

## THE CONSTITUTION OF THE WESTERN PIEDMONT ASSOCIATION

- Article 1. This Association shall be called, The Western Piedmont Association of (Original) Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.
- Article 2. This Association shall be composed of delegates, elected by the Free Will Baptist Churches who are members of this body. All ministers (licensed and ordained) and ordained deacons from our churches shall be considered "standing" degelates.
- Article 3. The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, and other such officers, boards and committees as may be deemed necessary to carry on the work of the body.
- Article 4. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates and one delegate for each fifty members over one hundred or a fraction thereof. This shall be in addition to "standing" delegates.
- Article 5. The church shall send by the hand of their delegates a report of all the work done by them during the year along with all statistics as will be helpful.
- Article 6. This Association shall have an Executive Board who shall have authority to investigate and receive churches into this body. All Churches wishing to come into this Association must petition the Executive Board before the annual session. No church shall be accepted at the annual association without first consulting the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall conduct the necessary business of the Association when the Association is not in session. This Board shall report its work annually to the Association and its work shall be subject to the approval of this body.
- Article 7. Any congregation desiring to be organized as a Free Will Baptist Church coming into this Association, must request the Executive Board of this Association to examine them doctrinally using the National Treatise as its guide. If satisfied, the Executive Board shall proceed to organize the group into a church. The newly organized church shall be recommended to the Association, whereupon at the pleasure of this body, they be given the right hand of fellowship.
- Article 8. This Association shall meet annually for business meetings and quarterly for fellowship meetings. The time and place of these meetings shall be decided by the body in its annual sessions. The Executive Board shall have leave to call "special" business meetings when it becomes necessary, provided that the member churches are properly notified.
- Article 9. This Association shall have a council of ordained ministers whose duties shall be to investigate and ordain ministers at the request of any member church. They shall report their work to the Association annually and all matters with regards to discipline shall be subject to the approval of the body.
- Article 10. This Association recognizes the independence of the local church, and the historic position of Free Will Baptists relative to congregational church government and therefore, assumes no higher authority than an advisory capacity. This body assumes no rights over local church property other than that which may be acquired by legal title.
- Article 11. This Association by majority vote may withdraw fellowship from any church or minister found to be walking disorderly, contrary to sound doctrine and practices as believed by Free Will Baptists.
- Article 12. Each church or minister, in order to maintain fellowship in this body must report either by letter or in person to the annual Association meeting. Each church should be represented by delegates.
- Article 13. This constitution may be amended at any regular business meeting by vote of two-thirds majority, provided that such notice shall be given at the first session following permanent organization.

## **BY-LAWS FOR THE WESTERN PIEDMONT ASSOCIATION**

- 1. Each session shall be opened with prayer and suitable devotions.
- 2. The clerk and assistant shall be elected at the beginning of the first session of the annual meeting. The Moderator shall appoint the necessary committees at the first session.
- 3. The Moderator shall read the rules of decorum and call for adoption of the program.
- 4. The Executive Board shall have charge of the promotional work of the Association. The officers of the Association (as defined in the constitution Article 3) shall be members ex officio of the board. The board shall consist of six members, with two members being elected on a rotating basis. One for two years, and one for one year. One man will be elected for a two year term each year.
- 5. The ordaining council shall consist of three members, (ordained ministers in good standing) to be elected on a rotating basis. One for three years, one for two years, and one for one year.
- 6. This Association is affiliated with the N. C. Association of Free Will Baptists' and the National Association. The treatise of the National Association is to be used, regarding our expression of faith and practices.
- 7. The Association approves and encourages the indifinite pastoral call.
- 8. The Association approves and urges our Churches to support the programs of our State and National Associations.
- 9. Each board and committee shall elect its chairman and treasurer. EXCEPTION: The Moderator of the Association is the chairman of the Executive Board and the treasurer of the Association is its treasurer.
- 10. A member may serve on as many boards and committees as he may be elected. EXCEPTION: No member may serve on the Executive Board and Ordaining Council at the same time.
- 11. Each Church shall send fifty cents per member (both active and inactive) with their annual report to the Association. This money shall be placed in the general fund and shall be used for the printing of the minutes and other Associational expenses.
- 12. Each Church should include in its report information concerning any minister who is walking disorderly (unfaithfulness, failure to tithe, etc.) The clerk of the Association should report this to the ordaining council

whose duties shall be to investigate such matters and make recommendations to the Association at the proper time.

- 13. Since the word of God requires faithfulness (I Cor.: 4:2) a minister in order to remain in fellowship with the Association must be faithful to his Church and Association. A Church must also be faithful. (see constitution article II)
- 14. A nominating committee shall be elected by the body at the last session of each annual meeting. Their duty shall be to present nominations for all associational offices (except committees appointed by moderator). The body shall have the right to nominate from the floor after this committee gives its reports, and all offices shall be filled by a majority vote.
- 15. These by-laws may be amended at any regular business meeting, provided that a quorum be present.

## RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The clerk, assistant clerk, or senior minister in years may call the meeting to order and shall have charge until the moderator assumes his place.
- 2. Roberts Rules of Order shall be used inasmuch as it pertains to Ecclesiastical bodies such as ours.
- 3. There shall be no conversation by members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- 4. Every person wishing to speak must first rise and address the moderator and be recognized by him before speaking.
- 5. No person shall interrupt (except in extreme emergencies) another while he is speaking.
- 6. All motions made must be seconded and shall be opened for discussion. The body by majority vote may close discussions at any time.
- 7. No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject, nor more than ten minutes each time without special leave from the body.
- 8. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave from the moderator.
  - 9. If any proposition or motion contains two or more points it shall be divided at the request of any member and voted on separately.
- 10. Motions lost shall not be recorded unless so ordered at the time.
- 11. The moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided that the chair shall be filled.
- 12. Any decision of the moderator may be overruled by a two-third majority vote.
- 13. Visiting brethern or sisters shall be entitled to be seated and accorded all the privileges of the body except voting.
- 14. Unlawful absense from the body denies a member voting privileges for that session.
- 15. It is urged that each member let Christian charity rule in every situation.

16. A quorum of at least nine members must be present in order to conduct any legal Associational business. These rules may be altered, amended, or suspended at any regular business meeting of the Association, provided that a quorum shall be present.

## RULES AND BY-LAWS FOR LICENSING AND ORDAINING MINISTERS

#### I. SCRIPTURAL QUALIFICATIONS

In order for a brother to be ordained to the gospel ministry by this Association, he must first meet the qualifications as set forth in the Holy Scriptures—which we hold to be our only rule of faith and practice.

- A. He must have been born again, redeemed by the precious blood of Christ, and made a new creature in Him. (Jn. 3:5-7, I Pet. 1:18-25, 2 Cor. 5:17)
- B. He must be called of God to preach. (Gal. 1:15-16, Heb. 5:4)
- C. He must meet the qualifications of a Bishop as set forth in the Holy Word of God. (I Tim. 3:1-7)

That any one desiring to be ordained to the Gospel ministry or received into our Association not be divorced and remarried or married to a divorcee, that he abstain from smoking, dancing, card playing, immodest dress, worldly hair styles (feminine looking), public mixed swimming, and bad credit. That he not have a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, and tongue speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval.

- 1. That the guidelines apply to presently ordained ministers with exception of marital status.
- 2. That the local church be encouraged to follow these guidelines in the licensing of preachers.

#### **II. ASSOCIATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

The local church shall, with prayerful consideration, license the men who are called to preach among its membership.

- A. The man that is licensed shall serve under the guidance of his church until such time as full-time ministry requires ordination. At that time, the church may recommend and request by letter that he be examined for ordination by the Ordaining Council of this associational body.
  - 1. We encourage when a brother is licensed that he be presented the treatise of our National Association with instructions to study during his licensing period. When he appears for ordination, he shall be expected to answer questions based on our treatise with regard to church policy, history, and Bible doctrines as believed by Free Will Baptists. (2 Tim. 2:15)
  - 2. He shall be encouraged to use every available means to study the Word of God in order to better prepare himself for the gospel ministry. He shall be advised of the various Free Will Baptist schools that are available to him.
- B. No man will be considered or examined by the Ordaining Council of this associaton who has not been properly recommended by a member church.

When a minister from another Free Will Baptist Association or Conference is called to pastor a member church—recognizing the authority and respecting the wisdom of said church in the selection of its pastor—this association will issue to said pastor a minister's card upon receipt of a letter of recommendation from a sister association or, if not a member of an association, upon receipt of a letter of recommendation from the requesting church. When an Ordained Minister comes from another denomination:

- A. He shall first become a member of a church of this association.
- B. His church shall recommend and request that he be examined by the Ordaining Council—at which time the Ordaining Council may or may not recommend that he be issued Free Will Baptist Credentials.

These rules may be suspended or amended by a majority vote of the Association in session provided that a quorum is present.

