# CONSTITUTION of the

# Palmer Association of Free Will Baptists

## ARTICLE 1. NAME AND PURPOSE.

This organization shall be known as the Palmer Association of Free Will Baptists and by this name shall it be designated in all its work, government and fraternal relations. The general purpose of the Association shall be the exaltation of Christ, the great Head of the Church, the edification of its members through the effective teaching and mutual encouragement in the use of the manifold means of grace; the unification of the methods and programs of its affiliated churches and subordinate organizations; and the coordination of persistent efforts in church extension, Christian education, benevolence and evangelism.

# ARTICLE 2. COMPOSITION.

This association shall be composed of churches, ordained and licensed ministers who are members of churches that are associated with the association and recommended by the membership committee and accepted by the body in session and approved by the messengers from the churches.

### ARTICLE 3. REPRESENTATION.

Voting privileges shall be accorded to all approved ordained ministers of the association who remain above reproach and five messengers from each church and one additional messenger for every 100 members or fraction thereof, properly seated.

### ARTICLE 4. GENERAL OFFICERS

The general officers of the association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a secretary-treasurer, an assistant secretary-treasurer, each of whom shall be elected for a term of two years beginning at the close of the annual session at which they are elected.

## ARTICLE 5.COMMITTEES.

Section 1. The Executive Committee shall consist of the general officers of the association together with two members elected from the churches at large for a term of two years. It is understood that this committee has no authority other than that which is expressly stated in the constitution and by-laws.

Section 2. A Membership Committee of six members shall be elected for a

term of three years, the tenure of two expiring each year.

Section 3. A Quarterly Fellowship Program Committee consisting of three members shall be elected for a term of two years.

Section 4. A Youth Committee consisting of three members shall be elected for a term of two years.

Section 5. A Digest Committee consisting of three members shall be appointed by the moderator at each annual session to serve only during that session.

Section 6. A Finance Committee consisting of three members shall be appointed by the moderator at each annual session to serve only during that session.

Section 7. A Committee on Committees consisting of five members shall be elected at each annual session to serve only during that session.

Section 8. Special committees may be elected or appointed at the option of the association.

### ARTICLE 6. ORDINATION.

The Palmer Association recognizes that the authority to ordain ministers has its source in the local church.

### ARTICLE 7. MEETINGS.

Section 1. The annual session of the association shall meet on the second Saturday in May at 9:30 A.M.

Section 2. The quarterly fellowship meetings shall meet on the second Saturday in August, November, and February at 9:30 A.M.

### ARTICLE 8.

The Reporting Year for Associational Churches shall be April 1 through March 31.

### ARTICLE 9.

This constitution may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the messengers present.

### BY-LAWS

### Section 1. Officers.

No person shall serve more than four (4) years successively in any one office or combination of offices.

A. The moderator shall preside according to the accepted parliamentary procedure over the sessions of the association.

B. The duties of the assistant moderator shall be those of the moderator when the latter shall so direct or when he is absent.

C. The secretary-treasurer shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the association and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the association and pay out same by order of the association. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the association.

D. The duties of the assistant secretary-treasurer shall be those of the secretary-treasurer when the latter shall so direct or when he is absent.

### Section 2. Committees.

A. The Executive Committee shall plan the program for the annual session in consultation with the host pastor. They shall perform any other duties as directed by the association in session.

B. The Membership Committee shall examine the credentials of ministers who apply for membership in the association and applications of churches that desire membership in the association and shall make recommendations according to their judgment.

- C. The Quarterly Fellowship Program Committee shall plan the program for the Quarterly Fellowship meetings in consultation with the host pastor.
- D. The Youth Committee shall plan, promote, and direct youth ministries and activities within the association and shall present an annual report of activities and finances.
- E. The Digest Committee shall receive the annual reports from the churches and compile a digest of information contained therein and report the same.
- F. The Finance Committee shall compile a financial status of the association and make recommendations accordingly.
- G. The Committee on Committees shall make nominations for each standing office and committee member whose term expires or is left vacated and present the same.

### Section 3. Meetings.

- A. The Annual Meeting shall be for the purpose of fellowship, inspiration, and the transaction of business.
- B. The Quarterly Meetings shall be for the purpose of fellowship, inspiration, and instruction in the work of the Lord. Only business necessary to receive new churches and new ministers into the association will be transacted.

### Section 4. Ordination.

The Palmer Association recognizes the authority of the local church to ordain men to the ministry of the gospel. It further recognizes the authority of the local church to ordain men to general Christian ministries. The following is suggested procedure in the ordination of a minister.

- A. The Candidate should be licensed for at least one year.
- B. The church should call together at least three ordained Free Will Baptist ministers to examine the candidate as to doctrine and general qualifications. The committee should make written recommendations to the church.
- C. The ordination service generally includes a sermon, presentation of the Bible, charge to the candidate, laying on of hands and prayer of dedication.

