

PROCEEDINGS

The Fifty-Second Session of the Western Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with the church at Pleasant Grove, Wayne County, North Carolina on October 12, 1938.

The Association opened by singing "Revive Us Again." Devotions were conduced by Rev. J. B. Ferrell. Scripture, Psalm 91. Prayer by Rev. S. H. Styron. The congregation sang "What a Friend We Have in Jesus."

In the opening remarks of the Moderator, he called to the attention of the Association some material growths that had been realized. He then declared the Association formally opened and ready for business.

The congregation stood and sang "There Is a Name I Love to Hear," and enjoyed an old-fashioned handshake. Benediction by Romie Mitchell.

THURSDAY MORNING

Devotions were conducted by Rev. C. E. Orton, reading from 1 Corinthians 15 and prayer by Rev. J. A. Evans, after which the congregation sang "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story."

Moved and carried that the name of Rev. R. C. Wiggs be discontinued as he joined the Texas Conference.

Rev. Henry Melvin presented Brothers T. H. Allen and A. P. Lee and asked that their names be recorded as licensed ministers.

Rev. E. D. Newland and M. C. Johnson of the Friends Church were present and extended a Welcome.

The Ordination Service was held and Brother L. S. Joyner was ordained. The Ordination service: Singing "Am I a Soldier of the Cross?" Prayer by Rev. W. R. Williams. Charge by Rev. Henry Melvin. Prayer by Rev. J. H. Worley. Presentation of the Bible by Rev. S. H. Styron. Song, "A Charge to Keep I Have." Extending the hand of Fellowship.

Temperance Report (Adopted).
