

# 1st Quarter

February 2, 1980

The Union Association met on February 2, 1980 with the Spring Hill Free Will Baptist Church. The meeting opened with congregational singing "Victory In Jesus". Brother Larry Waltman led the singing and Mrs. Dianne Wisham was the piannist. Brother Wallace Franks led in prayer. Another song was sung "It The Cross". Rev. Irvin Murphy brought the Morning Devotion. The theme for the association was "Walking As Christ Walked". Text: I John 2: 3-6.

The Business Session was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Lamar Parrish. The roll call of churches was made and appointed delegates were asked to stand. A motion was made to seat the delegates. It was seconded and carried.

Petitionary Letters was called for and the New Life Free Will Baptist Church of Thomasville, Ga. presented a letter requesting membership in Union Association.

A motion was made to refer the petition to the Executive Committee for examination. The move was seconded and carried. Only one member of the Executive Committee being present, there was a move and a second that the chair appoint delegates to serve on this committee to take care of this business. The motion carried. Rev. C. B. Dowdney and Brother James Jennings were appointed to serve with Brother James Silvers.

Visitors were recognized: Approximately 12 or 15 members of the New Life FWB Church were present as petitioners. Mr. and Mss. Wallace Franks and their daughter, Wanda, were present from the Little River Assoc. Rev. Gary Silence, a new Pastor in our Assoc. was also recognized.

Committees were appointed:

Finance Committee: Billy Hatcher, Guyton Adams, and
Enoch Parrish.

Digest Committee: Jeannine Silvers, Mrs. Elzie Franks, and Robert Simpson.

A Nominating Committee was needed due to the resignation of the Clerk-Treasurer.

Nominating Committee: Elzie Franks, Lester Lane, W. G.

Turner, Dorothy Murphy, Inez Harrell, Eva Hutto, Janice Wallace, Larry Waltman, Craig Brock, Glenn Etheridge, and Margie Harris.

Guyton Adams gave his Camp Mt. Bethel report and outlined a new method of arranging Camp Sessions. Bemiss Church is supposed to send the \$10,000 donation promised on the Mt. Bethel Swimming Pool right away. The Midway Assoc. has promised to raise \$5000.00 in the month of February for the Swimming Pool. Plans are to start the pool the first of March. M/S/C to receive as information.

Prayer by Rev. Ronald Wallace.

#### INTERMISSION

The meeting reconvened with Rev. Ronald Wallace, Assistant Moderator, serving as Moderator. The congregation sang a hymn, "When The Roll Is Called Up Yonder". Prayer by Rev. C. B. Dowdney, followed by another hymn, "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms". Ushers Glenn Etheridge and James Silvers received the morning offering. The Wallace Franks family rendered two special numbers, "Thank You, Dear Lord" and "I Can't Make It By Myself".

Rev. Lamar Parrish brought the morning message, using the text as presented on the Program.

Rev. Jerry Wisham, Interim Pastor of Host Church, welcomed everyone to lunch in the Fellowship Hall. Committee Meetings were announced and Rev. Ronald Wallace prayed the Lord's Blessing of the food.

#### LUNCH

The meeting reconvened after lunch with the congregation singing "Revive Us Again", followed by prayer led by Brother Price Irvin.

Rev. Ronald Wallace gave the Afternoon Devotion continuing the meeting theme of "Walking As Christ Walked" He read from an expanded text of Ephesians 4:1 and Amos 3:3.

Rev. C. B. Dowdney gave the State Executive report. The Dublin Mission under the direction of Rev. Miller is doing well. Rev. Larry Nix is proceeding with the new Atlanta (Smyrna) Mission. Georgia State giving is moving along well this associational year.

The Sylvester Free Will Baptist Church sent a letter requesting that the association join them in supporting the efforts of the Raybon County Chamber of Commerce
to retain the lighted Cross at Black Rock Mountain State
Park. Court Proceedings have been brought by the ACLU
to have the cross removed. A move to support and send a
donation was made and seconded. An ammendment to the
move to make the donation \$100.00 was made and seconded.
The ammendment and the original moved were carried.

The <u>Digest Committee</u> reported 10 churches, 24 delegates present. M/S/C to accept the report and release the committee.

