CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called the Piedmont Association of (Original) Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE 2. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected annually by the Free Will Baptist Churches cooperating with this Association and ministers who are members of this Association.

ARTICLE 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

ARTICLE 4. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates, and one additional delegate for every fifty members over one hundred.

ARTICLE 5. The churches cooperating with this Association shall send by the hands of their delegates a full account of all work done by them during the year and all such statistics and information as will be interesting and helpful.

ARTICLE 6. This Association shall meet once a year at such time and place as may be agreed upon by the preceding session, or by its Executive Board.

ARTICLE 7. The Executive Board shall consist of three members elected by the Association, one for one year, one for two years and one for three years. The Associational officials are members ex-officio of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall have interim authority.

ARTICLE 8. Ministers in good standing in our sister associations may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations and his name enrolled in our minutes.

ARTICLE 9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to represent by letter or delegate.

ARTICLE 10. This Association shall encourage a sound ministry, such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE 11. This Association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

ARTICLE 12. This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first setting of said meeting after permanent organization.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Associational officials are to be elected by ballot system.

The Clerk is to be elected after Moderator declares the house in order for business. The Moderator, Vice-Modrator and Treasurer are to be elected at the close of the session.

The Ordination Council is to be elected by the Association.

The Ordination Council is to consist of five members and has interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigations of ministers.

The Ordination Council must report its work annually to the Association.

The Executive Board is to make an annual report to the Association.

The Treasise of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists is to be used.

The Body sponsors the Minister's Conference.

The Body sponsors the Sunday School Convention.

The Body sponsors the Women's Auxiliary Convention.

The Body sponsors the F. W. B. League Convention.

The Seven-Point program of the State Association approved.

The indefinite pastor call approved.

When a church calls the Ordination Council it is to pay their expense.

The Executive Board has charge of the Associational Education Program.

The Chairman of each board or committee, is treasurer of its funds.

The Churches sending preachers and delegates to the Association are to pay for their board; the host-church will provide all the sleeping quarters they can, and arrange for rooms that may be rented.

The Minute Fund changed to General Fund, and the churches that are able are requested to send ten dollars.

The Moderator authorized to appoint from the floor the Nominating Committee, consisting of five men to nominate, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer and Ordination Council. The Body may place nominations from the floor for each office.

Ordination Qualification:

- 1. A Bible course satisfactory to the Ordaining Council.
- 2. If a minister cannot meet the standard and shows satisfactory fruits in his ministry, he may be ordained.
 - 3. A minister must be a tither in order to be ordained.

The Host Pastor, Rev. Mitchell Davis, gave the welcome address.

Rev. L. S. Gray gave the Moderator's Address.

Rev. Herman Hersey was elected Clerk.

The Moderator appointed the Associational Committees.

Rev. D. W. Hansley, a visiting minister from the Eastern Conference, was welcomed.

The Roll call of Churches was made.

The report of the Executive Board was read and adopted.

The report of the Ordaining Council was read and adopted.

The report of the Minister's Conference was read and adopted.

A letter from the West Lincolnton Church was referred to the Executive Board.

The report of the Quarterly Union was read and adopted.

Rev. J. J. Brooks brought the Association Message.

The Association adjourned to meet for business at 1:30.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

At 1:30 Moderator Gray called the body to devotions.

Rev. J. B. Starnes led the body in a song service.

Rev. D. W. Hansley, treasurer of the State Association Committee on Education, brought a report on the Bible college. It was voted to accept the report as information and receive an offering for the Bible College that night.

Mrs. Hazel Brown gave the report of the Woman's Auxiliary and it was received as information.

Rev. O. M. Hilburn gave his report as Promotional Secretary which was adopted.

The report of Ben Avenue Brotherhood received and adopted.

The Home Mission Report given and adopted.

The Association adjourned until Saturday Morning.

FRIDAY EVENING

Rev. L. S. Gray led the congregation in singing.

Rev. G. Russell led in prayer.

An offering of \$23.83 was received for the Bible College.

The Shouting trio sang several numbers.

Rev. John Floyd brought the first message preaching from 2 Peter 3:11.

Rev. Walter Carter spoke from John 3:7.

SATURDAY MORNING

Rev. J. B. Starnes led the bady in a song.

