CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strenghen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and the evangelistic effort for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF THE DECORUM

- (1) The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- (2) There shall be no conversation by the members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- (3) Every member wishing to speak shall first rise and address the Moderator.
- (4) No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
- (5) We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother and sister.
- (6) Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- (7) No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- (8) Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to, unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- (9) No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.
 - (10) On all motions made, where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.
 - (11) The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member provided the chair is filled.
 - (12) Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.
 - (13) Not less than nine members shall constiute a quorum.

YADKIN VALLEY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

- (1) This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by each church; three for the first fifty members or fraction thereof, and one for each additional fifty members or fraction thereof, sent to the Association to represent the church.
- (2) Each church is required to select the best qualified members of the body to represent the church and carry on business.
- (3) The Association, when assembled, shall first elect a Moderator and Clerk.
- (4) The rules of the decorum must be read immediately after the Association is assembled.
- (5) The Association will encourage a sound ministry, such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour: that the plan of salvation, presented by Christ, is strictly and definitely Grace, and, as presented by the gospel, will save all human beings who accept it.
- (6) Any minister, in good standing with his church, or Association, may be invited to a seat in our Council and may take part in the deliberations, and his name enrolled in our minutes.

- (7) It is the duty of the Association to appoint, or elect, committees to take care of special business, etc. Each committee report must be in writing, and turned in to the Clerk for reading before the assembly.
- (8) All queries regularly presented to the Association by any Church shall be attended to.
- (9) Any church wishing to become a member of this Association may do so by making application by letter and represented by the delegates of said church. The church must adopt our Articles of Faith and Church Covenent.
- (10) The Association may withdraw from any church who walks disorderly or violates any rule made and passed on by the body.
- (11) It is to be understood that the Association assumes no higher authority than that of an Advisory Council.
- (12) Any church wishing a letter of dismissal from this Association may do so on the grounds of a two-thirds majority of the members of said church.
- (13) Any minister found casting his influence against any church or, in any way, marring the character unjustly of another minister, or working in any way to secure the church of a fellow minister, will be dealt with by the Association.
- (14) This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by two thirds votes of the delegates attending. Providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first sitting of said meeting after permanent organization.
- (15) The Ordination Council shall have authority to ordain Pastors of churches entering this Association between Sessions.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- (1) The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- (2) God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creattor, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infintely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- (3) Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His Divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- (4) The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- (5) The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided

- for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- (6) The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- (7) The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- (8) The terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentence or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in fith and obedience until death.
- (9) Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by fith in Christ, men become His elect.
- (10) Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- (11) Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- (12) Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- (13) Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Godpel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- (14) Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in The Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2a).
- (15) The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- (16) Resurrection, Judgement and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into etennal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) The Ministers' Conference shall have authority to elect the Ordination Council. (Association of 1954).
- (2) All Ministers of this Association, licensed and ordained, shall have a seat, voice and vote at all Ministers' Conferences, and, along with all delegates, at Associational Conferences. (Amended thus Association 1966).
- (3) Any Minister failing to send a report to this Association shall subject his name to be placed on the Nominal Roll of Ministers. (Association of 1956).
- (4) Worship service shall be conducted at 11:00 a. m. on Friday and Saturday and at 7:30 p. m. on Friday during the Association (Association of 1958).

RULES GOVERNING ORDINATION COUNCIL

- (1) No minister may be granted license or certificate of ordination unless he presents a letter of recommendation from the church to which he belongs. Also, this church must be a member of this Association.
- (2) No licensed minister may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license unless he is called to be full-time pastor of a church.
- (3) No licensed minister, even though called to be assistant pastor, may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license.
- (4) All ministers being admitted to this Association must promise to relinquish the credentials they hold from this Association if, and when, he joins another Association, or when he is adjudged by the Ministers'-Conference to be disqualified to preach the gospel.
- (5) All Ministers entering this Association from another Free Will Baptist Association must present a letter of recommendation from the Association he is leaving. Also he must surrender the credentials he holds from the Association he is leaving.
- (6) The Ordination Council shall not have the authority to license women to preach.
- (7) This Council shall not issue credential to brethen who have two (2) living companions, even though divorced.
- (8) These rules must be read to each minister asking for entrance into this Association.

