CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called the Piedmont Association of (Original) Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE 2. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected annually by the Free Will Baptist Churches cooperating with this Association and ministers who are members of this Association.

ARTICLE 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

ARTICLE 4. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates, and one additional delegate for every fifty members over one hundred.

ARTICLE 5. The churches cooperating with this Association shall send by the hands of their delegates a full account of all work done by them during the year and all such statistics and information as will be interesting and helpful.

ARTICLE 6. This Association shall meet once a year at such time and place as may be agreed upon by the preceding session, or by its Executive Board.

ARTICLE 7. The Executive Board shall consist of three members elected by the Association, one for one year, one for two years and one for three years. The Associational officials are members ex-officio of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall have interim authority.

ARTICLE 8. Ministers in good standing in our sister associations may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations and his name enrolled in our minutes.

ARTICLE 9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to represent by letter or delegate.

ARTICLE 10. This Association shall encourage a sound ministry, such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE 11. This Association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

ARTICLE 12. This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the delegates attending, provided that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first setting of said meeting after permanent organization.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Associational officials are to be elected by ballot system.

The Clerk is to be elected after Moderator declares the house in order for business. The Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Treasurer are to be elected at the close of the session.

The Ordination Council is to be elected by the Association.

The Ordination Council is to consist of five members and has interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigations of ministers.

The Ordination Council must report its work annually to the Association.

The Executive Board is to make an annual report to the Association.
The Treatise of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists is to be used.
The Body sponsors the Minister's Conference.
The Body sponsors the Sunday School Convention.
The Body sponsors the Women's Auxiliary Convention.
The Body sponsors the F. W. B. League Convention.
The Seven-Point program of the State Association approved.
The indefinite pastor call approved.

When a church calls the Ordination Council it is to pay their expense.

The Executive Board has charge of the Associational Education Program.

The Chairman of each board or committee, is treasurer of its funds.

The Churches sending preachers and delegates to the Association are to pay for their board; the host-church will provide all the sleeping quarters they can, and arrange for rooms that may be rented.

The Minute Fund changed to General Fund, and the churches that are able are requested to send ten dollars.

The Moderator authorized to appoint from the floor the Nominating Committee, consisting of five men to nominate, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer and Ordination Council. The Body may place nominations from the floor for each office.

Ordination Qualification:

1. A Bible course satisfactory to the Ordaining Council.
2. If a minister cannot meet the standard and shows satisfactory fruits in his ministry, he may be ordained.
3. A minister must be a tither in order to be ordained.

Miss Hazel Dawkins gave the Women's Auxiliary district report.

Report of Publication and Literature Committee received and adopted.

Two members elected to the Executive Board: Clyde Cox two years, Rev. E. R. Tyner three years.

The Robbins Circle Free Will Baptist Church of Lexington, N. C., received into the Association. This church was organized by Rev. R. P. Sawyer.

The Calvary Free Will Baptist church granted a letter of dismissal.

Rev. N. W. Holt granted a letter of transfer to the Beaver Creek Association.

Associational Treasurer's report received and adopted.

Rev. O. M. Hilburn made an appeal for the Association to help the Portsmouth Church.

Rev. H. L. Buckner granted a letter of transfer to the Beaver Creek Association.

We met in legal sessions and by virtue of authority vested in us transacted the following business:

August 28, 1948 the Board met at March Hotel, Lexington, N. C., and received the Free Will Tabernacle.

The Associational Clerk authorized to print elaborate forms for every arm of the work.

The Associational Treasurer authorized to ask each church for an offering of five dollars for the general fund.

Rev. Sherman H. Oakes, elected Field Secretary of Kings Mountain Camp ground.

An Associational Bar at each setting of the body. Ministers and delegates seated inside the bar. Those outside the bar can go and come orderly at any time without permission of Moderator.

October 6, 1948, the Board met at Aleo Church, Rockingham, N. C.

Evangelist J. Jack Paskell to furnish his aluminum top tabernacle for the Piedmont Camp Meeting, to begin the fourth Sunday in April. He is to have a free hand in raising his budget, and after the budget is raised, he is to raise money to build a permanent tabernacle. The fourth Sunday is to be the Piedmont Sunday School and Singing Convention.

January 29, 1949 the Board met at Rockingham, and received the New Hope Free Will Baptist Church.

February 5, 1949, the Board met at First Church, Gastonia, and received the Bogger City Free Will Baptist Church of Lincolnton, N. C.
