PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-Fourth Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with Little Rock Church, Wilson county, N. C., on Wednesday, October 15, 1930, at 11 A. M. After singing by the congregation, prayer was offered by J. R. Bennett, superintendent of the Orphanage at Middlesex, N. C. This was followed by a song, and prayer was offered by C. M. Johnson.

A duet was sung by R. E. Tripp and Clarence Biggs of Goldsboro.

In the absence of the one appointed to preach the introductory sermon and his alternate, the moderator called upon Rev. R. E. Tripp, who preached an able sermon. Subject: Fruit of the Spirit. Text: "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."—Gal. 5:22, 23. Song No. 140 was sung and recess taken for dinner.

Wednesday Afternoon

Conference reassembled at one o'clock. Prayer by Rev. A. Lamonds. Special song, "Jesus Paid it All," was sung. The following committees were appointed:

The list of ministers was called and a large percent were found to be absent, however, a goodly number came later during the conference.

The following brethren from other conferences were made welcome and invited to participate with us in the proceedings of the meeting:

Bros. L. T. Phillips, W. T. Kirby, and S. H. Styron, were appointed to write an obituary of Eld. J. L. Strickland, deceased, to appear in the minutes of the conference.

A letter was read from Eld. D. A. Windham about the name "Original" appearing before the name Free Will Baptist, stating that it might give us trouble in law as he had somewhat investigated the matter.

A motion was made that we send a delegate to the Central Conference for the special business of looking after the name that we as a denomination should carry. (The motion was defeated).

On motion our church retain the name Original Free Will Baptist. (Motion adopted).

Letters were read from Elds. A. R. Flowers and E. C. Morris stating that they were sorry that it was so they could not attend this session of the conference. They each pray God's blessings to be with the ministers, delegates and visitors in attendance, and that much and lasting good may result from our deliberations.

Letters of dismission were granted to Elds. W. B. Batts and C. H. Denton as they desire to unite with the Central Conference, as they belong to a church that is in the Central Conference.

On motion this conference receive by letter Eld. F. R. Williams from the French Broad Association. The letter was read in open conference and Eld. Williams was received by the conference.

The devotional committee report that J. R. Bennett preach tonight and that C. M. Johnson preach tomorrow (Thursday) at 11 A. M.

On motion conference adjourn till Thursday at 9 A. M. Song No. 116. Benediction by C. H. Denton.

Thursday Morning

Conference met according to adjournment. Song No. 2, "Never Grow Old" was sung. Prayer by W. K. Jordan. Song No. 20, "I Am Thine O Lord."

The following ministers that were not present Wednesday arrived: W. K. Jordan, B. M. Carter, G. C. Joyner, E. Poston, S. H. Styron, J. H. Worley, A. A. Wells, J. E. Davis, W. R. Williams.

On motion Eld. W. E. Anderson become a member of this conference subject to receiving a letter from the Central Conference to which he now belongs.

Report of Educational Committee

Realizing that the greatest need of our church, especially our ministry, is Christian Education; and that such education cannot be obtained through our state educational system; and seeing that our only hope, as a denomination, lies in an educational institution owned and controlled by Free Will Baptist who have not been corrupted by Modernism; therefore, be it resolved:

First, that we adopt all recent plans, resolutions, or actions of the State Convention, in regular session or special executive sessions, concerning Eureka College as a Bible School and our brethren who are financially burdened or incumbered with its present indebtedness.

Second, that we recommend and encourage the circulation and study of the book, "Stewardship and Missions," which is sold by the Free Will Baptist Press at thirty-five cents per copy.

Third, that we advise our churches, Sunday schools, and Young People's Leagues that the best safe-guard against Modernism and "science falsely so called" is a faithful study of God's Word (2 Tim. 2:15) and the use of our own literature published by the Free Will Baptist Press at Ayden, N. C.

Fourth, that we indorse the Bible Correspondence School of the Moody

Bible Institute, 153 Institute Place, Chicago, Ill., and encourage our ministers to enroll in such courses as they think would be most profitable to them.

At the 11 o'clock hour a fervent prayer was made by Eld. J. H. Worley. A quartet composed of J. E. Jones, R. E. Tripp, Wiley Lamm, W. R. Williams, sang, "Draw Near to God." Song No. 67 was sung followed by a prayer by C. M. Johnson. After these preliminaries Eld. C. M. Johnson preached a very telling sermon. Theme: Stewardship. Text: Deut. 8:11-18. After song No. 13, "Prepare to Meet the Lord," was sung, the audience was dismissed for dinner.

Thursday Afternoon

Conference after enjoying a most refreshing dinner, reassembled at 1:40. Prayer by R. E. Tripp. "Traveling Home," was sung by the quartet mentioned above. J. E. Jones by request sang, "The Pearly White City."

The devotional committee report E. T. Phillips preach tonight at 7:30, and J. H. Worley tomorrow at 11 o'clock.