The Nominating Committee reported: Rev. Irvin Murphy was named to serve the unexpired term of the Clerk-Treasurer. M/S/C to accept the report and release the committee. Nominations from the floor were called for. Since there were no floor nominations, Rev. Murphy was elected by acclamation.

The Executive Committee reported on the New Life FiB Church petition for membership. M/S/C to accept the report and also to accept the church into the Association with full fellowship. The Moderator extended the right hand of Christian Fellowship to all the New Life Members present and to the Pastor, Rev. W. G. Turner.

The Ordaining Council reported:

"We recommend that we accept Rev. Gary Silence, Pastor of Poulan FWB Church, into fellowship with the Union Association as an ordained minister, coming from the Coastal Association of North Carolina, pending a letter from that Association." M/S/C to accept him and the moderator extended the right hand of Christian Fellowship to Rev. Silence.

"We further recommend that the association write a letter to the Cairo FWB Church expressing our Christian love and concern to them as a sister church of the Union Association of Free Will Baptist, concerning their Pastor's standing with the association. He is not and cannot be accepted as an ordained Free Will Baptist Minister by the Union Assoc. of FWB to which the Cairo Church is a member. Therefore we feel that the Cairo Church should be made aware of this fact."

M/S/C that the letter be writtem.

The Finance Committee reported receipts for this meeting of Dues-\$135.88 and the Morning Offering of \$66.00 making a total of \$201.88. The Committee recommended that we send \$100.00 to Camp Mt. Bethel and the \$100.00 formerly voted to go to Raybon County Chamber of Commerce. They also recommended Honorariums for the Clerk and the Moderator of \$25.00 and \$10.00 respectively. M/S/C to accept the report and release the committee. M/S/C to make the contributions as recommended.

A move to follow the Constitution in its procedures to deal with delinquent churches by appointing a committee to call on the Moultrie Church to determine their reasons for absence. The Move was seconded and carried. The Committee will be Rev. C. B. Dowdney, Rev. Ronald Wallace, and Rev. M. C. Powell.

M/S/C to give the Host Church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality.

Rev. M. C. Powell spoke briefly stating how their church became concerned with the cross in Black Rock State Park. Rev. Ronald Wallace brought to the floor the fact the our children would not have a summer church camp unless we plan for it now. The Pastors decided that they would get together and make concrete plans for it. The conversation led in the direction toward having the camp the week of August 17-23. Further announcements will be made later.

The Moderator asked for a rising vote of thanks to the retiring Clerk-Treasurer.

M/S/C to adjourn.

# 2nd Quarter

May 3, 1980

The Union Association met May 3, 1980, with the Sylvester Free Will Baptist Church in Sylvester, Georgia. The theme for the meeting was "Turning from God," using Hebrews 6:4-6 as the text. The meeting opened with the congregation singing, "To God be the Glory." Rev. C. B. Dowdney led the singing with Mrs. Evelyn Widener as pianist. Prayer was led by Rev. Damon Dodd. Another congregational hymn "Praise Him, Praise Him" was sung.

Rev. Damon Dodd gave the morning devotion, using Acts 2 as his text. He spoke on points to produce revival in churches.

Rev. Lamar Parrish called the business session to order. The roll call of churches was made with one church not represented. Ministers and Deacons were recognized. All appointed delegates from churches were recognized and a motion made to seat the delegates. The motion was carried. Visitors were welcomed. Petitionary letters were called for with none being presented.

The Moderator appointed the committees. They are as follows: <u>Digest Committee</u>: Mr. Guyton Adams, Mrs. Janice Wallace, Mrs. Dorcas Scarborough.

Finance Committee: Mr. William Lewis Sr., Mrs. Inez Harrell, Rev. Elzie Franks.

Rev. C. B. Dowdney gave a report on the State works. He reported Smyrna is in need of \$5,000.00 for the land fund. Dublin Church is averaging 40 in the morning and evening services. The State needs workers and support in several locations. Pray that the Lord will send workers and support into His harvest.

The Business Session was dismissed for inter-

mission with prayer led by Rev. Charles Harris.