### **III. DISCIPLINE**

- 1. The Association shall have the authority to discipline ministers only with regards to his standing in the Association. Matters of discipline with regards to his Church membership must be administered by the local Church.
- 2. A minister who is licensed or ordained by this Association shall be required to submit himself to the discipline of the Association with regards to his credentials which are issued by the Association.
- 3. If any person shall appear before the Ordaining Council with a just grievence of a private nature against a minister he shall be instructed to settle the matter according to the Word of God. (Matt. 5:22-24, Matt. 18:15-17.) After having exhausted all scriptural means of reconciliation the aggrieved may request investigation and action of the Council.
- 4. If any minister is the subject of discipline all charges must be presented in writing signed by the accusers. A copy of these charges must be presented to the minister at least thirty days before a hearing is held on the matter. The pastor of the minister's home Church must be informed of any charges pending against the minister. The minister so charged shall have the right to prepare his defense, and be represented by counsel of his choosing.
- 5. If charges arise against a minister which are of a public nature to wit; unfaithfulness, heresy, living in open sin, breach of Associational requirements. The ordaining council shall have the authority and take the proper action in accord with the rules of the Association. All matters of discipline against a minister shall be final only upon approval of the Association in session.
- 6. When the local Church disciplines a minister according to the Word of God, and it becomes necessary to withdraw fellowship from him, the Church should notify the ordaining council of its action and request that his ordination credentials be suspended. The council shall act in accord at the request of the church.
- 7. Each Church is expected to co-operate fully with the Association with regards to the discipline of ministers in order to encourage a sound and useful ministry among the brethern, failure to do so could effect the standing of the Church in the Association.
- 8. If a minister should be found guilty of charges that are properly presented against him, the Association may suspend his credentials

- 9. All ministers of this Association are required to report to each annual Association either in person or by letter with a report of his work.
- 10. These rules of discipline may be suspended or amended by majority vote of the Association, provided that a quorum is present.

## DOCTRINE

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: (a) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. (b) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. (c) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matthew 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in the store, as God hath prospered him." (I Corinthians 16:2).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

## CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by selfdenial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### ARROWOOD ASSEMBLY YOUTH CAMP

- 1. Campers and counselors are not permitted to leave the ground without permission from the director.
- 2. All campers and counselors are expected to be prompt at all meals and meetings unless excused by the director.
- 3. Campers and counselors are required to attend all classes, chapel, evening programs, campfire, cabin devotions, and recreation activities.
- 4. Athletic equipment and facilities are under the control of the recreation director and may be used only as specified by him.
- 5. Every camper, counselor and staff member must be responsible for his own bath cloths, towels, soap, sheets, blankets, pillow and pillow case, dress clothes, sport clothes, Bible, pencils, note book, ball glove, toilet articles, camera, and musical instruments.
- 6. Campers should not bring radios, record players, flashlights, tape players, or cassettes to camp.
- 7. Absolute quiet and attention is expected from every camper during chapel, classes, and fireside programs. Enter the chapel with a spirit of reverance and leave as orderly as possible. These services should be high moments of inspiration.
- 8. Campers and counselors are required to stay in their cabins each night from the sounding of "lights out" bell until the rising bell, except as directed by the director. No lights or noise will be permitted in the cabins during sleeping hours.
- 9A. The following dress code will be observed for all campers, counselors, staff members, and workers: Girls modest apparel, no shorts or tight clothing. Cullotes or gouchos will be permitted during recreation, free time, class time, and meal time, but dresses must be worn during the evening worship times, and these dresses must be knee length. All girls' swimsuits must be modest and one piece only.
- 9B. No clothing will be permitted with slogans carrying evil suggestions or impressions (this applies to both boys and girls).
- 9C. Boys must wear half sleeve sport or dress shirts during classes, meals, worship and other religious activities; during recreation and off time T-shirts may be worn. Boys must wear shirts, long pants, shoes and socks at all classes, meal time and worship time.

If a person does not comply with this dress code, his parents will be called and requested to either bring the proper clothing for the child or come and pick their child up and take him home.

- 10. No "griping" will be tolerated; any necessary compaints must be made to the counselor or camp director.
- 11. We encourage a wholesome relationship between all campers, counselors, staff members, and workers, but will not allow any evidence of familiarity. Boys and girls will be separated by age groups and cabins and each cabin will be separated by groups and at no time will boys be allowed in the girls area or girls allowed in boys area. There will be ample time for fellowship together.

## REPORT OF ORDAINING COUNCIL 1980-1981 TO WESTERN PIEDMONT ASSOCIATION

June 13, 1980—First Free Will Baptist Church, Stanley, NC

The Ordaining Council met for the purpose of ordaining Rev. James Hope into the Gospel ministry.

Members of the Council present were Rev. Ralph Willis, Rev. Ronnie Wilson, and Rev. Homer Savage, proxy for Rev. Roy Rikard.

## **SUBJECT: SPECIAL COMMITTEE REPORT** RE: MINISTERS' CHARACTER AND CONDUCT

Whereas many Free Will Baptist Church members and Christian workers have the sincere belief that certain practices should be observed by the ministers of the Gospel and desiring to maintain a high standard among such, we recommend that the following guidelines be inserted explaining Section I, point C under Qualifications of a Bishop, of Rules and By-laws for ordaining Ministers:

That anyone desiring to be ordained to the Gospel ministry or received into our association not be divorced and remarried or married to a divorcee, that he abstain from smoking, dancing, card playing, immodest dress, worldly hair styles (feminine looking), public mixed swimming, and bad credit. That he not have a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, and tongue speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval.

Special notes:

- (1) That these guidelines apply to presently ordained ministers with exception of marital status.
- (2) That the local church be encouraged to follow guidelines in the licensing of preachers.
