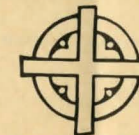

Proceedings

The Fifty-Third Annual Session of the Western Association of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with Marsh Swamp Church, Wilson County, North Carolina, October 11, 1939.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. W. E. Anderson, using as a Scripture lesson the second chapter of Job. The following songs were used during the devotional period: "Trust and Obey" and "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Prayer by Rev. J. H. Worley. Brother Anderson spoke on the integrity of Job.

The moderator, in his opening remarks, paid tribute to the deceased ministers and pointed out the responsibility of the Conference to the superannuated ministers.

The entire program of the Association was read by the clerk.

A letter from Rev. M. L. Cummings was read by the clerk, expressing his desire to attend the Association and pledging his prayers for its success. He enclosed \$5.00 as a personal donation.

The report of Committee on Evangelism was read and adopted.

We, the Committee on Evangelism, submit the following report:

First—A revival held in Princeton Free Will Baptist church with 22 converts sponsored by the Home Mission Board.

Second—The aforementioned revival resulted in the reorganization of the church with 15 charter members; the same congregating each third Sunday afternoon for regular services with regular pastor.

Third—Notwithstanding that the progress of our associational work has been to at least a small degree checked, financially speaking, during the recent weeks of economical uncertainties, the fires of evangelism have continued to burn warmly in our churches. This fact is evidenced in the glowing reports of many successful evangelistic campaigns.

Fourth—We recommend that since we as a body are not able at present to employ a regular full-time evangelist on the field, that we discharge the Committee on Evangelism and henceforth instruct the Home Mission Board to sponsor future evangelistic endeavors in needy and isolated sections of the Western Association.

Intermission of ten minutes.

Rev. W. R. Williams led the congregation in singing, "It Is Well with My Soul." Brother Williams presided over the Memorial service and presented the following speakers: Rev. W. G. Pike, memorializing the late Rev. A. A. Wells; F. A. Rivenbark, the late Rev. John Thompson; Rev. A. R. Flowers, the late Rev. J. K. Ruffin. All heads were bowed in reverence, honoring these deceased ministers and prayer was offered by Rev. J. H. Worley. The congregation standing sang, "I Am Resolved."

Rev. F. A. Rivenbark delivered the morning message, using as a text, Philippians 2:5. He stressed in the message the necessity of all Christians being Christ-minded. The closing song: "Make Me a Channel of Blessing" was sung by the congregation. Benediction by Rev. W. A. Hales.

Lunch.

At one o'clock, the Association re-opened, with devotions being led by Rev. E. C. Morris. He read from the third chapter of Philippians.

A quartette composed of Revs. E. C. Morris, R. N. Hinnant, Henry Melvin, W. R. Williams, sang "One of God's Days."

Visiting ministers were welcomed and allowed all the privileges of the Association, except that of voting. The following were present: Central Conference: Revs. Bruce Barrow, R. P. Harris, M. E. Tyson, and J. C. Moye. Eastern Association: J. C. Griffin, R. C. Proctor (delegate), L. H. Wetherington. Cape Fear Association: T. E. Beaman, C. B. Thompson, C. H. Coats.

The list of churches was called and reports were presented by the delegates and read by the Reading Clerk.

A verbal report of the Ordaining Board was given, recommending the restoration of Rev. R. E. Tripp as an ordained minister. A hand of fellowship was extended him by the Association.

A verbal report was received from the Moderator regarding the Princeton Church.

Rev. R. P. Harris sang, "Jesus, Oh How Sweet the Name."

An offering of \$6.24 was received to replace money borrowed from the Home Mission fund to purchase the Free Will Baptist stock of the late J. H. Newsome.

The congregation sang, "Sweet Peace, the Gift of God's Love."

Adjournment, and Benediction by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

WEDNESDAY EVENING

Song service was conducted by Brother Eddie Jones. Hymns used: "He Keeps Me Singing," "Standing on the Promises" and "Higher Ground." Prayer by Rev. Eppie Barnes. Brother Jones sang, "Death Is Only A Dream." Rev. E. C. Morris preached from the Scripture, Luke 19: 1-10, using as a subject: "A Man and the Man." Closing song, "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story."

THURSDAY MORNING

In the absence of Rev. B. B. Richardson, devotions were conducted by Rev. J. F. Parrish. Brother Eddie Jones led the congregation in singing, "At the Roll Call" and "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." He read from the 14th Chapter of Luke. Prayer by Rev. R. N. Hinnant. Singing "More Like the Master" by the congregation.

The moderator declared the Association open for business and the minutes of the previous day were read and approved. The clerk called the roll of ministers.

AUXILIARY COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee on Auxiliary Work wishes to report that the auxiliary work of our churches is, as far as seems possible, on the upward trend. New Ladies Aids, Leagues, and Sunday Schools are being organized fairly regularly.

Let us suggest,

1. That every church in our Association strive to present the auxiliary work to their people in its fullest sense. We believe that no church can meet its highest responsibilities, measure up to what is expected of it, or fully answer the challenge of a lost world without first being a well-rounded, progressive, and active organization. This goal is largely reached through a well-balanced program of auxiliary activities, including a live Sunday School, Ladies Aid, and Free Will Baptist League at least.

2. That the ministers of our Association assume a greater attitude of responsibility toward the auxiliary work of their churches. Too many of our ministers never visit their Sunday Schools, seldom offer assistance or inspiration to their Ladies Aids, and by far are too indifferent toward the youth of their churches who meet in their leagues each week. Many a pastor in our association could hardly tell you the number of leagues in his churches.

3. Finally, that we accept the stirring challenge of our young people to organize, promote, and progress. May we bow in shame if we fail to do our best for those who are under our spiritual care and who are counting on us as church leaders and ministers to lead the way.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE (ADOPTED)

Realizing that temperance is a moderate use of all things permissible and a total abstinence from all things unpermissible, we your committee on Temperance recommend and submit the following report:

1. That we call upon each and every member of the Free Will Baptist Church to be moderate in indulging their appetites and passions.
2. That they be careful in the matters of drinking and eating as to the kinds of drinks and foods and to the quantity taken at one time.
3. That we abstain from the buying, selling, or drinking of any kind of alcoholic beverage in any form.
4. We suggest or recommend that certain steps be taken to exclude or excommunicate from our churches any members buying, selling, or drinking or handling any beverage containing alcohol.
5. We also ask our people both men and women to set proper examples before their children regarding temperance in the matter of dressing and the use of cosmetics. We ask that the parents be more interested in teaching their children the Bible and carrying them to Sunday School, instead of patronizing the beauty parlors, and the shows and other amusements in our land.
6. We ask every member of the Free Will Baptist Church to set aside certain days for fasting and meditation with God.