#### Intermission:

Following intermission the morning worship hour was opened with the congregation singing "Redeemed". Prayer was led by Rev. Elzie Franks. The congregation then sang "There is Power in the Blood". The offer tory prayer was led by Rev. W. G. Turner. Mr. Earl Dawson and Mr. Bill McCoy served as ushers. During the taking of the offering, the congregation sang, "When We all Get to Heaven." Special music was provided by the Midway FWB Church Trio, made up of Toni Wallace, Michelle Tucker, and Stacey Gay. Rev. Ronald Wallace Brought the morning message using Hebrews 6:1-10 as his text, speaking on "Turning from God, and the Possibilities of Apostasy and the Dangers of Losing your Salvation." An invitation hymn, "Breathe on Me" was sung.

Brother James Jennings welcomed visitors and invited all to stay for lunch. Brother Jennings dismissed the congregation with prayer and asked God's blessings on the food.

#### Lunch:

The afternoon session opened with Rev. C. B. Dowdney as song leader and Mrs. Linda Gay, Pianist. The congregation sang "The Regions Beyond." Bro. Melton Harrell led prayer. The afternoon devotion was brought by Rev. Elzie Franks, using the text and subject adopted for the Association.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Lamar Parrish. Rev. Parrish read a letter from the Chamber of Commerce of Rabun County, Clayton, Georgia, thanking the Association for the financial assistance that was rendered for the purpose of defending a cross on Black Top Mountain. Rev. Parish also reported that the court had refused to hear the case and the cross would remain on the mountain. Rev. Parrish read a letter

from the Coastal Association of FWB of North Carolina recommending Rev. Gary Silence to our fellowship. A motion was made to accept Rev. Silence into our association and for the moderator to extend to him the right hand of Christian fellowhhip. The motion was seconded and carried. Rev. Parrish extended the right hand of fellowship to Rev. Silence.

Rev. C. B. Dowdney reported for the committee appointed to determine the intent of the Moultrie FWB Church in regard to the Association. Bro. Dowdney stated the church had refused to meet with the committee stating to him that they had already voted in conference to withdraw from the Association. Rev. Ronald Wallace made a motion that the committee be reaeased and that this Association withdraw fellowship and consider the Moultrie Church as an Independent Church. This motion was seconded by Rev. Elzie Franks. The vote was by a show of hands and the motion was carried.

The <u>Digest Committee</u> reported 10 churches, 9 Deacons, 7 Ministers, 26 church delegates, 2 board members and one visitor. A motion was made and seconded to release the committee. The motion was carried.

The Finance Committee reported the morning offering of \$64.35 and dues from churches \$144.38, making a total of \$208.73. The committee recommended that \$50.00 be sent to Rev. Larry Nix for the Symrna Land Fund, \$50.00 to the Union Mission Board, and \$183.50 be paid for publishing the Minutes. There was a M/S/C to accept the committee's report, to release the committee, and to grant the recommendations of the committee.

Bro. Guyton Adams gave a report from the Camp Board. Bro. Adams reviewed the camp facilities and restated the purpose of the camp. Future activities planned at the camp were reviewed. There was a M/S/C to accept this report as information.

Rev. Ronald Wallace introduced contestants competing in the Youth Competition that will be our representatives to the State Youth Rally.

After the introduction, each of the contestants demonstrated their talents. Toni Wallace, Sword Drill, assisted by Mrs. Linda Gay. Michelle Tucker, Keyboard, playing "This Little Light of Mine."

Margie Harper and Kelly Gay sang "Three Rusty Nails" accompanied by Mrs. Linda Gay. Congratulations were extended to all contestants from the Association by the Moderator.

A motion was made to give the host church a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality. The motion was seconded and carried.

M/S/C to adjourn.

# 3rd Quarter

August 2, 1980

The regular session of the Union Association met August 2, 1980, with Bay Free Will Baptist Church near Moultrie, Georgia. The meeting was opened with congregational singing led by Bro. Jack Faison, accompanied by Mrs. Louvenia Kleedehn. The opening song was "He Keeps Me Singing." Rev. C. B. Dowdney led the congregation in prayer. Rev. Kenneth D. Murphy brought the morning devotion.

The business session was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Lamar Parrish. The moderator read items three (3) and four (4) from the Association's Constitution and emphasized that standing delegates are expected to attend every meeting of the Association. The moderator called the roll of the standing delegates with the following results: 9 Ministers, 14 Deacons. The church appointed delegates were recognized followed by a M/S/C to seat these delegates.

