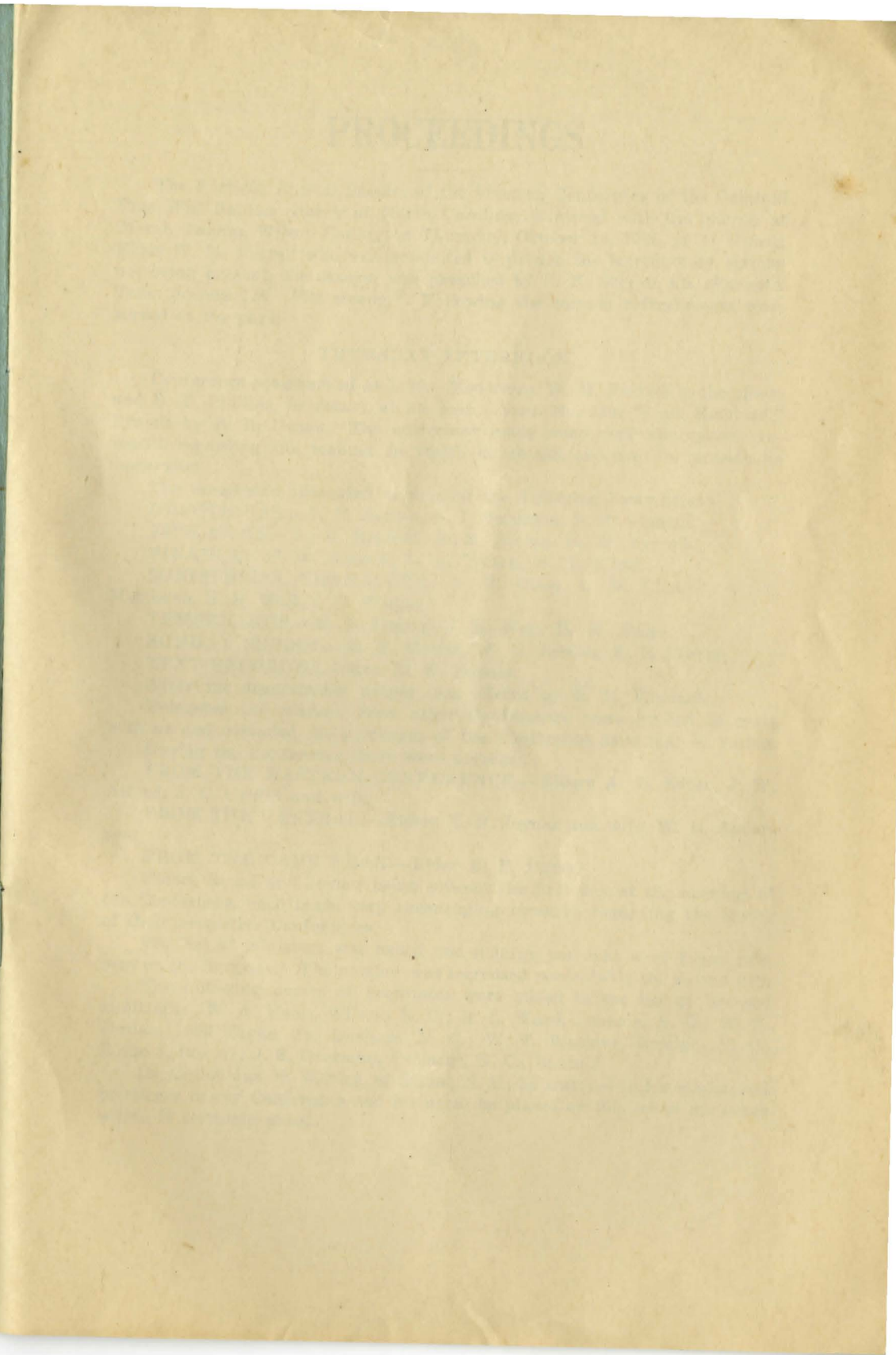