Temperance Report

(Adopted)

We, your committee on temperance, beg to submit the following report: Seeing the great need of a more careful consideration on the part of preachers and laymen to live in due bounds with Christ's admonition on purity of life conduct, Be it Resolved:

1. That the membership of our denomination refrain from participating in the things that do not conform to the teachings of Christ.
2. That as a conference we endeavor to build up a spirit of good will by showing Christian courtesy to all people, and that we emphasize our church as a means through which our church services may function toward magnifying Christ and his kingdom.
3. That we encourage sobriety, and that we urge our people to cast their ballots for the promotion of prohibition.
4. That both preachers and laymen do their best for the promotion and advancement of the Free Will Baptist denomination.

Verbal Report From the Orphanage

The Orphanage work was presented by the superintendent, J. R. Bennett. He showed very clearly how the home could be maintained if the different Free Will Baptist homes over the state would come to the rescue of the children. Any thing that would be of service in your individual homes can be utilized at this home where 85 children have to be fed and clothed contin-

uously. He asked the fathers and mothers of homes to take in consideration the needs of this body of children, remembering that we, the Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, are responsible for these destitute ones. The state is saying to us, you must care for them properly. The destiny of the bodies, minds, and souls of these children are to be looked after by us who claim to be the followers of him who loved and blessed the children that were brought to him. Ladies' Aids, churches, Sunday schools and all the working forces of our denomination should not forget our responsibility regarding the task that lies out before us. The recording angel is taking note of how we meet the needs of these children.

Following Bro. Bennett's earnest plea for the Home, a collection was taken amounting to \$42.54.

It was stated by the superintendent of the Home that Dr. E. C. Powell of Middlesex, had rendered free of charge a vast amount of medical service to the inmates of the Home. The sad intelligence has just been received that his brother has recently passed into the beyond, therefore, it was ordered by the conference that the moderator or clerk send Dr. Powell a telegram from the conference, expressing our deepest sympathy to him in this sad hour through which he is passing.

A duet composed of R. E. Tripp and J. E. Jones, very effectively rendered the song, "Since I Found My Saviour."

Report of the Ministerial Character Committee

We, your committee on Ministerial Character, upon investigation of Rev. A. Lamond's character and conduct, wish to submit the following report:

1. We find nothing against him so far as immoral conduct is concerned. We do find that his methods of living are such as to create criticism, and we would recommend that Bro. Lamonds either resign as pastor of Edgemont Free Will Baptist church at Durham, N. C., or arrange to move his family where he is located.

We further find that Bro. Lamonds acted in undue haste in excommunicating Elds. G. C. Joyner and W. K. Jordan, contrary to our discipline; and we further recommend that they be reinstated by their church to their former fellowship.

Conference met at 9:30. Song, "Holy Spirit Faithful Guide," was sung. The congregation joined heartily in singing, "Amazing Grace How Sweet the Sound." Prayer was offered by Eld. A. B. Utley.

Report of Sunday School Committee

We, your committee on Sunday school beg leave to report as follows: Realizing that the Sunday school is one of the leading auxiliaries of the church, in the training of our youth, in leading the lost to Christ and in developing Christian character, Be it Resolved,

1. That we put forth every effort that we can to get Christian officials and teachers in all our schools, those who are qualified both spiritually and educationally to conduct our Sunday schools.
2. That we request our teachers to read helpful literature and obtain all the information they possibly can on Sunday school work.
3. That we do all that we can toward having a progressive Sunday school in every church.

The above report was adopted.

Some very interesting talks were made on the line of Sunday school work by A. B. Utley, Z. E. Cox, and L. T. Phillips.

Rev. M. E. Tyson, a minister of the Missionary Baptist church, was present and made welcome in our midst.

On motion the Conference reimburse Bro. W. T. Kirby in the sum of \$10.00 for the expense he has been to in looking after church affairs of the conference.

On motion the next annual conference meets with Kenly church, in the town of Kenly, Johnston county, N. C., on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday after the second Sunday in October, 1931. S. H. Styron preaches the introductory sermon and C. M. Johnson is his alternate.

Resolution by L. T. Phillips

(Adopted)

Be it resolved, That each church in this conference send as a conference fund the amount of 10 cents *per capita*, to meet the general expense of the conference.

Report of Ordaining Council

We, your Ordaining Council of the Western Conference, beg leave to submit the following report:

We have examined Bro. J. W. Wall and deem it unwise to ordain him. In the case of Bro. Z. E. Cox, we can not ordain him at this conference due to the fact that he did not bring a letter of recommendation from his church.

We recommend, however, that he proceed to procure letter, and that he be ordained at a later date by ministers appointed for that purpose; namely, A. B. Utley, W. E. Anderson, and H. R. Faircloth.

NOTE BY THE CLERK

In the Statistical Table that is appended in the latter part of each minute, will be found the apportionment that the Executive Committee of the State Convention has apportioned to each church in behalf of the indebtedness of Eureka College, and that the signers of the Long Term Loan may be relieved of the great burden that is hanging over them on account of this indebtedness. The table may not be as it should be respecting each and every church, but it was necessary that some assessment or apportionment be made, so that the pastors and members of each church might know about what they were expected to raise during the present year. The calculation was made from the 1929 minute at a minimum rate of 40 cents per member. We trust that these amounts may be raised at an early date, for we do not want those who are under the burden of this debt to be crushed.
