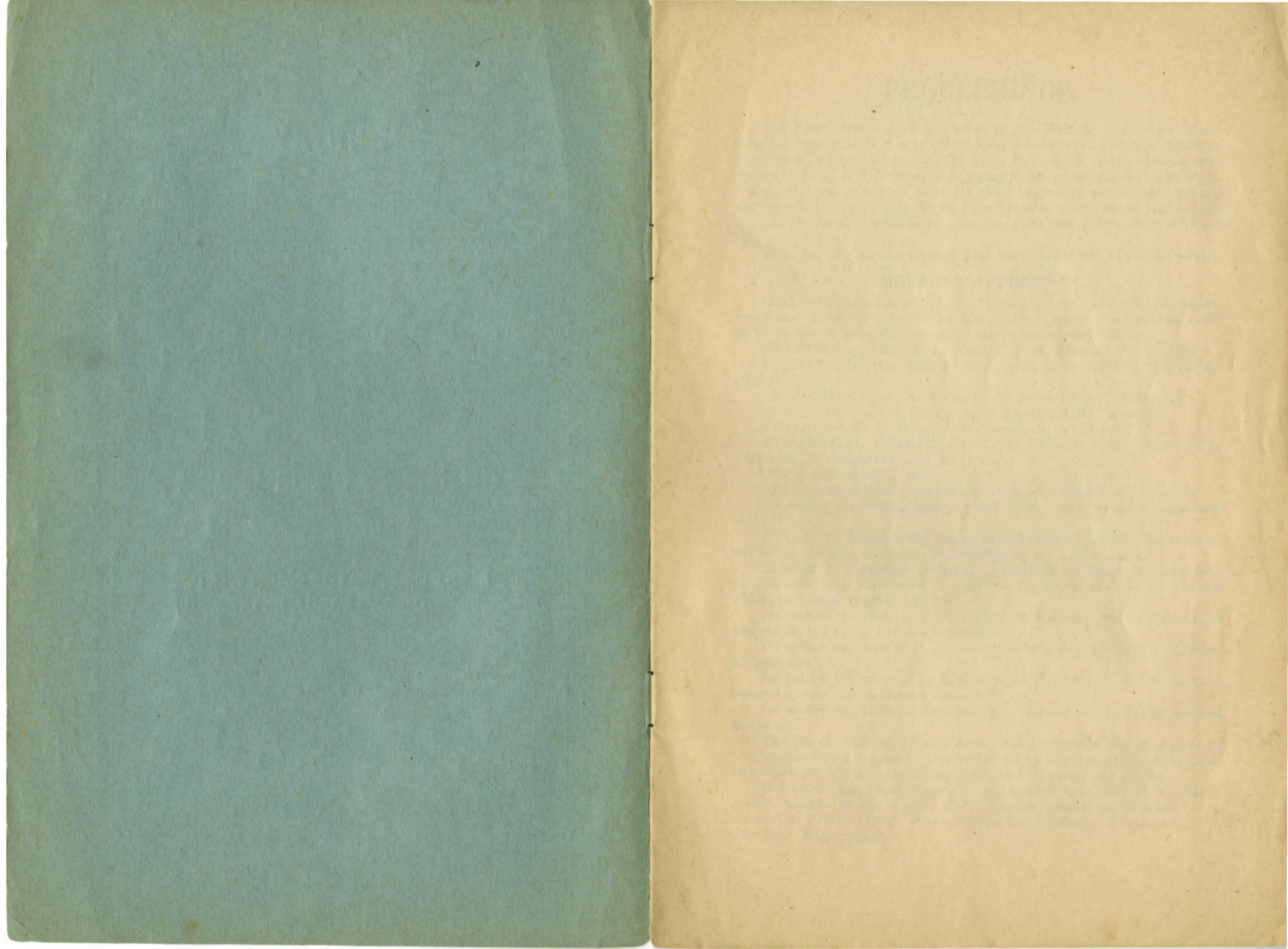

PROCEEDINGS.

The Thirty-Ninth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina convened with the church at Stony Hill, Wayne county, on Thursday, October 15, 1925. Opened with prayer by Elder L. T. Phillips and singing by the congregation. Eld. W. M. Ferrel, who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, was present and preached. Text: Rom. 10:12, "For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him."

