## PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Fifth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Holly prings, Johnston county on Thursday, October 13, 1921. Eld. W. M. Howell preached the introductory sermon. Text: Matt. 27:4. "What is that to us?"

#### THURSDAY EVENING.

Conference assembled at 1:10. Prayer by Elder A. B. Utley. Moderator, W. M. Howell and Secretary E. T. Phillips were present, also B. B. Deans, assistant moderator, and W. E. Anderson, reading clerk.

On motion the Examining Board of applications for enrollment of licentiates and ordained ministers be made an Ordaining Council, who shall function as an Ordaining Council as per the requirements of said council in our new book of discipline.

The following constitute said council as the old Examining Board were converted into the council by election: W. M. Howell, L. T. Phillips, R. F. Pittn an, B. W. Tippett, N. D. Wiggs.

All visiting brithin were invited to seats in the body and the moderator vas empowered to invite any who might come during the sitting of the conference.

The conference being organized, prayer was offered by Elder Geo. W. Davis.

On motion a letter of dismission, suitable for any member in good standing who might desire the same, be drafted by a committee of this conference and that the same be sent to the other conferences for their adoption. Committee to draft letter: L. T. Phillips, R. F. Pittman, S. H. Styron.

The list of ministers was called and their Christian conduct was inquired into.

Elders R. F. Pittman, J. E. Davis, and L. T. Phillips were appointed a committee to write an obituary of Elder Curtis Howell, to appear in the minutes.

The devotional committee report that H. F. Peeden open and Z. P.

Ferrell preach tonight.

On motion G. W. Holmes, of Franklin county, be referred to the Ordaining Council for further consideration as to enrollment.

Conference closed with benediction by Elder J. H. Whitley.

#### FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference opened at 9 o'clock. Prayer service conducted by Elder E. C. Morris. Prayer by M. C. Prescott. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

#### Report of Missionary.

Elder J. K. Ruffiin as missionary reports that he has done no mission work as the mission board has given him nothing to do. He reports that he has been instrumental in getting White Oak Hill into good condition, having held a meeting there and there being several additions to the church. The above report was adopted.

On motion Elder W. M. Howell make his report as to his visit to the South Carolina conferences and their way of working in their conferences as to missions. He says the conference there elects a board but no special missionary. That the board looks after the work and has some very successful work carried on.

A letter was read from Elder A. H. Outlaw of the Eastern Conference in regard to the foreign mission work. The letter was read and endorsed as to its merits in calling for a collection or apportionment from the conferences for this much neglected work.

The devotional committee report that G. C. Joyner open and N. S. Lancaster preach at the stand this morning at 11 o'clock.

On motion Elder M. C. Prescott be allowed 30 minutes to speak, immediately after the conference reassembles after the dinner hour.

A letter was read from Eled J. E. Jernigan setting forth the work that he had done through the year and regretting that he could not be present.

Elder Thos. E. Beaman as representative of the Free Will Baptist and the Publishing House in Ayden, spoke very fervently for a few minutes in the interest of the Publishing House and the work the company was doing. Told how the company had been handicapped for want of suitable machinery to do its vast amount of work. He stated that within a short period a new linotype machine would be installed and that the outlook for the company was much brighter for the future than it had been in the past. Eld. M. C. Prescott also emphasized the imoprtance of every family at least taking the paper, i. e., every Free Will Baptist family. A paper with less than 2000 paid up subscribers ought to easily have 10,000. Loyal support of the brotherhood would place the company in a splendid financial condition and would be worth untold blessings to the denomination at large.

The report of Elder Beaman was accepted.

#### Song Book Endorsed.

On motion the Western Conference endorse the work of the Song Book Committee, and urge that churches everywhere over the connection be advised to buy a full supply of the books that have recently been published and that they be use as our church song book in all our churches at as early a period as possible.

On motion Elder W. A. Benson be given a letter of commendation to join the Cape Fear Conference as per his request.

As soon as conference was assembled after dinner, Elder M. C. Prescott made a very strong plea for our institutions, taking for his subject, "Bringing UP the Rear." Text: "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth... but in heaven." He showed how millions were being spent for worse than nothing in many instances, and especially did he stress the need of our people supporting our institutions. We are losing annually our young people for the want of an institution of learning. The printing house is in great need; orphans are knocking for admission. We muse rise up and build.

Devotional committee reports that J. R. Morris open and B. W. Tippett preach at 2:50 p. m. J. E. Davis open and W. E. Anderson preach tonight, and A. B. Utley preach tonight at Piney Grove church.

The list of churches was called. (See table of statistics).

On motion conference close till tomorrow at 9 o'clock. Benediction by Elder H. F. Peeden.

#### SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock. Devotional services conducted by B. B. Deans. Minutes of Friday read and approved.

Report of Sunday School Committee.

Realizing the great importance of this conference taking some definite stand in favor of Sunday School work, and whereas the former Sunday School report was rejected,

Be it Resolved, That this conference endorse every progressive move put forth in Sunday School work, and that we request our churches and preachers to advise and co-operate with the State Sunday School Board as ar as practical. (Adopted.)

#### Report of Committee on Temperance.

Realizing the absolute necessity of an influence that may place a check on the stress of modern temptations that are being placed before our young people,

Be it Resolved, That we protest against intemperance in its various forms.

- 1. That we discourage the use of narcotics.
- 2. That we use our influence against the excessive indulgence in ball ames.

That we disapprove the modern dances.

- 4. That we protest against the use of indecent suits worn by our people in bathing pools and watering places.
- 5. That we discourage and protest against all forms of gambling; and at we do all in our power to break up the violation of our prohibition

#### Report of Committee on Missions.

We, your committee on Missions beg leave to report the following: Seeing the need of a greater effort being put forth by this conference for a better system of mission work in and out of this conference.

Therefore be it Resolved, 1. That this conference appoint for an unmited time a Missionary Board who shall have full control of the mission work in this conference.

2. That each union meeting appoint its own missionary, and any missionary who shall be appointed to do mission work, shall make report of his work quarterly to the mission board appointed by this conference.

3. That said board shall inquire into and investigate the work done by each missionary, and shall have power to accept or reject any and all work done by said missionaries. Further, they shall have right to regulate and compensate each man according to the work done.

4. That said board shall report annually to this conference the amount of work done.

#### SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF ELD. C. D. HOWELL.

The subject of this sketch was born near Goldsboro, N. C., January 4, 1837. He died near the place of his birth on April 29, 1921. He was the son of Morris and Polly Howell. Bro. Howell entered the civil war in 1861. He served in the army till the close of the conflict in 1865. In that year he returned home and later in the same year professed religion and joined the M. E. church. Some time after that he was licensed to preach, and served as a local minister. About the year 1894 he withdrew from the Methodist church and joined the Free Will Baptist at Stony Hill church in Wayne county. He received full power as a minister. He was ever faithful to the charge committed to him as long as his health would permit. It seemed to be his mission to build up weak churches, and we believe that no man could have done better on this line than he did. Elder Howell was twice married. His first marriage was to Miss Sophia Deans, February 6, 1868. To this union were born five children, four boys and one girl. Three sons survive him. In September 1912, he was married to Miss Josaphine West, who died a few days after Bro. Howell.

Surely a good man has laid down the working tools of life and gone to his final reward. "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord; yea, saith the Spirit, they shall rest from their labors and their works do follow them.