There were no visitors mor corresponding messengers to be recognized.

The moderator appointed committees: Finance Committee - Bro. Jack Faison, Bro. Earl Truett, Bro. James Jennings. Digest Committee: Bro. Glenn Ethridge, Rev. Gary Silence, Bro. Charles Harper.

Rev. M. C. Powell requested time to speak to the Association. Rev. Powell spoke about the neglect of Ministers, Deacons, and people in general in not attending the Association meetings. He expressed a desire for the ministers to encourage their congregations to attend. He also expressed his concern for the responsibility of the Ordaining Council. Bro. Powell gave his resignation from the Ordaining Council and asked the Association to pray for him and his family during this time of decision making.

Rev. M. C. Powell's resignation from the Ordaining Council was accepted with regrets. Bro. Powell was asked by the moderator to serve this date on the Council. The moderator asked Rev. C. B. Dowdney to serve on the Council in the place of Rev. Ronald Wallace.

Rev. C. B. Dowdney gave a report from the National Association meeting the past week. Bro. Dowdney praised the women for the outstanding job they did at the National with their programs. Bro. Dowdney said he was thrilled about the work in Georgia. Reports of revivals and people being saved, continue to come in. In May the people of the State were asked to respond to the needs of the land fund in Smyrna. The response was outstanding and the goal was exceeded. In June, a plea was made for the Dalton Mission and the response looks good. Bro. Dowdney reported that Rev. Billy McKinney has decided to move to Gainsville, Georgia, the first of July and start a mission there. Bro. McKinney is trying now to raise support and Bro. Dowdney expressed his hope that the State and especially our Association, would respond without Bro. McKinney having to spend valuable time coming to us.

Intermission was announced and the congregation was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Jerry Wisham.

Following intermission, the services were opened with the congregation singing "Count Your Blessings," led by Bro. Jack Faison, accompanied by Mrs. Louvenia Kleedehn. Prayer was offered, followed by the congregation singing "The Old Rugged Cross." The moderator issued a challenge for our churches to respond to the support of the Gainsville Mission and to also support our local Mission Board. The morning offering was received with Bro. Chuck Scarbrough and Bro. Earl Truett serving as ushers. The moderator asked that members from churches that were formed in the last thirty (30) years to stand. He commented that over half of our Association are from mission churches, therefore, we should accept the challenge to support missions. Special music was provided by Sister Simpson, singing "Sheltered In The Arms of God," and Gail Sellars singing "Carest Thou Not," accompanied by Terri Sellars. Rev. Gary Silence brought the morning message using John 20:21 as his text. He spoke of the necessity of allowing ourselves to be sent. He also challenged us to become concerned about missions and challenged all to become witnesses.

The congregation was welcomed by Rev. Irvin Murphy, and invited to stay for lunch. A prayer of dismissal and blessings on the food was offered by Rev. Lamar Parrish.

The meeting reconvened with the congregation singing "Christ Arose." Prayer was led by Rev. Elzie Franks. Bro.Jack Faison, Kirsten Kleedehn, and LaRee Parrish sang "This Is My Father's World," accompanied by Louvenia Kleedehn. The evening devotion was brought by Bro. Curtis Gay, using Malachi 2:8 as his text. Bro.Gay spoke of the need of strong positive leaders, and of the need for everyone to sense and accept responsibility.

A verbal request was made known that we issue a letter of good standing and recommendation to the Association in Tennessee for Rev. William Lewis, Jr. There was a M/S/C to grant the letter.

The Finance Committee reported the following: Dues received \$153.38, offering \$84.67 making a total of \$238.05. The committee recommended that \$129.20 be given to help support our association camp session; the moderator be given \$10.00; and the clerk, \$15.00. There was a M/S/C to accept the report, honor the recommendation, and release the committee. A motion was made by Rev. Elzie Franks and seconded by Bro.Jack Faison to send the Gainesville Mission \$75.00. During the discussion, the chairman of the Mission Board, Bro. James Silvers stated that the Mission Board had voted to send \$100.00 to the Mission now and send \$50.00 per month hereafter for one year. The

motion was put to a vote and carried to send the \$75.00.

The Digest Committee reported that 10 churches were represented, 14 Deacons and 9 Ministers. There was a M/S/C to accept this report and release the committee.