Following the sermon refreshments were served on the church yard.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference reassembled at 1:30. "Love lifted me" was sung by the congregation. Prayer was offered by Elder G. W. Davis. The moderator called the house to order and appointed the following committees:

After the organization prayer was offered by Elder R. N. Hinnant.

On motion the visiting brethren and sisters were invited to seats with us.

Elder B. P. Parks of the Cape Fear Conference, made some very encouraging remarks concerning the welfare of the denomination.

Elder M. L. Cummings of Raleigh, expressed his delight at being with us and made some statements in regard to the appreciation he felt for our cause, he having enlisted with us.

On motion the name of C. H. Denton of Nashville, N. C., Route 1, be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

On motion the name of M. L. Cummings be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

On motion the name of J. B. Ferrell, of Elm City, N. C., Route 4, be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

On motion the name of Jas. Driver be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

The list of ministers present during the Conference was 29, absent 12 of those who were ordained. Our record shows only two of the eight licentiates present, though others may have come in during the session.

Devotional committee report C. H. Denton open and J. K. Ruffin preach tonight at the church, E. T. Phillips preach at Pleasant Grove church on Friday night. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by A. R. Flowers. Adjournment.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference opened at 9:30. Praise by the congregation. Prayer by W. G. Boykin. Minutes of Thursday read and approved. A. E. Rouse was entered as a delegate from the Eastern Conference. He made some very cheering remarks concerning his abiding faith in our cause.

S. H. Styron of the Eastern Conference spoke of his attachment to the Western Conference as his work lay almost entirely in this Conference and asked if it were not in order for him to become a member of this Conference, pending the action of the Eastern Conference giving him a letter of dismissal and commendation.

N. D. Wiggs of the Central Conference stated that he was pleased to be with the Conference to which he belonged for many years and which he still loved. Spoke of the envelope system that the Central was using, that did away with a great waste of time and annoyance of calling the roll of churches as we now practice in this Conference.

On motion Elder S. H. Styron becomes a member of this Conference as soon as he receives a letter of dismissal and commendation from the Eastern Conference.

The Devotional Committee report that S. H. Styron preach today at 11 o'clock.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

After preaching by Elder Styron and a sumptuous dinner on the grounds, Conference reassembled at 1:30 for business. Prayer by the moderator.

A letter of dismissal and commendation was given Elder W. E. Anderson, recommending him for membership in the Central Conference, as he desires the same owing to his location and convenience.

An interesting and instructive talk was made by C. K. Dunn, manager of the Free Will Baptist Press. He told of the progress of the company what it was doing and the various changes through which it had recently passed. The importance of increasing the circulation of the paper. He stated that the company was even now in a position to do work much more readily than formerly, but that the company was still needing some very important equipments that he trusted would soon be put in through the liberality of the Conferences and union meetings.

On motion we endorse the course pursued by the committee in regard to selling the Coco Creek church property. Also that we continue the same committee, the Conference agreeing to stand by and uphold them in whatever course they may deem best to pursue in the future.

On motion we release Bro. W. T. Kirby as a committee in regard to the Black Jack Grove church property, and that he turn over the deed of said property to the Conference.

On motion the Conference turn over the deed of Black Jack Grove church to the trustees of said church.

Elder Ezekiel Westbrook of the Cape Fear Conference was welcomed

and called upon to explain something of what he knew about the Princeton church, and their desires as to joining the Cape Fear Conference. He stated that they showed an anxiety to join the Cape Fear Conference.

On motion it was decided that this Conference allow Princeton church the privilege of joining the Conference of their choice, and that the name of Princeton be dropped from our list of churches.

On motion G. W. Davis act temporarily in place of B. B. Deans on the ordaining council as Bro. Deans has to go home. Also that Elder R. N. Hinnant in like manner fill the place of L. T. Phillips who is on a committee. And that J. H. Whitley fill the place of W. M. Ferrell, our moderator.

The Devotional Committee report that Prof. Spencer open and E. C. Morris preach at the church tonight (Friday).

