PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Sixth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Pine Level, Johnston county, N. C., on Thursday, October 12, 1922.

Opened by singing, "On Jordan's Stormy Banks I Stand." Prayer by Eld. N. B. Wall. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder N. S. Lancaster. Text: John 10:10. "I am come that they might have life and that they might have it more abundantly."

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at 1:15. Song service by the audience.

The moderator, Elder W. M. Ferrell called the house to order and appointed the following committees:

After the organization, prayer was offered by Elder L. H. Wetherington.

Elder W. E. Gibbons, a delegate from the South Carolina Conference being present was invited to a seat and a welcome was extended to him.

Elder Gibbons spoke and thanked the brethren for the hearty welcome that had been extended to him. He spoke of the condition of our people in South Carolina, and dwelt upon their being one with us in faith and doctrine, but that they were not without their troubles and perplexities as all Christian people ever will be.

The following brethren were enrolled from other conferences.

The list of ministers was called and their Christian character inquired into.

On motion the clerk rearrange the obituary as found in the minutes of the Ministerial Association of Elder B. W. Tippett, and that the same appear in the minutes of the present conference.

The names of R. N. Hinnant and C. W. Johnson were presented to go before the ordaining council.

The devotional committee report that E. C. Morris preach at Pine Level tonight and that W. E. Anderson preach at Rains Cross Roads church.

The conference closed to meet at 9 o'clock Friday morning.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION.

Conference opened as per adjournment. Prayer by Elder J. E. Davis.
On motion W. T. Kirby be continued as a committee to look after the interest of the conference in Black Jack Grove church, and that he attend to the matter as speedily as possible.

On motion, the names of C. M. Johnson, W. W. Skellett, E. T. Lucas be entered as licentiates.

The devotional committee report that L. H. Wetherington open and W. W. Skellett preach at 11 A. M. today.

Prayer by Elder A. B. Utley.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference met at 1:15 opened with song by R. N. Hinnant. Duet by W. M. Ferrell and Mrs. J. R. Oliver.

On motion the church at Daniel's Chapel, Wilson county be received and delegates from said church be seated.

On motion, Elders R. F. Pittman and N. D. Wiggs be granted letters to unite with the Central Conference.

Elder W. B. Everett, Financial Agent of the College now being erected at Ayden, N. C., reported as follows:

Resolution in Regard to Erecting a Church in Wilson, N. C.

Whereas, Gaston Watson, of Wilson, N. C., has made a splendid proposition to this conference by offering a handsome site in the above named town for the location of a Free Will Baptist church; and whereas a delegation of preachers have agreed that it is the proper place, having met there to confer over the matter with each other.

Therefore, we, the Western Conference in session at Pine Level, N. C., appoint Elders S. H. Styron and J. K. Ruffin with D. B. Sasser, to confer with Gaston Watson and other interested parties as to the design and size of the church building, and that this committee arrange to have plans and blue prints prepared.

We further recommend that this committee arrange to make a canvass of the city and perfect an organization as early as practicable, and that the entire conference pledge our strength and co-operation in carrying out these plans.

The above resolution was adopted.

Dr. M. Hinnant made some very timely remarks concerning the importance of the hearty support of all our people in behalf of the Orphanage at Middlesex, N. C. He was followed by Superintendent C. G. Pope, who spoke of the great importance of the erection of another building as soon as possible, owing to the limited capacity of the building at this time. He stated

that he was compelled to turn down applications almost continuously on account of the present limitations.

A collection was taken for the orphanage, amounting to \$50.16.

The devotional committee report Z. P. Ferrel preach tonight at Rains Cross Roads; A. B. Utley open and E. T. Phillips preach tonight at the church.

Elder L. M. Mitchell, an aged minister spoke of his unswerving faith in his latter days and of his steadfastness in the same. Many of the brethren and sisters gave him the parting hand and remembered him with monetary donations.

Report of Ministerial Committee on Character.

We, your committee on Ministerial Character beg leave to submit the following:

1. That W. R. Flowers be excommunicated for unchristian conduct, and whereas his past record has proven detrimental to our cause both as a minister and worker in Sunday schools.

We, therefore, recommend that our churches refuse his services as a Sunday school superintendent or teacher in our Sunday schools.

2. We find that certain rumors circulated against B. B. Deans are absolutely false and without any foundation whatever. We further recommend that in the future no preacher shall be publicly implicated or accused but that all such be referred to the Ministerial Committee.

BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above report was adopted.

Report of Ordaining Council.

We, your Ordaining Council beg leave to report as follows:

The following candidates came before the council and were examined: R. N. Hinnant, Cyrus M. Johnson, E. T. Lucas, G. W. Holmes, W. W. Skellett, W. R. Williams. They were found properly qualified, therefore we recommend that after their ordination their names be placed on the list of ordained ministers.