# AN ORDINATION STANDARD GEORGIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

#### THE LICENSED MINISTER:

1. A person must be licensed for a period of one year before he can be ordained. He must also be called to the care of one or more churches, or into other services which would require ordination.

#### QUALIFICATIONS OF MINISTERS:

2. They must possess good, natural and acquired abilities, deep and ardent piety, be especially called of God to the work, and ordained by prayer and the laying on of hands.

#### **DUTIES OF MINISTERS:**

3. These are to preach the word, administer the ordinances of the Gospel, visit their people, and otherwise perform the work of faithful ministers.

#### THE QUESTION OF DIVORCE:

4. No individual shall be ordained to the gospel ministry who has been married and divorced, and in the process has more than one living companion. No individual shall be ordained whose wife has been previously married and divorced.

**NOTE:** These regulations are set forth to comply with the Biblical standard for ministers found in 1 Timothy 3:1-7.

#### THE ORDINATION OF WOMEN:

5. Traditionally and historically Free Will Baptist in the State of Georgia have not ordained women to the gospel ministry. So far as we are able to discern, this is still the true sentiment over the state. Therefore, until the thinking of our Free Will Baptist constituency becomes more definitive on this matter, we do not purpose to ordain women.

#### THE AUTHORITY TO ORDAIN:

6. Free Will Baptists, committed to the doctrine of congregational church government, understand that the authority to ordain ministers is in the local church.

In practice, however, the Free Will Baptist churches in Georgia work together in the matter of ordination by delegating the authority for ordination to the association of churches in which the local church holds membership. The true source of this authority should never be lost sight of.

#### PERSONAL PLEDGE OF INTEGRITY:

7. IF ORDAINED TO THE GOSPEL MINISTRY BY THE

ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS OF
GEORGIA, I PROMISE BEFORE GOD AND THE CONSTITUENCY OF SAID

ASSOCIATION:

- 1. To preach the Word of God in its fulness without fear, favor, or compromise, according to the best of my ability.
- 2. To continue to study and improve myself in every way possible.
- 3. To live a clean, upright, exemplary life, and to surrender any habit or

practice unbecoming to a minister of the Gospel.

4. To be considerate of my fellow ministers and their rights.

5. To be fair and impartial with those to whom I minister.

7. To preach and teach Free Will Baptist doctrines as set forth in the Articles of Faith of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and those of the

\_ Association of Free Will Baptists.

8. Finally, I promise, that if at any time I can no longer agree with Free Will Baptist doctrine or policy and preach and practice the same fully with the free consent of my heart and mind, or if I should fall into error and sin and depart from the faith, I will freely, without coercion or restraint, surrender my ordination credentials to the Ordaining Council of the association of which I am a member and cease my activities as a Free Will Baptist minister.

# association deconum

- 1. The officers of this Association shall be elected at the close of the last session of the odd calendar years.
- 2. Any person wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator and be recognized before speaking. He shall confine himself to the question under consideration and avoid personalities.
- 3. No person shall speak more than twice on any subject without permission from the moderator.
- 4. No motion shall be withdrawn after its discussion and must receive a majority vote for passage.
- 5. When a question is under discussion no motion or proposition shall be received except to lay on the table, to amend or postpone indefinitely, which several motions shall be preferred in the order in which they were stated.
- ó. Appointments shall be made by the moderator unless requested otherwise by the body itself.
- 7. Hembers wishing to be excused from the session shall request permission from the moderator.
- 8. The Association has a right to decide what hatters shall be admitted to its consideration.
- 9. When a person is called to the Gospel Ministry and desires to be licensed to preach, he should approach his local Church and request to be licensed. The Church should then examine him thoroughly as to the nature of the call, and request that the Ordaining louncil examine the person before being licensed. At the recommendation of the Ordaining Council and after a vote in a regular Conference, he then should be granted a License to Preach for the period of one year. At the end of the one year his license may be renewed or revoked. Or he may be ordained. (The method mentioned here is the normal practice of most literase and Associations).

10. That no licentiate shall be ordained until he has been a licensed Minister for the period of one year and called to the pastorate of one or more churches or one who becomes engaged in Christian service the nature of which requires the authority of an ordained Minister of the Gospel.