On motion the Conference release the Ordaining Council from demanding at this session of the Conference, the educational tests as set forth for applicants for ordination at a former session.

On motion we receive no church into this Conference without a deed in fee simple made to the Conference.

On motion Conference close until 9:30 Saturday morning.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met as per appointment. Song by the congregation. Prayer by N. S. Lancaster.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

On motion this Conference at this sitting be ordered through its treasurer to pay \$200 to the Printing Company or Free Will Baptist Press of Ayden, N. C.

Resolution on Education.

Introduction. Seeing the need of a broader and deeper intelligence of the fundamentals of the Christian religion, and the need of a more unified knowledge among people, of the real principles of our church,

Be it Resolved, 1. That we endorse the Summer School at Ayden of the Free Will Baptist, a necessity and as an aid to this end.

2. We recommend for our young ministers, who are not in a position to attend school, the reading course prescribed by the Ayden Seminary.

3. In order to create more interest in the reading of our church organ, *The Free Will Baptist*, we recommend the introduction and support of an Educational Column in the Free Will Baptist.

4. That we go on record opposing the teaching of any theory in our public schools that is contrary to the fundamental principles of the Christian religion, and that we use our influence in securing teachers, who are true to the teaching of God's Word.

5. That we encourage better home discipline for the safe guarding of our children against the social delusions so common among pleasure seekers of our times.

BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above resolution was strongly endorsed and adopted.

Strong addresses were made by Elders A. R. Flowers and A. B. Utley in support of the above resolutions before their adoption.

Prof. R. B. Spencer, President of the Seminary made a fine address, setting forth the merits of the institution, telling what was being done, and insisting upon our people patronizing our own institution which was standing for the true principles of the Bible.

Bro. J. S. Collier was appointed treasurer, pro tem.

On motion the finance committee retire settle with the treasurer, pro tem and report.

The Devotional Committee report that Elder W. M. Ferrell open and Elder M. L. Cummings preach today at 11 A. M.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON.

After a sermon by Elder M. L. Cummings of Raleigh upon the Baptism of the Holy Ghost and a very splendid dinner by the good ladies of the community, Conference reassembled at 1:30. Song by the congregation and prayer by Simon H. Styron.

Temperance Report. (Adopted.)

We, the committee on Temperance beg leave to submit the following:

Whereas, there are other things that destroy and demoralize as well as strong drink.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, 1. That we deplore the general tendency of the age to desecrate the Sabbath day.

2. That we do not patronize or frequent the race track, ball games, or any place of sinful amusement.

3. That we keep continually before our people the need of obeying the laws and impress upon them that one can not be a good citizen, much more a Christian, if he does not keep the law of the land.

The above report was received and the finance committee discharged.

NOTE.—Bro. John W. Bryan, Jr., was elected permanent treasurer of the Conference. His address is Goldsboro, N. C., R. F. D. No. 6. Bro. Bryan has not received at this time the report of funds, if any in the hands of Bro. Z. C. Bissett our former treasurer, therefore the above is only a partial report of the standing of the treasury.—SECRETARY.

On motion the secretary write J. W. Fuquay that he can only come into this conference as any other minister comes by being received as a licensed minister and afterward being examined as a licentiate for ordination.

Bro. C. G. Pope, Superintendent of the Orphanage Home, made a talk in which he stated that the Home was in great need of more funds than were coming in at present. About 80 children were now in attendance. Funds received from the receipts from the class had to be used in making payment on a building. Winter was coming on and those who had families must know what that meant. He spoke of the great need of a combination building for a school room and chapel service.

His proposition was endorsed by speeches from Miss Essie Sasser, Elds. Styron and Lancaster and others.

Report of Sunday School Committee. (Adopted.)

We, your Committee on Sunday Schools beg leave to make the following report:

1. We ask all pastors to insist upon the churches over which they preside to see that their churches have evergreen Sunday Schools.

2. We insist upon pastors being present at their churches in time for the Sunday school at each and every apointment if posible, and that they take an active part in the same.

3. We insist upon all churches using our own literature.

4. We insist on each school representing each year in the Mass Meeting and also making a yearly report of their work for the year.

5. We recommend that the Mass Meetings represent in the State Sunday School Convention.
