PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-first Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at Pleasant Grove, Wayne county on Thursday, October 18, 1917.

Elder J. C. Griffin preached the introductory sermon. Text. Psa. 133:1. "Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to awell together in unity."

After the intermission of one hour Conference reassembled for the transaction of business.

The following officers were elected:

Elder L. T. Phillips, Moderator; Elder E. T. Phillips, Secretary. The Moderator called to his assistance Elder J. H. Whitley. The Secretary called to his assistance Elder B. W. Tippett.

The following committees were appointed:

On motion all standing committees be allowed the full privileges of the body in regard to voting, etc.

On motion all visiting brethren be invited to seats in the body. The

following were enrolled:

Eastern Conference, Elder W. B. Everett and Elder S. H. Styron.

From Cape Fear Conference, Elder J. F. Casey.

From Central Conference, W. J. Braxton and Elder W. B. Nobles.

Elders Gause, Everett, Styron, and Nooles all made remarks that were very encouraging from their various conferences.

Prayer was offered by S. H. Styron.

The following were appointed a new Board of Examiners for ministers applying to the Conference for admission: J. C. Griffin, J. H. Whitley, W. M. Howell, B. W. Tippett, A. B. Utley.

The Devotional Committee report that N. B. Wall open and E. C. Morris preach at the church tonight; W. B. Everett preach at Pikeville; J. H. Whitley preach at Beaman's.

The list of ministers was called and their Christian conduct inquired

into.

On motion a committee investigate the case of Sister W. T. Johnson's child in regard to having its foot adjusted and report to this body. The same committee is to write the obitouary of Elder W. T. Johnson to appear in the minutes.

The following were appointed said committee: S. H. Styron, J. S. Collier, and J. E. Davis.

On motion Sister W. T. Johnson receive the pro rata part of the disabled minister's fund as though Elder Walter T. Johnson were living.

On motion Conference close to meet at 9:30 Friday morning. Prayer by Elder W. P. Gause.

FRIDAY SESSION.

Met as per adjournment. Praise and prayer by Elder B. H. Boykin. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

The following letter was read from B. H. Pate who was appointed Financial Agent for the Ayden School for the Western Conference at its last session.

Apex, N. C., October 15, 1918.

Dear Bro. Phillips:—It is with great regret that I will not be able to attend the Western Conference. I wish to state to the brethren that I have not for the past year been in a position to work for the Ayden School, as I have sickness in my family at all times. I regret to have to say that I have not collected any funds for the School. I wish to ask the brethren to appoint some one else in my place as Financial Agent, as it will be impossible for me to render the service that should be given, having so much sickness in my family. Hope the Lord will provide that I can be with you all next time. With the best of wishes for the brethren and that great results may come from this conference. You can advise the committee that I will give \$10 to the Orphan Home and also to the school the same amount. With best wishes.

On motion we accept the resignation of B. H. Pate as Financial Agent of the school for this Conference.

On motion we cease to appoint a Financial Agent for the school from this Conference and turn the matter over to R. F. Pittman, State Agent.

The following were enrolled as licentiate ministers: A. A. Wells, Princeton, N. C., and Jas. Daniel, Kenly, N. C.

The Examining Board made their report. (See reports of Boards and Committees.)

The following ordaining council was appointed to ordain Elder G. C. Joyner tonight at the church: L. T. Phillips, B. B. Deans and A. R. Flowers.

· Note.—It was so that Elders Deans and Flowers could not well attend, and ordination was conducted by Elder L. T. Phillips, assisted by Elder E. T. Phillips and E. C. Morris.

On motion a committee of five be appointed to investigate the condition of Fremont Chapel and report at the sitting of this Conference. The fol-

lowing were named as said committee: W. M. Howell, R. F. Pittman, E. G. Holland, W. H. Wells and J. C. Griffin.

Elder A. R. Flowers offered a resolution that was adopted. (See resolutions.) The Educational Committee made their report. (See reports of Boards and Committees.

On motion, owing to additional work imposed upon our secretary, requiring him to collect all monies, etc., coming to the conference before the sitting of the conference and that he carry as complete a report to the body as possible, that he be allowed \$5.00 additional for this service.

C. K. Dunn, editor of the Baptist, made some very timely remarks concerning the paper. He spoke of the importance of the Publishing Company as a great asset of the denomination and urged that our people should support it with their utmost energy. Every Free Will Baptist family should have the paper. All the churches that have schools should use our literature as much as possible. More stock in the company should be taken and the power of the company increased continually.

The committee that was appointed to investigate Fremont Chapel made their report. (See reports of committees.)

The Ministerial Committee made their report. (See reports of committees.)

Devotional Committee report as follows: A. R. Flowers preach at Pikeville tonight. At the church: Alonzo Wells open, E. T. Phillips preach. At Stony Hill church: W. M. Ferrell preach.

Elder J. E. Davis in behalf of the Orphanage at Middlesex reported that the work would begin in earnest about Thanksgiving Day. He urged the ministers to take the matter in hand and see how much they could raise by that time. He asked them to send whatever amounts they might collect at as early a date as possible to the treasurer of the Orphanage Board, W. J. Braxton, Winterville, N. C. He gave out several agents certificates to ministers by which they might work for the orphanage in a systematic way.

On motion Conference closed to meet at 9 o'clock Saturday morning. Prayer by J. J. Wilson.

Conference met as per adjournment. Praise by congregation. Prayer by Elder W. B. Nobles.

preach at 11 o'clock. This evening at 2 o'clock, W. M. Ferrell open and A.
B. Utley preach.

The committee that was appointed to make an investigation concern-

ing the child of Sister Johnson's (Mrs. W. T. Johnson) report that the sister is willing for the Conference to look after the welfare of the child as to having its foot set right.

On motion a committee be appointed to superintend the work of having the child's foot set right. Also that they report as to what they have done, what the cost will be, etc. The following compose said committee: *S. H. Styron, J. S. Collier and J. E. Davis.

On motion, W. T. Kirby investigate in regard to Pleasant Union church in Nash county. Advertise and sell same if possible with safety.

On motion, Rocky Chapel be dropped from the list of churches.

Report of Educational Committee.

Not having an opportunity to get a report from the treasurer of the

Seminary, we are unable to make a definite report of the amount received during the year; but report that the receipts were not sufficient to meet the needs of the school. To begin work there were 27 enrolled last year, this year there were 45, showing an increase in attendance and also increasing the needs of the institution. Realizing this need, we offer the following to this body:

- 1. That this Convention endorse the movement of the Financial Agent in raising \$50,000 for the school by 1920; also that we assist in any plausable way in raising this amount.
- 2. That we take immediate steps in making provision for the present emergency in that of providing places to take care of the students now in school and others who may enter.

And especially do we urge our young people to refuse any invitations to soft drink stands, social gatherings, and places of amusement.

We heartily denounce joy rides on the Sabbath that will take them from their church or Sunday school services.