Will the state of the state of

- a. That each Church exercise due caution in the licensing, commending to ordination, and calling of a minister to fill the Pastoral Office.
  - b. That any Ordained Minister coming to Union Association from another Denomination be placed on a One Year Waiting Period under the watchcare of this Association before being accepted into the Union Association.
  - c. A Minister coming to any church of Union Association from another Association must come before the Ordaining Council for questioning.
- 11. This Decorum may be amended at any session of the association by a majority vote.

# ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall hereafter be known as the Union Association of Original Free Will Baptist.
- 2. This body shall meet alphabetically with the the churches on the first Saturday in February, May, and August and the last Saturday in October.

(a) It shall not adjourn formally until all

business is settled.

- (b) It shall use its influence to promote a moral, spiritual, and benevolent program, utilizing all its institutions and auxiliaries.
- 3. This body shall be composed of member churches in good standing and all ordained ministers, deacons, and missionaries shall be standing delegates.

(a) All churches representing at this Assocciation shall be entitled to a minimum of 3 appointed delegates plus 1 additional delegate per 100 members or fraction thereof.

(b) 75 cents per member per year is suggested as the church representation fees. This may be broken down by paying one-fourth (1/4) of the total ammount per member per quarter.

(c) When member churches and ministers, whether serving a church or not, shall absent them-selves from the support of the Association, e.g., prayers, presence, etc., for three

(3) consecutive quarterly meetings;

(1) The Association shall appoint a committee to investigate said church or churches and minister or ministers.

(2) This committee is to report at the next regular quarterly meeting regard-

ing their findings.

(3) If a satisfactory report is not given, the church or churches and minister or ministers shall be apprised of their standing, namely:

- a. Placed on probation until the next regular quarterly meeting;
  b. No voting privileges until such church or churches and minister or ministers attend two (2) successive quarterly meetings, at which time they would be reinstated as members in good standing.
- 4. Requirement of delegate. Each standing delegate shall attend each and every session of this Association.
- 5. Requirement of Churches: Each church shall send a report to each session using the form adopted by the Association.
- 6. Each church in the Association shall be considered an independent body and shall control its own internal affairs having the unrestricted right to administer its own government without supervision or interference, being under Christ essentially independent and absolute.
- 7. The officers of this Association shall be: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer and shall be elected every two years.
- 8. Churches wishing to become members of this association must present petitionary letters, adopt our National Treatise, and conform to its usage.
- 9. There shall be an executive committee composed of the officers of this association plus 5 laymen elected by the body. The elected members serve 5 year terms on a rotational basis. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact business for the association when the association is not in session. Decisions made by the executive committee shall be subject to final approval by the association and must be recorded in the minutes. The executive committee may be called into session by the moderator or assistant moderators if the need arises.
- 10. There shall be a mission board consisting of one member from each church in the Association to serve four year terms on a rotational basis. It shall be

the duty of this board to supervise the missionary program of the association, to solicit the cooperation of member churches and individuals in promoting missions interest, to receive and disperse funds in the interest of missions support. A detailed report of this boards work shall be submitted to the last regular session of the association each year and shall be included in the minutes.

- ll. This constitution may be altered or amended at any regular session of this association by a majority vote.
- 12. There shall be an ordaining council composed of three ordained ministers belonging to this association. Members of this council shall be elected by the association for a 3 year term on a rotation basis. The duty of this council shall be to examine candidates for the ministry according to rules set forth in the association decorum. An annual report shall be submitted to the clerk of the association for inclusion in the minutes.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. First, we believe that there is but one living, true and eternal God the Father, of whom are all things from everlasting, glorious and immutable in all His attributes. I Cor. 8:6: Isaiah 40:28.
- 2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ by whom are all things, the only begotten Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, whom God freely sent into this world, because of the great love wherewith He loved the world; and Christ as freely gave Himself a ransom for all, tasting death for every man, who was buried and rose again the third day, and ascended into Heaven, from whence we look for Him the second time in the clouds of Heaven at the last day, to judge both quick and dead. I Timothy 2:3,6; Hebrews 2:9; St. John 8, Acts 2:4, Ephesians 3:1; Ephesians 6.
- 3. We believe that trere is one Holy Ghost, the precious gift of the Father through His dear Son, unto the world, who quickeneth and draweth sinners home to God. St. John 16;7,8; Acts 2:4; Ephesians 3:1; Ephesians 4:4,5; And that he comes into our hearts. John 1:1; 12; Galatians 4:4; 16; 2nd Cor. 5:12; Titus 3:5; 1 John 5:1; 10:13.
- 4. We believe in the Beginning God made man upright; and placed him in a state of glory without the least mixture of misery, from which he voluntarily by transgression, fell, and by that means brought on himself a miserable and mortal state subject to death. Genesis 2:17; 3:19.
- 5. We believe that God is not willing that any should perish; but that all should come to repentance and knowledge of truth, that they, might be saved; for which in Christ hath commanded the gospel to be preached among all nations and to every creature. Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; John 3:15; I Timothy 2:4.
- 6. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for want of Christ who died for him, but as the Scripture has said, for denying the Lord that brought them; because they believed not in the name of the only begotten Son of God. Unbelief, therefore, being the cause why

