The Ohio River Yearly Meeting of Free
Baptists in session with the
Parisburg church, in Gallia Co., the
meeting was called to order by Clerk
at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. F. H. Chase of Ports-
mouth led the devotion. Dr. W. J.
Fulton was chosen Moderator,
Rev. W. W. Crabtree and Leaverett
Shaver, assistants. Minutes of
last session read and approved.
Quarterly Meeting letters called for.
Letters were read from Meigs,
Jackson, and Shiloh. Under Article
IV of business the Moderator ex-
tended the securities of the Con-
ference to all visiting members
not delegates. Rev. F. H. Chase spoke
as Corresponding Messenger from
the Ohio and Kentucky Yearly Meeting.
The work generally good in his Yearly
Meeting. It convenes in September.
He requested a Corresponding Mes-
senger to it. The Moderator in-
formed Conference that we
have with us Rev. Davies of
the Baptist church of Ironton.

He was introduced to Conference by Moderator, and gave a few words of greeting. Rev. L. F. Sherritt read his paper left over from forenoon session of Ministers and Laymen's Conference. A motion was passed to send a delegate to the Ohio & Kentucky yearly meeting. The naming of the Delegate was referred to Committee on nomination of delegates to State Association. Motion carried to refer Rev. W. S. Rogers to Com. on the Ministry. Motion sustained to lay all papers of Rev. Corwin before the Com. on the Ministry. Committee on education reported, and on motion the report was adopted.

Report: 1st, that we, as a church stand for the highest and best in the line of public schools in the several communities in which we reside and that we each one pledge to the public school officers and teachers our hearty support and cooperation.

2nd, that we recognize the need of a more general mental

training in higher education
3rd, That we urge all candidates for the Christian ministry to accept the proposition of Rio Grande College in which the College offers free tuition to all ministerial students,
4th, That we accept the claim of Rio Grande College as our church school, and pledge to the Trustees of that institution our loyal support, not only in turning young people of our acquaintance to that College, but in financial aid as God has prospered us.

5th, That we request the Moderator to appoint a visiting committee, whose duty it shall be to visit the college within the next year, and report to the next session of the Ohio River yearly meeting, the condition and needs of the school, and the quality of work done.

6th, That we instruct our delegates to the state Association to secure a similar visiting committee with similar

Elderly voting in the affirmative, and three in the negative;

That Art. 3 of the Constitution

which reads: The yearly Meeting shall hold its sessions beginning the Friday before the 2nd Saturday in Aug., shall be changed so as to read: The yearly Meeting shall hold its sessions beginning the Wednesday before the 3rd Saturday in August, and close on Friday.

The above change is authorized by Art. 14 of the Constitution which reads: Any alterations may be made in this Constitution by the concurrence of two-thirds of its members.
