

PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Eighth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Micro, Johnston county, N. C., on Thursday, October 16, 1924.

Opened with prayer by Elder J. R. Morris. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder S. H. Styron. Theme: "The Lord's Prayer."

Following the sermon refreshments were served on the church yard.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference reassembled at one o'clock. Song by the audience. The Moderator called the house to order and appointed the following commit-

After the organization, prayer was offered by Elder B. B. Deans The following delegates were enrolled from the different Conferences: EASTERN.-Elder S. H. Styron.

On motion we invite Elder J. H. Worley of Pine Level to a seat with us and be allowed the privileges of this body save that of voting.

Interesting and edifying talks were made by Elders N. D. Wiggs, S. H. Styron, also J. H. Worley of the Holiness church.

The list of ministers was called and the Christian conduct of each inquired into.

On motion the names of J. R. Forest, Middlesex, N C.; J. S. Wilson, Bailey, N. C., Leonard L. Davis, Fremont, N. C., Route 2, be entered on the list of licensed ministers, also W. B. Batts, of Rocky Mount, N. C., and Ransom Smith, Selma, N. C. Rute 1.

The Devotional Committee report that E. C. Morris open and T. E. Beaman preach at 7:30 tonight E. T. Phillips open and G. W. Ferrell preach tomorrow at 11 o'clock; Wiley Ferrell open tonight and N. D. Wiggs preach. (Eld. N. D. Wiggs not being present, T. C. Marks preached).

On motion Conference close till 9:30 o'clock Friday morning. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by E. Poston.,

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met as per adjournment. Song No. 165. Prayer by Eld. A. B. Utley. Elder L. T. Phillips addressed the body concerning voting, stating that all our own Original Free Will Baptist brethren should be allowed to vote with us, but others not.

On motion we add B. B. Deans and H. H. Matthews to the original committee as to Coco Creek church and that they dispose of the same.

On motion we authorize the Trustees of the Conference to take the matter of looking after Princeton church in hand, investigate and report.

On motion Bro. W. T. Kirby be continued as a committee to look after Black Jack Grove church and that he dispose of it as he sees fit.

On motion B. B. Deans be chairman of a committee to see Mr. J. F. Bruton and the trustees of the Presbyterian church for information regarding church property now in question.

FRIDAY EVENING.

Met at 1:45 with song and prayer service conducted by E. C. Morris A strong plea for the Wilson church was made by Eld. S. H. Styron.

On motion B. B. Deans be placed on the Ordaining Council in place of Elder W. M. Howell, owing to Bro. Howell's feebleness.

On motion J. H. Whitley be placed on the Ordaining Council pro tem. C. K. Dunn of Ayden, Manager of our Publishing House spoke in behalf of increasing the capacity of the same in the town of Ayden, N. C.

The list of churches was called. (See Table of Statistics).

Conference adjourned until tomorrow. Benediction by N. D. Wiggs.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock. Prayer by T. E. Beaman.

Minutes of the previous day read and approved.

On motion the Western Conference take \$300.00 worth of stock in the Publishing Company, same to be raised.

On motion the proceeds from the sale of Coco Creek and Black Jack Grove churches be converted into stock in the Publishing Company as a part of the \$300.00 to be raised for said company.

The Devotional Committee report as follows: Wiley Ferrell open and Prof. K. S. Wuest preach at 11 o'clock; for tonight, L. S. Lancaster open and preach. On Sunday W. B. Everett preach at 11 o'clock.

Resolution by Eld. L. T. Phillips (Adopted.)

Owing to disorderly walk sometime by preachers of other Conferences,

1. Be it Resolved, That any preacher having the care of a church in another Conference shall for disorderly walk be dealt with by the church and Conference in which the offence is committed according to our Book of Discipline, page 23, fifth and sixth sections.

2. We ask all of our Original Free Will Baptist Conferences and Associations to accept and adopt this resolution. The same to be in force from the time of its adoption.

Report of Christian Workers Summer School.