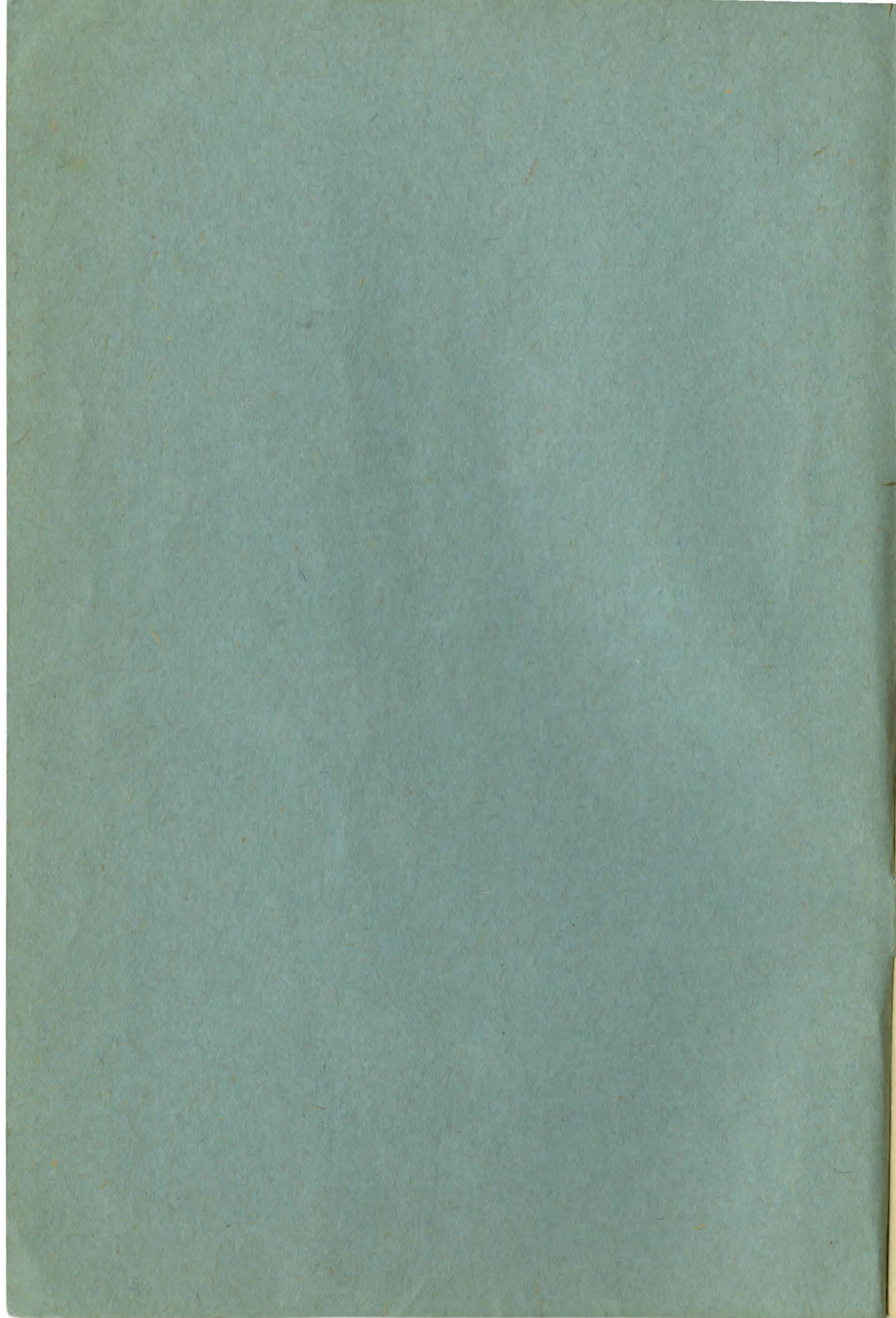

