PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Seventh Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Pleasant Grove, Wayne county, N. C., on Thursday, October 18, 1923.

Opened with song service conducted by Elder R. N. Hinnant. Prayer by E. T. Phillips. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder Geo. W. Davis, of Wilson, N. C. Text: Rev. 22:4. "And they shall see his face; and his name shall be in their foreheads."

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference reassembled at 1:15. Song service by the audience. Eld. W. M. Ferrell, the moderator, called the conference to order and appointed the following committees:

The moderator was empowered to invite visiting brethren and sisters to seats in the conference.

Elder N. D. Wiggs of the Central Conference gave a favorable report of the work in the Central Conference.

Elder M. H. Mellett spoke of the work in his conference, stating that the work there was introduced from ministers of this state. Said his people were enthusiastic for the building of the college at Ayden, and that they were arranging to have an orphan home in South Carolina.

Elder E. B. Joyner of the South Georgia Association, stated in his usual fervent manner, his devotion for the brotherhood in North Carolina.

That he would soon be in our midst as he had taken work for the coming year in the Central Conference.

Encouraging remarks were made Elder E. P. Kirby, of South Carolina., Elders Edwards and Rouse from the Eastern Conference, and also Sister Rouse expressed pleasure in being in the meeting.

The list of ministers was called and the Christian character of each was inquired into. All who failed to receive a favorable report were referred to the committee on Ministerial character.

One minister died during the year, Elder A. A. Holder of Durham. The moderator appointed a committee to write an obituary of Bro. Holder to appear in the minutes of the conference. Committee: Elders W. E. Anderson, Z. P. Ferrell and T. C. Marks.

By motion the following brethren were received into the conference and names entered on the list of licensed ministers: Wiley Ferrell, Selma, N. C., Route 1; E. G. Holland, Kenly, N. C.; Marcellus L. Williamson, Sims, N. C., Route 1.

Elder W. M. Howell spoke of the importance of scattering flowers during the life of individuals instead of waiting to adorn their graves after they were dead.

The Devotional Committee report as follows: G. W. Ferrell preach at Pikeville tonight; B. B. Deans open and Prof. A. R. Flowers preach tonight at the church.

Elder L. T. Phillips spoke of the importance of being loyal to the church and its doctrine.

On motion conference called off till 9 A. M., Friday.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference was opened in due form by the moderator at the appointed hour. Prayers were offered by B. B. Deans and J. W. Alford.

Minutes of the previous day were read and adopted.

The Committee that was appointed to look after Coco Creek church property report that they have obtained a deed for the same. Submitted by J. W. Valentine, L. H. Wetherington, S. K. Gillum, committee.

The above report was adopted and the committee continued.

The Devotional Committee report that W. B. Everett preach at 11 A. M. D. U. Oliver, of Pine Level offered his resignation as treasurer of the conference. His resignation was accepted and Z. C. Bissett, of Middlesex, N. C., was elected Conference Treasurer.

Conference adjourned to hear the address or sermon by W. B. Everett, to reconvene at 1:15 after the dinner hour.

At the 11 o'clock hour Elder Everett made a stirring address on Christian Education, using Heb. 13:21 as the basis of his discourse.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference convened at the appointed hour. Prayer by Elder G. W. Davis.

The moderator appointed Elder N. B. Wall to serve as a member of the Committee on Ministerial Character in place of R. N. Hinnant, who was not in the meeting on Friday.

The following new churches were received into the conference and their delegates seated:

Gethsemane, Nash county; May's Chapel, Wayne county; and Edgemont, Durham county.

The Devotional Committee reported that J. W. Valentine open and E. P. Kirby of S. C., preach at 3:15 P. M.

Elder B. P. Parks spoke in the interest of the Orphanage Home at Middlesex. He insisted on the importance of building a cottage to accommodate more children that they could care for with the present facilities. He spoke very encouragingly about the prospect of its erection in the near future. He specially stressed the demand of the hour and insisted on heavy offerings being given on Thanksgiving Day and at other times as well.

W. T. Kirby who was appointed to look after the property of Black Jack Grove church in Wayne county, says he has not so far been offered a reasonable price for the land and building that the conference empowered him to sell, therefore he is holding on hoping to be offered a better price in the future.

