PROCEEDINGS

The Forty Ninth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist church of North Carolina, convened with the church at Rains Cross Roads in Johnston County, N. C. on Wednesday October 16, 1935. After a selected song was sung, prayer was offered by Rev. S. H. Styron, followed by the hymn, "Jesus calls me." Prayer was offered by Rev. M. E. Tyson. "Have thine Own way Lord," was then sung.

Rev. Henry Melvin, the moderator of the conference preached the introductory sermon. His theme was, Building the Church, Text. Matt. 16:18. "Upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

At the noon hour a most excellent dinner was served by the community.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at one o'clock. "He leadeth me", was sung by the assembled congregation. "Standing in the need of prayer" was sung by a quartet composed of Revs. Henry Melvin, W. R. Williams, R. N. Hinnant, and W. M. Ferrell. Rev. R. N. Hinnant led in this singing and in most of the songs used in the entire meeting.

Prayer was offered by Rev. W. E. Anderson of Morehead City, N. C. The address of welcome was given by Rev. W. E. Anderson, pastor of the local church.

The following committees were appointed:

Devotional.—Luby Edwards, J. R. Evans and J. W. Boyette.

Educational.—R. N. Hinnant, G. C. Joyner, and A. R. Flowers.

Temperance.—J. H. Worley, W. E. Anderson, W. A. Hales.

Auxiliary.—Mrs. H. J. Corbitt, Mrs. C. G. Pope, Mrs. Wiley Lamm.

Finance.—J. A. Evans, W. R. Hyman, E. C. Morris.

Resolutions.—S. H. Styron, T. H. Fulghum, W. H. Wells.

A special committee composed of J. A. Evans, W. T. Kirby, and W. M. Ferrell was appointed to confer with Bro. Rufus Hyman relative to the Princeton church.

The list of ministers was called and each one checked.

The devotional committee reported that E. C. Morris preach Wednesday night and M. E. Tyson on Thursday at 11 o'clock.

The list of churches was called and reports read (See table of statistics).

Bro. G. L. Lipscomb was recommended to the conference as a licensed minister and was received into the conference as such.

Bro. T. H. Willey was introduced to the conference by the moderator.

Report of the Ordaining Council (Adopted)

Since the applicants for ordination, each of them having furnished us satisfactory recommendations, and having satisfied us as to their qualifications for ordination; therefore, we your ordaining council hereby recommend that the following licentiate ministers be ordained and their names be enrolled upon the regular list of ordained ministers, to wit: Isaac William Jerningan, E. D. Woodell, Dee Bissett, Milford Hales, Romie Mitchell.

The report concerning the Zebulon church was made by W. E. Anderson, and the matter was still left in the hands of Bro. Anderson.

The Moderator extended a hand of welcome to all the visiting ministers and delegates from other bodies. Those present on the first day of the session were enrolled as follows:

From the Central Conference.—Rev. R. P. Harris, delegate, Rev. M. A. Woodard and wife visitors.

From the Eastern Conference.—D. W. Hansley. The privileges of the conference were extended to them. Each expressed themselves as being pleased at being with us.

Rev. J. K. Ruffin made a verbal report concerning the Bailey church. It will be remembered that at the last conference the Bailey church became a part of the Rock Spring church, the two having consolidated.

By motion the conference adjourned till 9:00 o'clock Thursday morning. Benediction by W. K. Jordan.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT SERVICE

Service opened at 7:30. Wednesday night. Song service was conducted by Rev. W. E. Anderson. A duet was rendered by Elds. G. C. Joyner and W. K. Jordan. After which Rev. E. C. Morris of Elizabeth City preached, using as a text Phil. 2:25. The subject was "Epaphroditus" The minister discussed four leading topics: 1. Epaphroditus, the common sympathizer, 2. The common worker. 3. The common sufferer. 4. The affectionate friend.

THURSDAY MORNING, OCT. 17

Conference met at 9 o'clock. Song, "Pass me not O gentle Saviour." Prayer by Milton Johnson. Song No. 91, "Higher ground," was sung by the audience. M. L. Johnson was present from the Cape Fear conference and made welcome, also Revs. Griffin and wife, and R. B. Spencer, Moderator of the same Conference. L. H. Wetherington of the Eastern. I. J. Blackwelder, Editor of the Free Will Baptist, and M. E. Tyson of the Central, and W. L. Jernigan of the Pee Dee Conference.

Delegates from Hansley's Chapel, a newly organized church, were present and asked that the church be received into the conference. A letter was read stating their beliefs and practices as being in conformity to our book of discipline. It was moved and carried that the church be received and its delegates seated as per letter.

Another new church, Oak Grove in Durham County, was also received after a petitionary letter was read, and it was voted to seat its delegates in like manner as the above church.

