

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and the evangelistic effort for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF THE DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 2. There shall be no conversation by the members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- 3. Every member wishing to speak shall first rise and address the Moderator.
- 4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
- We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother and Sister.
- Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- 7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- 8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to, unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- 9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.
- 10. On all motions made, where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.
- 11. The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.
- 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.
- 13. Not less than eight members shall constitute a quorum.

YADKIN VALLEY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by each church; three for the first fifty members or fraction thereof, and one for each additional fifty members or fraction thereof sent to the Association to represent the church.
- 2. Each church is required to select the best qualified members of the body to represent the church and carry on business.
- The Association, when assembled, shall first elect a Moderator and Clerk.
- 4. The Rules of the Decorum must be read immediately after the Association is assembled.
- 5. Any minister, in good standing with his church, or Association, may be invited to a seat in our Council and may take part in the deliberations, and his name enrolled in our minutes.
- 6. It is the duty of the Association to appoint, or elect committees to take care of special business, etc. Each committee report must be in writing, and turned into the Clerk for reading before the assembly.

- 7. All queries regularly presented to the Association by any Church shall be attended to.
- 8. Any Church wishing to become a member of this Association may do so by making application by letter and represented by the delegates of said Church. The Church must adopt our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.
- 9. The Association may withdraw from any church who walks disorderly or violates any rule made and passed on by the body.
- 10. It is understood that the Association assumes no higher authority than that of an Advisory Council.
- 11. Any church wishing a letter of dismissal from this Association may do so on the grounds of a two-thirds majority of the members of said church.
- 12. Any minister found casting his influence against any church or, in any way, marring the character unjustly of another minister, or working in any way to secure the church of a fellow minister, will be dealt with by the Association.
- 13. This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by two thirds vote of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first sitting of said meeting after permanent organization.
- 14. The Ordaining Council shall have authority to ordain Pastors of churches entering this Association between Sessions.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserve, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His Divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by dis-

- obedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature or such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentence or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunction of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men becomes His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They have done good will, come forth to the resurrection of life and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Ministers' Conference shall have authority to elect the Ordaining Council. (Association of 1954).
- 2. All Ministers of this Association, licensed and ordained, shall have a seat, voice and vote at all Ministers' Conferences, and, along with all delegates, at Associational Conferences. (Amended thus Association 1966).
- 3. Any Minister failing to send in a report or dues to this Association shall subject his name to be placed on the Nominal Roll of Ministers. (Association of 1978).
- 4. The Annual Association shall begin with a Worship Service on Friday Night at 7:30 P. M. and the Business Session will be conducted on Saturday Morning to begin at 10:00 a. M. (Association of 1978)

RULES GOVERNING ORDAINING COUNCIL

- 1. No minister may be granted license or certificate or ordination unless he presents a letter of recommendation from the church to which he belongs. Also, this church must be a member of this Association.
- 2. No licensed minister may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license unless he is called to be full-time pastor of a church.
- 3. No licensed minister, even though called to be assistant pastor, may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license.
- 4. All ministers being admitted to this Association must promise to relinquish the credentials they hold from this Association if, and when, he joins another Association, or when he is adjudged by the Ministers' Conference to be disqualified to preach the gospel.
- 5. All Ministers entering this Association from another Free Will Baptist Association must present a letter of recommendation from the Association he is leaving. Also he must surrender the credentials he holds from the Association he is leaving.
- 6. The Ordaining Council shall not have the authority to license women to preach.
- 7. This Council shall not issue credentials to brethren who have two (2) living companions, even though divorced.
- 8. These rules must be read to each minister asking for entrance into this Association.

ANNUAL MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

The Annual Ministers' Conference convened at the Arrington Heights Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington, N. C. at 10:00 A. M. on September 2, 1978 with 15 present — 8 Ministers and 7 Visitors.

Welcome was given by the host pastor, Rev. Kenneth Deal, after which Rev. Junior Ballew led the congregation in singing, "I'll Fly Away". We then had an altar of prayer led by Rev. Johnny Triplette. Scripture for devotions was read by Rev. Raeford James, "The 23rd Psalm".

Rev. Wayne Hart, Moderator, then declared the conference open for business.

The first order of business was the nomination of new officers as follows:

The Ordaining Council was elected as follows:

There was one other item of business concerning unfaithfulness of some of our Minister brethren in the conference. A motion was made and seconded that "Any Minister missing three (3) Ministers' Conferences in a row without some form of notification, and after two (2) visits by their brother Ministers, would automatically surrender their credentials".

The motion carried and the business session was closed.

The next Ministers' Conference will convene with the Northview Free Will Baptist Church in Statesville, N. C. on the first Saturday in December, 1978.

