PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-First Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist church of North Carolina, convened with the church at White Oak Hill, Nash County, on October 13th, 1927. Song by the congreigation and prayer by D. B. Sasser.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder S. H. Styron. He preached from Psalms 40:1-3 and the last verses of Isa. 40.

After the sermon a very good dinner was enjoyed by all in attendance.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Conference reassembled at 1:15. The moderator of the Conference being absent attending a funeral, Eld. S. H. Styron was made moderator pro tem. Prayer was offered by Eld. J. R. McCaskey.

After the organization, prayer was offered by B. P. Parks.

Delegates and visitors were invited to seats with us and given all the privileges of the body save that of voting.

There were with us from bodies as follows:

FROM THE CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE.-B. P. Parks.

Each of the above named brethren made encouraging remarks concerning the work in their respective bodies, and expressed themselves as being highly gratified at being in our midst.

A letter was read giving an account of the splendid services that were being rendered by Elder A. R. Flowers in different sections of the South.

On motion the children representing the orphanage at Middlesex be allowed from 10:30 to 11 A. M., to render songs, recitations, etc., for the entertainment of the conference and others in attendance on Friday morning. The list of ministers was called and a fairly good number were found

to be present.

By order of the conference the following names were entered upon the list of licentiate ministers: B. B. Richardson, Middlesex, N. C., Route 1, and Bernice Phillips, Selma, N. C., Route 2.

The Devotional Committee report as follows: W. B. Batts open the

services at 7:15 P. M., and G. C. Joyner preach. Friday at 11 A. M., E. C. Gaskill preach.

Bro. D. B. Sasser of Mount Olive, N. C., made a talk with reference to Eureka College. Bro. Sasser is very enthusiastic in calling our people's attention to the vital necessity of supporting the same.

Praise service was led by Bro. Jones of Stoney Creek church, followed by prayer by W. A. Hales of Wilson, followed by adjournment till Friday morning 9:30.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Met according to adjournment. Devotional services were conducted by E. G. Holland. Song No. 40 and prayer by B. B. Richardson.

E. C. Morris was made temporary moderator awaiting the moderator of the conference.

The list of the churches was called, delegates names recorded, and contribution turned over to the finance committee. (See statistical table).

At the appointed hour Bro. C. G. Pope, Superintendent of the Orphanage presented a class from the Home, who rendered a most delightful and entertaining program that made a deep impression upon the large audience present.

At the 11 o'clock hour, Elder E. C. Gaskill of the Eastern Conference, preached a sermon that was very impressive from Isa. 35:8. "And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called the way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it," etc. His theme was "The Road." After this impressive sermon, the moderator, W. M. Ferrell rendered a solo, "The City of God," which made a great impression.

At the noon hour a very sumptuous dinner was enjoyed by a vast throng of people.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON.

Met at 1:45. Song by the congregation. A committee was appointed to examine and report upon the merits of the book, "The Upper Room Ought" composed by Rev. J. C. Griffin, of Goldsboro, N. C. Committee appointed: W. A. Hales, E. T. Phillips, E. G. Holland.

On motion a collection be taken for the orphanage on Saturday at the 11 o'clock hour.

C. K. Dunn, Manager of the Free Will Baptist Press, made a plea in behalf of moving the office equipment to a more suitable place in the town of Ayden, giving several reasons why such a move should be made.

On motion the Western Conference take \$100.00 additional stock in the Press located at Ayden, N. C., for the purpose of giving it a better location.

The Devotional Committee report that E. C. Morris open services at 7:15 tonight, and that Prof. Spencer speak in behalf of Eureka College. On Saturday at the 11 o'clock hour Eld. W. A. Dail preach.

D. B. Sasser spoke in the interest of the college, followed by Prof. Spencer.

On motion by W. B. Batts the Western Conference take an endowment of \$5,000 in the interest of Eureka College.

On motion by S. H. Styron, a committee be appointed to form a budget, estimating what each church should contribute to the next Annual Conference. The following were appointed said committee: S. H. Styron, W. T. Kirby, W. M. Ferrell.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE.

We, your Educational Committee beg leave to report as follows:

1. Since our college is doing preparatory and Junior College work, we recommend that our people as far as possible patronize Eureka College at Ayden, N. C.

2. (a) We recommend a faithful financial support of Eureka College and a close study of what it is doing for our church.

(b) That our churches work diligently and faithfully in putting over the budget that the college is now asking for.

3. That we request all our young preachers and applicants for the ministry to prepare themselves educationally and otherwise for the great task set out before them.

4. That we ask the college to work and put in force as soon as practical a Normal Sunday School Teachers course for those wishing to teach in our Sunday Schools. BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above resolutions were adopted.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GRIFFIN'S BOOK.

We, your committee appointed to examine the book written by Eld. J. C. Griffin of Goldsboro, beg leave to say that we find the work, "The Upper Room Ought," a most excellent production, that clearly and unmistakably sets forth feet-washing as a Gospel ordinance, that should be observed by God's people until he comes, and further that the auxiliaries of our church obtain the book and dispose of them to their own advantage and for the propagation of a great truth, that has been lightly observed by many.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9:30. Congregation sang No. 153 in Hymns of praise. Prayer by Elder J. E. Davis. Song No. 94 by the congregation.

Elder J. K. Ruffin was elected temporary moderator till the moderator arrived.

On motion Zebulon church be referred to Mission Board for their consideration.

On motion the conference send W. T. Kirby to Level Grove church in

Wake County, and that he be empowered to use his own judgment in the disposition of the church property there.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

We, your committee on Sunday Schools submit the following:

Realizing that the Sunday school is one of the leading auxiliaries of our church in the training of our youth, in leading the lost to Christ and in developing Christian character.

Be it Resolved, That we put forth every effort that we can to get Christian officials and teachers, who are qualified both spiritually and educationally to conduct our Sunday schools.

Further, we request that our teachers read as many helpful books on Sunday School work as they can or take some special course in the work.

Second, That we do all that we can toward having a Sunday school in every church. We mean 100 per cent strong throughout our entire denomination. BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above resolutions were adopted.

On motion we indorse the Sunday school report of the National Conference that was held in Florida last June.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

We, the committee on Temperance, beg leave to submit the following report, which is the same as last year's report with the exception that the word "Require" in the first paragraph be made to read "Request."

The report is as follows: That the preachers be requested to preach at least one temperance sermon during the year.

And, whereas, there are other things that destroy and demoralize as well as strong drink,

Therefore, be it Resolved, 1. That we deplore the general tendency of the age to desecrate the Sabbath Day.

2. That we do not patronize or frequent the race track, ball games, or any sinful places of amusement.

3. That we keep continually before our people the need of obeying the laws, and impress upon them that one can not be a good citizen, much more a Christian, if he does not keep the law of the land.

BY THE COMMITTEE.

The above report was adopted.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the treasurer, and that the treasurer report.

A collection was taken for the orphanage amounting to \$28.48.

Prayer was offered by Elder W. E. Anderson as an introductory service to a sermon that was delivered by Eld. W. A. Dail of the Central Conference.

At the 11 o'clock hour Elder W. A. Dail preached a very interesting and impressive sermon from the text, "Be thou strong and shew thyself a man." 1 King 2:2. He clearly demonstrated the fact that it was time for our people to cease being children and show themselves men in those things that

make for our progress along all lines. He regretted that many of our church reports failed to show that we were making the progress along many lines that we should. His sermon called for a spirit of progressiveness along all lines of Christian endeavor.