Conference closed by singing number 91 in Hymns of Praise.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 A. M. Song by the congregation, "Work for the Night is Coming." Prayer by Elder S. H. Styron. The moderator declared the conference in order for business. Minutes of Friday read and adopted.

On motion the secretary write to J. W. Fuquay stating that he was once a member of this conference but that he was disowned.

On motion the license and credentials of W. R. Flowers, that is in the hands of the Secretary be destroyed.

Elder L. T. Phillips reported that he went as one of the Executive committee to Floods Chapel church and that W. M. Howell also went with him. and that he did what he could.

On motion the conference pay Bros. Phillips and Howell for their expense incurred in going to Flood's Chapel.

On motion the conference appoint Elders L. H. Wetherington, J. W. Valentine and S. K. Gillum to look after the situation of Coco Creek, and that they dispose of the property as they see fit.

State Convention Resolutions Adopted

The following resolutions passed at the State Convention were adopted by this body, viz: An Advisory Resolution, Family Altar, Song Book, Revision of Discipline, and on Darwinism.

Advisory Resolution. Resolved, That this Convention advise all churches belonging to said convention, that should any church allow any minister belonging to the Co-operative Association to do work in said church, then the convention will feel itself compelled to disown said church or churches and will also instruct the conferences to which said church or churches belong to take similar action.

Be it Resolved, That section 5, under the heading, "The Ministry" be interpreted to mean that the committee on investigation has a right to silence the offender until the next conference, and the conference has a right right to deal with the offender regardless as to whether or not his home church or a church that he is serving deals with him.

SPECIAL NOTE.—In connection with the resolution on "The Family Altar," the Conference amended the same by inserting these words: "And that we also go back to our former custom of observing Friday before each Yearly Meeting in each church as a fast and prayer day."

On motion, this Conference appoint Field Secretary for the Free Will Baptist League. Elder R. N. Hinnant was appointed Secretary with the understanding that he co-operate with the pastors of the various churches in his work and that his expenses be allowed.

Sister Annie Deans reported that she had organized two Ladies Aids and that they were doing well. Her report was adopted and she was continued on the work.

Report of Committee on Sunday Schools.

Realizing the great importance of taking some definite stand in favor of Sunday School work, and whereas the former Sunday School report was rejected,

Be it Resolved, That this Conference endorse every progressive move put forth in Sunday School work and that we request our churches and preachers to advise and co-operate with the State Sunday School Board as far as practical.

BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above report was adopted at the session of 1921, and readopted by the present session of 1922.

Resolution by L. T. Phillips. (Adopted.)

Seeing the great need of a clean ministry both in spirit and in body in setting clean and wholesome examples before the public.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. That we the Western Conference will not after the sitting of the next annual conference in 1923, receive any more applicants for ordination who in any way use tobacco or intoxicants as a beverage.

2. That all of our teachers encourage their churches and congregations to abstain from the use of the same.

Resolutions Regarding the Unity of Practices by Ministers. (Adopted.)

Seeing the great need of all our preachers, pastors and churches preaching and practicing the Free Will Baptist doctrine as taught and recorded in the Bible, and in accordance with our book of Discipline.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. That all our pastors, evangelists, and preachers receiving members into the Free Will Baptist churches should urge upon them as their duty, a strict conformity to our discipline, and rules and government of our church and conference.

2. That they teach and impress upon the members of their churches and congregations the duty and importance of their support of all our church work and its institutions according to each one's ability, both spiritually and financially.

3. That every Free Will Baptist family have and read our Book of Discipline and be governed accordingly, also that they subscribe for and read our church paper, published at Ayden, N. C.

4. That all of our preachers, pastors, missionaries and evangelists, keep a record at the next general conference.

5. That these resolutions be in force from the day of their adoption.

Conference reassembled at 1:55 P. M. October 14, 1922.

Report of the Committee on Education. (Adopted.)

The committee on Education agreed to adopt last years report, which is as follows:

We, your committee on Education beg leave to submit the following: We heartily endorse the work of the Financial Agent, W. B. Everett in his efforts to raise \$250,000.00 with the understanding that 75 per cent goes to the School, 20 per cent to the Orphanage, and 5 per per cent to the Publishing House in Ayden.

BY THE COMMITTEE.

NOTE BY SECRETARY. It will be seen that the name of W. B. Everett appears in place of M. C. Prescott, who was the agent last year. It also might be noted that the Stockholders of the Publishing House decided in their annual meeting to donate their 5 per cent to the College so that the College is to get 80 per cent instead of 75 per cent as the report designates.

On motion the Orphanage Committee be discontinued.

W. T. Kirby made report of his trip to Ayden, to attend the stockholders meeting of the Printing Company. His report was accepted and his expense of travelling ordered paid.

Elder J. W. Valentine made a plea in behalf of Plain View church in Franklin county. A collection was taken for that church.

It was ordered that L. T. Phillips be paid \$4.00 and W. M. Howell \$3.00 for their expenses in attending Floods Chapel.