ANNUAL MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

The Annual Ministers' Conference of the Yadkin Valley Association convened September 6, 1969 at 10:00 A. M. with Arrington Heights Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington, N. C.

A song entitled, "I Love to Walk with Jesus" was sung and prayer was led by Rev. Johnny Triplette. Rev. Dewey Tilley read a scripture from Romans 3 and the host pastor, Rev. J. P. Langley turned the service over to the Moderator, Rev. Grover C. Bare. Bro. Bare declared the house in order for business and called the Roll of Ministers. The following Ministers were present: Reverends Alfred Absher, Grover C. Bare, Henderson Eller, William E. Gilmore, Willard W. Howard, J. C. Huneycutt, Raeford James, J. P. Langley, Dewey W. Tilley, Johnny Triplette, Wayne Hart and Arlie Green. Rev. I. W. Plyler reported by letter because of his physical condition. Rev. Archie Wyatt, a visiting minister, was given a seat and voice in our conference.

The Moderator read a scripture from Isaiah 54:13. Rev. Raeford James read the "Rules of the Decorum." The Clerk, Rev. J. P. Langley read the Minutes from the last Ministers' Conference.

Fisher (2), Donald Fritts (0), William E. Gilmore (3), Arlie Green (2), Wayne Hart (4), Willard W. Howard (4), J. C. Huneycutt (4), Raeford L. James (3), J. P. Langley (5), J. Henry Swaim (2), Dewey W. Tilley (1), and Johnny Triplette (4). (This number also includes two days of the Association).

The next Ministers' Conference will meet with Near Calvary Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington, N. C. on the first Saturday in December, 1969.

The Conference then adjourned and was dismissed by Bro. Clifford Head.

At the eleven o'clock hour, Rev. Archie Wyatt, a visiting minister, brought an inspiring message from Acts: 13-14. He used as his theme, "They all continued in one accord." After the message, Rev. J. P. Langley dismissed the congregation in a dismissal prayer.

After the appointing of these committees, we were adjourned in order that the committees could get together, and also for the eleven o'clock worship hour.

The Worship Hour was opened with a song, "Deeper, Deeper", led by Rev. J. P. Langley. A congregational prayer was led by Rev. Willard W. Howard.

Rev. J. C. Huneycutt had been selected to present the message and read a scripture form St. John 6: 48-5; and brought an inspiring message from it. After the message, we adjourned until 1:30 P. M. for lunch. Rev. Johnny Triplette dismissed us in prayer.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session opened with the body singing "He Abides", after which Mrs. Minnie Lamb led our hearts to prayer. The House was declared in order by the moderator, Rev. J. P. Langley.

An offering was taken which amounted to \$13.25. The Treasurer's Report was read by the treasurer, Bro. William House. The Ministers' Reports were read by the clerk, followed by the reading of the Sunday School and Church Reports by the assistant clerk.

A discussion was made pertaining a way of clarifying Rule No. 1 of the Constitution, enabling a better understanding of equal representation of all churches by way of knowing exactly how many delegates each church is allowed to send to the Annual Association. This was tabled over to the Saturday morning session to be voted on at that time. After a lengthy discussion,

adjournment was welcomed by all and we were dismissed in prayer by Rev. J. Henry Swaim.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Beginning with the body singing a song entitled, "Love Lifted Me", the Saturday morning session of the Yadkin Valley Association convened. Rev. Wayne Hart led us in prayer, followed by a scripture reading from Psalms 56 by Rev. Willard W. Howard. The House was then declared in order for business by the moderator.