The report of Bro. Kirby was received and he was continued as a committee for the ensuing year.

E. T. Phillips, editor of the Free Will Baptist, our church organ, spoke insistently upon the importance and duty of the brotherhood in regard to supporting the paper and upholding our Publishing House in every way possible.

The Devotional Committee report that W. B. Everett preach tonight at Pikeville; Elders G. C. Joiner and W. E. Anderson tonight at Bro. Beaman's; L. H. Wetherington open and M. H. Mellett preach at church tonight.

Conference adjourned till Saturday 9 A. M. Prayer by L. H. Wetherington.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock. Prayer by R. N. Hinnant.

Devotional Committee report that R. N. Hinnant open and S. H. Styron preach at 11 o'clock.

Resolved, That this conference go on record as endorsing the action of the Stockholders of the Ayden Free Will Baptist Printing Company, in asking that personal reflections against brethren, one against another be excluded from the columns of our church organ as much as possible for the good of all concerned, also destructive criticisms.

Report of Temperance Committee.

Realizing that the initiative to all moral and religious discipline rests in the early training,

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. That we especially stress the importance of good home training for our childhood, and that all parents make special efforts to safeguard their children against many modern and secular interpretations.

2 That our Sabbath Schools and churches maintain and support only the most wholesome amusements and environments for our young people; and that we tolerate and support no form of recreation for our young people that is not wholesome.

3. That we impress the need of good citizenship and we condemn all forms of mob violence and support the enforcement of law and order.

4. That we encourage the spirit of brotherly love and Christian affection among all Protestant people, and especially our own brotherhood.

The above resolutions were clearly explained by Prof. A. R. Flowers chairman of the committee, after which, the report was adopted.

Elders A. B. Utley and G. W. Ferrell were appointed to work with the Mission Board in the absence of R. L. Barnes, and E. A. Winstead.

Eld. N. S. Lancaster was appointed to work temporarily in the place of Elder L. T. Phillips in the committee on Ministerial Character.

Resolution as to Orphanage.

Be it Resolved, That this conference appoint a standing Orphanage Committee, whose duty it shall be to keep the needs of the Home before our people, also to aid in correcting misunderstandings arising which will reflect upon the Home.

The above resolution was adopted and the standing committee appointed. (See list of officers, committees, etc.)

Dr. M. Hinnant, Treasurer of the Orphanage Board made a thrilling speech in behalf of the Home. He told the conference plainly that no one had any strings upon any of the land or any property connected with the Home. It is ours. The title to the property, deeds and the like are as firm as they can be made. The orphanage is now out of debt, but the winter is coming on and it means something to clothe so many children. Besides all this it is of the greatest necessity that buildings be erected to care for many worthy applications that are knocking at the door of the institution for admittance. Like Bro. Parks of the day before, he impressed upon the brotherhood the importance of making a grand rally on Thanksgiving Day in behalf of the institution.

Following the address a collection was taken for the Home amounting

to \$50.00. The moderator then called off the business of the session for 11 o'clock service.

Eld. S. H. Styron preached. He portrayed in a very forceful manner the account of the Savior going over the sea to Gadara and meeting the man from the tombs. He showed that the Gadarenes were very much wrought up over the loss of their swine. They cared for hogs above everything else. They put the material above the spiritual and there are many people today who make this awful mistake.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference opened at the appointed hour. Prayer by Prof. A. R. Flowers.

Report of Educational Committee.

Realizing that spirituality and intellectuality are inseparable,

Be it Resolved, 1. That all parents be urged to place only the most wholesome reading matter before their children, and that we protest against the use of over exaggerated fairy stories in our public schools.

2. That we encourage the dignity of honest manual work, and that we give to our children of the rural districts such advantages as far as possible as will be conducive to the making of country life more interesting.

3. That we do all that we can to give our children the advantage offered them by the public schools of our country.

4. That we as a denomination keep constantly before our people the absolute need of our denominational school, and that we make every sacrifice reasonable to complete the College at Ayden, N. C., and equip the same with a faculty of competent Christian men and women.