The Worship Service began with a song, "Victory In Jesus" led by Bro. Danny Wilson. Prayer was led by Rev. Alfred Absher. A soul-stirring message was delivered by Rev. Junior Ballew on being commissioned and impowered by the Holy Spirit. Then a time of fellowship, testifying and singing was enjoyed by everyone.

An offering was received in the amount of \$9.71, bringing the total in treasure to \$33.13. \$23.13 was given to the Association leaving a total of \$10.00 for miscellaneous purposes.

The meeting was then dismissed in the fear of the Lord.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

September 8, 1978

The Twenty-sixth Annual Association opened at 10:00 A.M. and everyone was welcomed by Rev. Kenneth Deal. The service was opened with everyone singing "When We All Get To Heaven". Rev. Lester Hughes read the Scripture from Psalms 122 after which there was an Altar Prayer.

The service was then turned over to the Moderator, Rev. Alfred Absher who immediately declared the House in Order for business. The Roll Call was made by Rev. Bobby Brown.

After much discussion, it was voted on and passed that due to the lack of interest for the Friday Morning Sessions, the Association will begin at 7:30 P.M. on Friday Night with the Worship Service being conducted and the business session to start on Saturday at 10:00 A.M.

The Ministers' Conference asked the Association for permission to be able to convene with how many Ministers they had present at the Ministers' Conference. It was discussed and passed that no quorum would be necessary for the Ministers' Conference convening.

Due to some Ministers failing to send in Reports or Dues, their names would be subjected automatically to the Nominal Roll of Ministers. Also, a Minister who missed four Meetings within one year, without a personal or letter contact either with the Moderator for the Clerk of the Ministers' Conference or Association, the Ordaining Council will send this delinquent Minister a letter. If no answer or response is received to the letter, then a Committee will be sent to ask for the Minister's credentials. All Ministers are to be expected to surrender their credentials without question, should this deem necessary.

Near Calvary Free Will Baptist Church was reinstated into the Association and then we adjourned for a brief intermission.

After intermission, Rev. Guy Owens, State Minister at Large, was given the service with no singing. He gave a short condensed report of the State Work and read the Scripture which was found in Hebrews 25 and delivered a wonderful and inspiring message and then we were dismissed by Rev. Junior Ballew for lunch.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

All the Reports were read and these Reports may be found elsewhere in these Minutes. A Motion was made, seconded and carried to send \$10.00 Monthly to the State Association instead of the \$75.00 per year. This money is to be sent out of the Offerings which each Church sends to the Clerk monthly to be deposited in the Savings Account. The Clerk will be responsible for sending these checks to the State Association.

The Association voted to give the typewriter to the Clerk of the Ministers' Conference.

The Committee Reports were read and we voted to reimburse the Clerk for expenses incurred during the year. The expenses were \$37.15.

The Motion was made to adjourn and Rev. Kenneth Deal dismissed in prayer.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

The Saturday Morning Session was opened with the Song, "Eastern Gate" led by Brother Danny Wilson. Rev. W. W. Howard led in prayer and Rev. Raeford James read the Scripture which was found in Psalms 27. The Moderator, Rev. Alfred Absher declared the House in Order for Business, after which the Roll Call was made by Rev. Kenneth Deal. The Rules of the Decorum were read by Rev. Lester Hughes and the remaining Reports were read and accepted by the Body.

Reverends Howard Pittman and John Hall, visiting Ministers, were given a voice and seat in our deliberations.

A short Memorial Service was observed in memory of Rev. J. E. Fisher who went to be with the Lord a few weeks before the Association.

The next Association will meet at the North View Free Will Baptist Church in Statesville, N. C.

Rev. W. W. Howard was accepted back into the Association which was followed by a letter from the Near Calvary Free Will Baptist Church.

A goal of \$400.00 was set to send to Rev. Guy Owens for expenses connected with the National Association which will be convening in Charlotte in 1979. Several Ministers and Churches have pledged money for this purpose. All monies sent in for these expenses should be sent to the Clerk, Brother Jack Langley, Jr. and specified as "National Associational Expenses". This money should be sent in as soon as possible but no later than May 31, 1979.

After this, we went right into the Worship Service.

The song, "I'd Rather be an Old Time Christian" was sung by the congregation. Rev. John Hall led the congregation in prayer and Rev. Howard Pittman preached a great and inspiring message taken from Job 16:19.

We were then dismissed by Rev. Kenneth Deal.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

MINISTERS' REPORT COMMITTEE

We the Ministers' Report Committee recommend the following: Due to the fact that there has been much discussion in the past over unfaithfulness of our Ministers in the areas of reports and dues, no satisfaction has been obtained, we recommend that any Minister failing to pay his dues or send in a report, that his name be placed on the Nominal Roll of Ministers. If this happens two years in a row, that Minister shall surrender his credentials.

We also recommend that this be written in the By-Laws of the Association, exempting those Ministers that are disabled, on a pension, or are retired.