Rev. Wade Calvert led in prayer.

It was voted to omit preaching in order to finish business session sooner.

The Moderator commends Rev. O. M. Hilburn on his work as Promotional Secretary, and asks the churches to take an offering for him.

The report on Publication and Literature read and adopted.

A report on superannuation was received as information.

Rev. Mr. McLeod gave report on orphanage which was adopted.

Voted to send 10c per member to next Association with the Church letter.

A letter from the Meadow-View Church was referred to the Executive Board?

The Body was dismissed for 10 minutes to allow Committ's to meet.

After 10 minutes the Association was called to order and Rev. J. B. Starnes led the body in a song.

Rev. John Newton led in prayer.

The report on Foreign Missions was adopted.

The report of ordaining council was given and adopted.

Rev. L. S. Gray was granted a letter of good standing to the Beaver Creek Association effective after the closing of the present session.

Rev. L. S. Gray was given a rising vote of thanks for his work as Moderator.

Rev. O. M. Hilburn was granted a letter of good standing to the South Carolina Association. He was given a rising vote of thanks for his work as Vice-Moderator.

Rev. E. R. Tyner was elected Moderator for the coming year.

Rev. Walter Carter was elected Vice Moderator.

Brother D. D. Hunsucker was elected treasurer.

The following were elected as the Ordaining Council: Rev. J. B. Starnes, Rev. Mitchell Davis, Rev. L. H. Clayton, Rev. Wade Calvert, and Rev. Walter Carter.

The body elected Rev. Wade Calvert as chairman of the Ordaining Council.

The following were elected to the Executive Board; Rev. Wade Calvert, member for two years; and Rev. Harold Goforth, member for three years.

A rising vote of thanks was given the Host Church and Pastor.

The Resolution Committee gave the following reports, Publication and

Literature, Orphanage, Home Mission, Sunday School, Foreign Missions, Education, Ministerial Support and Finance. These reports were adopted.

The clerk's salary was set at \$35.

The Treasurer's Report was read and adopted.

It was moved to discontinue the Quarterly Union. The motion was tabled.

A report was given on the National Association.

The next Association will meet with Ben Avenue Church, Kannapolis, N. C.

Rev. A. E. Lingerfelt and Rev. Mac F. Crisp were ordained.

The Association adjourned until Friday before the first Sunday in August, 1951.

Executive Board Report

We, the Executive Board, beg to submit the following:

September 3, 1949, the board met at High Point Free Will Baptist Church and elected Mrs. Roy Rickard, Mrs. Wade H. Calvert, and Mrs. Shermon H. Oakes as delegates to the state convention. \$10 was given on the minute fund and the treasurer was asked to ask Churches for an offering on the minutes, \$3 as a minimum and \$5 as a maximum. The associational treasurer was to pay the Shelby Daily Star and Kings Mountain Herald advertising bill for camp meeting. The High Point Free Will Baptist Church was received into full fellowship and given the right hand of fellowship. Rev. S. Oakes delivered the message.

November 26, 1949, the board met at the Cramerton Free Will Baptist Church and decided to sell the Kings Mountain camp ground appointing Rev. Wade Calvert and Rev. S. Oakes with authority to dispose of the property. Their expenses were to be paid. Rev. O. M. Hilburn was elected Field Secretary of the Piedmont Association.

February 4, 1950, the board met at Mt. Holly Church and elected Rev. Roy Rickard to fill Brother Clyde Cox's unexpired term. The churches would be asked to send a minimum of \$5 to the General Fund.

April 15, 1950, the board was called to the Thomasville Free Will Baptist Church for the purpose of reconciliation. We found the church divided into three factions. The pastor resigned and was accepted. We were unable to unite the factions.

June 30, 1950. The board met at Goshen Grove Free Will Baptist Church. The withdrawal of Thomasville Free Will Baptist Church was read to the board and Rev. J. J. Brooks and Rev. J. B. Starnes appointed to investigate their deed. The treasurer reported a deficit of \$25 and the churches were asked to give an offering. The Moderator was asked to arrange the program for the association and Rev. J. J. Brooks was asked to preach the Associa-

tional sermon. We withdrew fellowship from Washington Street Free Will Baptist Church.