the just and righteous God of Heaven will condemn the children of men; it follows against all argument that all men, at one time or other, are found in such capacity as that through the grace of God they may be eternally saved. Acts 17:30; Mark 6:6; Hebrews 3:10; I Joh 5:10.

- 7. We believe the whole Scriptures are infallibly true and that they are the only rules of faith and practice. II Timothy 3: 16,17.
- 8. We believe in the doctrine of General Provision made of God in Christ for the benefit of all mankind, who repent and believe in the Gospel. Luke 14:16,20; Matthew 28: 19, 20; Luke 24: 47; Acts 3:19; Mark 1:
- 9. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost, through Christ His Son, and that the Holy Ghost offers His divine aid to all the human family; so as they all might be happy, if they would give place to His divine teachings; Whereas, sue who do not receive the divine impressions of His Holy Spirit, shall at a future day, seal their own condemnation, and charge themselves with their own damnation, willfully rejecting the offers of sovereign grace. Matthew 11:27; St. John 6:45, 65; Psalm 1:1; Titus 2:11, 12; Jeremiah 22:29.

- ll. We believe that all children dying in infancy ing not actually transgressed against the law of God i their own person are only subject to the first death was brought on them by the fall of the first Adam and

by the guilt of Adam's sin, for "of such is the Kingdom of God". I Cor. 15:22; Matthew 18:25; Mark 9: 36,37; Matthew 19:13.

- 12. We believe that good works are the fruits of a saving faith, and that in the use of this means of grace and not out of the use of these means, eternal life is promised to men. Revelations 22: 14, 15; Isaish 1: 19, 20; Latthew 7: 8; Jeremiah 6:16; Luke 13: 34, 35.
- 13. We believe that no man has any warrant in the Holy Scriptures for justification before God through his own works, power, or ability, which he has in and of himself; only as he by grace is made able to come to God through Jesus Christ; believing the righteousness of Jesus Christ to be imputed to all believers for their eternal acceptance with God. Romans 4:24; Acts 8: 20,21.
- 14. We believe that all things are foreseen in the wisdom of God; so that God knoweth whatsoever can or cannot come to pass upon all supposed conditions; yet not as having decreed any person to everlasting death or everlasting life, out of respect or mere choice, further, that he hath appointed the godly unto life, and the ungodly who die in sin, unto death. Hebrews 4:13; Proverbs 8:22,31; Matthew 25: 31, 46.
- 15. We believe as touching gospel ordinances in believers; baptism, laying on of hands, receiving of the sacrament in bread and wine, washing the saint's feet, annointing the sick with oil in the name of the Lord, fasting, prayer, singing praise to God, and the public ministry of the Word, with every institution of the Lord we shall find in the New Testament. Mark 16:15, 16; Acts 8:17; Acts 19:6; Luke 22: 19, 20; John 13: 5, 17; John 5:14.
- 16. We believe the Gospel mode of baptism is by immersion, and that the believers are the only subject for baptism. Matthew 3:16; Mark 1:9, 10; Acts 3: 19, 21; Ronans 6: 4; Colossians 2: 12.
- 17. We believe in a general resurrection of the dead and a final judgment at the last day. John 5:28,29; II Cor. 5: 10.
- 18. We believe the happiness of the righteous is eternal and the torments of the wicked are endless. Matt. 25:
