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## PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Third Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist, of North Carolina, convened with the church at King's Chapel, Durham county, on Thursday, October 16, 1919.

Elder L. T. Phillips, who was appointed, attended and preached the introductory sermon, Subject: "Jesus anointed by Mary."—St. Mark 14:1-10.

#### THURSDAY EVENING.

Conference assembled at 2 P. M. Prayer by E. C. Morris. Elder P. P. Deans, who was elected Moderator at the last conference called the sent. The Secretary, E. T. Phillips, was also present.

The chair appointed the following committees:

On motion the standing Examining Board be re-elected and vacancies filled.

On motion the same committee be re-elected as a standing Orphanage Committee.

The following visiting brethren were present and made welcome:

From the South Carolina Conference.—Elder W. E. Gibbons and E. Poston.

Central Conference.—Thos. E. Beaman.

Eastern Conference.-S. H. Styron, A. H. Outlaw, J. W. Alford.

Each of the above named brethren made very encouraging remarks concerning the work in the various conferences from which they hailed.

The conference being organized, prayers were offered by Elders A. H. Outlaw and E. Poston.

The list of ministers was called and the Christian conduct of each inquired into.

The names of H. F. Peeden, W. G. Boykin, and W. R. Flowers were offered to go before the Examining Board.

Elders B. W. Tippett, A. B. Utley, and J. R. Morris were appointed a committee to write an obituary of Elder J. W. Cox to be spread upon the minutes.

Devotional Committee report that W. M. Howell open and T. E. Beaman preach tonight at 7:30.

On motion, Conference called off till Friday 9 a.m. Praise by congregation. Prayer by S. H. Styron.

#### FRIDAY MORNING.

Met as per adjournment. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by J. R. Morris. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

W. T. Kirby, who was appointed to sell Pleasant Union church, reports that he sold the same for \$141.60 for the conference.

On motion, we receive the report of W. T. Kirby, and that he be allowed \$5.00 for his services in disposing of the said church.

On motion the Orphanage receive one-half the proceeds from the sale of said church.

On motion, the conference buy a\$100 bond in favor of the Seminary, and that the conference use one-half of the proceeds of the sale of Pleasant Union church, in Nash county in payment of said bond and that the conference make up the deficiency between the one-half proceeds of the sale of the church and the \$100 bond.

A letter was read from Elder E. A. W. Husketh and referred to the Ministerial Board.

Devotional Committee report that W. R. Flowers open and A. H. Outlaw preach at the stand at 11 a. m.

The moderator appointed J. C. Griffin in place of R. F. Pittman on the Examining Board, and E. C. Morris in place of N. D. Wiggs, in consideration of the absence of Elders Pittman and Wiggs.

Bro. J. S. Collier reported that the work had been done for the child's foot of Sister Johnson, the cost being \$156.40, which had been paid.

On motion, the report of Bro. Collier be received and that he be allowed to draw on the treasury for the amount still due him.

On motion, the conference give a vote of thanks to the committee for their untiring work in behalf of Sister Johnson's child and for what of good they may have been enabled to have accomplished.

On motion Elder L. M. Mitchell be placed on the retired list of ministers.

On motion, a committee be appointed to find out the bills of those who were sick and present the same to the conference, some of the brethren becoming very sick while attending the conference. W. E. Anderson, E. G. Holland, and J. K. Ruffin were appointed said committee.

#### FRIDAY EVENING SESSION.

Conference opened after noon hour by singing hymn No. 293 at 2.30. J. W. Alford, Field Secretary for the Bond Issue for the Seminary was given time to address the house on the importance of the Bond Issue that the Ayden Seminary is putting forth. His address from beginning to end was earnest, logical and bristled with persuasive and eloquent arguments in favor of the bond issue. He sowed good seed and we trust they will bring forth an abundant harvest.

A vote of thanks was tendered Elder Alford for his splendid and appropriate address.

#### Report of the Sunday School Board.

Your committee beg to submit the following: The work of the Sunday School in the bounds of our conference in most places is doing a very commendable work. Many precious souls have been saved this year through the work of the Sunday Schools. Yet we regret to say that there are a few churches in the bounds of our conference that are not having any Sunday Schools at all, such a report brings us to a state of sadness.

Since the work of the Sunday School has proven to be of so much value in the teaching of the people God's Word, and in bringing them to a knowledge of their duty to their Lord and their fellow man. We therefore submit the following:

First. That the pastors be urged to more greatly impress upon their people the great need of Sunday Schools in all their churches, also the duty of the individual members in regard to the work of the Sunday school.

Second. That this conference select a local board, consisting of five whose duty it shall be to encourage the work of the Sunday school, and to gather all the information possible, and to make a report from time to time as may be necessary, and to make an annual report at each conference meeting. They are to meet together as often as possible to devise plans and ways to greatly advance the work of the Sunday school, and to raise funds sufficient to meet the demands of this great work.

The term of this board shall last for one year, and close at the end of the meeting of the next annual conference.

Third. That the pastors be asked to try to get every church to pledge a definite amount each month to meet the increasing demands of our Sunday schools in our state and conference, which amount shall go into the hands of the Conference Sunday School Board, to be distributed as they may deem best. The same to be used only in Sunday School work.

Fourth. That this conference go on record as endorsing the work of the State Free Will Baptist Sunday School Board in their efforts to do general Sunday school work throughout the state and in their efforts to put out a Field Secretary.

Fifth. That we ask our churches and Sunday schools to raise a definite amount during the year for state Sunday School work, to the amount of 10 cents per capita, and that said money be sent direct to the chairman of the Sunday School Board, Thos. E. Beaman, Ayden, N. C. Thus more rapidly hastening the kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on earth and in bringing lost souls to a throne of grace.

Elder W. E. Gibbons of South Carolina made an interesting and touching farewell address to the conference.

#### Educational Committee's Report.

We, the committee on education beg to recommend:

First. That we patronize the Seminary at Ayden by sending our boys and girls there, instead off to other schools.

Second. That we urge and encourage our young ministers to take this opportunity of better preparing themselves for their work.

Third. That we urge our ministers to push the sale of bonds, and the

laity to buy to their limit.

Fourth. That we accept the resignation of Bro. Deans and thank him for his services as director, and we recommend the appointment of Dr. M.

for his services as director, and we recommend the appointment of Dr. M. Hinnant, of Micro, N. C., in place of Bro. Deans.

On motion we pay the directors belonging to this conference their traveling expenses in attening the meetings of board of the Seminary.

Resolution in Regard to Disabled Ministers.

Seeing the need of more finance for the relief of disabled ministers of this conference, and whereas Christianity and brotherly love bind us to act in response to their needs.

We the Western Conference of North Carolina do recommend that cach church in this conference send a contribution of not less than \$5.00 and as much more as possible to each annual session of this conference for the purpose above mentioned. The same to be apportioned to each minister, who is disabled, by a committee appointed at each regular session of the conference.

2. That there be a committee appointed by the conference to divide the funds as they may see fit among our various institutions and necessary expenses of the conference.

We further recommend that the names of Bros. W. G. Boykin and J. E. Jernigan be placed on the list of licensed ministers.

We ask that W. R. Holder's name be placed on the list of ordained ministers.

We recommend that W. H. Cockrell's name be discontinued from the list of ministers as he is not a preacher now.

We ask that the name of Elder L. B. Grice be discontinued from the list of ministers, he having declared that he was not a Free Will Baptist in heart, and assuch we ask this conference to demand his license and credentials.

We suggest that the conference appoint a committee of five to confer with Marsh Swamp church and Prof. A. R. Flowers concerning the trouble existing between them and report the same to the Executive Committee.

#### Report of the Committee on Missions.

We, your committee on Missions beg leave to submit the following: First. That we endorse the Constitution and By-Laws of the Woman's Home Mission Society, of the Eastern Conference, a copy of which is herewith submitted:

Constitution.—Article 1. This organization shall be known as the Sunday School, Woman's Home Mission and Little Worker's League Convention, of the Eastern Conference of North Carolina.

