

## **PROCEEDINGS**

The Forty Eight Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Saint Mary, Wilson County, N. C. on Wednesday, October 17, 1934. Several songs found in Hymns of Adoration were sung by the audience, led by the moderator of the conference, Rev. Henry Melvin of Durham. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. H. Worley of Selma, N. C.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. W. M. Ferrell of Kenly N. C. He read as a foundation of his sermon, Corinthians 10: 1-4. Text: Christ and his subject was Leadership. He held up Christ as the great exemplar of our lives and stressed being followed by the leadership of Jessu. At 12 a. m. a most excellent dinner was served by the good people of the community.

#### Wednesday Afternoon

Conference reassembled at 1:14 o'clock. Song No. 116 in Hymns of Adoration was sung. Prayer was offered by the Moderator.

The list of Ministers was called. Possibly one third of the ministers whose names are recorded on the minutes answered to their names

No visiting ministers or delegates were recorded on the first day.

The list of churches was called with small percent responding.

Rev. W. A. Hales of Wilson, N. C., made a statement to the conference, in which he acknowledged that he had been overtaken in a fault, and that he had been penitent and prayerful over the matter to the extent that he felt that the Lord had forgiven him and that he was at peace with his Maker. He asked the conference for forgiveness and that he be restored to full fellowship in the conference and his former position as a minister, if the conference would so grant it.

By motion Rev. W. A. Hales was admitted into full fellowship in the conference, and his name was ordered place on the list of ordained ministers again, as it formerly had been.

Rev. Rufus Hyman presented a letter from the Salem Association of Florida, stating that he was an ordained minister of said Association in good standing, and that he would be dismissed from that Association when it was made known that he had united with another body of like faith.

By motion Rev. Rufus Hyman was received into this body, upon his request, and his name placed on the list of ordained ministers of this conference. P. O. Address Wilson, N. C. R. F. D.

By motion The name of Rev. L. H. Boykin be placed on the list of licensed ministers of this conference.

The ministers and delegates who were in attendance extended the hand of fellowship to Elds. Hales, Hyman and Boykin,

By motion we change the name Sunday School Committee to that of Auxiliary Work.

#### Report of the Devotional Committee.

The Devotional Committee reports that service to night open at 7 o'clock for prayer and song and that preaching be by Rev. J. B. Ferrell, commencing at 7:30 P. M. That on Thursday at 11 o'clock A. M. Rev. Henry Melvin preach in the School building.

The first Union Meeting Dist., sent a donation of \$5.00 to the conference by Bro. R. L. Pittman, which was thankfully received by the body.

Vacancies caused by the death of Rev. B. B. Deans were filled as follows on different boards: On Ministerial Character. J. A. Evans, and on the Ordination Board, Rev. W. R. Williams

On motion the conference close until Thursday morning at 9:30 o'clock, and that in the closing prayer a special prayer be made for Eld. L. T. Phillips who is absent from the conference owing to serious illness. Prayer was offered by Eld. J. B. Ferrell.

#### WEDNESDAY NIGHT SERVICE.

On Wednesday night the services were held in the Grammar School building of the Saint Mary School. The choir rendered several songs in a very inspirational manner Rev. J. B. Ferrell of Elm City community preached a very impressive sermon subject: "Lost Opportunites." His text was a part of the tenth verse of the 25th, chapter of Matthew, "And the door was shut." The minister forcibly, and clearly, impressed upon the large audience the great folly of letting opportunity after opportunity pass without grasping the opportunities as they continually present themselves to us. It will be sad to find at last that the door is shut and that we are forever shut out.

#### THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9:30. Prayer by H. R. Faircloth Song, "Have thine own way Lord" etc.

These delegates and visitors expressed themselves as being pleased to meet with us, but gave no definite information about the workings of their respective conferences.

Minutes of the preceeding day were read, corrections made and the minutes approved.

The roll of ministers was called, finding that on both a goodly percent of the ministers were present, though several were absent owing to illness and the infirmities of age.

The roll of the churches was called the second day and records made which will be found in the Table of Statistics.

Report of Committee on Education (Adopted).

We your Committee on Education, beg leave to submit the following report:

- 1. We recommend that Sunday School Institutes be held under the supervision of the Educational Board of this conference in all our churches as far as practical.
- 2. We recommend that the Conference stand behind the Smithfield Bible School and that we urgently ask each pastor to raise the amount of \$100 per month from each of his churches, and forward same to W. B. Crumpler of Goldsboro, N. C., the Treasuer of our State Convention so that he can make monthly payments as needed

Report of Committee on Auxiliary Work.

We your Committee on Auxiliary Work submit the following:

From our experience in church work, we have found that churches that are properly organized into the Auxiliary Departments of our churches; such as Sunday Schools, Free Will Baptist Leagues for our young people, and the Women's Auxiliary work, are doing a greater work for Christ and his church than those without them.

We ask our people to use the best literature, and that our literature be used by our Sunday Schools, Leaguers, and Ladies Aids, and that we also take advantage of the use of Teachers' Magazines and any other good helps that we may need to better prepare ourselves for the Lord's work

We further ask that all these departments be organized in all our churches, and that spaces be added to the letters to the conference for reports of expenditures for literature and for missionary work and that

these letters give the names and address of the President and Secretary of each department.

Revs A. R. Flowers and J. K. Ruffin were appointed to write a sketch of Eld. B. B. Deans to appear in the minutes of this conference.

At the eleven o'clock service Rev. Henry Melvin, the Moderator of the conference preach in the School Building of St. Mary near the church

The auditorium of the School Building seemed to be completely filled with anxious listeners. The minister read Matt. 16: 13-18. Christ was with his disciples near Caesarea Philippi and asked his disciples who he was. You remember Peter's reply. The theme of the speaker was, The Church. Text "I Will build my Church." He dwelt upon the stability of the church, and the unstability of those who compose the church militant today. What would be the results if all professors were true and tried Christians in reality!

At the close of the service in the school building, Rev. J. R. Bennett, Superintendent of the Orphanage Home made an appeal to the audience in behalf of the eighty five children in the Home. Bro. Bennett reported that the Home was in a good way to get out of debt and that when that happy time arrived that he would labor to keep it in the same way; he would make a rule to pay as he went.

A collection was taken amounting to \$51.00, this with what was sent from the churches amounted to about \$100.00.

Near twelve o'clock, the vast audience returned from the school building to the church where a most sumptuous feast of food was served. An audience of several hundred were well fed, and much choice food was left showing the wondrous hospitality of the community of St. Mary's church.

#### THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

Met shortly after one o'clock. "O for a Closer Walk with God" And "Majestic Sweetness Sits Enthroned" were sung by the congregation. Prayer was offered by Rev. M. B. Woodlief.

Bro. H. G. Watson of Kenly was appointed Treas. pro tem in the absence of Bro. W. T. Kirby, who for some cause was retained at his home.

On motion the conference grant to Rock Spring church in Nash county the building and furniture of the church of Bailey, N. C.

On motion the Board of Trustees be granted the power to sell Zebulon Church property. After the sale of said property enought of the funds be retained to place a marker at the grave of Eld. B. W. Tippett's grave in connection with the grave of Sister Tippett also, the marker for the grave of Bro. and Sister Tippett not to exceed \$100.00. All other funds received beyond the \$100 to be turned over to the Middlesex Orphanage as a fund to be used in the erection of a church building at the Orphanage Home.