PROCEEDINGS

The Fortieth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist church of North Carolina, convened with the church at Marsh Swamp, Wilson County on Thursday, October 14, 1926, at 11 o'clock. Elder W. M. Ferrell who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon not being present, the sermon was preached by S. H. Styron, his alternate. Text: Joshua 1:6. "Be strong." Following the sermon refreshments were served on the yard.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference reassembled at 1:30. Moderator W. M. Ferrell in the chair, and E. T. Phillips, Secretary at his post. Sang No. 139, "I am Resolved." Prayer by B. B. Deans. The moderator made some very appropriate remarks regarding the manner in which he should endeavor to preside as moderator.

After the organization prayer was offered by R. N. Hinnant.

Delegates and visitors from other Conferences were invited to seats with us and extended the privileges of the Conference save that of voting.

Elders Rouse and Joyner being present the first day at the opening of the Conference, each made very encouraging remarks regarding the status of their respective Conferences.

The list of ministers was called and a large per cent were found present on the first day. The number was increased perceptibly the second day.

On motion Jas. H. Worley, of Selma, N. C., be restored to his ministerial privileges in our Conference and his name be placed on the list of ministers where it formerly stood.

The Devotional Committee report that E. T. Phillips preach tonight in the church, and tomorrow at 11 o'clock, W. A. Hales open and E. B. Joyner preach.

Conference closed for the day with prayer by A. E. Rouse.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference opened as per adjournment at 9:30. Prayer by Z. P. Ferrell. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

On motion Daniels Chapel, Wilson County, be given a letter of recommendation to join the Central Conference at their request.

The clerk read a letter from Elder M. C. Prescott, who has been appointed Circulation Manager of the Free Will Baptist, our church organ. After the reading of the letter, the Conference adopted the following motion: This conference offers a premium of \$10.00 in gold to the minister, lay member, brother or sister who secures the largest number of yearly paid up subscriptions to the paper during the coming year, either new names or renewals, provided that no one be considered as a contestant until they have secured the amount of twenty-five paid up yearly subscriptions.

On motion when the minutes of this Conference are sent out from the Publishing House, two blank church letters be sent in the package addressed to the church clerk.

REPORT OF A SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

Elder L. T. Phillips, chairman of the committee to look after the Valentine-Wilson controversy submits the findings of the committee as follows:

The committee appointed by the Western Conference to settle the Valentine-Wilson matter, after due and prayerful consideration, have reached the following findings:

That J. W. Valentine, J. J. Wilson, and J. S. Wilson, the three as party together appear to have been guilty of non-Christian conduct. And as a result of such findings they are silenced and set aside until there is a complete Christian reconciliation.

Elder J. C. Griffin, Secretary of the Board of the Orphanage made a strong plea for the Orphan Home at Middlesex. He emphasized the need of raising means to finish paying back money that was borrowed to build the Boys' Dormitory at the Home. Every possible effort must be employed to secure the needed \$12,000 by January the first 1927.

At 11 o'clock Elder E. B. Joyner preached a soul stirring sermon from the text: "God so loved." He dwelt with great fervency upon the love of God.

Recess was taken till 1:30 Friday evening, during which time a most sumptuous feast was enjoyed on the grounds.

The list of churches was called, delegates names were enrolled with their contributions for various purposes. (See statistical table.)

On motion, the church at Princeton be restored to this Conference at their request.

On motion we receive the Orphanage church as a member of this Conference.

The Devotional Committee report that J. C. Griffin preach tonight, and J. H. Worley tomorrow at 11 o'clock. Benediction by J. H. Whitley.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference assembled at 9:30. Prayer by E. T. Phillips.

On motion Bro. W. T. Kirby of Kenly be appointed to represent the Western Conference in the Stockholders' meeting of the Free Will Baptist Press, located at Ayden, N. C.

On motion each of the committee, who have not already been paid their expenses in attending the Valentine-Wilson case be allowed \$5.00 to be paid by the Conference.

Petitions for the next Conference were taken up from Union Grove, Little Rock, and White Oak Hill churches.

By a close vote over Union Grove church in Wayne County, the Conference goes to White Oak Hill in Nash County, near Bailey, N. C. S. H. Styron preaches the introductory sermon and C. M. Johnson is the alternate.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL CHARACTER.

We, your committee beg leave to make the following report: The case of Elder G. C. Joyner and Z. P. Ferrell was compromised and settled.

We further recommend that Elder J. W. Valentine be excluded from the Western Conference, amended that his license and credentials be demanded.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

We, the committee on Temperance ask that we accept the report of last year with the following addition, that the preachers be required to preach at least one temperance sermon during the year. Last year's report is as follows:

Whereas, there are other things that destroy and demoralize as well as strong drink,

Therefore, be it Resolved, 1. That we deplore the general tendency of the age to desecrate the Sabbath day.

2. That we do not patronize or frequent the race track, ball games, or any sinful places of amusement.

3. That we keep continually before our people the need of obeying the laws and impress upon them that one cannot be a good citizen, much more a Christian, if he does not keep the law of the land.

2. That we again emphatically go on record as being opposed to the teaching of any theory in our public schools that is contrary to the revelation of the truth as contained in God's word, and that we ask our people at large to co-operate with the committees of schools in securing teachers

who accept the teachings of God's word in preference to the so-called revelations of science.

3. That we encourage better home discipline for the safe guarding of our children against the social delusions so prevalent today.