A Christian Worker's Summer School was held in the Free Will Baptist Seminary, August 4-8, with a total registration of 75. This being the first session the registration far exceeded our expectation. The results of the school was indeed gratifying.

The faculty was composed of M. B. Prescott, R. F. Pittman, L. E. Ballard, A. H. Outlaw, and Thos. E. Beaman. The lecturers were: Hon. S. J. Everett, Dr. C. Banks McNairy, Prof. W. F. Walters, Rev. J. L. Welch, and Prof. R. B. Spencer.

The courses of instruction were as follows: Bible lectures on the Church, by J. L. Welch; Sunday School Organizations and Administration, by Thos. E. Beaman; Free Will Baptist League Work, by L. E. Ballard; Evangelism, by R. F. Pittman; Church Organization, by A. H. Outlaw.

The evening lectures by Hon. S. J. Everett, C. B. McNairy, Prof. W. F. Walters and Prof. R. B. Spencer were well attended by the people of the town of Ayden and community, and were indeed a great source of instruction.

This Summer School has been established as a permanent school. We are to have a larger and more thorough course next term which term will also be longer, probably two weeks instead of one week.

The said Summer School is under the control of a joint committee of the Ministerial Association and the Board of Trustees of the school.

We are asking this Conference to endorse the said School and that the preachers and all churches workers who possibly can attend the next session.

- 1. We ask all pastors to insist upon the churches over which they have the oversight to see that their churches have evergreen Sunday Schools.
- 2. We insist upon pastors being present at their churches in time for the Sunday School at each and every appointment if possible, and that they take an active part in the same.
 - 3. We insist that all our churches use our own literature.
- 4. We insist on each school representing each year in the Mass Meetings and also making a yearly report of their work for the year.

Temperance Report. (Adopted.)

We, the committee on Temperance beg leave to submit the following: Whereas, There are other things that dstroy and demoralize as well as strong drink.

Therefore, be it Resolved, 1. That we deplore the general tendency of the age to dscrate the Sabbath Day.

2. That we do not patronize or frequent the race track, ball games, or any place of sinful amusement.

3. That we keep continually before our people the need of obeying the law, and impress upon them that one can not be a good citizen, much more a Christian, if he does not keep the law of the land.

Prof. K. S. Wuest, principal of the Bible Department of the Seminary, was present and made a very impressive address on the inconsistencies that exist among professing Christians, showing why it is so or why the Christian does not enjoy the fullness of the blessings that he should. The life of the worldly ungodly person is represented by the caterpillar crawling around on the ground with nothing to be admired about him but rather repulsive. The Christian life may be compared to the butterfly that has been transformed from the caterpillar state to the glorious state of the butterfly. The reason the person changed into the new life does not always soar like the butterfly is because he has will power, and can be led by Satan to commit sins that mar his peace and happiness.

Dr. M. Hinnant of the Orphanage Board made a strong plea for the Orphanage. He also strongly urged the importance of supporting the Superanuates of our denomination. The Lord knows that we are not doing our

duty along that line. Let us arouse and raise a sum sufficient to at least give those who have worn themselves out in the cause a reasonable allowance.

SATURDAY EVENING.

Conference met at 1.15. Prayer by S. H. Styron.

Report of Educational Committee. (Adopted.)

Realizing that spirituality and intellectuality are inseparable,

Be it Resolved, 1. That all parents be urged to place only the most wholesome reading matter before their children, and that we protest against the use of over exaggerated fairy stories in our public schools.

- 2. That we encourage the dignity of honest manual work, and that we give to our children of the rural districts such advantages as far as possible as will be conducive to the making of country life more interesting.
- 4. That the examining board of this Conference be required to prepare a list of questions annually to which all applicants for ordination shall give written answers, and shall be required to answer correctly 85 per cent of all questions.
- 5. That we as a denomination keep constantly before our people the absolute need of our denominational school, and that we make every sacrifice reasonable to complete the college at Ayden, N. C., and equip the same with a faculty of competent Christian men and women.