The changing of Rule No. 1 discussion was presented to the body and after a brief discussion, was voted on and passed. This rule previously read thus: "This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by each church and sent to the Association to represent the church". The change may be observed by referring to the Constitution, rule No. 1 on page 5 of these Minutes.

All of the reports of the various committees were read and accepted and will be found elsewhere in these Minutes. The remaining Ministers' Reports, Ladies Auxiliary Reports and CTS Reports were also read that had not been turned in to the clerk previously.

The Treasurer gave another report since other contributions and monies had been received after the report on Friday.

Reverends Ronald Creech, Broncho West, Billy Morris, and Clarence Ballew were given a seat and voice in our deliberations and each made some informative reports pertaining to their activities of which they are engaged in. Rev. Creech told of the growth of the Witness Book Store, The Free Will Baptist Witness, the starting of a new Mission work in Charlotte, N. C. and the progress that had been made in the funds for a station wagon for the Book Store.

Rev. Broncho West reported on his work in the mission of which he had been instrumental in organizing in Winston-Salem, N. C. This mission was officially organized on Friday night, September 12, 1969 and has grown greatly under the leadership of Rev. West and his wife.

Rev. Clarence Ballew reported on the church bond issue in which he is currently engaged. Anyone desiring information on obtaining church bonds may get in touch with Rev. Ballew, Rev. Ronald Creech, or the clerk of this Association, Jack Langley, Jr.

Rev. Billy Morris, the moderator of Tidewater Association in Norfolk,

Va. was in a revival campaign with Rev. Broncho West expressed his interests in the great work of the Free Will Baptists in North Carolina.

The Ministers' Conference voted to turn the offerings taken in at their meetings over to the Association treasurer. Also, a motion was made, seconded and passed to donate \$50.00 to the station wagon fund and was turned over to Rev. Ronald Creech.

A suggestion was made by the moderator that each minister in this Association be required to renew his Ordination Certificate every four years. By doing this, a minister would not be able to have his credentials renewed if he had been proven to be unfit to preach the Gospel or had shown no interest in the Association. This was not presented to be voted on at this convening but that it might be considered as a possible issue at the next Annual Association. After this, the Association adjourned for the eleven o'clock worship hour.

After a song, "Are You Washed In The Blood?" was sung, Rev. Billy Morris brought an inspiring message from Joshua 5:2, using as his subject, "Bearing and Removing the Reproach". After this great message was rendered, Rev. Broncho West led us in the dismissal prayer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS FINANCE COMMITTEE

We, the Finance Committee do hereby recommend the following:

- (1) That each church send fifty-cents (\$.50) per member, annually to this Association.
- (2) That each Sunday School send ten-cents (\$.10) per member, annually to this Association.
- (3) That each Minister send six dollars (\$6.00) annually to this Association. In addition to this, we recommend that each pastor receive a free will offering on the last Sunday before the Annual Association.
- (4) That the Association pay the Clerk twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year for his services.
- (5) That the Association pay the Treasurer ten dollars (\$10.00) per year for his services.
- (6) If the Executive Committee is called to a church, said church shall pay the traveling expenses of the members of the council.

MINISTERS' REPORT COMMITTEE

We, your Committee on Ministers' Reports, do recommend that each minister attend the quarterly Ministers' Conferences; if it is absolutely impossible to be at these conferences, each minister is urged to send in a report to the clerk in time to be read at the conference. We recommend that each minister attend the Annual Associations and bring to these Associations a complete report of their work during the past year; this report to contain the following information:

Minister's name, address, telephone number, name of church he pastored, (if any), number of sermons he preached, number of revivals conducted, number of professions, number of members received into church, number baptised, number of funerals conducted, number of couples united in matrimony, number of homes visited, number of Sunday School lessons taught, number of visits to hospitals, amount of money received in religious work, amount of money given for religious work, and the approximate miles traveled in religious work.

We also recommend that pastors call Free Will Baptist ministers, or, ministers in harmony with Free Will Baptist doctrine, to conduct their revivals.