Report of the Educational Committee (Adopted)

We your committee on Education recommend that this conference endorse the resolution adopted by the General Conference in session at Black Jack Church. This Sept. 16-17, 1935.

Educational Report of the General Conference.

Rev. J. L. Welch made report for the Board and read the report submitted at the 1934 session and asked for readoption, and that the Board recommend that Nashville, Tenn. be selected as a suitable site for the location of a Bible College. Too, that a Board of Trustees be elected to receive and hold property that may be acquired for an Educational institution. Report adopted. See report of Educational Secretary for session of 1934 and Board of trustees elsewhere.

Report of Auxiliary Work.

We your committee on Auxiliary Work, submit the following report: Realizing that the youth of today is the hope of tomorrow, we see the necessity of training our boys and girls; and so far we have found no better way of Christian training than through the Sunday School and Young People's Societies. We recommend that only trained, consecrated teachers and leaders be used.

We further recommend that the best literature available be used in all our organizations, and that teachers avail themselves of every opportunity for useful training.

Statistics show that our most progressive churches are those in which the women are organized in Ladies Aids and Missionary societies. We ask that every church in the conference organize one of these societies, that have not one at present.

The watchword of the Woman's Auxiliary, "Laborers together with God", suggests to us a wonderfully high calling. May we all aspire to such a position.

ORDINATION OF MINISTERS

At 10 o'clock the following ministers were duly ordained by the Ordaining Council on the floor of the conference:

Milford Hales, Kenly, N. C.: C. D. Woodell, 804 Holloway Street, Durham, N. C.; I. W. Jernigan, Bailey, N. C.; Dee Bissett, Bailey, R. 1.; Romie Mitchell, Fremont, N. C., R. 1.

The prayer of ordination was offered by Rev. G. C. Joyner. Rev. Henry Melvin delivered the charge. After the charge the Bible was presented by the Ordaining Council, and the ordination was perfected by the laying on of hands. Prayer by Rev. J. H. Worley.

Bros. R. C. Wiggs and F. H. Rivenbark were received into the conference as licensed ministers from Edgemont church in Durham.

While the congregation sang, the right hand of welcome was extended to the newly ordained and licensed ministers.

At the eleven o'clock service, Rev. M. E. Tyson preached. The Scripture was taken from Jeremiah 18:4. "And the vessel that he made of clay was marred in the hand of the potter; so he made again another vessel, as seemed good to the potter to make it." From this text, a vivid sermon

was preached showing how the potter worked in remaking the marred vessel.

Song No. 67 was sung, "Have thine own way Lord." Benediction by I. J. Blackwelder. Before the dismissal for dinner, a collection was taken for the Orphanage amounting to \$39.58. A sumptuous dinner was served by the good people of the community. There was no scarcity of the most wholesome viands.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at one o'clock. The congregation sang, "I am bound for the Promised Land." Prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

The Finance Committee was asked to retire, settle with the Treasurer and make their report.

Moved and carried that Eld. G. W. Ferrell be placed on the Retired Ministers' list.

Rev. M. B. Woodlief made a report of the work that he was doing at Franklinton. He stated that he had organized a Free Will Baptist Church in the town and asked that it be admitted into the conference. It was moved and carried that the church be admitted.

It was moved and carried that the churches at Holy Springs in Wake county and Mineral Springs in Durham county be dropped from the list of churches.

Report of Temperance Committee (Adopted)

Realizing that temperance is a moderate use of all things permissible and a total abstinence from all things unpermissible, We your committee on Temperance recommend and submit the following report:

1. That we call upon all members of the Free Will Baptist Church to be moderate in indulging their appetites and passions.
2. That they be careful in the matters of eating and drinking as to the kinds of foods and drinks and the quantity taken at one time.
3. That we call upon them to set aside certain days for fasting and meditation.
4. We also ask our people both men and women to set proper examples before their children regarding temperance in dressing and the use of cosmetics and that we be more eager to teach them the Bible instead of patronizing in an intemperate way the beauty parlors of our land.
5. That we abstain from the buying, selling, or drinking of any alcoholic beverage in any form.
6. We recommend that certain steps be taken to exclude or excommunicate from our churches any member buying, selling or drinking or handling any beverage containing alcohol.

Moved and carried that the conference send a delegate to the National Convention at Nashville, Tenn. The chair appointed Revs. S. H. Styron and R. N. Hinnant as delegates to the Nashville Convention.

Petitions were taken for the next Annual session. Rock Spring, Pleasant Grove and Micro were voted upon. Rock Spring in Nash county near Bailey, N. C. receiving a majority of the votes, the session of 1936 is to convene with Rock Spring Church.