### Section 5. Provision for Membership.

A. Churches. Each church which is a member of the association is expected to be represented by written report and messenger from the church at each meeting. In the event this cannot be done a letter should be sent to the association stating the circumstances. Regular attendance and communication should be maintained with the association to remain in good standing.

B. Ministers. Each ordained and licensed minister who is a member of the association is expected to attend 75 percent of the regular meetings. In the event an absence becomes necessary a letter should be sent to the association stating the circumstances. When a licensed or ordained minister is attending an educational institution and is unable to attend, a letter should be sent to the association stating the same. Regular attendance and communication should be maintained with the association to remain in good standing.

C. Should a church or licensed/ordained minister be called into question the association shall direct the membership committee to investigate and report.

### Section 6. Amendment.

These by-laws may be amended at any regular session by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the messengers present.

### YOUTH COMMITTEE REPORT

### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE EVALUATION AND RECOMMENDATION CONCERNING SECTION 5 OF THE PALMER ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

It does appear that our Palmer Association is in trouble. Interest and

attendance in this quarterly function seems to be dwindling. Since this association traditionally represents a very important part of our Free Will Baptist heritage there are those who sincerely feel that the cause behind this decrease in participation is a growing lack of love and loyalty for the Free Will Baptist denomination. Yet, when examined objectively with the present progress of our movement in mind other more logical reasons come into focus.

Years ago when most churches were very small and mostly rural, our denomination power base was found, to a large degree, at these quarterly meetings. Once every three months the churches in a specified area of a state would come together, both laymen and ministers, for an entire Saturday of preaching, business, food, and fellowship. Most ministers pastored more than one church, usually on a part time basis. Few women were employed and most were free on Saturday to attend these tri-monthly affairs.

However, today our Palmer Association, like many other Free Will Baptist Associations of its kind, has undergone a complete change from what it once was. Our meetings are brief. There is no need for the traditional "dinner on the ground," no business transacted, and few laymen attend. Today our local churches are in actuality our denominational power base. With almost all the wives employed and many husbands holding down a second job, Saturday is just too valuable a day to sacrifice to a quarterly meeting. Many pastors are not present to answer the roll call. Saturday is the only day they can catch many of their parishioners at home, it's the big day for their weekly bus visitation, and a hundred things have to be done on this last day of the week that were missed earlier in the week. Thus, only a small percentage of our pastors attend on a regular, consistent basis.

Is it fair to conclude that this tragic decline of interest in our traditional quarterly association stems from a lack of love or loyalty for the Free Will Baptist denomination? No! This decline of interest does not indicate a lack of love, but rather a change in our society and a healthy growth among our local churches. Today's typical church of the Palmer Association is not the former small, part time church in a rural setting. Instead it is more and more the larger urban church with a multi-ministry and a full time, full salaried staff. Our general lack of involvement in associational meetings is not due to any denominational disloyalty, but rather to the blessings of God upon our movement causing our local churches to grow and multiply as at no time in our past history.

What are we to do with our Palmer Meetings? Should we continue meeting tri-monthly on Saturday as we have in the past and just ignore the increasing lack of participation? Or, should we continue with rigid regulations requiring faithful attendance by all our ministers and churches? Or, should we give up and do away with these meetings altogether?

The solution to our dilemma will not be found in any of the aforementioned alternatives. Love and a desire for fellowship cannot be legislated and it is ridiculous to punish churches and pastors for their growth and progress. Nor should we ignore our need for interchurch cooperation and fellowship and the growing gap between our congregations.

Is there another alternative? We believe there is! Why not revaluate our present situation in the light of our past and present needs and then adopt a quarterly meeting more in keeping with this evaluation? This has been given serious study by the Executive Committee composed of men interested both in the sovereignty of the progressive local church and the preservation of our Free

Will Baptist heritage and the inter-fellowship of our Free Will Baptist churches.

The Executive Committee of the Palmer Association, being concerned with this matter called three special meetings to discuss this problem and consider solutions. From these meetings, the committee offers the following proposal to replace Section 5 of the Palmer Association By-Laws.

(1) Rather than meeting three times a year on Saturday, our quarterly meetings would meet every third month on a Monday morning at 10:30 A.M. at one of our member churches (alphabetically as we do now). These meetings would be for inspiration and fellowship. There would be a brief devotional service and then those present could adjourn to a nearby restaurant for fellowship and food. For most pastors, Monday morning is the best time in the week for such meetings. Nonetheless it would be well for each minister to endeavour to bring to these meetings as many laymen as he can.

(2) Once a year there would be the annual business meeting conducted on

Saturday according to our present practice.

(3) For a minister or church to remain in good standing with the Palmer Association, they affirm their desire to do so by submitting the annual report. This policy is in harmony with the Free Will Baptist Treatise, Part IV, Chapter III, Section IV, Number 5 (1977 ed.).

Failure to submit the report after being notified would subject the church to disciplinary action in accordance with the Free Will Baptist Treatise, Part IV,

Chapter III, Section IV, Numbers 4 and 5 (1977 ed.).
