CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE 1. This Association shall be called the Piedmont Association of (Original) Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE 2. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected annually by the Free Will Baptist Churches cooperating with this Association and ministers who are members of this Association.

ARTICLE 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.

ARTICLE 4. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates, and one additional delegate for every fifty members over one hundred.

ARTICLE 5. The churches cooperating with this Association shall send by the hands of their delegates a full account of all work done by them during the year and all such statistics and information as will be interesting and helpful.

ARTICLE 6. This Association shall meet once a year at such time and place as may be agreed upon by the preceding session or by its Executive Board.

ARTICLE 7. The Executive Board shall consist of three members elected by the Association one for one year one for two years and one for three years. The Associational officials are members ex-officio of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall have interim authority.

ARTICLE 8. Ministers in good standing in our sister associations may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations and his name enrolled in our minutes.

ARTICLE 9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to represent by letter or delegate.

ARTICLE 10. This Association shall encourage a sound ministry such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the Gospel which is freely offered to all.

ARTICLE 11. This Association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.

ARTICLE 12. This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first setting of said meeting after permanent organization.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Associational officials are to be elected by ballot system.

The Clerk is to be elected after Moderator declares the house in order for business. The Moderator, Vice-Moderator and Treasurer are to be elected at the close of the session.

The Ordination Council is to be elected by the Association.

The Ordination Council is to consist of five members and has interim authority to ordain ministers and has charge of investigations of ministers.

The Ordination Council must report its work annually to the Association.

The Executive Board is to make an annual report to the Association.

The Treatise of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists is to be used.

The Body sponsors the Minister's Conference.

The Body sponsors the Sunday School Convention.

The Body sponsors the Women's Auxiliary Convention.

The Body sponsors the F. W. B. L. League Convention.

The Seven-Point program of the State Association approved.

The indefinite pastor call approved.

When a church calls the Ordination Council it is to pay their expense.

The Executive Board has charge of the Associational Education Program.

The Chairman of each board or committee, is treasurer of its funds.

The Churches sending preachers and delegates to the Association are to pay for their board; the host-church will provide all the sleeping quarters they can, and arrange for rooms that may be rented.

The Minute Fund changed to General Fund, and all churches are requested to send 10c per member

The Moderator authorized to appoint from the floor the Nominating Committee, consisting of five men to nominate, Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer and Ordination Council. The Body may place nominations from the floor for each office.

Ordination Qualification:

- 1. A Bible course satisfactory to the Ordaining Council.
- 2. If a minister cannot meet the standard and shows satisfactory fruits in his ministry ,he may be ordained.
 - 3. A minister must be a tither in order to be ordained.

No man can hold more than one associational office.

September 16, 1950, we met at Cramerton, N. C., with Rev. Roy Rikard as proxy for Rev. L. H. Clayton and Rev. L. M. Pierce as proxy for Rev. J. B. Starnes. We ordained Rev. J. Self, Rev. Winford Floyd and Rev. John Whitworth.

December 2, 1950, we met at High Point F. W. B. Church in Lancaster, S. C., and ordained Rev. Edd C. Gasking.

February 19, 1951, we met with the Robbins Circle Church at Lexington, N. C., with Rev. L. E. Lawing as proxy for Rev. Mitchel Davis, and Rev. Bernie Player as proxy for Rev. J. B. Starnes. We ordained Rev. Mac. F. Crisp.

March 17, 1951, we met with Westover Church at Kannapolis, N. C., and ordained and received into the Piedmont Minister's Conference Rev. F. E. Carver.

August 2, 1951, we met with the Ben Avenue Church, Kannapolis, N. C., and exchanged papers with Rev. H. J. Sawyer, coming from the Beaver Creek Association. We reinstated Rev. - Rev. L. H. Clayton gave the following resolutions from the Ordaining Council and they were all voted on and adopted.
- 1. Since some of our ministers who are holding certificates of ordination are not attending the Church services, we ask that the Ordaining Council serve as a committee to see why they are not attending Church. We ask that each member of the Ordaining Council be allowed to call in a minister to serve with him on this committee if he is not in reach of other members of council.
 - 2. We recommend that the Church give no certificate of license to

preachers, but recommend them to the Ordaining Council for examination at the Minister's Conferences.

3. We recommend that the licensed minister serve under Conference license until he is called to pastor a Church and that he be enrolled as an evangelist until his call to a church.

It was voted that no man can hold two Associational offices, not to interfere with Article 7 of the Constitution.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.