- Art. 2. The officers of this Convention shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer and Executive Committee. These officers, except the Executive Committee, who shall be appointed by the President at each regular session of the Convention and shall consist of three members beside herself and the Secretary, shall be elected by acclamation every year.
- Art. 3. It shall be the duty of the President to preside over all conventions; to state and put all questions properly brought before the Convention; to preserve decorum, to fill all vacancies in office; to appoint all committees and to perform all duties usually pertaining to such an affice.
- Art. 4. The Vice-President shall occupy the chair in the absence of the President or at the option of that office and in this capacity shall perform all duties pertaining to that office.
- Art. 5. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a full and true record of all the proceedings of the Convention in a book provided by the Convention for that purpose.
- Art. 6. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Secretary to aid the Secretary in her duties and act as Secretary in the absence of that officer.
- Art. 7. The Treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this Convention and shall use the same according to the conditions of the said Convention and shall produce a written report at each annual meeting of the Convention of all money received and paid out. All orders for money during year must be signed by the chairman of the Executive Committee.
- Art. 8. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to look after the local welfare in this district in organizing all Sunday schools, Woman's Home Mission Societies and Little Worker's League and arranging a program for each Convention, with the President as chairman of this committee.
- Art. 9. The members of the Convention shall consist of delegates appointed by various local societies of this Convention, Superintendents of Sunday schools and presidents of the local societies; visitors also may become members at the discretion of the Convention, said members shall not have the right to vote. All ministers shall have the same privilege as officers and delegates.
- Art. 10. Any church having and maintaining a Ladies Aid Society, and who do not feel able to have a regular oorganized Woman's Home Mission Society, are requested to lay aside five cents each month per member for the purpose of Missions.
- Art. 11. The time of meeting of this Convention shall be on Thursday before the fourth Sunday in August at 11 o'clock A. M., and shall be opened by an introductory sermon, by some minister selected by the executive committee.
- Art. 12. The motto of this Convention shall be, "WE CAN DO THINGS IF WE WILL."—Philippians 4:13.
- Art. 13. Any amendment to this Constitution shall be on the table by 1 o'clock P. M., of the day of the Convention, said amendment shall not be voted on before 2:30 P. M., of the same day, and shall be adopted only by three-fourths majority vote of members present.

14. This Convention shall be conducted by regular parliamentary rules. (See Robert's Rules of Order.)

Second. That this conference appoint an organizer whose duty it shall be to organize the Society in the various churches.

Third. That the societies take steps to co-operate with the Woman's Home Mission Convention of the Eastern Conference with the view of perfecting a state organization of the same.

#### THURSDAY NIGHT SESSION.

After a splendid Gospel sermon by Elder S. H. Styron, a presbytery composed of Elders J. W. Valentine, S. H. Styron and J. C. Griffin, proceeded to the ordination of Elders W. R. Flowers and H. F. Peedin, which ordination was carried out in a very impressive and orderly manner, both candidates having passed a very thorough examination by the examining board.

#### SATURDAY MORNING SESSION.

Conference met as per adjournment at 9:30 A. M. Devotional services were conducted by Elder B. H. Boykin.

On motion, the pastor who was appointed by the First Union Meeting District to preach at Fremont Chapel make his report. The report is as follows. That said church ask this conference to send them a preacher. That they would pay half the salary of said minister, leaving the other half for the conference. Says that committee had been appointed to get a pastor through the conference, but that the committee failed in its efforts, and that he ((Elder Wall) got back and filled an appointment.

The above report of Elder N. B. Wall was accepted.

#### Report of Evangelist L. T. Phillips.

Elder L. T. Phillips, the evangelist appointed by last year's conference, reports that he had had one point that he had been supplementing, and that the prospects were bright for a good work being done. He also stated that his expenses had been paid.

The report as above recorded was received and adopted.

A vote of thanks was tendered Elder Phillips for his excellent work as Evangelist for the conference.

On motion, the conference pay L. T. Phillips \$20.00 for his services as missionary out of the mission funds.

Om motion, the Committee on Ministerial Character go to Marsh Swamp church and comply with their recommendation as to the work to be done there.

Eld. E. T. Phillips was re-elected as a Trustee of the Ayden Seminary, he is to serve with Dr. M. Hinnant also elected at this meeting.

#### Report of Committee as to Edgemont Church.

The committee that was appointed to look after the prospects for a church in Durham, known as Edgemont, report that they do not recognize the location as a fitting place for a church and that they ordered the work stopped.

The report as given above was adopted.

On motion, we accept the report of W. T. Kirby and allow his account of \$15.60.

On motion, we allow the account of E. G. Holland, \$4.00 for expenses in attending the State Convention as a delegate from this body.
