
Aug. 19, 1910, was called to order by  
the Clerk at 2:00 P.M. and Rev. C.  
C. Dray was chosen Moderator,  
and Dr. W. J. Fulton Asst. Moderator.  
Prayer was offered by Rev. C. C.  
Dray. Letters were called for,  
two were handed in one from  
Gallia Q.M. and one from Shiloh  
Motion sustained that members of  
the Athens Quarterly Meeting be ad-  
mitted a seat in Conference for  
discussion of questions, and to  
serve on committees. Letters were  
read from the Gallia and Shiloh  
Q.M.s. Rev. W. H. Crabtree gave  
a verbal report of Meigs Q.M.  
Jessie Carpenter gave a report of the  
Athens Q.M. Rev. J. W. Turner  
gave a report of the Jackson Q.M.  
Motion prevailed that all visiting  
Brethren and sisters, not delegates  
be extended the courtesies of the  
Conference. Minutes of last year

Yearly Meeting Session was called  
or and recall — excepting reports  
of committees. On motion the  
moderator appointed a committee  
of three to conduct an examination  
of Bro. C. H. Rogers and report the  
same to Conference. Also a mo-  
tion was sustained that the request

Saturday morning 8:30 o'clock Rev. W. L. Reisinger conducted the Delegational service. Minutes called for and read. On motion the Moderator appointed Dr. W. J. Fulton, Rev. J. W. Turner, and Rev. F. W. Bates a Com. on order of business for our yearly meetings. The Com. on the examination of Rev. C. S. Rogers, and Rev. A. J. Peck reported, and by motion the report was adopted. The report is as follows: Your committee on examination of candidates for the ministry recommend first, that Bro. C. S. Rogers be granted a primary license for one year; second, that Rev. A. J. Peck be received on his credentials as an ordained minister, and commend him to the fellowship of our ministry and church and that the Clerk certify his certificate of ordination.

Com. on Temperance, Rev. C. O. Clark,  
Rev. W. A. Rogers, Jessie Carpenter,  
reported. The report was discussed  
by G. W. Bing, Mr. W. J. Fulton, Rev.  
C. O. Clark, Rev. F. W. Bates, Rev. A. C.  
Dry, and on motion the report was  
adopted. Following is the report:

Whereas the open saloon encour-  
ages the drinking of intoxicating  
liquors, and the drink habit is  
the direct or indirect cause of  
three-fourths of all the crimes  
that are committed, and is in  
itself a sin, therefore be it  
resolved:

First, That we again place  
ourselves on record as uncom-  
promisingly committed against  
its use as a beverage.

Second, That we will work,  
and pray, and vote, and do all  
in our power to banish it en-  
tirely from our beloved State  
and Nation.

Came on Missions consisting of Dr.  
W. J. Fulton, Nellie Carpenter, and  
Julia Swisher reported. After  
a discussion by Dr. W. J. Fulton  
and Rev. A. C. Droy, the report was  
adopted. The report is as follows:

Whereas our Foreign Mission  
work in India and Africa has  
been greatly blessed of God dur-  
ing the past year as evidenced in  
the health of our missionaries,  
and the continued revival spirit,  
the large number of conversions to  
the Christian faith, and the fact  
that some of the missionaries who  
have served many years, have  
been permitted to return to their  
humble land; and in the fact others  
have been ready to take up the  
work of those returned, among the  
number going to the Foreign field  
is Miss Amy Coe, formerly of Ohio  
and who has been adopted by the peo-  
ple of Ohio as their missionary.  
Therefore resolved, That as a yearly  
Meeting we are grateful to our

Father on Heaven for these assurances of His grace, and of His power to save all men; and for the verification of His promise: "Lo, I am with you always, even to the end".

Second, That as a real expression of gratitude to God, and of our faith in His gospel, we ask our ministry and people to give the cause of missions their study, prayers and support more universally and liberally that the Kingdom of God may come to all nations of the earth.

Third, That we hail with joy the Student Volunteer Movement, and the Laymen's Missionary Movement, and the Young People Society world wide missionary movement, and ask our people to acquaint themselves with these advanced and most hopeful efforts for the world's salvation.

Fourth, That we ask all our people to co-operate with our

organized mission work and give  
it their most earnest and liberal  
support.

The hour of 10:00 o'clock having  
arrived, the special order of the  
day, that of merging the yearly  
meetings into a State Association,  
was taken up. A motion was  
made and seconded that the  
Y. M. C. be merged into a state  
association. It was discussed  
by Rev. W. J. Fulton, Rev. C. O. Clark,  
Rev. J. M. Turner, S. H. Bing, Rev. F. W.  
Bales. On motion Conference  
adjourned before the vote was  
taken. 10:30 A.M., Rev. J. M. Turner  
preached from the text found in  
John 7:46. The Conference was  
called to order at 3:15 P.M., and  
the question of merging the Y. M. C.  
into the State Association was  
further discussed by Rev. J. M.  
Davis, Rev. W. W. Crabtree, Rev. J.  
M. Turner, Rev. F. W. Bales, Rev. W.  
J. Fulton, Rev. A. C. Droy, Rev. C.  
O. Clark. Vote was taken

and the motion was lost by vote  
of 7 to 2.

A motion was made and seconded to begin the Y. M. on Wednesday evening and close with the service on Friday night if not in conflict with the Constitution. It was discussed by Rev. F. W. Bates, Rev. W. H. Cobbletree, Rev. A. C. Droy. A vote resulted in 5 for it and 4 against it. As the 14th Article of the Constitution requires a two-third vote of Conference, hence the motion was lost.

Committee on business gave the following report: The your Com. on business have not found any matter of business to present to Conference. But by looking over the Constitution of this Y. M. we find no continuous body existing, and as we believe by a revision of the Constitution of this body, the membership to our Y. M.s will become greatly increased.

and the interest in our gatherings increased, we, your Com. therefore recommend that we have a committee on revision consisting of Dr. J. M. Davis, Dr. W. J. Fulton and Bro. J. F. Coughenour.

The Article for revision that which provides for the annual sitting be revised as to read as follows: This yearly meeting shall consist of the Ministers in good standing who are members of the L.M.S. in the bounds of this G. M., the Clerks of the several L.M.S. together with the delegates & who may be elected from the L.M.S. to represent them in annual conference. The motion to adopt the report was lost.

Motion sustained that we send a corresponding delegate to the Baptist Association which meets at Racine, that Rev. C. O. Clark be the delegate.

Report of Com. on Education called for. The Chairman of the

Committee moved the adoption of report of last year on Education. The motion prevailed. The com. consisted of Dr. J. M. Davis, W. H. Hartsook, Birdie Lasher.

The Treasurer, J. J. Coughlin, gave a report of the financial condition of the yearly Meeting. The receipts of the year total \$96.31. The payments of the year total 90.31. The balance on hand, is \$5.39. It was voted to receive and adopt the report.

Committee on order of business reported, and on motion the report was adopted.
